Inside the shop, a 20-foot fresh meat case is stocked daily with a wide variety of hand-cut meats, house-made specialties, and seasonal items. With butchers on duty from open to close, customers can count on custom cuts, expert advice, and a friendly face at the counter. The commitment to freshness doesn't stop at the butcher block. Each month, the shop brings in more than 20 varieties of fresh seafood directly from Florida, making "Seafood Weekend" a much-anticipated event.

Their dedication to supporting other local producers is just as impressive. Throughout the store, customers will find locally sourced grocery staples such as eggs, milk, sourdough bread, honey, coffee, beef tallow, jelly, and goat cheese, to name a few — strengthening the local food chain and keeping dollars close to home.

The Butcher on Main also boasts a full-service deli with more than 50 meats and cheeses available by the pound. Guests can take their selections home or enjoy a made-to-order sandwich in the spacious lounge area. 




The Innat Tree City

A LEGACY OF HOSPITALITY AND COMMUNITY HAT BEGAN as a bold vision in 1998 has blossomed into one of McMinnville's most distinctive destinations. The Inn at Tree City emerged from a family deeply rooted in hospitality, vision, and community pride. In 2003, the Sheth family transformed the property, originally purchased as a Holiday Inn Express, into the Best Western Tree City Inn. In 2024, the inn underwent a comprehensive reimagining, becoming a hotel that reflects the serenity and charm of McMinnville and Warren County.

Owner Keval Sheth, who moved to McMinnville from Ohio at the age of 12 and graduated from Warren County High School in 2004, leads with a mission to elevate local tourism while staying deeply connected to the community that shaped him. "McMinnville is home," Sheth said. "This isn't just a place to stay. The Inn at Tree City is part of our town's story."

The Residences at Main Street Center

N THE center of downtown McMinnville stands a building that has witnessed more than a century of change — and now, it's entering a bold new chapter. The Residences at Main Street Center will soon be a fully renovated 35,000-square-foot landmark that blends architectural preservation with modern living. Originally constructed in three phases — beginning in 1881, expanded in 1902, and completed in the 1960s — the building has housed everything from hardware stores, to photography studios, to boutiques, and furniture stores.

Renovations began in 2020 with the first floor, now home to a vibrant mix of commercial tenants, including a restaurant, spa, tattoo shop, physical therapy clinic, and locally owned boutiques. In 2024, work began on the second and third floors, which will soon feature 10 residential apartments, two of which will be available as short-term rentals through Vrbo and Airbnb. These upper-level spaces offer guests and tenants a unique blend of nostalgia, breathtaking mountain views, and a bird's-eye view of the city.

Designer Raven Young's vision infuses each unit with curated elegance and livable charm. From dramatic paint palettes to ornate trim work, custom built-ins, and soaking tubs, every detail reflects her commitment to comfort, character, and craftsmanship. Each apartment includes washers and dryers, fireplaces, private balconies, smart TVs, and keyless entry systems. Unique tile floors and industrial-chic touches nod to the building's layered history while embracing modern aesthetics.



The Nursery Capital of the World

LOCAL NURSERIES HAVE DEEP ROOTS IN THE FERTILE SOIL OF INNOVATION AND INDUSTRY.

ERTILE SOIL at the foothills of the Cumberland Plateau, combined with our ability to ship plants across the country, and our proven heritage of horticulture innovation, is why we earned the title "Nursery Capital of the World." Located in Department of Agriculture Plant Hardiness Zone 7a, our region enjoys mild winters and warm summers — ideal for cultivating a wide range of plants, shrubs, and trees.

The nursery trade has been vital to our local economy since the 1870s, when Pomona Nursery began growing apples, grapes, pears, and plums. By the 1960s, there were over 150 registered nurseries within our county. While McMinnville serves as the heart of the industry, Warren County is now home to an estimated 400 nurseries that range in size from small-scale boutique growers to wholesalers who ship nationwide.





Cedarwood **Nursery and** Cedarwood **Pumpkin Patch**

Cedarwood Farms in McMinnville adds autumn magic to its nursery roots with a beloved seasonal pumpkin patch. From late September through October, families flock to enjoy their brand new 100-foot super slide, a giant combine, hay maze, corn maze, jump pad, pedal cars, two petting zoos, and whimsical pumpkin train. The on-site country store and kitchen round out the experience with colorful mums, gourds, homemade meals, and weekend bonfires by the lake, complete with live music, oney-gooey s'mores, roasted hot dogs, and cozy conversations.

