New superintendent takes helm amid referendum push made, this would only allow



Rick Aulie has come back to his roots as the new superintendent of Crosby-Ironton Schools

Bv ANN SCHWARTZ Rick Aulie, the new superintendent of Crosby-Ironton Schools, took over his new job this summer.

Born and raised in Deerwood, Aulie is a 2003 Crosby graduate. He has lived in Deerwood, Emily and Crosby.

Following high school, he achieved teacher's licenses in k-6 teaching and middle school. He worked as a kin-

dergarten teacher at Riverside Elementary in Brainerd, while he completed graduate education at St. Cloud and Southwest State Universities, enabling him to get principal and superintendent licenses.

He spent the next decade-plus working as a principal in Fosston, MN, and Pine River Backus.

"I have loved the chance to make connections with the schools' students and staff and in the community," Aulie said about what he loves about the job. "I have spent time getting to know businesses and community groups and learning everything the community has to offer our students. I have been able to reconnect with lots of known faces and get to know new faces. I have enjoyed getting to know my school board, their communication styles and what I can do to better serve them and the

Challenges he noted are helping to onboard new principals at CRES Elementary and Crosby-Ironton High School, as well as learning about school finances, the role of the superintendent and the district's strategic plan. "Every day I learn something. I am learning how to set short-term and long term priorities."

He finds it difficult to spend as much time at the elementary school as he would like to.

Aulie and his wife have four children. He likes to golf, run, do yard work and stay busy.

Referendum set

On November 4, Crosby-Ironton School District voters will have the opportunity to vote on a referendum that would bring in \$1.5 million a year for 10 years. Because of the financial constraints and cuts already

them to keep what they have and not do new things, he said. "It would allow us to maintain and sustain what we have."

Polling places will be in Crosby, Deerwood, Emily and Mission. Early voting starts on Friday, Sept. 19. There are many ways to vote early and on the day of the election. There are options at the Crow Wing County Courthouse and by mail.

Previous referendums failed by about 35 votes in 2023 and 517 votes in 2024. Taxes would increase by \$26 a month on a \$400,000 home and \$13 a month on a \$200,000 home.

If the referendum fails, the board will make deep cuts, including canceling online school and college contracts, eliminating five teachers, including Family and Consumer Science, music, high

school science, foreign language and one elementary teacher.

Half of a full-time school counselor and a full time high school custodian would be eliminated.

All curriculum and supply budgets would be frozen.

Sports and activities would not be funded, included football, volleyball, cross-country skiing, tennis, basketball, dance, wrestling, track, baseball, softball and golf, Also cut will be band and choir during the day, Knowledge Bowl, National Honor Society, Prom, robotics, special Olympics, strength and conditioning and yearbook.

Those sports and activities could only continue through fundraising.

Aulie's goal is to be "transparent, clear, consistent and accurate." He returned a phone call immediately for

Superintendent Daniel J. Stifter proudly shared the news, calling the growth "real progress" and a reflection of targeted efforts made by staff, students, and families.

given to students each spring to measure mastery of grade-level standards in math, reading, and science. In 2025, Aitkin had 471 students participate and the district's strategic focus is paying off.

Superintendent Stifter credits several key shifts:

- Targeted support: Increased staffing of licensed Title teachers at Rippleside Elementary.
- Structured study halls, systems of support for the district to make sure that each and every student is getting the correct support in their
- Data-driven instruction: Quarterly data meetings to adjust teaching based on academic progress, attendance, and behavior.
- · Phonics and reading initiatives: New curriculum (UFLI), LETRS training, and expanded instructional time in language arts. With dedicated 120 minutes K-3 and 90 minutes 4-6 for Language Arts instruction.
- Cross-curricular teaching: More integration of vocabulary and nonfiction reading into science and social studies.
- Focused intervention: Small group and individual support tailored to student needs through WIN time ("What I Need Time").
- Strong Tier 1 instruction: Emphasis on high-quality classroom teaching for all students.

"Our intervention process really allows us to focus on each individual learner and what specific skills we can support to promote student growth and raise academic achievement," said Stifter. Looking Ahead: keeping the momentum




