





said State Parks Director, Matthew Capps. "We are committed to helping every state park visitor enjoy a first-class experience, and it's gratifying to know that we have partners who are willing to step forward and help us accomplish that goal."

The playground project carries a total price tag of nearly \$450,000, and the Foundation continues its fund-raising efforts to transform the playground project from dream into reality.

Renovated again in 1998, the stadium now seats 14,215 and has an artificial ProGrass playing surface.

From 1986-2013, Braly Stadium hosted the NCAA Division II Football National Championship Game. Since the Division II title game was created in 1972, no city had served as the host for more than five years until the Shoals area and Braly Stadium did it for 28 straight years. It is the second longest continuous period that any site had hosted any NCAA championship in any sport on any level.

The Lions have a record of 281-134-8 in the stadium for a 68.7%-win percentage. In playoff games at Braly Stadium, the Lions were tough to beat with a 26-8 record. UNA also has a 41-25 record against ranked opponents inside Braly.



These days, our screens are like front doors to the world—full of family photos, news from old friends, and fascinating stories. It's wonderful, but just like we've learned to be careful about who we let into our homes, it's smart to be mindful of what we let through our screens. Lately, a new

kind of trickster has appeared, using something called Artificial Intelligence, or AI, to create lies that can look and sound incredibly real.





remote control or a microwave. It just takes a little practice. Let's walk through four simple ideas that can make you feel more

First, play detective by looking sideways. In the past, if a newspaper looked legitimate, we tended to trust it. Now, slicklooking fake news sites can be created in an instant. So, when you see a story that makes you raise an eyebrow, try this: instead of just studying the website itself, open a new tab on your internet browser. Type the main idea of the

headline into Google and see what other sources—like your trusted local news channel or a major network—have to say about it. If you can't find any mention of it, or if they are calling it false, you've just uncovered a great clue.

Second, listen to your gut when things feel too urgent. Have you ever gotten an email that made your heart race? Or seen a post that made you incredibly angry? That's exactly what these tricksters are counting on. They use our strong emotions—fear, outrage, even excitement—to get us to react before we think. So, if a message gets your pulse up, consider that your internal alarm bell. Take a deep breath. That feeling is your cue to slow down and doublecheck, not to click or share.

Third, let go of the old saying, "seeing is believing." I know, it's a tough one. We've always trusted our eyes and ears. But this new technology can create a video of a politician giving a speech they never gave, or a photo of a tornado that never touched down. So, when you come across an image or video that seems too shocking to be true, it just might be. A little gentle skepticism is your friend here. Wait to see if reliable news sources you've known for years confirm it before you believe it.

And finally, the old-fashioned phone call is your best friend. Here's a scary one: scammers can now use a short clip from a

social media video to clone your grandchild's voice and call you in a panic, asking for money. If you ever get a call that feels wrong, even if the voice sounds spot-on, just hang up. Then, call the person back on the number you have saved in your own address book, or ring another family member to check on things. That simple, separate phone call is your best defense.

Remember, we're all navigating this new landscape together. By adding these few simple tools to your routine, you can browse with more confidence and peace of mind, leaving you free to enjoy the very best parts of being connected.

CHURCH LAW (Or Lack Thereof)

Churches branch off and form new congregations with some regularity. Given the sheer number of different religions and denominations it is not surprising that people will disagree. Courts will not resolve these conflicts.

Recently, a nonprofit group of members from Auburn United Methodist Church, calling itself Auburn Methodist Coalition sued the Alabama-West Florida Conference of the United Methodist Church. The Coalition

sought an order requiring a vote of the entire church membership on whether the congregation should disaffiliate from the United Methodist Church, and a declaration that the Conference and denomination held no right in the local church. The Conference moved to dismiss, arguing that the ecclesiasticalabstention doctrine deprived the trial court of jurisdiction. The trial court denied the motion, and the Conference petitioned the Alabama Supreme Court for a writ of mandamus directing dismissal.

The Alabama Supreme Court ordered the trial court to dismiss the action, holding that civil court lacks authority to compel or oversee a church disaffiliation vote because such matters fall squarely within ecclesiastical governance. The Court explained that under long-standing precedent, Alabama courts cannot adjudicate issues of internal church polity. Polity in this context means a form of process of civil government or constitution.

The opinion reiterated that, under the ecclesiastical-abstention doctrine, civil courts must defer to a denomination's own procedures for internal decision-making. The process of disaffiliation, including who may call for and vote on separation, is governed by the denomination's ecclesiastical law in this case, the United Methodist Church's Book of Discipline. Any attempt by a civil court to direct that process would entangle the judiciary in religious governance, contrary to the First Amendment.

The First Amendment prohibits the government from establishing a religion AND interfering with the free exercise thereof which are two separate things. The practical reality is that the court system will not involve itself with church matters.

Medicare Minute

Types of Medicare Advantage Plans

There are basically two types of Medicare Advantage Plans. One type is a HMO. HMO stands for Health Maintenance Organization. The other type is a PPO or Preferred Provider Organization. Although both are Medicare Advantage Plans there are some distinct differences in the two.