Owner Buddy Patterson and his son, Lucas, planted eight acres of pumpkins in the summer of 2001. The crop fared so well that his wife, Jana, a local teacher, talked them into creating the annual family-focused event, which allows families and school-aged children to rediscover the foundations of agriculture. The Patterson family now plants 40 acres of pumpkins to ensure that every guest receives a pumpkin.

They are also a wholesale and retail nursery specializing in evergreens, shrubs, and shade trees, including several varieties of arborvitae, hollies, boxwoods, maples, oaks, flowering cherries, and more.




Hale and **Hines Nursery**

As a locally owned family business, Hale and Hines Nursery has been a staple in our wholesale nursery community since 1978. They specialize in large container-grown shade, flowering, and evergreen trees. These include 450 varieties of container trees and over 60 varieties of fieldgrown trees such as Japanese maples, red maples, flowering dogwoods, junipers, arborvitaes, Southern magnolias, oaks, and Ginkgo biloba. They serve retailers, wholesalers, landscapers, and municipalities nationwide. Their meticulously planned and organized 900-acre operation blends horticultural heritage with state-of-the-art innovation.

With the help of a Tennessee Department of Agriculture grant, Hale and Hines recently finished construction of a production facility for high-quality 15, 30, and 45-gallon-sized plastic pots with handles. They have used similar pots since 2003, but have had to import them from Italy. This exciting new plastics operation will reduce costs for the nursery, as well as for farmers and other nurseries in our region that rely on these types of containers.

Utilizing their 128-slice CT Scanner, they offer Cardiac CT Angiography to diagnose and monitor high blood pressure, high cholesterol, irregular heartbeats, and other risk factors for heart disease, heart attack, and stroke. The expansion of a state-of-the-art cardiac catheterization lab means Ascension provides the only lab of this type in our region. They perform



both diagnostic and therapeutic cardiac catheterization procedures on adults, which improves the recovery and overall health of patients who would otherwise have to travel great distances for this degree of specialized cardiac care. The renovation of approximately 1,092 square feet of the current hospital facility makes this first-floor lab easily accessible.

In keeping with its promise to continue offering high-quality health care, Ascension expanded its ICU, welcomed new physicians, completed an extensive renovation of its main lobby, added a pharmacy for uninsured and low-income patients, and increased innovations in health care for every citizen of Warren County. AN INDUSTRY UPDATE

NEFAB

NEFAB is a global leader in sustainable packaging and logistics solutions, serving industries like automotive, telecom, and e-mobility. In 2023, NEFAB purchased Polyflex Products LLC in Morrison. An \$8.3 million expansion of their manufacturing operations facility on Red Road in McMinnville will create 58 additional jobs. This new location will add material extrusion capabilities and reuse end-of-life industrial packaging, working alongside the Morrison location, where thermoform packaging operations begin. Polyflex will employ 85 across Warren County.

MCNEILUS STEEL INC.

McNeilus Steel Inc. is a family-owned, full-line steel fabricating service center that has been in operation since 1948. After 75 years of continued growth, McNeilus broke ground on its newest location on West Maple Street in Morrison. This \$23.4 million investment includes a 200,000-square-foot facility that is expandable up to 500,000 square feet. This location will primarily offer steel distribution of bar stock, tubes, sheets, and plates. Their facility is almost complete, and a ribbon-cutting will follow. They created 55 jobs.

BRIDGESTONE AMERICAS INC.

Bridgestone is investing \$550 million to expand its truck and bus radial tire plant at 725 Bridgestone Dr. in Morrison. The project will add 380 new jobs and 850,000 square feet to the facility, increasing its total footprint to 2.8 million square feet. The expansion will boost production capacity and introduce advanced technologies, including RFID-enabled tires, artificial intelligence in manufacturing, and Enliten — a new tire technology platform focused on performance and sustainability. Construction is expected to be mostly completed by 2026. This investment supports Bridgestone's commitment to U.S. manufacturing and aligns with its global sustainability goals. This facility is one of Bridgestone Americas' key manufacturing sites, and with its recent expansion, it has become an even bigger player in commercial tire production.



