AUBURN - Last year, UNA announced a football game with Auburn during the 2028 season. The game was previously announced for September but has since moved to later in the season.


Now, in a recent joint announcement, a second game has been scheduled at Jordan-Hare Stadium for the 2032 season.

Hammock cautions those paying by mail the payment must be postmarked by December 31. He said the mail goes through Birmingham and then is taken to Florence, which can take several

days.
"We have seen them take as long as five days and we've seen them in one day," Hammock said. "That's my concern. It doesn't matter when we work it. It must be postmarked before the end of the year."

Payments also can be made in person and online for Lauderdale County residents, he said.

To pay online, go to alproptax.com and enter your county in the box that pops up and follow instructions. Hammock said a 2.5% online fee is added for the transaction.

Residents also can come to the revenue commissioner's office on the first floor of the Lauderdale County Courthouse to file in person. Hammock said work on the heating and air conditioning system is underway, so he recommends dressing warmly.

Those who file late incur a cost of \$20 per account and 1% of what they owe, Hammock said.

He said the courthouse is open Thursday, Friday, Monday and Tuesday and then closes starting Wednesday, December 24, for Christmas.

It reopens December 29 and remains open through December 31. That is a total of seven business

days for filing. Courthouse hours are 8am-5pm.

The Colbert County Courthouse will close on December 24, December 25, and December 26. Its hours are 8am-4:30pm.

Lauderdale County homeowners 65 and older who have lived at the same location at least five vears can fill out a senior property tax exemption, Hammock said.

He said there are no income restrictions on the program. Homeowners must reapply for the program each year.

A bill authorizing the freeze was introduced during the 2024 legislative session by District 1 State Rep. Phillip Pettus, R-Greenhill. It was signed into law by Gov. Kay Ivey on April 30, 2024.

Lauderdale County voters overwhelmingly approved of the local referendum, which received 95% of the vote in the 2024 general election.

Anyone who wants to file for the exemption can come to the revenue commission's office on the first floor of the courthouse and show proof of ownership of the home for at least five years and that you are at least

to those who do not have dental insurance and who cannot afford this service otherwise," said volunteer dental director, Dr. Gil Griggs. "Many of our patients are referred to us from Emergency Rooms or from other dental offices.

Special recognition was given to Dr. Griggs at the event for his 25 years of volunteering as dental director. Also honored was Dr. Nicholas Pieroni who provided 52% of the program's dental clinics over that period. Each was honored by dedicating the dental exam rooms in their honor.



• On Dec. 22, 2001, the world's first cloned cat, appropriately named CC, or Copy Cat, made her debut in a Texas biomedical lab. She lived for 18 years, possessed all the attributes of a normal cat, and her

birth jumpstarted a petcloning industry around the world.

• On Dec. 23, 1982, the Missouri Department of Health and the federal Centers for Disease Control told residents of Times

Beach, Missouri, that their town was contaminated by the chemical dioxin sprayed on its unpaved roads, with the unfortunate result that the town would have to be demolished. By February, the federal and state governments had spent \$36 million to buy all the town's houses, with the exception of one that the owners refused to sell, and the city was officially disincorporated.

• On Dec. 24, 1801, British inventor Richard Trevithick took seven of his friends for a test ride in his "Puffing Devil," aka "Puffer,"

the first steam-powered passenger vehicle.

On Dec. 25, 1971, Garo Yepremian punted a 37-yard field goal in the second overtime of an AFC playoff game, giving the Miami Dolphins a 27-24 victory over the Kansas City Chiefs in the longest game in NFL history: 82 minutes and 40 seconds.

• On Dec. 26, 1946, mobster Benjamin "Bugsy" Siegel opened the Flamingo Hotel in Las Vegas, Nevada. Singer/comedian Jimmy Durante headlined the entertainment, with music by band leader

Xavier Cugat. The opening flopped, however, due to bad weather that kept away many Hollywood guests, and as gamblers didn't have rooms at the hotel, they took their winnings and gambled elsewhere. The casino lost \$300,000 in its first week.

