THE MARATHON, TEXAS MARATHON



Tumbleweed Smith

I'm always amazed at the talent I find in small towns. Marci Roberts of Marathon plays piano and does other things.

"I'm an architect and interior designer. I had a business in Austin, worked in New York City five years working on big commercial projects. Here in Marathon, I started a grocery store after the only one in town closed. I started a health

Tumbleweed Smith center here."

She is married to Big Bend Photographer James Evans and designed a gallery for him on Marathon's Main Street. The community has had a marathon race since 2003. It's known as M2M. Marci got involved with that and when the director quit in 2011, Marci took it over. It has become Marathon's biggest event.

"I took it on as my own business and grew it from a hundred racers to 500 racers. Last year we had seven countries and twenty-six states represented. And I don't do any marketing. It's all word of mouth. I don't know how it happened. My idea was to give racers the best experience they ever had at a race. And I wanted our little town of 400 people to all come together for this one race. My idea was to disperse all the money back into the community. Because at that time we would have fund raisers but it was really bake-sales and small events. Local ranchers helped but I wanted outside money to come in and help us. That was the whole impetus for that."

Racers pay a fee to enter. For the full 26.2 miles race, the entry fee is \$130. The half marathon, 13.1 miles, is \$120. The 10K is \$70, the 5K is \$60. Racers register at marathon2marathon.com.

"We bus them to the various starting points north on Highway 385. They all come to the same finish line at the Community Center."

This year the race is Saturday October 25, it's really a celebration that starts the Wednesday before. A famous chef prepares meals and there are all sorts of things going on.

"We have a pasta dinner Friday night that you can pay for, then we have a barbeque lunch at the finish line. Everybody is having lunch at the finish line watching the racers come in, then we have the awardees party afterwards. That's really wonderful."

Racers get t-shirts and all kinds of trinkets. The prizes to the winners are impressive.

"We are known for our belt buckles. We have these amazing carved buckles and we give six of them out. They go to first and second full marathon male and female and the first male and female in the half marathon. And there are other prizes like a pendant or money clip."

Proceeds from the race go to the chamber, the library, the health center, fire station and other things in the community.


