Six Retired Floridians...

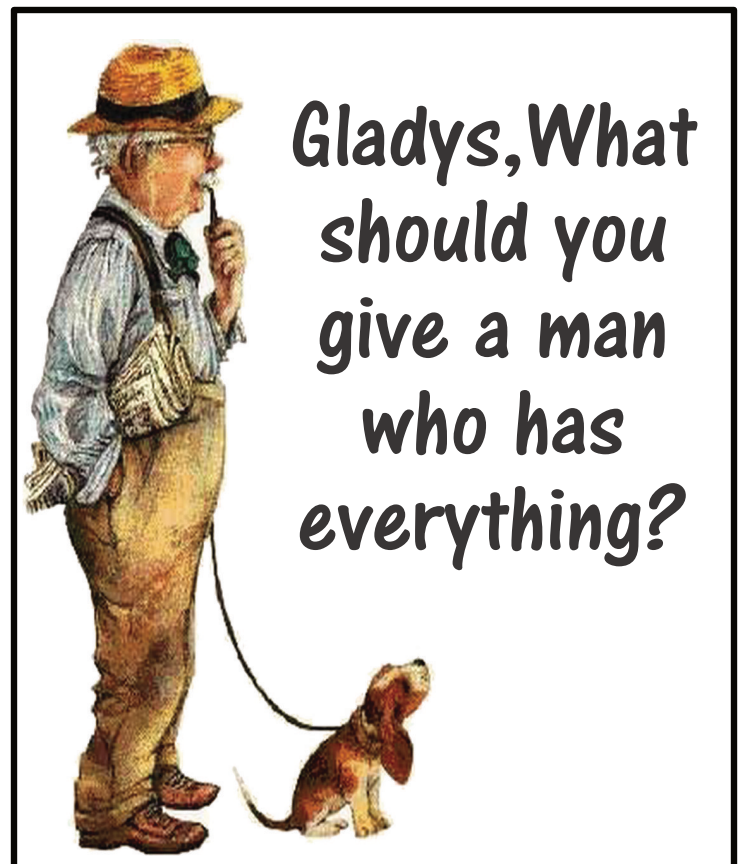

What Happened in Texas?

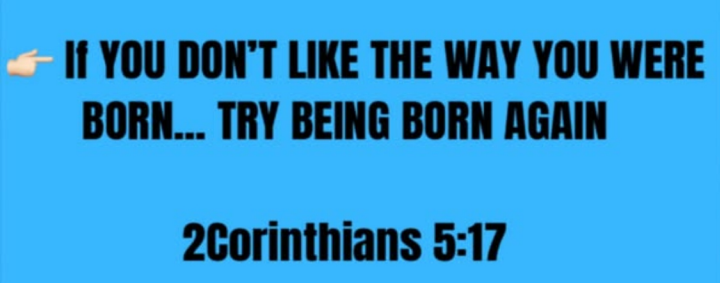

AUNT T'S KITCHEN

SOUTHWEST PORK STEW

Ingredients

- 1 (16-ounce) jar Salsa Verde
- 2 cups Reduced-Sodium Chicken Broth
- 1 (15-ounce) can Black Beans (drained and rinsed)
- 1 (15-ounce) can Tomatoes (fire-roasted diced)
- 1 pound Smoked Pork (shredded, without sauce)
- 1 teaspoon Ground Cumin
- Kosher Salt (and freshly ground black pepper)



Directions

1. Cook salsa verde in a large saucepan over medium-high heat, stirring occasionally, 2 minutes. Stir in chicken broth and next 4 ingredients, and bring to a boil. Reduce heat to medium, and simmer, stirring occasionally, 10 minutes. Season with salt and pepper, and serve immediately.

