

Leighton Grant Alabama. for Hydrants

MONTGOMERY -Gov. Kay Ivey last week announced a \$90,000

Appalachian Regional Commission grant for the town of Leighton to upgrade the town's fire hydrants and other water system components to ensure effectiveness in the event of a fire, particularly in the downtown district.

Property Damage Claims

Virtually all automobile accident cases involve a claim for property damage. I'm not a fan of the way that insurance companies treat property damage claims.

There are some things you should know. First, if your car is a total loss, they will only pay for a rental car up the day or so after the total loss offer is made. If your airbags went off, your car will be a total loss, and you might as well start shopping.

Rental cars create a problem of their own because what the insurance company allows on a daily rate and what the rental car companies charge, by the time you get all the charges people end up owing money than is allowed and may not be in a great position to pay at that time.

When a car is a total loss, the insurance company offer is supported by other similar vehicles and their value. What I mean is that the insurance company does a comparison of similar cars and come up with a value for what your car was worth. You may disagree, but do not disagree and pay storage fees. Have the car moved to your house if you're going to argue. I have seen people argue over a few hundred or a thousand dollars while the wrecked car sits in storage at \$40 a day. I had one case that was over \$1,100.00 difference in the value of the car, but the argument lasted for nearly 400 days before they came to see me. By that time, the \$1,100.00 was small potatoes.

If you do not have the title to your car because there is a loan on your car, the insurance company will have to pay the lienholder (the company that made the loan and has the title) if the car is totaled. If the car is damaged, they can pay to have it repaired but not if the cost of repair exceeds 75% of the value of the vehicle.

What I think most people don't stop to consider is that a car or truck is something that is used up. Every time a car is driven, some of it is gone. Accountants use the term depreciation. Depreciation is the accounting term that uses a decrease in value to account for the decrease in value that all cars experience as they are used. Obviously, a car with 5,000 miles is worth more than a car with 100,000 miles on it. Often loans don't match the depreciation and the difference between what the car is worth and what you owe is what you get. Often this is not as much as people wanted or even enough to pay off the car.

If you traded in a car that was paid for or made a large down payment or simply just got a good deal, you'll have money left over after the insurance company pays you. On the other hand, if you didn't make a large down payment and you use your car a lot and run the mileage up to and from work, school and every errand that we have to run, you may find yourself with a gap in coverage and might consider GAP coverage, which is often available at the time of purchase and will pay the difference between what's owed and what's paid. Thirty years ago, I never thought it was a good idea but I'm seeing longer loans and higher depreciation and now think it is a valid consideration.

FIRST PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH (1818)

The Presbyterians organized the first church in Florence and purchased this property from the Cypress Land Company in 1818. A sanctuary was erected here in 1824. James L. Sloss, an early Alabama Territory missionary, was installed as the church's first permanent pastor in 1830. Although the church buildings have undergone several major expansions and renovations, the present sanctuary occupies the site of the 1824 building — the "mother church" of Florence. The congregation in 1968 decided to remain an urban church and to continue its historical presence in the heart of Florence.

Sure, Hamas gave up much of its leverage in hostages, but I am not convinced they know the whereabouts of even 10 of the 28 corpses that are also meant to be returned. None of the female corpses will remain intact, lest the militants risk being exposed for sexual crimes. They are now claiming rubble is hindering progress in retrieving the bodies. They can play on this for years.

Yet, Hamas and the

Palestinian people will come out winners if they continue to abide by the terms of the ceasefire. Hamas members and civilians will stop dying, they will have their area rebuilt to the tune of hundreds of billions in international aid, and they can have a peace that few alive in that region have experienced. They will also have their honest share of the food shipments instead of rations being diverted away from the populous areas so Israel can be accused of genocide, a preposterous accusation from the outset.

Studies confirmed by various humanitarian organizations indicate that a net total of over 470,000 metric tons of food was supplied to Gaza in the seven month period from January-July 2025 (Adjusted for projected food loss and spoilage), enough for every man, woman, and child to ingest about 3,000 calories per day.

However, timely and equitable distribution was nonexistent-for whatever reasons.)

My primary concern is the prisoner /hostage exchange ratio of 197-to-1, with most of the prisoners classified as hardened criminals and war detainees. Over 140 of the 1,968 were to scheduled to be deported abroad, about 100 relocated into the West Bank through East Jerusalem and three into Gaza. The other 1,700? Who knows?

You can bet your backside, most will be armed, and the U.S. will still be viewed as "The Great Satan." Militant Islamic factions here and abroad will still bring their children up to hate infidels, mistreat women in society, and destroy Christians and Jews.

The ceasefire/peace treaty not withstanding and with all due respect to the families of the hostages and prisoners on both sides, I am not sure how the world is a safer place with almost 2,000 Palestinian criminals back in society. At least 200 of those criminals were convicted terrorists doing life.

If we are honest, it's been common knowledge for many years that if militant Islam put down its weapons and said "no more," there would be a permanent peace in the region; If Israel put down its weapons and said, "no more," it would quickly be obliterated.


We know there will be renegade actions from time to time from those who do not agree on this arbitrary ceasefire that some elected representative, who is far removed from the situation, brokered from across the world.

President Trump proclaimed an end to the war during his speech to the Israeli parliament in Jerusalem. However, Israel and Hamas have not agreed on the next series of crucial steps in Gaza.







My wife and I recently learned she's pregnant. She's about to begin her second trimester, and we're both really excited. There is a bit of concern, though. During a detailed ultrasound, the doctor found an issue that might mean our baby could need minor surgery soon after delivery. Financially, we're in Baby Step 2 of your plan. With the extra bills after the baby's born, should we save money in a sinking fund for the added expenses while we continue paying off debt?

Dear Jared, Congratulations on the new baby! I know you're both probably on an emotional rollercoaster



right now, what with the pregnancy and the possibility of surgery for your little one. Make sure you pray and hug on each other a lot in the days ahead, okay? Doctors can do all kinds of incredible things, but including God in any equation is a good idea.



Medicare Minute Value of a Local Agent 2

A local agent can be a valuable asset to you when signing up for a Medicare Plan. Any agent offering Medicare plans must be licensed by the State of Alabama, appointed by the insurance companies they represent and go through an annual certification required by Medicare. If an agent does not have these qualifications they cannot offer Medicare Advantage or Prescription Drug Plans. This is a good thing because you, the consumer, can be assured that your agent has been completely vetted. This includes proof of citizenship and background

Your local agent must also go through training courses with the insurance companies they represent. These courses are designed to assure that the agents have a complete understanding of the plans they are offering. Medicare Advantage and Prescription Drug Plans can be complicated because they have premiums, copays, deductibles and a specific provider network. Knowledge of what you are enrolling in is crucial.

Because if a person makes a commission for enrolling you, that person can go to the insurance company on your behalf if you have a problem.
