The Lakes Area Food Shelf announced Monday, Oct.

27, that it plans to open a new branch to serve the Brainerd and Baxter communities — expanding its reach at a time when more families are feeling the

pinch of food insecurity.

The announcement comes as food shelves across Minnesota brace for an expected surge in de-

mand, with federal food assistance programs like SNAP and WIC temporarily halted due to the government shutdown.

Leaders of the Pequot Lakes-based organization said the expansion decision grew from months of conversations with Brainerd Lakes Area nonprofits working to address rising local hunger. According to the food shelf's data, nearly 200 households served each month come from Brainerd and Baxter, compared to about 120 from Pequot Lakes. For many of those families, that means a round trip of 50 miles or more just to access food.

To meet that growing need, the Lakes Area Food Shelf is now in talks to acquire a retail or commercial building in the Brainerd/Baxter area to house the new facility, while continuing full operations

> in Pequot Lakes. The estimated cost of expansion is \$1.7 million, covering the purchase, renovation, and operation of the new site. The goal is to open the doors by

April 2026.

In a news release, the agency shared that it plans to follow the same successful model used in 2023. when community support helped raise over \$500,000 to renovate the Pequot Lakes location and launch a Community Resource Center. That center now connects clients with vital social services, offering more than just food assistance.





Bob Kroll is a highly decorated retired police lieutenant. He spent 32 years on the Minneapolis Police Department serving assignments on patrol, investigations, the SWAT team, and the union board. He also served 21 years in the U.S. Army Reserve as a military police officer

Police Chief Booker Hodges has worked as a school resource officer, patrol deputy, narcotics detective, SWAT operator, patrol overnight watch commander, inspector, undersheriff, acting chief deputy, an assistant public safety commissioner and now chief of police. Prior to joining the Bloomington Police Department in April of 2022, he served with Minnesota Department of Public Safety, Prior Lake Police Department and the Ramsey and Dakota County Sheriff's Office. Chief Hodges earned a doctorate degree in public administration. He serves as an adjunct professor at University of Northwestern in Saint Paul and has previously served as past president of the Northstar Chapter of the National Association of Black Law Enforcement Executives (NOBLE), as well as an elected National Parliamentarian for NOBLE.