UNITECH NORTH THREE STAR AMERICA LLC MALL

An adhesive manufacturer based in Ansan City, South Korea, is locating its first U.S. facility in Morrison with an investment of \$30 million. Phase one of the project will create 75 new jobs. This location will specialize in the production of thermal adhesives and battery compression pads for electric vehicle battery manufacturers across the Southeast, as well as industrial adhesives and sealers. Unitech is one of nearly 30 economic development projects started in the Upper Cumberland region since 2019, representing \$840 million in capital investments and approximately 2,700 job commitments.

With the help of a federal grant, Warren County purchased the Three Star Mall in late 2023, launching a \$9 million revitalization project to transform the space into a vibrant hub for the community. Plans include replacing the former JCPenney with a new health department and adding a senior center, a veterans service office, and offices for the Upper Cumberland Human Resource Agency. A proposed 5,000-square-foot community room will provide people of all ages a place to unplug and connect over games, coffee, and snacks. Renovations began in December 2023. Located at 1410 Sparta St. in McMinnville, the mall will serve as a centralized resource for community services and support them all under one roof.

INTERNATIONAL "SISTER CITY" COLLABORATION

Launched by President Eisenhower in 1956, the Sister City program was created to promote international peace through grassroots diplomacy connecting communities across the globe through education, culture, and economic exchange. Following the announcement of Unitech Co. Ltd.'s first U.S. expansion in Morrison, the South Korean company based in Ansan City signed a Sister City partnership with Warren County. This collaboration strengthens international relationships, encourages cultural understanding, and lays the groundwork for future investments, educational exchanges, and job growth to benefit local families and businesses.

Motlow's Automation and Robotics Training Center

WARREN COUNTY'S BEST-KEPT SECRET

OTLOW STATE Community College has served Middle Tennessee since 1969, growing from a single campus in Moore County to a multi-site institution committed to workforce development and academic excellence. The McMinnville campus, established to meet the educational needs of Warren County and surrounding areas, has become a regional hub for advanced technical training — especially in automation and robotics.


At the core of this innovation is a new wing for the Automation and Robotics Training Center (ARTC), located next to the McMinnville campus. This recent addition not only expands Motlow State's Mechatronics program (one of the first in Tennessee) but also marks the beginning of the Electric Vehicle Engineering Technology (EVET) program. Nissan donated four electric vehicles, and Tennessee Tech donated two vehicle charging stations to ensure students have access to the latest technology.

With these recent additions, ARTC is likely the only academic facility in the nation equipped to credential workers for the world's top three robotics manufacturers: ABB, FANUC, and Yaskawa Motoman.

According to Larry Flatt, executive director of the program, the facility has become a mecca for anyone interested in pursuing robotics — especially since students can learn the equivalent of a 16-week course in four days.







This accelerated model is not only efficient — it's transformative. The robotics program doesn't just serve local students. Applicants come from across the country because their employers appreciate the hands-on experience and small class size, with only two students per robot.

In the last 18 months, ARTC has trained over 300 people who traveled from 33 states, representing 160 companies. Technicians, engineers, and career changers are earning certifications that open doors in manufacturing, logistics, and automation. Their presence boosts tourism dollars, fills local hotels and restaurants, and contributes to Warren County's growing reputation as a destination for technical excellence.

Flatt said, "ARTC continues to champion the team's vision, which took it from concept to placing Motlow and its workforce division at the forefront of providing industry-recognized certifications. This vision resonates not just locally but across Tennessee and beyond. As an equal mix of education and innovation, we continually receive requests to understand how we did it and how we continue to add other programs. Our partnership with almost a dozen leading robot and automation companies gives us a distinct advantage in carrying out one of our missions. That is to ensure there are



enough highly skilled professionals to serve existing industries, spur livable wage jobs, and boost economic growth."

Motlow's efforts align with Tennessee's Drive to 55 initiative, which began in 2013 with a mission to ensure that 55% of Tennesseans hold a postsecondary credential by 2025. Through this initiative, the state distributed \$24 million to institutions offering certifications that made Tennesseans more employable. This grant allowed Motlow to build its 12,500-square-foot robotics training facility for \$5 million.

Prospective students are encouraged to apply for Tennessee's tuition-free programs, such as tnAchieves and TN Reconnect. These programs allow high school graduates and adult learners to pursue robotics training without financial barriers.

A recent grant from the National Science Foundation, coupled with Mitsubishi Electric Corporation's recognition of it as the first non-corporate training center, new certifications, and innovative equipment, ensures that Motlow's McMinnville campus is not only training tomorrow's leaders but will also continue to fuel our local and state economies.