• On Dec. 27, 1935, Regina Jonas became the first woman ordained as a rabbi. After many male rabbis fled Germany during World War II, she stepped into the void, though synagogues, at least, would not welcome her. She died in Auschwitz.

• On Dec. 28, 1917, writer/

satirist H.L. Mencken published a history of the bathtub, including a claim that bathing was unlawful in Boston between 1845 and 1862. The story, which was a spoof designed to test reader gullibility, was widely shared by newspapers and historians. (c) 2025 King Features Synd., Inc.



A small gesture that may seem insignificant to some can mean the world to others.


Regardless of our position, there is ALWAYS someone who has a greater need.

We have covered the different types of health plans and how to choose the one that may be best for you. We also discussed Medicare prescription drug plans and how they can change and need to be reviewed each year. But, just because the Annual Enrollment Period is over doesn't mean you can go to sleep at the wheel. There are some things you need to stay on top of.

To begin with you should make sure you have received your enrollment card from each insurance company you signed up with. If you enrolled into a Medicare Supplement and prescription drug plan you should have received two cards. One card from the company handling your supplement and another card from the company handling your drug plan. If you enrolled in a Medicare Advantage plan you should have received one card and that's from the company your Advantage plan is with.

The second thing to verify is your premium is coming from the appropriate place such as your bank account or Social Security check. You may not know this until January. If the premium is taken out of your bank account, for example, and you don't see it deducted in January you will want to contact the company. You don't want to go two or three months without paying the premium and then have to pay those months at one time. It's better to address it up front.





coin would only be worth its assigned \$50. However, to someone who understands the value of gold, the coin is worth much, much more.

'I dabble in collecting silver and precious metals, so I knew it would be worth something," Stoltz said. "This is my first year being part of the Army, and I was expecting

to count some folded-up bills and loose change, but we have a very generous area."

Salvation Army Lts. Tim Michelle and Cook said this is not the Cook first time they have encountered a gold coin in

a Red Kettle. They were formerly stationed in Louisville, Kentucky, and they said a donor would drop one in a kettle each year still wrapped in its plastic

packaging.
So, they knew that it was important to have the coin appraised.

I went in just wanting to get it checked out and wanting to talk to someone more knowledgeable," Michelle Cook said. "The coin is valued at \$4,225. I was just trying to keep my composure.

She added the coin was so valuable because of its condition. Per the appraiser, it is nearly perfect with no evidence of wear.

'You can still feel all the ridges," she said. "It looks like the donor took it out of the case and put it directly in the kettle.

The appraiser intends to purchase the coin, and the anonymous match day donor has agreed to include the appraised value of the coin in the match amount.

A total of \$26,000.55 was raised on match day, including the coin's appraised value.

Once the anonymous donor provides the match, that will bring the match day total to \$52,001.10. The 2025 Red Kettle campaign total through December 13 was \$103,000.55.

"Kettle season is one of our biggest funding sources for programming and social services," and social services,
Tim Cook said. "This is
the time of year
when people are
more

generous, and it's the same time when... because it's the end of the year, a lot of belts get tightened with the Christmas season and the season

turning colder. More funding is being used to support the community, but the community is also donating more.

"The Salvation Army had a slogan a few years ago: 'Hope knows no season,'' said Michelle Cook. "It's true. The more money we raise during Red Kettle, the longer we can help the community."

The Red Kettle campaign goal is \$300,000 this year.







How To Help Yourself If You Are Hurt In An Accident

Personal injury law is an area of the law where caring about a client and hoping that the law provides a solution is important. People get hurt and there's tons of lawyers who want the case and it looks like it's all about profit for the lawyer. People don't know what to do or who to hire when they get hurt. There ought

to be statistics on lawyers like there are on baseball players so you can see who really gets the job done, but

One mistake that we see that does hurt someone's case, whether they try and resolve the case themselves or whether they call a personal injury firm like ours, is failing to tell the doctor or nurse that you were hurt in an accident. Obviously, telling a doctor or a nurse that you were in an accident can change the way you are perceived, and I understand that. However, at the end of the day, if whoever evaluates your claim looks at the medical records and there's no mention of an accident, then it hurts whatever case you may have had.