POTATO, LEEK, AND ROASTED GARLIC

Ingredients

- 3 small garlic heads roasted
- 1 Tbsp. olive oil
- 1 1/2 tsp. kosher salt
- 2 Tbsp. unsalted butter
- 3 cups leeks, trimmed, washed, and thinly sliced
- 3 cups Yukon Gold potatoes, peeled and chopped
- 6 cups chicken broth
- 1/2 cup mayonnaise
- Freshly ground black pepper, fresh thyme leaves, and croutons, for topping



Directions

1. Melt butter in a large saucepan over medium. Add leeks, and cook, stirring occasionally, until starting to soften, about 3 minutes. Add potatoes and 1/2 teaspoon of the salt, and cook, stirring occasionally, about 2 minutes. Add chicken broth; bring to a boil over medium-high. Reduce heat to medium, and vigorously simmer, stirring occasionally, until potatoes are very soft, about 18 minutes. Add roasted garlic using immersion blender, process until smooth.
2. Place mayonnaise in a medium bowl, and gradually pour 1 cup of the potato mixture into bowl, whisking constantly until smooth. Pour mayonnaise mixture back into pot along with

remaining 1/2 teaspoon salt; blend until smooth. Top with pepper, thyme, and croutons, and serve immediately.

TENNESSEE ONION

Ingredients

- 1/4 cup (2 oz.) unsalted butter, cubed
- 3 lb. sweet onions (about 4 large), thinly sliced (about 9 cups)
- 2 1/2 tsp. seasoned salt
- 2 tsp. dried Italian seasoning
- 1 tsp. dry mustard
- 1 Tbsp. Worcestershire sauce
- 2 tsp. apple cider vinegar
- 5 cups chicken broth
- 12 (1/2 -in.-thick) slices baguette, plus more for serving)
- 3/4 cup Cheddar cheese, shredded
- 3/4 cup smoked Gouda cheese, shredded



Directions

1. Step 1 Heat butter in a large Dutch oven over medium-high until melted. Add onions, seasoned salt, Italian seasoning, and mustard; stir to coat onions in butter and seasonings. Cook, stirring occasionally, until onions are translucent, 5 to 7 minutes. Cover, reduce heat to medium-low, and cook, stirring occasionally, until onions are very soft, 25 to 30 minutes. Step 2) Stir in Worcestershire and apple cider vinegar; increase heat to medium-high. Cook, uncovered, stirring often, until onions are light golden brown, about 10 minutes. (The onions will release liquid.)
2. Step 3 Add broth; cook, scraping up browned bits from bottom of Dutch oven; bring to a boil over high, stirring occasionally. Reduce heat to medium and simmer, undisturbed, for 10 minutes. Remove from heat.
3. Step 4: Preheat oven to broil with rack about 8 inches from heat source. Ladle soup into 6 (8- to 10-ounce) broiler-proof bowls or crocks, and place bowls on a rimmed baking sheet. Top each bowl with 2 baguette slices, 2 tablespoons Cheddar, and 2 tablespoons Gouda. Broil in preheated oven until cheese is bubbly and bread is browned in places, 2 to 4 minutes..

Coconut-Curry Butternut Squash

Ingredients

- 1/4 cup extra-virgin olive oil
- 1 teaspoon curry powder
- 1/2 teaspoon cumin
- 1/4 teaspoon chili powder
- 1/8 teaspoon cinnamon
- 2 yellow onions, sliced
- 1 large butternut squash, peeled and seeded, cubed
- 1 1/2 teaspoons kosher salt
- 1 (13.5-oz.) can coconut milk
- Water as needed
- 1/2 teaspoon apple cider vinegar



Directions

1. Heat oil in a Dutch oven over medium heat. Add spices and stir until spices color the oil and become fragrant, about 1 minute. Add onion and cook over medium heat until soft and translucent, about 8 minutes. Add butternut squash, salt, coconut milk, and enough water to just cover the squash. Bring to a boil and then reduce to a simmer.
2. Allow to cook until squash is very soft, about 40 minutes.
3. Allow squash to cool slightly before using an immersion blender to puree the soup.
4. Finally, stir the apple cider vinegar into the pureed soup.

