



Screen Time: Not Just a Kids' Issue



While screen time is often discussed in relation to children, adults are equally vulnerable to its negative effects. Many professionals spend long hours on computers, then unwind with streaming or social media—adding up to significant daily exposure. Yet, the threshold for harmful screen use in adults remains unclear. Some experts suggest limiting social media to 30 minutes a day can significantly boost well-being

Depression: A 2017 Preventative Medicine Reports study linked TV and computer use to moderate or severe depression, with similar findings reported in adolescents.

Eye strain: Screen use can strain eyes. The American Academy of Ophthalmology advises the 20-20-20 rule: every 20 minutes, look 20 feet away for 20 seconds.

Neck and back pain: Looking down at screens strains the neck, shoulders, and back-a condition known as "tech neck." Reid Health warns prolonged posture can lead to serious musculoskeletal issues.

Cognitive changes: A 2020 Science Direct study linked smartphone addiction to impaired brain signaling and reduced cognition. Stanford Lifestyle Medicine adds that 5+ hours of daily TV raises risks for dementia, stroke, and Parkinson's.

Reduced physical activity: Excessive screen time often reduces physical activity, contributing to obesity and related health risks.

Impact sleep: The JAMA Network reports that among 122,058 participants in the American Cancer Society Cancer Prevention Study-3, screen use was linked to shorter sleep and poorer sleep quality. Using screens before bed can disrupt circadian rhythms.



Eat Bright, Sleep Tight

A new study from Columbia University and the University of Chicago reveals that eating 5 cups of fruits and vegetables daily can improve sleep qualitystarting the same night. Participants who hit the 5-cup mark experienced deeper sleep and fewer nighttime awakenings.

For families, this is a game-changer. Kids are especially sensitive to dietary shifts, and poor sleep can affect mood, learning, and behavior. Swapping processed snacks for produce-like berries at breakfast, carrots at lunch, and broccoli

at dinner-can help children fall asleep faster and stay asleep longer.

Why does it work? Fruits and veggies are packed with fiber, antioxidants, and complex carbs that stabilize blood sugar and support melatonin production, which regulates circadian rhythms.

The Cosmetic Tweak That Eases Dry Eye

Forgoing eyeliner could ease dry eye, Chinese findings suggest. In the study, women who used eyeliner at least three times per week over one year were less likely to suffer from dry eye (as measured by a scale called the Ocular Surface Disease Index) than women who went

without. And applying eyeliner to the inner rims of eyelids proved especially problematic. The researchers say eyeliner ingredients can worsen dry eye by irritating the meibomian glands, which produce an oily substance that keeps tears from evaporating too quickly.



Peel, Sniff, Smile

The scent of citrus—especially oranges has been scientifically shown to reduce stress and boost mood. In fact, studies have found that just smelling orange essential oil can lower anxiety levels and promote calmness, making citrus not only good for your body but also your brain.

So, whether you're peeling a mandarin or zesting a lemon, you're giving your nervous system a little sunshine boost.

The Power of **Hourly Movement**

Experts recommend standing or moving for at least 5 minutes every hour. Here's what that can do:

- Boost circulation and prevent blood pooling in the legs
- · Engage muscles in your legs, core, and back
- Improve posture and reduce spinal compression
- Enhance focus and energy, especially during long work sessions

Even light activity—like stretching, walking to refill your water, or doing a few squats—can make a difference. A study published in Medicine & Science in Sports & Exercise and reviewed by Harvard Health Publishing found that short walking breaks every 30 minutes significantly lowered blood pressure and improved metabolic health. Dr. Howard LeWine of Harvard notes that "any movement is better than none"especially when it comes to counteracting the effects of prolonged sitting.



Whimsical Trees for Santa's Biggest Fans

CHRISTMAS EVE feels extra magical when kids are buzzing with excitement over Santa's visit. Their joy brings the season to life—so why not make something just for them? These whimsical "Christmas Tree Cake Pops" are a sweet surprise for little ones (and maybe a few grown-up elves too).

Christmas Tree Cake Pops

Makes 24 cake pops

1 box of vanilla cake mix 1 teaspoon milk

3/2 cups of green candy melts

½ cup unsalted butter, softened 24 cake pop sticks

1 cup confectioner's sugar1 teaspoon vanilla extractlcing dotslcing stars

Prepare cake according to package instructions, adding 3/4 cup canola oil to the cake mix before baking.

Once cake is cool to the touch, transfer to a large mixing bowl and break up into crumbs. Allow to cool completely.

In a medium bowl, add the butter, sugar, vanilla, and milk. Use an electric mixer and beat on medium speed for about 4 minutes until light and fluffy.

Add % of the frosting to the cake crumbs and mix until mixture can hold together well. Refrigerate for at least an hour.

Using your hands, shape the cake pop mixture into 24 conical shapes.

