



On Tuesday, November 4, voters in the Aitkin Public School District will face a decision that could shape the future of education and community life for generations to come.

The two-question bond referendum on the ballot is the result of years of planning. Since 2016, the Aitkin School Board has been studying the condition of its facilities, listening to residents, and weighing every possible option. Now, the time has come

The first question proposes a \$59.44 million investment to build a new PreK-6 school to replace Rippleside Elementary, along with a new transportation center to replace the current bus garage. The second question proposes an additional \$6 million to build a community wellness and recreation center, which would be attached to the new school and open to residents of all ages.

The urgency behind this plan is clear. Rippleside faces serious health and safety concerns that go far beyond cosmetic fixes. With core parts of the building nearing 70 years old, the building suffers from poor air quality, outdated classrooms, failing infrastructure, and accessibility issues. Its roof and boiler systems are deteriorating, and the bus garage is located near a railroad and an oil company.

A new PreK-6 school would be more than just a fresh start - it would be

support young learners. The proposed design includes secure entrances, ADA-compliant access, modern HVAC systems, and classrooms tailored to modern teaching methods, including space for group work, personalized learning, and special education services.

While the high school also needs attention, the board has prioritized the elementary school as the district's most urgent need. Importantly, the new school's design would allow for a potential future high school and unified campus. In addition, the district has worked closely with MnDOT to ensure that, if the referendum passes, Highway 169 improvements will make the new school safe and ac-

Even for those without children in school, this project carries wide-reaching benefits. Strong schools attract families, help local businesses, and improve property values. The wellness center would offer a shared space for fitness, recreation, and tion would bring jobs and economic activity.

If the referendum fails, the district will lose a rare \$5 million grant from the IRRRB - funds that are only available for this specific project. Rippleside's problems will persist and grow more costly, forcing the district to spend limited resources on emergency fixes rather than solutions.

Early voting is already underway, and Election Day (Nov. 4) is approaching fast. For details on how to vote, visit WeAreAitkin.org/vote. If both questions pass, the estimated monthly tax increase would be about \$19 for a \$175,000 home and \$38 for a \$300,000 home. Future Hwy. 210 project from Crosby to Deerwood open house Oct. 29

The Minnesota Department stop by at their convenience in 2028. Construction is slatof Transportation (MnDOT) is inviting the public to an open house-style event to learn more about an upcoming construction project on Highway 210 (also known as Highway 6) between Crosby and Deerwood.

The open house will take place on Wednesday, October 29, from 4 to 6 p.m. at Deerwood City Hall/Auditorium, located at 23770 Forest Road. This informal event will not feature a formal presentation. Instead, attendees can to view project layouts, ask questions, and interact with members of the MnDOT project team.

What's planned for the proj-

The project, which is expected to unfold in phases, will involve significant updates to both the road surface and infrastructure between Crosby and Deerwood. The preliminary design work for the project will continue through 2027, followed by final design and traffic plans ed to begin in 2029, and a detour will be required during that time.

Here's a breakdown of the improvements that are planned:

Crosby to Deerwood

Resurfacing of Highway 210: From east of Third Avenue East in Crosby to East Broadway in Deerwood, and from Ruggles Avenue to east of Highway 6 in Deerwood.

Drainage Updates: Repairing or replacing drainage pipes and ditches.

Road Safety Enhancements: Installation of pavement markings and rumble/mumble strips, along with guardrail upgrades or replacements.

Deerwood

Reconstruction of Road Surface: The stretch from East Broadway to Ruggles Avenue, including the intersection of Highway 210/Highway 6 and Crow Wing County Road 12, will undergo significant reconstruction.

Stormwater Infrastructure: Replacement or repair of underground stormwater structures, curbs, and gutters.

Pedestrian Upgrades: New or updated sidewalks, pedestrian approaches, and crossings to enhance safety for foot traffic.


