



I've been told I should "step up and be a leader." But honestly, leadership feels overwhelming. What does it really take to lead?


That's a powerful question—and one I've wrestled with myself. Too often, we confuse leadership with a title, a corner office, or a nameplate on the door. But the truth is, leadership has little to do with position. It has everything to do with action.

Real leadership begins long before anyone else is watching. It begins with how you lead yourself.

I learned this lesson the hard way in my early career. I was eager to move up, make decisions, and have influence. But I quickly discovered that if I couldn't manage my own time, handle stress with grace, or admit when I was wrong, I wasn't ready to lead others. Self-leadership is the training ground for every other kind of leadership.

And it's not easy.

Leaders face criticism. Sometimes fair, sometimes not. You can't please everyone, and you shouldn't try. You'll face ambiguity. The answers aren't always clear, and waiting for perfect information usually means you're already late. Decision-making





This Country Needs Jesus and Sports

It sure seems like portions of our country have definitely lost their way, especially on extreme fringes. This has been sadly showcased recently with the assassination this summer in the Minneapolis area of Minnesota House Democratic caucus leader Melissa Hortman and her husband Mark; earlier that morning Democrat senator John Hoffman and his wife, Yvette, were also shot in their house by the same shooter but fortunately survived. Then on August 27th a mass shooting occurred at the Church of the Annunciation, also in Minneapolis, during a scheduled school-wide Mass attended by students and faculty of Annunciation Catholic School. Two children, Fletcher Merkel and Harper Moyski tragically died in the shooting while 21 others were injured, including 18 other students. Then, on September 10th, right-winged political activist Charlie Kirk was assassinated while speaking at a Turning Point USA event at Utah Valley State University. We also have had many other senseless acts of violence occur that are sadly far too many to mention in one article, these are the three that have really garnered the most

These tragedies don't define a country, how you respond to them does, and sadly how the fringes of both political parties have responded has been despicable. Instead of trying to come together for a solution to why these senseless acts of violence continue to happen, we just want to point fingers at the other political party and blame them. With the Charlie Kirk shooting, the far left sadly did a victory lap when it was found out the shooter came from a conservative Mormon family who had guns in the house; later the far right did a victory lap when it was discovered the shooter held liberal beliefs and was romantically involved with a male who is transitioning to become a female. I ask the question, what does it matter? All that matters is that Charlie Kirk's wife and two children have to bury their husband and father this week. The same finger pointing happened in the Church shooting in Minneapolis, and I asked then, what does it matter? All that mattered was that those parents in Minneapolis had to bury their children several weeks ago, something a parent should never have to do, and those kids who survived have to live with that trauma the rest of their lives. The same goes with the shooters of the aforementioned tragedies, it doesn't matter their political beliefs, there are no damn winners in this when the end result is innocent people are dying. If we want to keep playing the blame game instead of coming up with a solution, these kinds of attacks are going to continue to happen.

What is the solution you ask? While I certainly don't have the answer, I know the best starting point is Jesus Christ. If we all would get back to trying to live like Jesus lived this world would be such a better place. While I know we can't be perfect like Jesus was, we certainly can try to love one another like Jesus loved us, and we certainly can give grace and forgiveness to one another like Jesus gives us daily. As John 15:12 says, "This is my command: Love one another as I have loved you." Notice it doesn't say to love only those who look, think and act just like you! Another great example for people to learn from comes from sports. I loved what Oregon head football coach Dan Lanning had to say after their game on Saturday night, "The US could learn a lot from our locker room, I think the people of this world could learn a lot from our locker room. You walk into that locker room and you got guys from different races, different backgrounds, different religions and you got a team that loves each other.... And I think we're missing some of that in our country." Lanning hit it on the head later in his press conference when he said, "life matters, and I think we've lost sight of that." He also went on to say that some people will disagree with him because he said too much about the topic, and some people will disagree with him because he didn't say enough about it, but if you disagree with him or even hate him, he still loves you and life matters. If we can come together and cheer for our favorite sports teams and not care at a game what the views are of the person next to us are, why can't we do that with the rest of our lives?

