Charming park in Tamarack now has pollinator garden

Driving to Duluth, you may notice a charming little park in Tamarack, Minnesota, along Hwy. 210.

Boasting a playground, clean bathrooms, a picnic shelter, open space and more, the park now has a pollinator garden. Such gardens use special plants to attract butterflies and insects which pollinate plants.

Deb Drexler, a retired school teacher from rural

Tamarack, was the impetus behind the project. "I moved to the area in 2017. I love to garden and grow vegetables and flowers. For a couple of years, I wanted to do something for Tamarack."

A Carlton County Master Gardener, Drexler obtained a \$900 grant from Aitkin County's Business Development and Recreation Grant, with matching funds from the Tamarack Activities Club.

She did research on polli-

nator gardens and what type of plants to use. "I thought, with a city park, that we shouldn't use seeds but

She got needed permission from the city council and, with the help of her husband Greg on the fence, located the garden on the eastern edge of the park and surrounded it with the fence. It was completed by late June. There are laminated maps and information for the pub-

lic to read and be educated. "It is a work in progress.

It will take a few years to fill it in, but a couple things did bloom this year. We have to keep it watered and weeded and keep dogs out of it. "My goal was to attract but-

terflies and other pollinators and to educate the public about how they could do this themselves, as I have on my property. I have a pollinator garden and honey bees. Many, many people stop

at this rest stop and hopefully this gives them this something new to look it and they will spend some money in the area."

Crosslake Lutheran Church Jul Fest






