ABOD President's Message — September 30, 2025

Welcome everyone to the Association Board of Directors September 2025 meeting. This is our first evening meeting in an effort to involve more residents who cannot make daytime meetings. Any feedback you would like to give us after the meeting would be helpful in our scheduling future evening Board meetings. It is our intent to do at least one per quarter and our next evening meeting will be Tuesday, December 9.

I would like to thank the many Valle Vista residents who turned out for our town hall last week. Your input and questions were invaluable in helping this Board come to a decision on which approach to take on the sewer project, which will be voted on later in this meeting.

Off topic, I would like to thank Bob Robles, Rob Howe, Jim Hansell and their group for arranging, organizing and pulling off an excellent Villager golf trip to Reno. Almost 50 golfers had a great time golfing, drinking, eating and gambling over four days in Reno. I hope to win some money golfing next year because this year everybody else was just too good.

We have an All-DAC meeting coming up on Monday, October 13 at 6 p.m. The purpose of that meeting is to give everyone an opportunity to hear what is going on with the changes to the CBOD Bylaws. I was selected as a member of the Bylaws Amendment committee, and, at first, I was very much against the main amendment of instituting an initiation fee on new buyers. However, after serving on that committee and putting myself in the position of devil's advocate on that issue and a few others, I have come around to understand why, what will be called a Capital Fund Fee, is necessary. I have asked for this All-DAC meeting in order to present a brief overview of what this committee is doing, why it is necessary and to answer any questions. There will be at least two future town halls on the changes, as well as articles already published and those to be published on this topic. I think it is important all Villagers understand what is being done and why. There are many working parts that need to be updated including the redline version of the Bylaws, changes to two CBOD policies, the CBOD Capital Projects Plan and the fee schedule. All of these will be presented together so the Villagers can see how all this will work. The 5-Year Capital Projects Plan is already posted on the Member Portal and I believe the redline version of the Bylaws was put on the portal yesterday. I have put in more hours than I care to admit reading and re-reading all of these documents so if anyone has any questions or comments, you know who to ask.

Thank you for coming and as usual, my phone, my email and my door are always open and available for questions, comments or discussions.

Club Capital Dues and The Bylaws

Adding a Capital Fund Fee to Club Bylaws will significantly ease Villages financial challenges and reduce future increases in Club Capital Dues.

The Villages needs more income just to maintain the facilities we already have and to pay for any improvements to our various amenities (meeting rooms, restrooms, paths, courts, pools, etc.). To meet this challenge the Club Board is proposing a Capital Fund Fee to be paid by new buyers of Villages homes. The bylaws will be modified to allow a Capital Fund Fee. The actual amount of the fee will be established annually based on need.

This fee will add to our yearly income. Without this income the Club will have to raise money through higher monthly dues, special assessments and/or loans, all of which will be paid by residents. Other HOA communities have similar membership fees.

Adoption of the Capital Fund Fee will necessitate a change in our Club Bylaws. To ensure this is done in an orderly manner, with input from all parties, the Club Board has formed an Ad Hoc Bylaws Committee that will propose Bylaws updates, which will then be subject to a vote by Club Members in early 2026. This process will include meetings with Villagers and a Town Hall-style meeting at Cribari Auditorium on Thursday, November 13 to inform residents and answer questions.

Club Board President's Message— September 30, 2025

Welcome to Autumn! The change in seasons seemed to happen quickly this year. There is a lot happening at The Villages, including several important developments that are taking place behind the scenes.

One major project currently underway is the construction of the Verizon cell tower. This project is expected to significantly improve cell coverage for Verizon customers in our community. Additionally, it will provide a welcome boost in revenue for all Villagers.

We are also exploring new ways to maintain the delivery frequency of *The Villager* while reducing costs. One option under consideration is transitioning from a newspaper to a magazine format. We are still in the process of evaluating this change and hope to have more information to share with you next month.

The wait for our community survey results is almost over. I anticipate being able to share the findings with you soon. As we digest those findings we will propose strategies to address the desires and needs expressed by our residents. Please look for more updates on this important topic in the coming months.

The Bylaws group is nearing completion of its first draft of proposed revisions. We have planned a robust schedule of Town Hall meetings and informal discussion sessions. These gatherings will give everyone the opportunity to ask questions and voice any concerns about the proposed changes.

