

FRANK NESHEIM



Frank "Hank" Nesheim, beloved husband, father, and Brainerd resident, passed away on September 29, 2025, at the age of 93. His funeral was October 4, and he is interred at Camp Ripley Veterans cem-



High School in 1950, he moved to St. Paul, where he worked, learned carpentry, and served his country. When his National Guard unit was mobilized during the Korean War, he served honorably in the U.S. Army as a stateside radio operator. He married Lucy Taray of St. Paul in 1957.

Frank returned to Brainerd in 1959, where he continued working as a carpenter until 1967 when Frank's father died and Frank and Lucy took over Nesheim Bait and Tackle, and minnow hatchery. The business grew to supply minnows to dozens of bait shops in the Brainerd lakes area and surrounding cities. Far from a little store, their shop became a full-service destination offering rods, reels, ice augers, depth finders, etc., extensive varieties of tackle, and numerous types of healthy live bait.

With his quiet strength and work ethic, Frank was the steady center of the operation. He opened the shop daily at 5 a.m., tended the ponds, raised minnows, made deliveries and helped customers into the evenings. Whenever he was home, he worked in the shop. He never complained; he simply did what needed to be done. Their children helped in the summers, and they employed staff throughout the years — several of whom staved for decades. Frank led by example-calm, dependable-and his quiet integrity and sense of humor left a lasting impression on countless fishermen.

In 2025, Nesheim Bait and Tackle was inducted into the Minnesota Fishing Hall of Fame, honoring the 35 years of dedication the Nesheims and staff showed serving Minnesota anglers.

Frank was preceded in death by his parents, his brother Eugene (Sonny) Nesheim, and his sister Lois Garvey. He is survived by his wife, Lucy; his four children, Chris Nesheim-Plonsky (Dave), Julie, Nancy Davis (Bruce), and Eric (Karla); four grandchildren, and many nieces and nephews.

Frank was a devoted fan of the Timberwolves, Twins, Vikings, and Gophers-a loyal Minnesota sports fan to the end.





NewsHopper™ Snowmobiles took over the streets in northern Minnesota town

Snowmobiles took over 3rd St. NW in Aitkin as part of the Sip N Stroll event for Fishhouse Parade Day.

The Aitkin SnoDrifters and Mille Lacs Trails snowmobile clubs worked together on a historic display of sleds along with bonfires and a warming

"We increased from 17 units last year to 34 this year, though the weather was a little warmer," noted John Buhlmann, Aitkin. Buhlmann, who works at Graphic Packaging in Crosby, is an active member of the SnoDrifters Snowmobile Club of Aitkin. "To attract more snowmobile owners to join our display, we did lots of advertising," explained Buhlmann.

The furthest participant traveled from Somerset Wisconsin. Of special note where two Arctic Cat units— one of the earliest snowmachines. The entire display showed everything from Teardrops Ski-Doos from the late 60s and Scorpions made right in Crosby.

"We actually partner with Mille Lacs Trails," continued Buhlmann. "We take over the street and build up two bonfires. We have the warming tent there and Mille Lacs Trails has clothes for sale. We sell snowmobile club memberships and tickets for our cash raffle."