The nuts and bolts of this area of the law primarily consists of three areas:

- 1) Did somebody break a rule like running a stop sign?
 - 2) Was someone hurt as a result?
 - 3) How did the injury affect them?

In other words, if a person who is working 40 hours a week supporting their family is hurt, can't do their job, and has lost wages, that's a valid claim. That is a different claim than someone who's retired and on a fixed income would have. Could be the same facts and injury, but a different result.

In every personal injury case, if it comes down to a contest, the doctor has to say that the accident caused the injury and the treatment. If you don't tell them, they don't know. The doctors are simply lost at that point.


Help yourself by telling your healthcare providers that you were involved in an accident and that your injuries are related to that accident. From a medical standpoint, doctors rely on an accurate history to diagnose and treat injuries. When a doctor knows the injury resulted from a car accident, they are more likely to order imaging and properly document the injury correctly. Medical records are one of the strongest forms of evidence in a personal injury case. If your records don't link your injuries to the accident, the insurance companies will argue that your condition is unrelated to the accident.

Telling your doctor that you were in a car accident protects both your health and your rights. What you say to your doctor matters. If that doctor doesn't want to treat you, there's one down the street who does.



How To Find a Quality Nursing Home for Your Loved One

Dear Savvy Senior, Can you give me some tips on picking a good nursing home for my father? Since his stroke, I've been taking care of him at home, but he's gotten to the point where it's too much for me to handle. Exhausted Daughter

Dear Exhausted, Choosing a nursing home for a loved one that provides quality is a very important decision that requires careful evaluation and some homework. Here are some steps you can take that can help you find a good facility and avoid a bad one.

Make a list: There are several sources vou can turn to for referrals to top nursing homes in your area including the Area Agency on Aging (call 800-677-1116 or visit *Eldercare.acl.gov* for contact information); your dad's doctor or nearby hospital discharge planner; friends or neighbors who may have had a loved one in a nursing home; and online at Medicare's nursing home compare tool at Medicare. *gov/care-compare*. This tool will not only help you locate nursing homes in your area, but it also provides a 5-star rating system on recent health inspections, staffing, quality of care, and overall rating.

Also, keep in mind that it's always best to choose a nursing home that's close to family members and friends who can visit often, because residents with frequent visitors usually get better care.

Call your long-term care ombudsman: This is a government official who investigates nursing home complaints and advocates for residents and their families. This person can tell you which nursing homes have had complaints or problems in the past and can help you locate a good facility. Visit *LTCombudsman.org* for local contact information.

Contact the nursing homes: Once you've

narrowed your search, call the nursing homes you're interested in to verify that they can facilitate your dad's needs. Also, find out if they have any vacancies, what they charge, and if they accept Medicaid.

Tour your top choices:

During your nursing home visit, notice the cleanness and smell of the facility. Is it homey and inviting? Does the staff seem responsive and kind to its residents? Additionally, be sure to taste the food, and talk to the residents and their family members, if available. Ít's also a good idea to visit several times at different times of the day and different days of the week to get a broader perspective.

And be sure to find out about their staff screening and training procedures, staff-to-patient ratio, and the staff turnover rate.

To help you rate your visit, Medicare offers a helpful checklist of questions to ask at *Medicare.gov/media/document/12130nursing-home-checklist508.pdf* that you can print and take with you on your visit.

Paying for Care

With nursing home costs now averaging \$324 per day nationally for a semi-private room and nearly \$371 for a private room, paying for care is another area you may have questions about or need assistance with. Medicare only helps pay up to 100 days of rehabilitative nursing home care, which must occur after a hospital stay of at least three days.

Most nursing home residents pay for care from either personal savings, a long-term care insurance policy, or through Medicaid once their savings are depleted. Or, if your dad is a veteran, he may be able to get funds through the VA's Aid and Attendance benefit (see VA.gov/pension/aid-attendance-housebound).

To learn more about the payment options, ask the nursing home director. You can also get help from your State Health Insurance Assistance Program (SHIP), which provides free counseling on all Medicare and Medicaid issues. To find a local SHIP counselor visit *ShipHelp.org* or call 877-839-2675.