Tennessee College of Applied Technology **Major Campus Expansion**

OUT WITH THE OLD AND IN WITH THE NEW

HE TENNESSEE College of Applied Technology (TCAT) in McMinnville is undergoing a transformative expansion — one that not only enlarges its footprint but also replaces the original buildings that have stood since 1964. This ambitious project marks a new chapter for a campus with nearly 60 years of proven experience in workforce development and hands-on technical training.

Funded through Gov. Bill Lee's Fiscal Year 2023-2024 budget proposal, TCAT-McMinnville was selected as one of 29 major projects across the state. Of the \$945.9 million allocated for TCAT campuses, McMinnville was awarded funding for two projects: the main campus in Warren County and the Coffee County campus in Manchester. Construction is already underway, with substantial completion of the

Manchester site expected by January 2026 and the McMinnville campus slated for completion by mid-2027.

During construction, students will notice temporary changes including relocated entrances and exits, increased noise and activity, parking adjustments, and safety barriers. These disruptions are a small price to pay for what's ahead: larger classrooms and lab spaces, state-of-the-art equipment, expanded student lounge areas, and improved parking.

"This expansion is about safety, future growth, and creating modernized training spaces," said Daniel Bratcher, external relations representative for TCAT at Coffee County. "We're most excited about having the space to offer new programs that the community needs."

TCAT-McMinnville currently boasts an 85% completion rate, an 88% job placement rate, and a 100% licensure rate, which reflects its commitment to student success. The school offers accelerated, industry-aligned programs with hands-on training and a wide array of workforce certifications.

Bratcher said, "TCAT-McMinnville has the benefit of being a competen-

cy-based learning center. This is an approach to teaching and learning where students progress based on their ability to demonstrate mastery of skills or knowledge rather than time. This is a benefit for the student because of the flexibility and efficiency for students, and it ensures students do not move forward without learning previous material."

For anyone seeking hands-on training and a fast track to employment, TCAT-McMinnville offers a practical, career-focused alternative to traditional college. With programs ranging from nursing and massage therapy to welding and commercial truck driving, students have the skills to thrive in high-demand fields across our state and beyond.

Enrollment is open year-round and operates on a first-come, first-served basis. Prospective students begin by submitting an online application and providing transcripts from high school, college, military service, or GED/HiSET programs. Financial aid is available through several state and federal programs, including Tennessee Promise for recent graduates, Tennessee Reconnect for adult learners, the Wilder-Naifeh Technical Skills Grant for full-time students, and grants available to veterans.

WARREN COUNTY MAKES ALL FORMS OF EDUCATION A TOP PRIORITY.

ARREN COUNTY makes education a priority for all students by providing programs like TN Promise, and tnAchieves, and Higher Ed opportunities through the Foundation of Educational Progress.

The Tennessee Promise is a scholarship and mentoring program that began in the fall of 2015. The scholarships they offer students cover tuition and fees not covered by the Pell Grant, the HOPE scholarship, or TSAA. For this program, removing the financial burden is key, but an important component of Tennessee Promise is the mentorship each participant will receive as they prepare for their higher education. Students must also complete 8 hours of community service per term, maintaining satisfactory academic progress (2.0 GPA).

tnACHIEVES

tnAchieves is an organization that partners with the TN Promise Scholarship in 83 of the 95 counties in Tennessee. They aim to increase

higher education opportunities for Tennessee high school students by providing mentorship and scholarships.

The organization serves about 90% of Tennessee's high school seniors each year, working with 98% of all TN Promise scholarship applicants.

The organization also provides student advising and support, increasing retention and completion. This ensures consistency in many areas.

tnAchieves guides students from high school through college and into their careers. Foundation of Educational Progress.

The Foundation of Educational Progress is a nonprofit that helps provide resources for students pursuing an education. It improves educational progress by enhancing academic scholarships and programs. The foundation offers educational assistance to students in the Warren County.

COUNTY AREA

The organization's website also provides information on organizations similar to the Foundation of Educational Progress for students who are not located in Warren County.

It is essential to ensure that our future leaders are prepared for the next step, and the Foundation of Educational Progress is a great starting point for Warren County students.

ROBOTICS

It is no surprise that Warren County makes STEM a top priority in enhancing students' quality of education. The county has an Automation Robotics Training Center (ARTC), part of the workforce group of Motlow College. They are one of two facilities within 250 miles that have three competing robot companies in the facility. The center's mechatronics program helps students learn the technical skills needed for the workforce while providing hands-on experience.