BLACKED-EYED PEA WITH HAM HOCKS

Ingredients

- 1 Tbsp. olive oil
- 2 cups chopped yellow onion
- 3 garlic cloves, minced
- 1 tsp. ground cumin
- 2 lb. smoked ham hocks
- 1 lb. dried black-eyed peas
- 10 cups lower-sodium chicken broth
- 3 cups chopped stemmed collard greens
- 3/4 cup chopped celery
- 2 dried bay leaves
- 1 (8 1/2-oz.) pkg. precooked microwavable white rice
- 1 1/2 Tbsp. fresh thyme leaves
- 3/4 tsp. black pepper
- 1/2 tsp. kosher salt
- 1/4 tsp. cayenne pepper



Directions

1. Heat olive oil in a large nonstick skillet over medium. Add onion; cook, stirring often, until translucent, but not brown, about 5 minutes. Add minced garlic and cumin; cook, stirring frequently, until garlic is fragrant, about 1

minute. Transfer mixture to a 6-quart slow cooker. Stir in ham hocks, black-eyed peas, chicken broth, collard greens, celery, and bay leaves. Cover and cook until ham hocks and peas are very tender, about 4 hours on HIGH or 7 to 8 hours on LOW.

2. Remove and discard bay leaves from soup. Use tongs to transfer ham hocks to a cutting board. Let stand until cool enough to handle, about 5 minutes. Remove and discard bones and skin; shred meat into bite-size pieces. Return shredded ham hocks to mixture in slow cooker, and stir to combine. Add rice; stir until heated through, about 1 minute. Mix in thyme, black pepper, salt, and cayenne. Serve hot.

SWEET POTATO

Ingredients

- 2 Tbsp. olive oil
- 1 1/2 cups chopped yellow onion
- 1 cup roughly chopped carrots
- 1 Tbsp. chopped garlic
- 3 lbs. sweet potatoes, peeled and cut into 1/2-inch cubes
- 2 lbs. Yukon Gold potatoes, peeled and cut into 1/2-inch cubes
- 1 1/2 tsp. kosher salt
- 1 tsp. black pepper
- 1 tsp. ground cumin
- 1/4 tsp. ground cinnamon
- 1/8 tsp. cayenne pepper
- 7 cups chicken stock
- 2 Tbsp. salted butter
- 1 cup finely chopped pecans TOASTED
- 1/2 cup plain yogurt
- 1/4 cup torn fresh flat-leaf parsley leaves



Directions

1. Heat oil in a large Dutch oven over medium-high. Add onion and carrots, and cook, stirring, until softened, about 5 minutes.
2. Add garlic, and cook, stirring, until fragrant, 1 minute. Add sweet potatoes, Yukon Gold potatoes, salt, black pepper, cumin, cinnamon, and cayenne pepper, and cook, stirring, 1 minute.

Add stock; bring to a boil. Reduce heat to medium-low, and simmer until potatoes are very tender, about 30 minutes.

Process soup in Dutch oven using an immersion blender until smooth.

Top servings with 2 tablespoons pecans, 1 tablespoon yogurt, and 1/2 tablespoon parsley.

One of them indicated that 256,000 people liked it, 1.3 million people commented on it, and 16,500

May the year 2026 bring all of you a very blessed and fruitful New Year.

The summer and fall of 2025 brought the most extreme climate conditions in our corner of Alabama that this human has ever experienced, bringing extremely stressful conditions for both gardening and plant survival. After finding myself on the ground staring at the sky, and wondering what happened, I learned the drastic effects of dehydration and the utmost importance of drinking plenty of water with added electrolytes! An important life lesson! The long drought affected our fruit trees and some ornamental shrubs, because too little regular watering has caused much damage, even killing a few treasured rose bushes.

However, the abundant rainfall of several days answered many prayers! We love the wonderful blessings of winter's cooler days, making outside projects so much more enjoyable and enduring. It's also been a happy time of tidying up the garden beds, small or large, gathering free mulch from fallen leaves and pine needles (from our neighbors' trees) to spread lightly over the garden beds, which in turn provide moisture retention

and valuable organic nutrients that aerate and enrich the soil as they break down.

Most winter veggies as transplants can handle below freezing temperatures, such as broccoli, cabbages, celery, collards, garlic, kale, leeks, lettuce, rutabaga, spinach, and Swiss Chard.

