

California State Historical Resources Commission unanimously finds Willow Glen Trestle eligible for listing on the **National Register of Historic Places**

he Friends of the Willow Glen Trestle nominated the Willow Glen Trestle for listing on the California Register of Historical Resources and the National Register of Historic Places. The nomination was approved yesterday following a public hearing before the California State Historical Resources Commission in San Francisco. The nomination was contested by the City of San José. In 2014, the Friends of the Willow Glen Trestle won their public-interest lawsuit challenging San José's refusal to prepare an environmental impact report (EIR) to consider alternatives to demolition of the evocative 1922 Trestle as part of the Three Creeks Trail. The City's appeal of that decision to the Sixth District Court of Appeal remains pending. The City also prepared an EIR but has not yet reconsidered the demolition based on that EIR. The City's Historic Landmarks



Ashritha Eswaran of Evergreen competes in Chess Championship

hess champion Ashritha Eswaran, 15, has been invited to the invitation- only 2016 U.S. Women's Chess Championship in St. Louis for the second year in a row last week.

Eswaran, a sophomore at Notre Dame High School in San Jose, is among only 12 of the nation's best female chess players invited to participate in the prestigious event. In 2014, she was the youngest player and won a prize for the Best Game of the Tournament, had three wins, and was the youngest and lowestrated player in the tournament.

Eswaran began playing chess when she turned seven, and at 13, she received her National Master title. Her ratings have risen rapidly, in January 2010, she had a rating of 650 and by Feb. 2014, she became Candidate Master. She received training first at the NorCal House of Chess and then with Bulgarian GM Dejan Bojkov.

In June 2015, Eswaran won first place in the U.S. Girls Junior Championship in Tulsa, Oklahoma

despite being lowest seed. She won with a 6.5/9 and qualified to play in the 2016 US Women's Championship. The very next day, she flew to Cali, Colombia for the 2015 Pan American Youth Chess Championship, where she tied for first place, but ended up getting the Bronze through a tie break in Girls Under 18 section.

In August of 2015, Eswaran won first place at the Pam Am in El Salvador, and received title of Woman International Master. This year in February, Eswaran played and came in an impressive third in the incredibly competitive American Continental Women's Champion-ship in Lima, Peru, for the second time.

Eswaran is also a part of the "Young Stars - Team USA" program which is sponsored by the Kasparov Chess Foundation (KCF) and the Chess Club & Scholastic Center of Saint Louis (CCSCSL). Other accomplishments throughout her career: All-Girls National Championship U12 (2012) and again in 2013 in U14 section. She



played in the World Youth Championships four times from 2012-2015.

Renters Rights Coalition calls for rental reform after inadequate Council response

ast night, the most intense mobilization of San José tenants and their allies in decades forced the City Council to make the first real changes in its ineffectual rent control ordinance since 1979. Shockingly, the Council failed to make improvements to the law that would be strong enough to stem the current massive tide of displacement of low-income and diverse families and individuals in our community. This anemic response flew in the

face of the City Housing

Department's expertly-researched study of the ineffectiveness of the City's rent policies and the profitability of rent-controlled properties. It was also an insultingly inadequate response to story after story of hardship that renters told, hour after hour, late into the night at City Hall. Our lower income neighbors—workers who cook the food, care for those who are elderly and ill, and clean the floors; seniors; families with children; and people with disabilities—also have the human right to live in health, safe and secure housing in San Jose.


Our large and growing coalition of community based-organizations—together with swelling ranks of renters—who see daily the effects of poor housing conditions, unfair evictions, and skyrocketing rents, will not allow this weak and ineffective response to stand. In the weeks and months to come, our coalition will again press this City Council for stronger rent caps and meaningful protections against unfair evictions and displacement. And we will keep coming back until renters are treated justly in our community.

voted, unanimously, to designate the Willow Glen Trestle as a City landmark, but its recommendation was overturned by the City Council. The EIR considered conflicting opinions as to historic status but relied on the opinion of one historic expert to conclude that the trestle was not historic.


"Now that the State Historical Resources Commission has determined that the Willow Glen Trestle qualifies as an historic resource eligible for listing on the California and National historic registers, California law requires that the City treat it as historic," said Friends of Willow Glen spokesperson Dr. Larry Ames. "We are thrilled that this issue has been conclusively resolved."

The EIR prepared by the City had concluded that the trestle could be safely rehabilitated for use in the Three Creeks Trail project, but could be slightly more costly to maintain over the next 50 years than a new steel bridge. Since the EIR concluded that the trestle was not historic, its demolition would have no adverse environmental impact. That conclusion is no longer valid.

One of the speakers in favor of historic status was Milford Wayne Donaldson, FAIA, the former California State Historic Preservation Officer. Another was Seth Bernstein, an expert in historic resources, who explained to the Commission how the trestle helped to shape the community of Willow Glen.