The Tennessee College of Applied Technology (TCAT), next door to the center, provides young men and women with many hands-on opportunities.

TCAT is a two-year program designed to prepare students for their careers. There are nine programs in the technical and skilled trade industries at TCAT-McMinnville. The program constantly finds new ways to expand and help students pursue their dreams.

Students earning the Mechatronics diploma will be trained in manufacturing, focusing on accuracy and productivity using various skills like pneumatics, hydraulics, robotics, computer controls, and preventive maintenance.







VERY SEASON has something unique to offer the Rock Island visitors, but the park manager, Damon Graham's, favorite season is spring. The profusion of wildflowers, including some rare orchids as well as migrating birds, make Rock Island feel magical.

Have you ever seen an osprey, with its six-foot wingspan, pulling its sushi dinner out of the river right in front of you? That is a sight to behold and something to put on your bucket list. In addition to osprey, eagles call the park home yearround, and visitors can see a wide variety of songbirds, some rare, at the park. Birds are most likely to be seen during spring and fall during migration when the park has fewer visitors. The quiet surroundings make bird sightings more common.

SUMMER

Summer brings an influx of visitors for the variety of outdoor activities available. Weekends are often overflowing, so be sure to arrive early or plan to visit mid-week to enjoy the park. Families enjoy swimming at the sandy beach on Center Hill Lake and taking advantage of the three boat launches. Fishing is always popular at Rock Island; be sure you have your license if you are 13 years or older. Camping and picnicking help to extend the outdoor experience. Eating outdoors gives you a million-dollar view and enhances the flavor of your food.

Seasonal ranger-led activities include kayaking, nature walks, and animal presentations, among others. Check the park's website for schedule information.

FALL

The coolness of fall brings fewer visitors and a return of migrating birds. It is a wonderful time to lose yourself in the oasis of Rock Island. Enjoy the crunchy leaves as you hike or the beauty of the fall colors as you kayak around Center Hill Lake.

People who have mobility challenges love seeing an amazing waterfall from the parking lot. At Rock Island, beauty is available to people with all levels of health and fitness.

Immerse yourself at Rock Island by staying for a few days. RV hookup sites are available year-round, while tent camping can be done March 15 - October. Camping is a wonderful way to get back in touch with nature, but if a few more luxuries are your preference, there are lovely rental cabins available.

WINTER

Winter at Rock Island can have a magic of its own. The leaves have fallen, so you can see the views more clearly with the fewest visitors. A vigorous walk in a beautiful place warms body and soul.

As John Burroughs said, "I go to nature to be soothed and healed, and to have my senses put in order." Rock Island State Park is nearby in every season to assist with our mental and physical health.

SPRING

Spring rains make the park water levels change drastically. The roar of the water and awe-inspiring churning help one to appreciate the power and strength in all of those individual droplets merging in the rivers. While not all trails and areas are accessible with high water, it is a sight to behold.

Be aware of potential water release by the TVA. If you hear sirens or notice rising water, retreat immediately to higher ground.

The centerpiece of the 883-acre Rock Island State Park is the beautiful Center Hill Lake, along with three rivers: Caney Fork, Collins, and Rocky.





The sight is not only a feast for the eyes, but it's also an authentic taste of McMinnville that you won't find anywhere else.

When you come to the Warren County Farmers Market, you also have the opportunity to talk with the growers and producers, to learn about their practices, and to hear the stories of an heirloom variety of carrots or the process of curing bacon.

The farmers market in McMinnville is easy to find. Look for the water tower in downtown McMinnville. It's open from 6 a.m. to noon, every Wednesday and Saturday, from the beginning of April through the end of November. Also, watch for special events throughout the season.

Gilley Pool, operated by the McMinnville Parks and Recreation department and in close proximity to the recreation center, has separate membership and daily

pass options. This is due to the seasonal nature of the pool being open from Memorial Day through Labor Day.

Affordability and access are high priorities according to Justin Scott, parks and recreation director for the city of McMinnville. Providing a clean and safe place to exercise supports the healthy lifestyle goals of area residents. Now that Milner Recreation Center is fully operational and reopened as of June 2021, the staff welcomes the public with open arms and encourages them to come in, tour the facility, and try it for a day to fully experience all the center has to offer.






