



EATING OUT? YOU'RE SPENDING MORE THAN YOU THINK

Dear Dave.

What's one unique step you took at any point in your life to save money that anyone is capable of doing if they put their mind to it? Jeff

Dear Jeff,

As I always say, living on a written, monthly budget is a key factor in getting out of debt, staying out of debt and saving money. As for a "unique" step we took to save money maybe it wasn't that unique — but after going broke, we stopped eating out at restaurants. I mean completely. No pizza nights and no drive-thrus. Not even little things off the value menu. During the work week, we ate breakfast



and dinner at home, and for lunch, I brown-bagged it. Every. Single. Day. On weekends, we ate all three meals at home both days. Nothing fancy, just good, simple food.

And it made a huge difference. Most folks don't realize how much money they spend eating out. A quick breakfast here, a fastfood lunch there ... it'll drain your bank account fast if you're not careful. But when you're broke, you're broke. You've got to look at that person you see in the mirror every morning and admit it. Then, you have to start living like it.

In other words, stop acting rich when you're broke. That means doing basic, common sense things like I said earlier. Cut down on your spending, and learn to live on a written, monthly budget — one where every dollar is accounted for and has a job to do — before the month begins. Otherwise, you're just digging yourself deeper and deeper into a financial hole.

Anybody can take control of their finances once they become intentional about changing their behavior with money and motivated changing about their lives. Then, when you've gotten control of your money, you can go out and celebrate with a really nice steak dinner. But until then, if you're struggling financially, the only time you should see the inside of a restaurant is if you're working there.
To make money.

To get out of debt. And save!







Medicare Minute Value of a Local Agent

If you are turning 65 soon, coming off employer coverage, or vou are in Medicare's Annual Enrollment Period, you will find that there are many ways to sign up for your 2026 Medicare health or drug plan. You can enroll online, enroll over the phone, have a non-insurance person help you enroll or you can enroll in your plan through a local insurance agent that is certified to offer Medicare plans.

If you want to deal directly with a particular insurance company you can do that online or over the phone. All insurance companies now have a website and toll free number to call. Some people feel as though they need help in choosing a plan. They will call on a friend, family member or non-insurance person to help them. All three of these methods are perfectly acceptable under Medicare guidelines. If you choose to enroll without the help of an insurance agent it will be up to you to read and understand the plan's summary of benefits, assure that the doctors, hospitals and pharmacies you want to use are in the plan's network and make sure your drugs are covered on the plan's drug formulary.

There's an important question you'll want to ask yourself; "If I have a problem with my plan can the person helping me enroll go to the insurance company on my behalf to help me solve it?" If the answer is "no" then you will be on your own to deal with the company. Your local insurance agent must be appointed by the company they enroll you with. Therefore, if you have a problem with your plan the agent that enrolled you can go to the company on your behalf. Next week we will look specifically at the value of a local agent and how an agent earning a commission can actually be a good thing for you!!

Stop Fleecing the Regular Workers

"Rather than letting billionaires like Elon Musk put practically none of massive incomes into' Social Security, Jim Hightower writes at CounterPunch, them pay Social Security taxes exactly like regular workers do.

As is always nearly the when discussing case Social Security, there's quite a bit to unpack, let's start

congratulating Hightower on the fulfillment of his wish, long before he even

expressed it:

Social Security exactly like regular workers do. Regular workers

workers 12.4% half directly and half theoretically their employers, from but thereby reducing the money available for wages -- in Social Security tax on every dollar of income they earn up to \$176,000.

Elon Musk and other billionaires also pay 12.4% in Social Security tax on every dollar of income they earn up to \$176,000.

\$176,000 isn't the only Social Security There's also a maximum benefit amount. Elon Musk and other billionaires, just like regular workers, can potentially receive a maximum monthly payout of \$5,108 if they wait until the age of 70 to retire.

Hightower doesn't really want to treat Elon Musk just like a regular worker. He wants Musk to pay more, without receiving a commensurate increase in return, so as to subsidize the retirements of those regular workers.

