What If Parents Just Listened?

When Elizabeth Barrett Browning wrote, "How do I love thee? Let me count the ways," she may have been writing about her husband, but the phrase resonates with me as a parent. Love is so much more than just a feeling; it's a language we speak every day- and often without a single word.

Sure, sometimes we feel like we should express our love in the form of a gift, a surprise trip, or that fancy tech gadget. Because as many of us know, the wishlists of our children these days can be long. There are other ways we already show how much we care; a cooked meal, helping with homework, taking care of them when they are sick. While these are essential parts of our role as parents, they are often seen as expected duties rather than powerful acts of love.

So, what is not expensive or obligatory, and can possibly make the greatest impact? I believe it's listening. Everyone appreciates a good listener and we are typically drawn to those people. Why is that? Because it makes us feel like someone cares. We feel special when somebody takes the time to stop what they're doing to hear us. It makes us feel important and valuable.

Sure, we might feel like we are listening to our kids. Since their infancy-loud and clear- we've been hearing them; crying means they need something, a tantrum means they want something, a question is often because they need an answer or they are simply bored. But are we really listening? Maybe equally as important- do our kids know when we are or aren't? And when we respond, are we giving them what they really want and need?

While we think we're hearing them, we might not be; at least not to the best of our ability. A common challenge is that we have spent so much time, over so many years, talking to (or at) our kids that we might feel if we aren't talking they probably aren't paying attention. What if they miss something? I hear that

(loud and clear).

The truth? If we are always the ones doing the talking, we are actually the ones missing things. Are we hearing their worries, small victories- their true feelings- and are we following up on those later? Don't fall into that trap that we need to have all the answers. We never will and we don't have to. Sometimes the more we say, the less they hear anyway. Pausing and asking questions is what we should be doing; not only does it take some of the pressure off, but it also opens doors to get to know our children better.

Listening is one of the most powerful ways a parent can express love for a child. Most importantly, it builds trust. When a child knows they have a safe space to share their thoughts and feelings (and we also refrain from snapjudgement responses), they will confide in us more. If we want them to come to us with the big things, we have to prove we can be good with the small ones.

It might be hard to do with so much noise in our lives—including our own anxiety and technology. But simply being present for our children (at any age) is an act of love. The better listener you are, the more your children will talk to you, creating a cycle of solid trust and deeper connection. It's a priceless gift- and one that you will receive in return- no matter how old they are or the miles that set you apart.

It's a testament to the belief that by working together, the Catholic community can create an even stronger future for its children's education.

Two Catholic Schools in Wickliffe, Ohio: Mater Dei and All Saints

At the heart of the LCCSN are two well-established schools in Wickliffe: Mater Dei Academy and All Saints School. While both schools are now part of the same network, they maintain their unique identities

and traditions, offering families distinct, yet equally excellent, Catholic educational experiences.

Mater Dei Academy: A STEM-Designated School

Located on the grounds of Our Lady of Mount Carmel Church and operating since 1955, Mater Dei Academy is an Ohio Department of Education STEM-designated school. It's committed to providing a Christ-centered education that empowers students in pre-kindergarten through eighth grade to grow spiritually, academically, and socially. Mater Dei's philosophy is rooted in teaching doctrine, building community, and serving others. The school is known for its challenging curriculum and emphasis on moral values, preparing students to be compassionate leaders and courageous innovators.

All Saints School:



DID YOU KNOW?

Families have their own reasons for choosing private school over public, and class size may factor into those decisions. According to U.S. News and World Report. the student-to-teacher ratio at private schools in 2021 was 12.5 students per teacher, lower than the average 15.4 at public schools. The National Center for Education Statistics says public schools have an average class size of 25 students, compared to 19 students per class in private schools. ThoughtCo. indicates public school classes can be as large as 25 to 30 students, particularly in urban neighborhoods, while most private schools keep their classes limited to 10 to 15 students. Freemont University reports that students learn faster and perform better in smaller classes. Those in classes with fewer than 20 students often get more individualized attention, participate with greater frequency, and have better communication with the teacher.