Check online for your variety of any of these to learn how much cold tolerance they can take. My online search reveals that "Root vegetables like carrots and parsnips become sweeter after frost, and their roots can survive in the ground with mulch protection, even as low as 0o" (according to AI).

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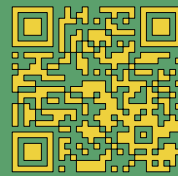
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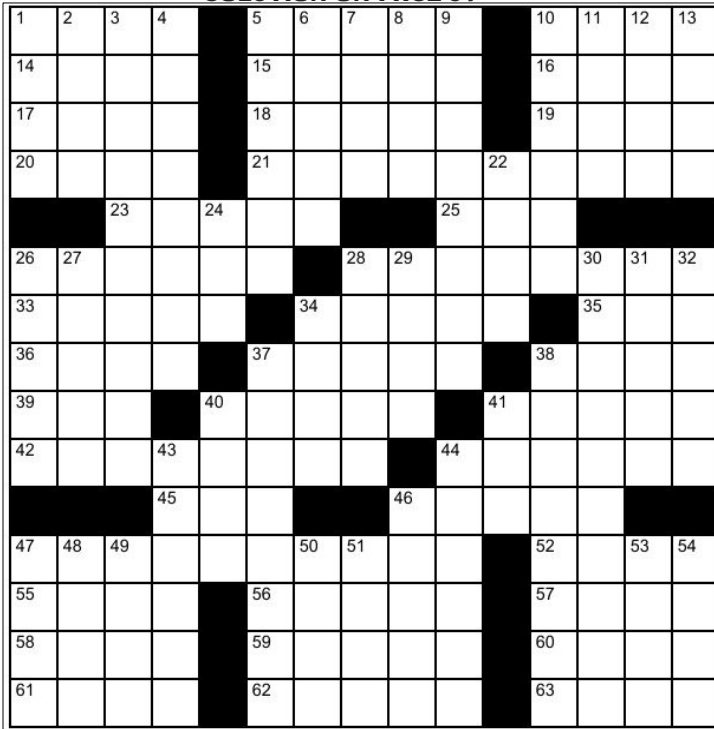

Though he never learned to read and write English, Sequoyah singlehandedly brought literacy to the Cherokees. Fascinated by white men's books, this son of an Indian woman and a white trader dreamed of creating a written language. His breakthrough came when he divided all Cherokee sounds into 86 syllables, devising a symbol to represent each one. Inspired by the script in missionary Bibles, Sequoyah used it as the basis for his new alphabet, turning letters upside down or on their sides, sometimes adding curlicues. However intricate the designs, their function was simple, and Sequoyah taught his five-year-old daughter to read in less than a week. In 1821 a group of skeptical tribal chiefs also mastered the alphabet in seven days, then gave Sequoyah permission to teach the language to the whole tribe.

After his death in 1843, this Cherokee chieftain was honored in a way that made his name known far and wide: the towering redwood trees of California were named Sequoias.

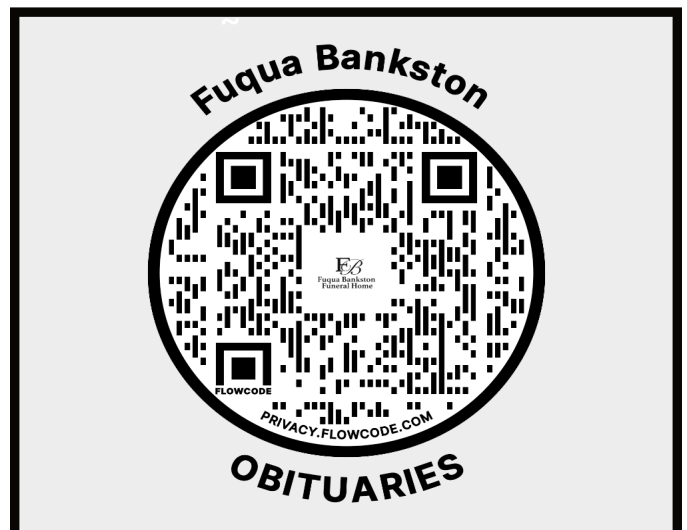