He wants, in the common parlance, to "redistribute wealth," in the form of retirement income. Social Security already

does that, but in a different direction: It forces black men to subsidize the retirements white of women.

average expectancy of a black man in America is 68 years, which means that the black man who doesn't retire early receives a whopping one year of Social Security checks before shuffling off this mortal coil. Kind of a raw deal, huh?

The average life expectancy of a white woman in America is 81.1 years, which means white even the that woman who works to the maximum retirement age of 70 receives more than 11 years of those payments. Sweet deal, huh?

To add insult to injury, the labor participation rate of white women is lower than that of black men -in part because our culture still encourages "oneincome households" after marriage with the man "breadwinner" white women work fewer vears before retirement, but enjoy more years after retirement, at the financial expense of black men.

If Hightower merely

suggested reversing ot wealth of the flow redistribution bottom-up to top-down -- I'd still call shenanigans, but he instead characterizes the Social Security Ponzi scheme as "an egalitarian effort to provide a decent retirement for all," which it isn't now and never has been.

The best thing to do with Social Security, if "decent retirements" is the goal and, more importantly, if individual freedom and choice are the criteria -- is eliminate it.

"Regular workers" and their households earn an average annual return on their involuntary Social Security "investment" of 1.23%. Actually investing that 12.4% of income in an S&P 500 indexed mutual

fund produces an average annual return of 10%.

Instead of taxing the multi-billionaires more. tax everyone at 0% and let the market make them prosperous.



• On Oct. 13, 1773, French anti-discrimination laws protecting LGBTQ people.
• On Oct. 15, 1864, the world's first successful combat submarine, the H.L. Hunley, went down in Charleston Harbor during a demo run, killing its inventor and namesake along with seven crew members. The vessel was recovered and performed its only successful mission the following year when it sank the Yankee ship Housatonic, but sank again, taking its third ill-fated crew with it. Raised again in 2000, it is currently on exhibit in

Charleston.
• On Oct. 16, 1964, after conducting a successful nuclear test, China became the fifth nation with atomic bomb capability, after the United States, the Soviet Union, Great Britain and France.

• On Oct. 17, 1985, magicians Penn & Teller notably responded to "Late Night" host David Letterman's invitation to "surprise" him on their next appearance on his show by unleashing hundreds of cockroaches from a top hat onto his desk. While Letterman was unsurprisingly hardly pleased, he later admitted the stunt made "great TV." • On Oct. 18, 1974, singer

Al Green was attacked by his former girlfriend, Mary Woodson, in his Memphis home while taking a bath. Woodson dumped a pot of scalding grits on his back before retreating to a bedroom where she killed herself with Green's gun.

• On Oct. 19, 1994, Jesse Timmendequas was charged with killing 7-yearold Megan Kanka in New Jersey. The crime inspired Megan's Law, a statute requiring that information about convicted sex felons be made available to the public. Versions of Megan's Law have been passed in many states since her death.

• On Oct. 20, 1967, the mythical Bigfoot was believed to have been filmed in northern California, firing the imaginations of numerous enthusiasts. However, when a prominent researcher sent the FBI a supposed hair sample, agents concluded that it was, sadly, of "deer family origin.'

• On Oct. 21, 1797, the USS Constitution launched in Boston Harbor. A 44-gun U.S. Navy frigate, it was constructed to fight Barbary pirates off the coast of Tripoli, and performed admirably during those conflicts. In 1805, a peace treaty with Tripoli was signed on the Constitution's deck.

• On Oct. 22, 1895, a train with a faulty brake tore through the Gare Montparnasse in Paris and out the front before landing nose down in the street. Onlookers purchased train tickets just to see the

• On Oct. 23, 1958, Boris Pasternak was awarded the Nobel Prize for Literature for "Doctor Zhivago," a romance set during the Russian Revolution and World War I. The book was banned in the

Soviet Union, and the Soviet government forced Pasternak to renounce the honor, but his admirers smuggled the manuscript out of Russia in pieces and the CIA helped with distribution behind the scenes. Appearing in numerous translations around the world, it was hailed as a classic, but Pasternak was banished from the Soviet Writers Union, ending his literary career.

