Trail Blazers Recognized

ROGERSVILLE - Joe Wheeler State Park dedicated a portion of a park trail in memory of long-time park ranger **Howard Fuqua** and unveiled a historical marker at the park's First Creek Boat Ramp on Saturday, November

The historical marker chronicles the history of the pre-civil rights era at Joe Wheeler State Park and the contributions of Fuqua, the first black park ranger in the Alabama State Parks System, and longtime ranger Samuel Harden Sr., the second black ranger who replaced Fuqua, who served 38 years at Joe Wheeler State Park.

A portion of the Awesome Trail was officially named in Harden's memory, and members of his family attended the ceremony

The historical marker, installed near the park's main entrance on U.S. 72 in Rogersville, also commemorates Camp Drake. That site, within what is now the park's day-use area, hosted African-American Boy Scouts of the Tennessee Valley Council for many years prior to the civil rights movement.

The project is a partnership between Álabama State Parks and the East Lauderdale Historical Society.

Medicare Minute Prescription Drug Plans

October 15th through December 7th is a period of time that Medicare has set aside to make changes to your Prescription Drug Plan (PDP) or Medicare Advantage Plan (MA) if you want. Whether you have a Medicare supplement and a stand-alone drug plan or a Medicare Advantage Plan with prescription drug coverage now is the time to review your drug plan for 2026. Like MA plans, drug plans have certain things you want to look at when considering which PDP is best for you. Those things are premium, deductibles, copays, coinsurance and the plan's provider network.

Although the things listed above are most important so are the tiers that drugs are place into. So before we discuss the cost of the plans let's look at drug plan tiers. Normally there are five tiers to a drug plan. Tier 1 and Tier 2 drugs are usually your most common generic drugs. Tier 3 drugs are preferred brand, Tier 4 drugs are non-preferred brand and Tier 5 drugs are specialty drugs. One of the most misunderstood parts of a drug plan is the tier a person's drug is in.

Many people we meet with think that if their drug is listed in a certain tier under their current PDP it's the same on all plans. This is not always true. Sometimes, for example, a drug may be listed a Tier 2 under one plan but may be a Tier 3 under another plan. Why is this important? Because in most drug plans the copays are higher for Tier 3 than Tier 2.

You can check the tiers of your drugs by looking at the plan's formulary. The formulary is a list of the drugs that are covered by the plan. You can get the formulary of the plan you are considering by going to the plan's website, going online to Medicare.gov or you can visit our office and we can help. • On Nov. 24, 1947, the House of Representatives voted 346 to 17 to approve citations of contempt against 10 Hollywood writers, directors and producers who'd refused to cooperate at hearings dealing with communism in the movie industry held by the House Un-American Activities Committee. The men were sentenced to one year in jail.

• On Nov. 25, 2000, after passing a resolution earlier in the year, the **United Nations General** Assembly recognized the first International Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women. The resolution marked the anniversary of the death of three sisters -- Patria, Minerva and Maria Teresa Mirabal -- who were murdered in the Dominican Republic in 1960.





Losing Traditions We Held...



UNA's run of playoff consistency as a member of the Gulf South Conference in Division II began in the early 90's and continued through the 2016 season with only brief groupings of seasonal missteps. The games on those weekends were memorable with the Lions often advancing.

UNA's choice to step up to Division I was a risky move, but was supported by those who count, many of whom thought it should have been pursued 20 years earlier.

The move has produced a few competitive bright spots, none of which have taken place on the football field at the FCS level (formerly Div. I-AA). There were two sevenwin seasons to start a probationary period (with a mixed schedule), but no winning seasons since 2020, not even close.

Perhaps this vear

has been the most disappointing. The Lions were sitting at 2-9 with the season's final game pending on Saturday, November 22, a day after our press deadline for this issue. Prospects for a win weren't encouraging against a Southern Utah team that had won five straight entering the contest.

Regardless, the most recent effort before this writing was a 61-0 shellacking at the hands of United Athletic Conference co-leader Tarleton St. It represents the worst loss in UNA football program history, and at least for that week had the Lions tied for last place in the conference.

Several other losses this season have also been embarrassing in nature – 52-23, 49-21, 56-28, among them.

Ironically, the Southern Utah game was UNA's last game at Braly. The Lions will open the new Bank Independent Stadium on campus next season.