In most HMO plans you generally can only go to doctors, health care facilities or hospitals that are on the provider list of the plan except in emergency. HMO plans require you to name a primary care provider (PCP). Your PCP becomes the quarterback of your health care. This means you may have to have a referral from your PCP if you want to see a specialist or another health care provider. All HMO plans do not require a referral, so this is a question you will want to ask of considering an HMO.

In a PPO plan, you also have a defined network of providers. You will pay less if you use a provider in the plan's network but, unlike a HMO, you may have some coverage if you go to an out-of-network provider. You will pay more for using an out-of-network provider versus an in-network provider. Also a PPO plan may give you the option of getting your health care from a provider outside your immediate geographical area whereas a HMO can be more limited.

HMO and PPO plans are similar in many ways. They both have a defined network of providers, both have a copay on most services you receive and except for a few exceptions will both include prescription drug coverage. Finding a Medicare health plan is about finding the plan that is right for you. It's a good idea to research both HMO and PPO plans if you are considering a Medicare Advantage Plan.

SIGNS OF THE PAST



NEWBURG

First known as New Boston when a post office was established here in 1832, by 1834 the community was known as Newburg. The Newburg Masonic Lodge #388 was organized in 1872. Since its completion in 1878, the Lodge hall has been a center for community events, serving as the meeting place for the Masons and other clubs, as well as church, school, and voting precinct. Mt. Pleasant Methodist Church, active since its founding in 1824 by Rev. James Smith, located 1/4 mile east of this site.

Denton Hollow burial site of William Russell (ca. 1745-1825) one mile south. Major Russell, for whom nearby Russellville was named, served with Andrew Jackson during the Creek War and returned to this area to settle after the war.

Location: 34.4864°N, 87.5826°W 8 mi E of Russellville on CR24

Contrary to the directions on the Newburg marker, William Russell's buriel is 2 miles south at 34.4561°N. 87.5714°W because the marker was relocated when a new highway was built.

Having Fun?

that's respectable, yet underwhelming. Another less discussed but equally important factor in the disappearance of diving boards is the evolution of how people use pools, lifestyle changes, and harsh legal/safety liabilities in pool settings, both public and private.

Backyard pool owners today are more likely to opt for a holistic "yard resort" vibe that prioritizes aesthetics, hydrotherapy features, lap swimming, and aqua aerobics over splashing, recreation, kid noise, cannon balls, and competitive skills like diving. A diving board in such a setting can be viewed as unnecessary, disruptive, dangerous.

But are the kids having fun? Maybe, since many have never seen a diving board, and they don't know what they are missing.

The feature article and photo in this week's issue about the new playground planned for Joe Wheeler State Park demonstrates how drastically the equipment has changed in two generations, even from the turn of the century, and what can be considered "a playground" these days.

In the 1960s and 70s for example, before mounting regulations, safety cautious parents, and the ever-growing and litigation liability markets redefined a "playground," parks were filled with jungle gyms, metal slides, invigorating swing sets, teeter totters, spinning merry-go-rounds, and children screaming their lungs out with joy.

Sure, we got some scrapes and bruises from time to time back in the day, and yes, in summer, the slides would get hot. Most kids knew when the slides might be hot. And if they didn't, they knew for next time. There were greater dangers in a kid licking a filthy piece of playground metal when frozen, than finding the hot slide.

Some did not want to swing as high or did not want to stray far from the middle of the merry-go-round. Tall spiral slides

were great for young thrillseekers, but the ladders required kids to use the sturdy hand rails on the way up. Each playground element regardless of the challenge incorporated science while honing agility and resilience. There was often a rubberized base on the ground, but the equipment didn't come with cushioned padding or protective covers, so the bars would have lasted for a century.

We also created our own bike trails, knew the dangers of traffic, dug tunnels in dirt for matchbox car cities, made our own car noises, made/ modified our own forts, swam in the creek, baited our own hooks, played tackle football in an open lot, filled sidewalks with chalk art, and were masters at jumping rope.

However, there were no participation trophies being handed out then. when we tumbled, fell, or got knocked off, we wiped off the dirt, ran some fountain water on any scrapes, and got back to it. Playgrounds of that era created a generation of tough, often fearless kids. Bruises, scrapes, and occasional broken bones were just part of childhood. Success and fun created confidence. Now, one misstep has someone

looking for a lawsuit.

The large metal slides got smaller and were soon replaced with even smaller plastic alternatives. They were cooler to the touch, didn't work as well, and they created static shock. And in 2025, the equipment stature has been reduced even further. It's neither invigorating, entertaining, nor engaging.

I'm sorry, but from my perspective, I simply cannot imagine spending half-million a dollars on some glorified Little Tikes equipment that will fade in a few years, succumb to weather in a few more, and offers few thrills and no chills. Yet, we still call it a playground.

We are in such a push to get kids outside into the sunshine and away from the screens, yet is this all we can offer? When plastic slides that don't slide and walled walkways with 4 ft. elevation are all we can create for their enjoyment, it's easy to see why the kids don't want to waste their time outside.


