



Every family has a few phrases that get passed down through generations - little bits of wisdom that settle deeper than we realize. One of mine came from my mother. She used to say, "Make sure the good times outnumber the bad."

At the time, it sounded simple. Almost too simple. But the older I get, the more I realize she was gently offering a blueprint for living. Not a plan to avoid difficulty-none of us escape that—but a reminder that even a single hard day doesn't define us. What matters is the broader arc of our lives.

And let's be honest: sometimes the bad days do pile up. Especially this time of year. The holidays can magnify whatever we're carrying: the loss of someone we love, worries about money, loneliness, or the quiet pressures we keep tucked away. Some people sail through December; others feel the weight of it.

So what do we do?

My mother's advice wasn't about ignoring pain or pretending everything is fine. It was about perspective, and the power each of us has to influence the scoreboard of our own life. If every day is hard, something needs attention. Either the circumstances need to change, or the way we're seeing those circumstances needs to shift. Both paths require courage, and both lead toward hope.

Here are a few practical ways to "tilt the balance" when a bad day shows up uninvited:

1. Measure the day in moments, not hours.

A bad morning doesn't have to equal a bad day. You can turn things around at 2:17 p.m. with a walk, a call to a friend, or a quiet cup of coffee. People who seem resilient aren't avoiding hardship, they're experts at salvaging good moments inside hard days.

2. Get outside. Even for five minutes.

There's something healing about crisp air, winter sun on your face, or watching geese skim the lake. Nature resets the nervous system in ways we don't always understand but always feel. You don't need a hike, just a few steps toward fresh air.

3. Let someone know you're struggling.

Not with a long speech. Just a sentence: "Today's been rough." Most people are far more compassionate than we give them credit for. And saying it out loud shrinks the heaviness. Pain thrives in silence. Connection weakens it. 4. Do the next small thing.

When life feels overwhelming, shrink the target. Wash one

dish. Send one message. Fold one shirt. Small wins generate momentum, and momentum creates relief. You don't have to reclaim the entire day, just the next ten minutes. 5. Revisit the things that used to bring joy.

Read a few pages of a favorite book. Turn on the song you

loved in high school. Watch a movie you've seen a hundred times. Familiar joy has power. It reminds you there's a version of yourself who still knows how to smile. 6. Limit your exposure to comparison.

Social media is a highlight reel, especially during the holidays. You're comparing your behind-the-scenes to someone else's perfectly staged front porch photo. Put the phone down. Real life happens away from the scroll. 7. Give something away—time, encouragement, gratitude.

Service is one of the fastest ways to lift a fog. Buy a stranger's coffee. Thank someone who deserves it. Send a note to a person

who shaped your life. When you brighten someone else's day, your own light strengthens. 8. Allow yourself the grace to begin again tomorrow. This might be the most important one. A rough day doesn't

into tomorrow. Let morning be a reset button. We can't control everything life hands us, but we can influence the balance sheet. The good days don't have to be spectacular. They just have to be more frequent than the bad ones. A few minutes of peace. A laugh. A moment of gratitude. A conversa-

View From The Bench by John Adams, Jr.

Hawks Humble Huskers, Again

There was no late game drama needed this year in Lincoln for Iowa to defeat Nebraska for the 10th time in the last 11 games. Iowa had won back-to-back games on walk-off field goals and 13-10 victories, but Saturday the Hawks took the drama out of the game early in the third quarter and rolled to an impressive 40-16 victory as chants of "Let's go Hawks" and "I-O-W-A" could be heard throughout Memorial Stadium the entire fourth quarter in a game that Iowa dominated in every aspect to finish their regular season 8-4 and 6-3 in the B1G. The win also wraps up an undefeated run in the Trophy Games in B1G Conference play for Iowa, where they totally dominated their rivals, Wisconsin, Minnesota and Nebraska by a total of 118-19.

The first half of this game was very competitive, with Nebraska taking a quick 7-0 lead on an Emmett Johnson short run after he had raced 70 yards to the goal line before being tripped up. Kaden Wetjen would put Iowa in great field position by returning the ensuing kickoff to the Nebraska 44-yard line, and then the Huskers were called for a facemask penalty that moved the ball to the 29-yard line. Iowa had to settle for a Drew Stevens field goal on that drive to trim the lead to 7-3. The Hawkeyes would take the lead on a beautiful stop and go route by emerging tight end DJ Vonnahme, quarterback Mark Grownoski hit him with a perfect pass and Vonnahme would score from 35-yards out to give Iowa a 10-7 lead. The Huskers would tie the game on a field goal by Kyle Cunanan, but the Hawks would answer with an impressive drive to take the lead for good on a Kamari Moulton 3-yard TD run. Cunanan added another short field goal to trim that lead to 17-16 but Iowa would take momentum into halftime and never give that up with a 51-yard drive that culminated with a short Gronowski run to give the Hawks a 24-16 lead.