The university

also paying tribute to the 1990's at the game also and recognizing part of the Lions' heyday, the 30th anniversary of their third-straight Division II National Championship in 1995.

Unfortunately, losing IS often part of the growing process in football. However, consistent losses and numerous blowouts are unacceptable. Tarleton St. made the Division I move about the time UNA did, and they play winning football every year. So UNA has a lot to consider this off season.

Is it time for a change at the top? UNA Athletics Director, Dr. Josh Looney publicly stated his support for head coach Brent Dearmon after another recent loss. Is he still committed?

The new notwithstanding, stadium is in the lowest FCS tier when it comes to investing in the football program. New NIL (Name-Image-Likeness) parameters create a de facto pay-forplay environment at all NCAA levels. Will they be able to compete for quality FCS athletes and at least become competitive in most games? Or will the new stadium be a big splash in seasons one and two, and then drift into obscurity with half of the 10,000 seats empty in seasons to follow?

One big off field change this season was no radio broadcast for UNA games, instead opting for The Varsity Network, touted as "the fastest growing digital radio platform in college football."

That may be the future and offer added features but today, in some people's mind, if a college football team doesn't have a radio broadcast, it doesn't have a "presence."

At this point, we'd settle for a respectable presence on the field.



How to Prepare Your Online Accounts Before You Die

Dear Savvy Senior, I recently had an estate plan drafted, including a will, power of attorney and advance directive, but I'm not sure what to do about all my online accounts – email, banking, and social media. What can I do to make sure my family can access what they need and protect my digital information after I'm gone.

Almost 80

Dear Almost,

In addition to creating an estate plan, you should also make a "digital will" that lists all your online accounts and login information. This will help your loved ones access your electronic devices and online accounts more easily so they can manage your electronic affairs, according to your wishes, after you're gone.

Montana State University offers a Digital Assets Inventory Worksheet (see Montana.edu/estateplanning/digitalsssetsworksheet. pdf) to help you get started. Or consider purchasing a "password book" on Amazon for a few dollars. This will let you record and organize your online account information alphabetically. Here are a few other tips to help you prepare your digital life for your survivors.

Apple: If you're an iPhone, iPad or Mac user, you should nominate a "legacy contact" who can access your Apple account's data after you die. This is a secure way to give trusted people access to photos, files and messages. To set it up you'll need an Apple device with a fairly recent operating system. iPhones and iPads need iOS or iPadOS 15.2 and MacBooks need macOS Monterey 12.1.

For iPhones, go to settings, tap Sign-in & Security and then Legacy Contact. You can name one or more people, and they don't need an Apple ID or device.

You'll have to share an access key with your contact. It can be a digital version sent electronically, or you can print a copy or save it as a screenshot or PDF.

Take note that there are some types of files you won't be able to pass on – including digital rights-protected music, movies and passwords stored in Apple's password manager. Legacy contacts can only access a deceased user's account for three years before Apple deletes the account.

Google: Google takes a different approach with its **Inactive Account Manager** (see Support.google.com/ accounts/answer/3036546), which allows you to share vour data with someone if it notices that you've stopped using your account. When setting it up, you need to decide how long Google should wait - from three to 18 months - before considering your account inactive. Once that time is up, Google can notify up to 10 people.

You can choose what types of data they can access – including emails, photos, calendar entries and YouTube videos.

There's also an option to automatically delete your account after three months of inactivity, so your contacts will have to download any data before that deadline.

Facebook and Instagram: If you're on Facebook or Instagram, both of which are owned by the parent company Meta, you can have your accounts either memorialized or deleted after you die if the companies get a valid request from a family member or friend. See Facebook.com/help/1111566045566400 or Help.Instagram. com/264154560391256 for details.

Meta also strongly recommends Facebook users add a legacy contact to look after your memorial accounts – see Facebook.com/ help/1070665206293088. Legacy contacts can do things like respond to new friend requests and update pinned posts, but they can't read private messages or remove or alter previous posts. You can only choose one person, who also must have a Facebook account.

Passwords: If you use a password manager – a service that creates, saves and manages passwords for all your online accounts – see if it has an emergency access feature. Some services, like Keeper, Bitwarden and NordPass, allow users to nominate one or more trusted contacts who can access your keys in case of an emergency or death.