Change can be difficult, but updating our bylaws is necessary to ensure the well-being of our community. As we discuss these revisions, I have a few requests: please recognize the many hours of hard work the Bylaws working group has devoted to this effort. If you have comments or concerns, I encourage you to be respectful and constructive. Propose vs Oppose. Try to suggest solutions rather than simply opposing any changes. Approaching these discussions with openness and respect will help us have a richer and more productive dialogue.

Laundry room users in Cribari, Montgomery and Hermosa districts will see some changes in November.

CSC Serviceworks, the current laundry room equipment vendor, will replace coin boxes with fully digital payment hardware on all machines. This will reduce vandalism, enable a more reliable digital payment processing experience and offer Villagers a variety of payment options including Apple Pay, Google Pay, Venmo, Pay-Pal, and credit/debit cards. This means Villagers can use an app-One Tap Away or a debit/credit card just as you would in a grocery or other type of store.

Verizon Wireless Tower at The Villages

Construction is underway on a new 70-foot "monopine" cellular tower and related equipment yard inside the Golf Maintenance Yard. The tower will be unmanned, fully fenced and camouflaged to resemble a pine tree.

The Villages and Verizon Wireless have executed a Land Lease Agreement granting Verizon the right to install and operate the communications facility.

- Initial Term: Five years, commencing on the first day of the month after Verizon begins installation.
- Extensions: Automatically renews for two additional 5-year terms, unless Verizon provides notice to terminate, for a potential total of 15 years guaranteed, with the ability to extend further to a maximum of 35 years.
- Base Rent: \$21,600 per year (\$1,800 per month), payable monthly in advance.

Standard annual rent escalators apply (per lease schedule). This rent provides unrestricted income to the Club.

Additional Benefits

- Improved Cell Service—Stronger Verizon 4G/5G coverage throughout The Villages, including homes, golf course and common areas.
- Emergency Reliability—A35kW generator and 500-gallon propane tank will maintain service during PG&E outages.
- No Resident Expense—Verizon pays all construction, permitting, utilities, and maintenance.
- San Jose Planning approved the project in the winter of 2025. Installation is now underway with service activation expected in the fall of 2026.

The Verizon lease delivers \$21,600 in annual rent with automatic 5-year renewals, providing a stable new revenue stream and enhanced wireless service—all at no cost to Villagers—while remaining discreetly located in the Golf Maintenance Yard.

Changes in the Standard Tax Deduction

How the New Deduction affects You

The federal standard deduction represents the amount of income you can exclude from taxes. You have probably heard about new legislation that might positively impact what you owe, starting with the 2025 tax year.

The standard deduction for 2025 for filers under age 65 is now \$15,750 for single filers and \$31,500 for filers who are married filing jointly (MFJ). For filers aged 65 and over it is \$17,350 for single filers and \$34,700 for MFJ.

In addition, for years 2025 through 2028, the following "bonus" deduction amounts will apply for filers aged 65 and over whether they use the standard deduction or itemize deductions. Single filers with taxable income of \$75,000 or less will have an additional \$6,000 added to their deduction. For MFJ filers the additional deduction amount is \$12,000 if your taxable income is \$150,000 or less.

If your taxable income is more than the \$75,000 and \$150,000 limits, you may still be eligible for a partial "bonus" deduction. Below are two examples of how to calculate your personal deduction amount. The examples are for a single filer with \$100,000 in taxable income, and an MFJ filer with \$200,000 in taxable income. The basic formula applies in all cases:

Single: Subtract \$75,000 from the \$100,000 leaving \$25,000. When you multiply the \$25,000 overage by 6% you get \$1,500, and subtract that from the \$6,000 bonus. The remainder is your actual bonus deduction amount of \$4,500.

MFJ: Subtract \$150,000 from \$200,000 leaving \$50,000. When you multiply the \$50,000 overage by 6% you get \$3,000, and subtract that from the \$12,000 bonus. The remainder is your actual bonus deduction amount of \$9,000.

If your taxable income is usually stable, and you're curious about how this change will impact your tax obligation for 2025, you might want to pull out your 2024 tax return and do a sample

How the New Deduction affects Social Security's Financial Stability

Unlike most income tax revenue, which flows into the general U.S. Treasury, taxes on benefits go into Social Security's two trust funds, one for retirement and survivor benefits and one for disability benefits. In 2024, those taxes added \$55.1 billion to Social Security's coffers.

