## Sertoma Club's Winter Wonderland at Northland Arboretum



The glow of the holidays has officially returned to the Northland Arboretum, where the Brainerd Area Noon Sertoma Club's Winter Wonderland is now open for its 18th year. The beautiful drive-thru Christmas light display, a tradition since 2007, once again transforms the wooded trails into a sparkling maze of festive color, music and motion.

This year's display features more than 80 lighted and animated scenes, offering families a bright escape into holiday cheer. Visitors spend 15 to 30 minutes winding through the glowing pathways, all while tuning their radios to holiday music that accompanies the route.

Winter Wonderland is open 5:30 to 8 p.m. on Thursday, Friday and Saturday nights through Dec. 23. Beginning

Dec. 24 through Dec. 31, the display welcomes visitors every night through the end of the month.

The entrance is located at the Northland Arboretum Visitors Center, 14250 Conservation Drive in Baxter.

# Long Lake CC prepares for 2026

The woods around Long Lake Conservation Center (LLCC) are alive with the sounds of laughter, learning, and a love of nature. As the 2025–26 school year gets underway, the center has already hosted a bustling season filled with discovery and adventure.

So far, 14 schools have visited Long Lake, bringing 1,043 students for immersive, hands-on environmental learning. Another seven schools and 500 students are scheduled before year's end, keeping the trails well-traveled and the classrooms buzzing.

Altogether, LLCC educators have delivered more than 550 hours of environmental education this fall alone. That learning has been supported by \$86,311 in financial aid from the Environment and Natural Resources Trust Fund, administered by the Legislative-Citizen Commission on Minnesota Resources (LCCMR), and \$9,560 in scholarships from the Long Lake Conservation Foundation. Since September 1, the center has also hosted seven non-school groups, proving that Long Lake isn't just for students—it's for everyone who loves the outdoors.

And if you think this fall has been busy, just wait until you see what's in store for 2026. The new year promises to be one of the most creative and community-driven yet, filled with stories, art, and

music inspired by nature itself.

The program not only helps keep the county's natural beauty intact but also reduces the environmental impact of discarded electronics, which often end up in landfills. By responsibly recycling the old lights and cords, residents are ensuring that valuable resources, such as copper, are repurposed, helping to conserve raw materials.

"Everyone has those tangled strings of lights or worn-out extension cords hiding in a drawer or garage," said Strack. "Now, instead of letting them collect

dust, you can easily recycle them and do something good for the community."

The initiative is part of the county's ongoing efforts to promote responsible waste management and sustainability. The Land Services Department is always available to assist residents with other recycling or waste-related questions, whether it's about hazardous materials, composting, or demolition waste.
