CWD sampling nears 10,000 as DNR thanks hunters for participation

Minnesota's effort to track and manage chronic wasting disease (CWD) reached a major milestone this fall. According to a Nov. 20 Minnesota DNR press release, mandatory CWD sampling in designated zones wrapped up after the opening weekend of firearms deer season and participation was

Statewide, hunters have submitted nearly 10,000 samples so far this year. DNR officials extended their thanks to the many hunters who took the time to have their deer tested, noting that widespread participation is essential for detecting and responding to the disease. Thousands of test results

pending

CWD test results are updated regularly on the DNR website, which displays statewide results, summary statistics, and maps indicating where positive cases have been found. The agency notes that roughly 4,000 samples are still pending, so hunters who don't yet see results for their deer are encouraged to check back

All results collected this fall will appear on the DNR's online CWD results page, and any hunter whose deer tests positive will be contacted directly by the DNR.

Testing still available

Although mandatory sampling has concluded for the remainder of the 2025 deer seasons, hunters can still choose to have their deer state's long-term strategy to

DNR keeps three-walleye limit for Mille Lacs Lake winter season



Anglers heading to Mille Lacs Lake this winter will find familiar rules waiting for them. According to a Nov. 20 Minnesota DNR press release, the state will keep the three-walleye limit in place for the upcoming ice fishing season — a sign that the lake's walleye population continues to strengthen.

The regulation allows anglers to keep three walleye longer than 17 inches, with only one allowed to exceed 20 inches.

"Mille Lacs' walleye population is trending in a good direction for both adult and juvenile fish," said Brad Parsons, fisheries section manager for the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources. "We're pleased to keep the current regulation

in place for this winter and offer anglers this harvest opportunity."

For yellow perch, the daily and possession limit will be 10. The change is a shift from last year, which began with a perch daily and possession limit of 20 that had to be reduced to 5 after the state in early March, exceeded its harvest allocation. The daily and possession limit of 10 is intended to provide state anglers the opportunity to harvest a meal of perch while also keeping the state within its harvest allocation.

Each year the state and the Ojibwe nations who retain harvest rights in the 1837 Treaty Area jointly set the harvest amounts for different fish species in Mille Lacs for the year. Fall netting data informs where harvest levels will be set when the state and Tribes meet in January.

Once harvest levels for the year and the state's winter harvest are known, the state may need to adjust regulations for the open water season that begins on May

With northern pike increasing in abundance over the past two years to the highest numbers ever measured by the DNR, the possession limit will increase from three to five fish. This regulation retains a length limit of 30 inches that has been in place since 2020, which protects Mille Lacs Lake's

trophy-sized pike, while the possession limit increase is intended to encourage additional harvest. Winter fishing regulations for walleye will be in effect from Monday, Dec. 1, through Sunday, Feb. 22, 2026. Yellow perch regulations will be in effect from Monday, Dec. 1, through Friday, May 8, 2026. Northern pike regulations will be in

effect from Monday, Dec. 1, through Tuesday, March 31, 2026. Winter regulations for Mille Lacs Lake are set after completion of the DNR's annual fall netting assessments. The 2025 assessment found a slightly lower adult walleye abundance than in 2024, along with strong numbers of year-old walleye that have good potential to contribute

to the fishery in the future. Forage species such as young yellow perch and tullibee also are currently abundant, allowing medium to larger walleyes to fatten up over the summer and be in good condition heading into the winter. Complete regulations are available on the Minnesota DNR website (mndnr.gov/ millelacslake).

Deer harvest climbs as hunters see strong season

Minnesota deer hunters are off to one of their strongest starts in years. According to a Nov. 20 Minnesota Department of Natural Resources press release, the second weekend of firearms season has wrapped up — and the statewide harvest is noticeably on the rise.

During the first nine days of the firearms season, hunters harvested 123,634 deer, an 8% increase from last year and 5% above the five-year average. Preliminary numbers show that antlered bucks made up 64% of the harvest, does 25%, and fawns 11%.

In total, Minnesota's statewide deer harvest has reached 157,983, putting hunters 8% ahead of last year's pace. The most dramatic jump is in the northeast region, where harvest totals are up 14%.

Wildlife officials point to two mild winters and a strong growing season as likely contributors to the rebound in deer numbers — and, in turn, the successful hunt many are experiencing this fall.

Minnesota's deer hunting calendar starts each fall with archery season in September, the state's longest-running season and a favorite of

roughly 100,000 bowhunters. The spotlight then shifts in early November to the regular firearms season, which draws nearly 400,000 hunters statewide, making it the largest and most visible of the state's deer harvest periods.

A season many hunters miss

Minnesota's 16-day muzzleloader season kicks off this year on Saturday, Nov. 29, and runs through Sunday, Dec. 14. While it receives far less attention, many hunters consider it one of the most rewarding times to be in the woods.

Participation is notably

lower — only about 45,000 hunters typically head out with their traditional firearms. That reduced pressure, the DNR notes, offers four distinct advantages:

- 1. More predictable deer movement as winter approaches
- 2. Concentrated food sources, making deer easier to pattern
- 3. Better tracking conditions thanks to colder weather and the increased chance of snow
- 4. A quieter, calmer woods, ideal for hunters seeking