But that represented only about 4 percent of the program's total revenue, which comes mainly om payroll taxes assessed on U.S. workers and their employers. However, reducing it would still have an impact on the trust funds, which are projected to run short of money in 2034 unless Congress acts to shore up Social Security's finances. If nothing is changed and that happens, benefits would have to be cut by about 19 percent, according to the latest annual report from Social Security's trustees.

But that's only when you look at the two trust funds combined. The trustees project that the fund for retirement and survivor benefits, which faces the most significant gap, will run short in 2033. The Committee for a Responsible Federal Budget, a nonpartisan fiscal policy think tank, estimates that the new deduction and other provisions of the reconciliation bill will accelerate that fund's insolvency by a year, to 2032.


Rich James for a program entitled "Floral Focus: How to Capture Stunning Flower and Fungi Images with Any Camera."




A new flavor joins Global Village Healthy Eating class

PICKLEBALL

Evolution of Equipment

This week, we continue with more pickleball history.


Wooden Paddles (1965-1980s): Early players used homemade plywood paddles. Heavy, stiff, and unforgiving, they made soft shots difficult but encouraged power play.

Fiberglass & Nomex Paddles (1984–1990s): In 1984, Arlen Paranto, a Boeing engineer, created the first composite paddle using fiberglass and Nomex. This innovation replaced heavy wooden paddles, increased ball speed and control, and helped propel pickleball toward modern professional play.

Graphite & Polymer Core Paddles (2000s-present): Modern paddles use graphite or carbon fiber faces with polymer cores, combining lightness, responsiveness, and power. These paddles are now standard in professional play.

Balls: Early balls were ordinary Wiffle balls. Today, balls are engineered for indoor and outdoor play, with varying hole patterns and materials to optimize bounce, speed, and spin.

This equipment evolution has not only improved performance but also made the sport accessible to a wider age range and skill level.

Let's All Get Together Now—Be a part of our "Culture of Care" and follow these simple Golf Course Etiquette Guidelines...We can all participate in keeping our golf course beautiful by observing these *nine* simple acts of care:

- 1. Follow the 90-degree rule (longer hitters) or the Entrance Gates (shorter hitters) when entering the fairway
- 2. Drive the cart from shot to shot keeping the cart in the fairway as you play the hole... please avoid driving in the rough as much as possible to maintain the integrity of the rough
- 3. Do not drive within 30-feet of the greens defined by the yellow painted ground lines in front of each green
- 4. *Exit* every hole through the **exit gates** please do not drive on the mounding around the greens and proceed

from hole to hole using the cart paths

- 5. Respect any roping, cart directional signs and Ground Under Repair
- 6. Fill all divots with sand mix
- 7. Repair pitch marks on the greens
- 8. Smooth out the sand in the bunkers with the bunker rake and return the rake at a right angle to bunker edge placing the head of the rake in the sand and the handle of the rake on the bunker edge. Do your best to push the rake instead of pulling the rake ...we don't want the new sand to build up on the edges of the bunkers.
 - 9. Knock the sand off your shoes before walking on the green

Let's all make it a goal to leave our golf course in better shape than we found it, every time we play.

Tips from the Pro-Step by Step

Every golfer seeks more consistency. A consistent Pre-Shot set up routine will help create consistent play. Just look at the PGA and LPGA Tour stars and you can see that they have a consistent pre-shot routine before every shot. It helps to narrow your focus, eliminate distractions, strategize the shot, focus on a specific target and maintain a smooth and consistent rhythm and cadence for each shot. Strive to repeat the same sequence of how you set up for each shot.