Any doubt as to who would win this game was quickly removed when Karson Sharar forced a fumble on punt coverage and the ball squirted into the Nebraska end zone, where it was recovered by the Huskers for an Iowa safety that gave Iowa a 26-16 lead. Gronowski would add another TD run in the third quarter and the route was on. Moulton scored his second touchdown of the game after Reece Vanderzee made the catch of the game to put Iowa at the Nebraska one yard-line, and the Hawks lead 40-16. Iowa's defense totally shut down Nebraska in the second half, limiting them to just 42 yards after they were torched by Johnson and the Huskers for 189 yards in the first half.

I wasn't sure who would win this game until I listened to an Iowa Everywhere podcast, "2 Guys Named Chris" while driving down to Kansas City to celebrate Thanksgiving with our family. Whether you are an Iowa Hawkeye or Iowa State Cyclone fan, if you are ever looking for a podcast to add to your library, Iowa Everywhere does a fantastic job of covering both teams, and "2 Guys Named Chris" to me is the pinnacle as Chris Williams, who owns Cyclone Fanatics and Chris Hassel, who is an absolute media star who works for CBS Sports and is a die-hard Iowa Hawkeye fan, give fantastic perspectives of both programs. Chris and Chris were previewing the Iowa-Nebraska game and they were going over which each of them were going to pick, when Chris Hassel made an excellent point that stuck with me, he said "Iowa has the better team, better quarterback now that Dylan Riola is out; Nebraska is playing at home, which is a big advantage, but I'm going with Iowa all day because of their culture compared to Nebraska's culture." Hassel hit the nail on the head with the culture comment. I know Iowa fans sometimes complain about Kirk Ferentz and Iowa not winning the big game, or not having an exciting offense, but be careful what you wish for in a coach. Ferentz constantly has Iowa at 8-4 or better, his teams compete at a very high level, this year's teams is just a few plays away from making the College Football Playoffs, he recruits and develops kids with high character who rarely get in trouble, and his culture is incredibly strong. Culture is a hard word to define, but you know when a program has it and when one is still searching for it, and there is no doubt which category these two football programs are in!

The Thief of Words offers gritty realism If you like good stories you can sink your teeth into and

chew on for a while, The Thief of Words is for you. Anthony Bukoski, grandson of Polish immigrants, Marine Corps Vietnam veteran and former University of Wisconsin-Superior professor, offers a cavalcade of reallife characters in this stunning collection. Polish displaced persons, faithful Catholics and blue-collar workers dot Bukoski's landscape that ranges from Superior, Wis., flour mills and seedy lakefront bars to the steaming fields of Louisiana. Bukoski's depiction of waterfront bars

ANTHONY BUKOSKI

is hauntingly reminiscent of that of East LA by a writer with a very similar last name, Charles Bukowski.

Bukoski also evokes fatherly images similar to Theodore Roethke's "My Papa's Walz" in his title story, "The Thief of Words".

"If the neighborhood was awake, it would have wondered that something so precious could happen in the East End of Superior, Wisconsin, a father rescuing his son after a terrible thunderstorm. I wanted to be close to him to touch his work shirt, anything now that I realized how important he was for working like this, for taking care of us. This is the Polish way."

That love continues far past life on Earth. "... and each time he's here, each time I miss him, Walter

Wozniak of the Polish Club, Walter Wozniak of the Saint Adalbert's Holy Name Society, Wozniak the laborer, I say over and over in two languages, "Father . . . Father."

In the story "Chokecherries", the narrator finds similarities and unity between Polish refugees and his Native father who was displaced from the reservation.


"Forget Me Not", set in blue-collar Superior, tells how a man who goes to fight in Vietnam returns to find his girlfriend had married another man. One can only wonder if Bukoski had a similar experience.

Bukoski draws realistic characters into a masterful narrative that should leave anyone spellbound. Anyone who enjoys a good story would love this book.

Bukoski's biography is indeed impressive, with eight short story collections, including Time between Trains, a Booklist Editor's Choice as one of the best books of fiction for American libraries, and The Blondes of Wisconsin, winner of the Edna Ferber Fiction Award. He is also a member of the National Book Critics Circle and past fellow of the Christopher Isherwood
