### Tumbleweed Smith

Ronnie Hollar of the panhandle town of Fritch has had a life of hard work and great enjoyment from his leisure time activities like church work, playing in a bluegrass band and delivering food to people who are infirm in their homes. He dropped out of high school, knowing he was about to be drafted so he just joined the Army on his own. He served four

Tumbleweed Smith years in Germany and Viet Nam. During his military years he earned a High School GED. After the service he worked in his dad's bait shop, grocery store and filing station. Later he did construction work building dams and grain elevators. He spent twenty years working in a carbon black plant.

Ronnie has been a musician sine he was a small boy. Both his parents were musicians and encouraged Ronnie to learn to play the guitar and sing. When he was in Viet Nam serving in the Army he obtained a guitar and played it with some buddies. Back home he found some musician friends and they enjoyed getting together and just jamming at somebody's house.

"Then we got to wondering if maybe someone else might want to hear us," says Ronnie, "so we went to a nursing home, played some bluegrass, country and gospel music and the audience loved it. Some even got up and danced. When they first came out some were in wheelchairs and some were asleep. But when we played, they became alert and started singing with us."

Ronnie's group is called The Pickers and have a regular performance schedule now. They belong to a bluegrass association that has two events a year in Amarillo. One in the spring is called the Spring Bloom. The one in October is called Boo Grass. For a while Robbie did solo work at a restaurant, playing and singing.

He had remained friends with some of his buddies from the Viet Nam war. One of them knew that Ronnie hadn't have a diploma from his high school and told him that because he dropped out of school to go to the military, he was eligible to get a diploma. So he went to the principal of Fritch High School and asked the principal if he was eligible to get his diploma. The principal looked into it and asked Ronnie if he would like to be in the next graduation class. Ronnie said yes and bought a cap and gown.

"He asked me where I wanted to be in the group of high school graduates and I told him to just put me in the back," says Ronnie. "But be put me first in line. The diploma had the year I was supposed to graduate, 1964. I was 71 years old when I egraduated with the class of 2016. I was definitely the oldest one in the class."

Ronnie turned out to be the main attraction at the event. "Several of the graduates wanted their picture made with me. When they called my name and I walked across the stag e people stood up and applauded."

His wife and son were in the audience. They stood and clapped with pride.