Melt the green candy melts. Dip one end of each of the cake pop sticks into the melted chocolate before inserting into the bottom of the cake pops. Dip each cake pop into the melted chocolate, making sure to cover completely, allowing excess to drip back into bowl.

Use a toothpick to create the textured look of the tree and decorate with the icing dots and stars before standing upright to dry completely.





Reindeer Treats: Tiny Antlers, Big Flavor

FOOD BRINGS people together and adorable cookies add to the festive feel, especially during the holiday season. These Peanut Butter Reindeer Cookies are both delicious and charming—perfect for adding warmth and whimsy to your celebrations.

Peanut Butter Reindeer Cookies

Makes 48 cookies

½ cup unsalted butter, softened

34 cup peanut butter

 $\frac{1}{3}$ cup granulated sugar

1/3 cup (packed) light brown sugar

1 large egg

1 teaspoon pure vanilla extract

11/2 cups of all-purpose flour

1 teaspoon of baking soda

½ teaspoon salt

48 large red M&M candies

96 mini semisweet

chocolate chips

Pretzels, broken into 96 1-inch pieces

Preheat oven to 350 F. Line 2 baking sheets with parchment paper.

In a large bowl, beat together butter, peanut butter, sugar, and brown sugar on medium speed until light and fluffy, for about 2 minutes. Add egg and vanilla extract and mix until combined.

In a small bowl, whisk together flour, baking soda, and salt. Add the dry ingredients to the wet ingredients and stir until just combined. Roll the dough into 1-inch balls, and place at least 1 inch apart on cookie sheet. Bake only 10 to 12 cookies at a time. Refrigerate the bowl of dough in between batches. Bake for 7 to 9 minutes, until the cookies are just set.

Immediately place one M&M in the center of each cookie for a nose (press down a bit if your cookies aren't flat enough), 2 mini chocolate chips for the eyes, and 2 pretzel pieces at the top for antlers. Carefully transfer the cookies to a wire rack to cool completely.

Hanukkah's Golden Favorite: Potato Latkes

LATKES ARE A BELOVED staple of Hanukkah celebrations, with roots tracing back to Eastern European Jewish communities who adapted the humble potato into a festive favorite. This season, air frying offers a fresh twist.

Potato Latkes

Makes 4 servings

3 large russet potatoes, peeled

2 eggs

1 teaspoon kosher salt

3 tablespoons matzo meal

1 tablespoon cornstarch or potato starch, plus extra for

dusting

Cooking spray

Sour cream, to serve

1 tablespoon chives, snipped

Salt

Freshly ground black pepper

Coarsely grate potatoes on a box grater; alternatively, use grater attachment on a food processor for uniform pieces.

Submerge potatoes in a bowl of cold water. Drain well and wring out in a clean dish towel to extract as much moisture as possible.

Beat eggs in a large mixing bowl with half the salt. Whisk in matzo meal and cornstarch or potato starch.

Add dried potato to egg mixture, stirring thoroughly to combine. Divide and shape into four large latkes, approximately 1/4-inch thick.

Dust with more cornstarch (or potato starch, whichever using), gently shaking or brushing off excess. Season with remaining salt.

Preheat air fryer to 380 F. Spritz basket with cooking spray before carefully arranging latkes in it.

Cook for 8 minutes. Turn and cook for a further 4 to 6 minutes until golden brown all over.


Remove from air fryer and cool briefly before serving with a garnish of sour cream and chives.



Sensory-Friendly Holidays

A GUIDE FOR FAMILIES



he holiday season brings joy, excitement—and for many children, a flood of sensory input that can quickly become overwhelming. From flashing lights and crowded rooms to unfamiliar foods and disrupted routines, the festive atmosphere can pose challenges for kids who thrive on predictability and calmness.

Experts in child development say that sensory overload isn't limited to children with diagnosed conditions. Any child can struggle with the intensity of holiday experiences, especially when routines shift and expectations rise.

To help kids feel more grounded during the holidays, specialists recommend a few simple strategies:

- Maintain familiar routines. Stick to regular meal times, bedtimes and daily rituals whenever possible.
- Prepare for new environments. Talk through upcoming events, show photos of unfamiliar places, and explain who will be there and what to expect.
- Pack comfort items. Bring along favorite snacks, foods, toys, blankets, headphones or sensory tools that help kids self-regulate.
- Plan for breaks. Find a quiet space to regroup. A short walk or car break can reset the nervous system.
- **Designate a quiet space.** Whether at home or visiting, create a calm area where children can retreat and recharge.
- Watch for sensory triggers. Strong smells, loud music or scratchy fabrics can be distressing. Offer breaks and alternatives.
- Encourage hydration and rest. Regular water and downtime can help balance stimulation.
- **Dress for comfort.** Choose soft, breathable clothing and avoid tags or tight layers.

While holiday traditions vary, the need for emotional and sensory safety is universal. With a little planning, families can create celebrations that feel joyful—not overwhelming—for everyone.







have arrived at that point in my life when a splurge looks like microwave lunches.