Here are some simple steps to follow before each golf shot to attain more consistency – A Pre-Shot Routine:

- 1. Take a deep breath and RELAX
- 2. Stand BEHIND your ball and pick a specific target and landing spot
- 3. Pick an intermediate target that is 2-5 feet in front of your ball and is directly in line with our target
- 4. Set the clubface first behind the ball aiming at your target
- 5. Build your grip...be sure to recheck your clubface and target line
- 6. Set your feet and stance be sure that you are comfortable
- Waggle the club to maintain relaxed hands and arms and to enhance your FEEL
 One last target check...then SWING

Two More quick tips:

- 1. When addressing the golf ball in preparation for the shot, your focus should be on your target more than on your swing
 - 2. Always think one shot ahead to avoid high numbers
- 3. Think about the conditions of the shot and NOT your swing mechanics Let us know if these tips help... To sign up for a lesson with me, email ssteele@the-villages.com

'Apron, Tablet, and Stoking Faith'

When General Manager Theresa Ostrander joined The Villages, she referenced the "shelf of Strategic Plan binders" in her office. With wry smiles, we nodded. Spanning over 700 years, to-

day's readings lay out a plan, a process, and a hope that also binds the 2023-2031 Pastoral Plan for the Diocese of San Jose.

In the first reading from the distressed prophet Habak-kuk, written about 612 BCE, the Lord counsels Habakkuk, "Write the vision clearly upon the tablets, so that one can read it readily. For the vision still has its time... and will not disappoint; if it delays, wait for it, it will surely come..." (Hab.2:2). Almost 700 years later in Luke, 17:5-10, Jesus urges his apostles to stoke their faith and continue to build the Kingdom of God. "Put on your apron...do all you have been commanded." (Luke 17:8, 10). In the second reading

of Paul to Timothy (2 Tim.1:6-8, 13-14), the imprisoned evangelist exhorts the younger Bishop Timothy to remember the faith of his grandmother Lois and mother Eunice and "Guard this rich trust [in the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus] with the help of the Holy Spirit that dwells within us." (2Tim:1:14)

Like Habakkuk, the Diocesan team under the leadership of Bishop Oscar Cantu, with consultation offered to all in the Diocese, created the Pastoral Plan. They wrote it large, so it can be easily read. The primary goal of the Pastoral Plan is Spiritual Renewal for the People of God in the Diocese of San Jose. Bishop Cantu defines spiritual renewal as "as the opening of our hearts and minds to God on a regular basis so that the Holy Spirit can work in our lives. We can see the Holy Spirit at work when we perceive the fruits of the Holy Spirit. [These are] charity, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, generosity, gentleness, faithfulness, modesty, self-control, chastity."

To nurture this fruit, the Pastoral Plan focuses on six strategic priorities:

- Worship: To provide reverent and joyful worship experiences that deepen our connection to Christ and His people
 - Outreach: To be Christ to everyone we meet
 - Formation: To invigorate the formation of missionary disciples
- Youth and Young Adults: To understand and engage young people and to cultivate young leaders for our church and our world.
 - Family Ministry: To make Christ the center of family life
- Structural Renewal: To build a sustainable future in support of the mission of the diocese. In reflecting on these priorities, pray today's refrain: If today you hear his voice, harden not your heart. (Ps.95). -Please be advised that BellaVista Landscape Services is scheduled to begin application treatment in Olivas 9/29, Valle Vista 9/30, and Highland 10/01. During the provided hours please stay off the turf from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. In order to complete these treatments please practice extra caution and stay off the lawn and keep your pets secure.

Signage will be placed on lawns and notices have been sent via FastNews as well. Grubs are the larvae of beetles, commonly Japanese beetles or June bugs, that live in the soil and feed on grass roots. This feeding can damage turf by causing brown patches, thinning grass, and attracting animals like raccoons and birds that dig the lawn up to eat the grubs. Grub infestations often go unnoticed until significant damage has occurred—many areas of The Villages have been affected in the past. Earlier this summer, BellaVista Landscaping proactively treated the entire community to preserve the health and appearance of the community's turf. The goal was to ensure the turf root system remained strong, the lawn stays lush and green, and the overall landscape remains attractive and resilient throughout the season. This initial treatment was largely successful. However, BellaVista and management have identified the need for an additional treatment for grubs in Village Highland. Village Olivas, and Village Valle Vista.

In defense of our high HOA dues... Yes, I get buyers that have a hard time swallowing the cost of our monthly dues. Here is my answer to them. Take a 2,300-square-foot Olivas property that sells for 1.5-1.6 million and see that this same size house would sell for 2.1 -2.5 million outside, because of the local schools driving the price. You can see that the money you saved in here, can pay for many years of HOA dues. Plus, you get the benefits of the amenities The Villages has, less house and yard maintenance and more free time to have adult fun and activities. It truly pencils out.