"Now that the trestle is confirmed to be an historic resource, demolition is unlawful because rehabilitation for the Three Creeks Trail project is feasible," said Friends' lawyer Susan Brandt-Hawley, "and the City's Gayle Frank of appeal is moot." Preservation Action Council of San José (PAC*SJ), who also spoke in favor of listing at the hearing of the state Commission added: "We are so pleased with the unanimous vote that will protect the Willow Glen Trestle." Martha Heinrichs, a member of the Friends group, stated: "This amazing 94-year-old wooden train trestle in Willow Glen has supported many decades of history here in Santa Clara County when we were known as the 'Valley of Hearts Delight.' It is an important link to the families that farmed and had orchards here; to those workers who labored picking the crops to send to the canneries; to those who worked in the canneries; and to those connected with the railroad. One can see how closely genealogy, history, and historic preservation are connected with this train trestle: a treasure worthy of recognition and preservation."

"We are long-time trail advocates. We commit to working with the City to secure funding to rehabilitate the trestle as a safe, long-term segment of the new Three Creeks Trail," added Dr. Ames.



While the trestle once carried trains, it now has become a historic resource.



Report uncovers crisis of underemployment in Silicon Valley

new report by Working Partnerships USA, The Center for Popular Democracy and the Fair Workweek Initiative, uncovers the widespread epidemic of underemployment in San Jose. Released as San Jose's Opportunity to Work campaign gathers signatures for a first-of-its-kind ballot initiative to help hourly workers gain access to more hours on the job, the report's findings provide one explanation for the growing inequality that has plagued Silicon Valley, as the growing prevalence of part-time jobs have denied many the chance at a meaningful paycheck. In San Jose more than four out of every ten hourly workers do not have full-time employment at their primary job, forcing one out of every three households into financial uncertainty.

"Silicon Valley is one of the wealthiest regions in the country, but even in an economic boom, far too many working people can't earn enough to make ends meet," said Working Partnerships USA Executive Director Derecka Mehrens about why her organization started investigating this issue. "The data and the worker stories point to a crisis of underemployment characterized by the rise in unstable, part-time jobs. The minimum wage is finally catching up, but working people can't even make it on \$15 an hour if they aren't getting enough hours at work."

The report, A Hidden Crisis: Underemployment in Silicon Valley's Hourly Workforce, shows that a raise in the minimum wage alone will not move working families out of poverty, arguing for the need to reform work schedule policies that have not kept up with changing employment structures. Locally, the Opportunity to Work Initiative would require large employers to offer additional work hours to current qualified workers before hiring new staff to fill the need.

"Most Americans count on good wages and enough hours to make ends meet," said Carrie Gleason, Director of the Fair Workweek Initiative at the Center for Popular Democracy. "San Jose has been a leader in the country's movement to raise the minimum wage and so it makes sense communities are calling for more hours. The data shows what we all know - we have too little say in the hours we work. It's getting harder to have a paycheck families can count on when employers only offer half a job without stable hours. San Jose's economy is thriving and the Opportunity to Work Initiative will help ensure that working people in the city thrive."

The data also highlights how underemployment dis-

proportionately impacts people of color, women, and immigrants, with sixty three percent of hourly parttime workers being women and sixty nine percent being people of color.

Salvador Bustamante, Executive Director of Latinos United for a New America, explained, "By the time people pay rent, they have next nothing left to get through the rest of the month and put food on the table. How can they get by on only 10 or 20 hours a week of work? They're stringing together two or three jobs just to make ends meet and it puts a huge strain on their families and their health."

Alejandra Mejia, a 10 year McDonald's employee and leader in the Fight for \$15, shared the impact of this trend on her own family: "My work hours have always been up and down. This week, they only gave me eight hours, even though they keep hiring new people. I'm a single mom with three kids. I can't support my family on so little. I'm already on food stamps and if I can't pay rent, I literally don't know where we will go."

"Public policy like the Opportunity to Work Initiative would give 64,000 part-time workers in San Jose the chance to work sufficient hours for a reliable, livable paycheck," said Ben Field, Executive Officer of the South Bay AFL-CIO Labor Council. "Currently, more than three-fourths of the part-time workforce earns less than \$15 an hour. Opportunity to Work, coupled with an increase in the regional minimum wage to \$15 an hour by 2019, will help these workers pay their rent and put food on the table."

Part-time hourly workers, of which 58 percent are rent-burdened (paying more than 30 percent of their household income for rent) and 45 percent lack access to job-based health insurance, find it more and more challenging to meet their most basic needs as the cost of living continues to skyrocket. From the groundbreaking San Jose minimum wage increase in 2012 to the Opportunity to Work Initiative, Silicon Valley continues to serve as a model for the rest of the country of how the new economy can generate shared prosperity.