• On Oct. 24, 1921, in the French town of Chalonssur-Marne, an American sergeant chose the body of the first "Unknown Soldier" to be honored among the approximately 77,000 American servicemen who died on the Western Front during World War I.

 On Oct. 25, 1964. Minnesota Vikings star defensive end Jim Marshall ran 66 yards in the wrong direction into his own end zone after recovering a fumble against the 49ers in San Francisco, Despite the gaffe, the Vikings won.

• On Oct. 26, 1984, 19-year-old John McCollum was found shot to death on



How to Stave Off Cognitive Decline as You Age

Dear Savvy Senior,

Are there any proven strategies to preventing cognitive decline? I have a family history of dementia and worry about my own memory and cognitive abilities as I grow older.

Forgetful at 55

Dear Forgetful,

For most people, starting in their fifties and sixties, the brain's ability to remember names, multi-task or learn something new starts declining. While our genes (which we can't control) play a key role in determining our cognitive aging, our general health (which we do have some control over) plays a big factor too.

Here are some healthy lifestyle strategies – recommended by medical experts - you can employ that can help stave off cognitive loss and maybe even build a stronger brain.

Manage health problems: Studies have shown that cognitive problems are related to health conditions, like diabetes, heart disease and even depression. So, if you have high blood pressure, high cholesterol or diabetes you need to treat them with lifestyle changes and medication (if necessary) and get them under control. And if you have a history of depression, talk to your doctor about treatment options.

Exercise: Aerobic exercise increases blood flow to all parts of your body, including your brain, to keep the brain cells well nourished. So, choose an aerobic activity you enjoy like walking, cycling, dancing, swimming, etc., that elevates your heart rate and do it for at least 30 to 40 minutes three times a week.

Eat healthy: A heart-healthy diet, like the Mediterranean diet, will also help protect the brain. A Mediterranean diet includes relatively little red meat and emphasizes whole grains, fruits and vegetables, fish and shellfish, and nuts, olive oil and other healthy fats. Also keep processed foods and sweets to a

Get plenty of sleep: Quality, restful sleep contributes to brain health too. Typically, adults should get between seven and nine hours of sleep daily. If you have persistent problems sleeping, you need to identify and address the problem. Medications, late-night exercise and alcohol can interfere with sleep quality and length, as can arthritis pain, sleep apnea and restless leg syndrome.

If you need help, make an appointment with a sleep specialist who will probably recommend an overnight diagnostic sleep test.

Challenge your mind: Some research suggests that mind challenging activities can help improve memory, and slow age-related mental decline. But be aware that these activities consist of things you aren't accustomed to doing. In other words, crossword puzzles aren't enough to challenge your brain, if you're already a regular puzzle doer. Instead, you need to pick up a new skill like learning to dance, play a musical instrument, study a new language or do math problems - something that's

challenging and a little outside your comfort zone.
Brain-training websites like Lumosity, Elevate and Peak are good mind exercising tools because they continually adapt to your skill level to keep you challenged.

Socializing and interacting with other people is another important way to stimulate the brain. So, make a point to reach out and stay connected to friends, family and neighbors. Join a club, take a class or even volunteer - anything that enhances your social life.

Don't smoke or drink: Smoking and regular alcohol consumption both effect the brain in a negative way, so kick the habit if you smoke and, if you drink, do so only occasionally.

Check your eyes and ears: A growing body of evidence shows that vision and hearing loss, which affects brain stimulation, can also increase the risk of cognitive decline. So, get your eyes and ears checked regularly and treat any issues promptly.

Reduce stress: Some stress is good for the brain, but too much can be toxic. There's evidence that things like mindfulness meditation, yoga and tai chi are all good ways to help reduce