One last thing that I believe would help that many of these shooters have in common is that they spend a lot of time on social media and the internet in a "dark internet" culture that feeds into their extremism. Social media can be a cancer that continues to grow if you allow it to, as it just feeds the things that you already believe, and enforces your views even stronger. Use social media for good, follow people who are positive and bring good energy, and try to limit your screen time. If you are a parent, be sure to limit your child's screen time, and if they are gaming, be sure you know what they are playing and who they are playing with. I've gotten a little long-winded with this article, but felt like a lot of this needed to be written and hopefully heard. While I am so far from perfect, and so far from being Christ-like, I know that trying each day to live that way, while I may fail, will at least make those around me better; and if we all do that, slowly but surely, this country will change, one community at a time!



Tootsie Roll Drive is held annually, with most of the donations distributed to Hope Haven in Spirit Lake and Estherville. The funds will assist with the Hope Haven mission, including: "As followers of Christ, we unleash potential in people through work and life skills so that they may enjoy a productive life in their community." In addition, nearly a third of the funds were designated specifically for Special Olympics.

Iowa Great Lakes Council 5043 is one of the most active in Iowa, in the past few years contributing more than \$30,000 to local community needs, including Hope Haven, Iowa Helping Hands Fund, American Wheelchair Mission, the Grotto of the Redemption, Cherish House, Guatemala Mission, Women of the Well Project, Prison Ministries, as well as to local family, community, and parish needs. Local Knights sponsor annual youth events including the Free Throw Competition, Spelling Bee, Coats for Kids, and the Keep Christ in Christmas Poster Contest.

In 1882, Blessed Michael McGivney, a young parish priest in New Haven, Connecticut, founded the Knights of Columbus to serve the needs of a largely immigrant Catholic community. What began as a small fraternal benefit society has since grown into one of the world's leading international charitable organizations, with more than 1.9 million members in over 16,000 local councils. In the past year Knights provided 285,000 children with winter coats, brought 243 U.S. service members to Lourdes on pilgrimage, and gave more than \$325,000 to the formation of

LETTER TO THE EDITOR

The publisher does not necessarily share the views/opinions stated in the "Letters to the Editor" published in The Lakes News Shopper.

It is disheartening to learn of summer spikes in bacteria at 2/3's of Iowa's state beaches. Iowa is falling far short of managing our nutrient load including nitrite and phosphate runoff from our land and into our waterways. Not to mention, the eroding loss of our topsoil. Iowa's economic engine and the black gold among our natural resources.

Iowa's first in the nation per capita cancer mortality rate (and rising cancer trends) coupled with communities across the State having drinking water perpetually at risk are bad for business and a detriment to recruiting the skilled workforce Iowa needs to be competitive in the world marketplace.

The rhetoric and lack of urgency to address Iowa's water quality remains unchanged since the 1990s. Touting volunteer efforts and collaboration with farmers, landowners and partners conjure up the appearance that we are addressing water quality concerns with vigor. Yet, the water quality crisis continues with

Every Iowan, on or off the farm, has a hand in the water quality problem and a role in the solution. That said, fertilizer, manure and agriculture contamination remain the biggest threats as noted by Sarah Howe of the Iowa Environmental Council.

Speaking as a farmer and landowner and without pointing fingers or playing the blame game, there are simple strategic adjustments that we can implement with our agriculture which will make a material improvement to our water and soil quality.

Cover crops, no-till, prairie strips, buffer strips along our waterways, precision agriculture, converting marginal-unprofitable crop acres to grass and grazing, restoring wetlands all lend to improving water and soil quality. Moreover, there is government funding to support these stewardship practices. In short, a key component of Iowa's water quality fix is a

simple statewide adjustment to our farming practices. We can no longer kick the can down the road...or float it downstream. As Ben Franklin once noted, "when the well is dry, we know the worth of water." The same could be said if the well were

poisoned.

Lakes Area Farmers Market is still open until the end of September. At that time, the marina starts moving boats into the building for winter storage. But some vendors will remain outside into October with a selection of vegetables and other items. Lots of fall vegetables are available at the Farmers Market. Now is the time to get some for use over the winter. Potatoes store for several months in a cool, dry place (not the refrigerator). Winter squash, such as acorn, butternut, and buttercup, also can be stored for several months. Tomatoes can be canned or frozen. Clean and freeze peppers or onions or, store onions in a cool, dry place. Carrots should be refrigerated. Besides vegetables, there is excellent sourdough bread, quick breads and bars, pickles and salsa, jelly, and honey. The farmers Market is located on the fairgrounds in Spirit Lake and is open Wednesday 3:30 to 7:00 PM and Saturday 7:30 AM to 12:00 noon. We hope to see you there.

Chicken Fried Steak Fingers

Veggie oil for frying 2 cups all-purpose flour 2 tablespoons all-purpose steak seasoning, divided cup buttermilk

1 egg 4 pounds beef cube steak

Dipping sauce

1 cup mayo 1/2 cup sour cream

2 tablespoons yellow mustard


1 package dry Italian salad dressing 2 tablespoons dried dill

Preheat oven to lowest temperature. Pour 1 inch oil into a large cast-iron or other thick-bottomed skillet. Turn heat to medium low. Place the flour in a shallow pan. Sprinkle half the steak seasoning over flour, and mix together. Cut steak into 1-inch strips. Add the rest

of the steak seasoning, rubbing into each piece. Turn heat to medium on skillet. Place each strip in the flour mix, then into the milk and egg mix, then back into the flour. Shake off excess and place each strip on a plate. Repeat until all strips are coated. Sprinkle a few drops flour over oil. If it sizzles, it's ready to fry. Using tongs or a fork, place strips side by side in hot oil. Don't crowd the pan, or it will cool the oil. After about 2 to 3 minutes, when strips start to brown on bottom, turn over. When second side is brown, remove and place on a cooling rack that has been set on a cookie sheet. Set the sheet in the preheated oven. Repeat until all fingers are cooked. In a bowl, whisk together all dipping sauce ingredients.

New Laborshed Details Regional Labor Pool

The Iowa Lakes Corridor Development Corporation (Corridor) and Iowa Workforce Development announced the updated "Laborshed" reports for Buena Vista, Clay, Dickinson, and Emmet Counties for 2025.

 $Conducted \, every \, three \, years, the \, ``Laborshed" \, study \, provides$ detailed information about workforce availability, occupations, wages, benefits and commuting patterns. Iowa Workforce Development estimates that there are 121,803 workers in the Corridor "Laborshed," defined as the area or region from which an employment center draws its commuting workers. This is an increase of 5,000 over the 2022 estimate. Data is based on mail surveys of businesses in the region and phone call surveys of residents.

'Workforce data and commuting patterns from the Iowa Workforce Development Laborshed reports are important to both existing businesses and potential industry in the Iowa Lakes Corridor Region," said Corridor President & CEO Curt Strouth. "In our Business Retention & Expansion visits and other conversations with business leadership, workforce is always a topic. Being able to put numbers to these conversations is helpful as we support business and community growth and develop local programming.'

Businesses in the Iowa Lakes Corridor Region draw workers from as far as Brunsville in the west, Fort Dodge in the east, Windom, Minn. to the north and Wall Lake to the south. The employed are currently commuting an average of 12 minutes one way.

Wholesale & Retail Trade is the largest employer industry in the region. Approximately 19,549 people (16.5 percent of the workforce) are employed in Wholesale & Retail Trade, consistent with 16.4 percent reported in 2022. In comparison, the percentage of people employed in healthcare increased from 12.7 percent to 15.8 percent. Other major industries are Manufacturing (11.4 percent of the workforce) and Transportation (8.1 percent).

Among survey respondents, 7.4 percent described themselves as unemployed. This is different than the amount published by the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics, which applies to a stricter definition for unemployment. 63.1 percent of these individuals are likely to accept an employment opportunity, and 1 in 4 employed people say they would be willing to change employment for the right opportunity.
