





David Engen, a former Minneapolis pastor, is Norway's budding reality TV star whose fame is now emigrating to America. Engen, won Season 6 of Norway's reality TV show "Alt for Norge" ("Everything for Norway" the motto for Norway's royal family) this past November.

The award-winning series, often referred to as "The Great Norway Adventure," follows a dozen Norwegian-Americans who travel to Norway and compete is a series of challenges which immerses them into Norwegian culture. The winner received not only a \$50,000 cash prize; but, more importantly got to meet their Norwegian relatives who were tracked down by the reality show genealogy researchers.

Engen's path to "Alt for Norge" began back in 2014 when he heard from a friend a casting company was searching for contestants and he

Area cities, schools to receive aid

The Iron Range Resources and Rehabilitation Board recently met and made a number of important decisions that impact the cities of Aitkin and Crosby, as well as the Crosby-Ironton and Aitkin school districts.

Both the Aitkin and Crosby-Ironton schools will be included in the Applied Learning Institute program which the other range school districts have participated in for some time. The ALI program is done in partnership with the range junior colleges technical training programs.

"This is great opportunity for our high school students to be exposed to a whole range of vocational career opportunities," said Rep. Dale Lueck, R-Aitkin. "Over

the years, our high school direct aid for water, sewer, shops and curriculum offerings have not kept pace with the rapid advances in the technical career fields. The ALI program starts on the path to correcting that."

A total of \$500,000 is being made available to assist the Aitkin, Crosby-Ironton and the Cook County school districts in upgrading their shop facilities. But even more important as part of ALI program they will be able to access the additional instructional and curriculum development assistance necessary to bring the classes on line.

Lueck said local infrastructure grants awarded by the IRRRB also are of importance to the region. The city of Aitkin will receive \$99,000 in road and site work for the construction of a new 1,245 square-foot dental clinic. He said this \$738,842 project will provide new development, increase in tax base, and add long-term jobs in the community of Aitkin.

The city of Crosby will receive \$250,000 in aid for a sewer, water and road reconstruction across 10 city blocks in a northeast section of the town. This grant supports a Crosby housing rehabilitation and public infrastructure project totaling \$2.5 million in partnership with funding from the Minnesota Department of Employment and Economic Development and the Minnesota Public Facilities Authority.

noted. "But they were excellent at communicating with our families."

The contestants didn't sit around much. They had challenges involving "ski jumping," says Engen, "cross-country skiing, camping, sailing, farm work, competitive hot-dog-andorange-soda consumption, performing rock music hits on stage, language interpretation and quizzes on Norwegian dialects, religion and traditional foods."

Engen was the last American standing (winner) and

the 'Alt For Norge' finale shows him finally meeting his Norwegian relatives that had come from the small place called Gausdal, in the Gudbrand Valley near Lillehammer, where his great-great-grandfather Ole Olson Hagerud family lived before arriving in America in 1868.

"David Engen's invitation to travel to Isle is a circuitous path to say the least." noted Jerry Jacobson, Tusenvann Lodge Secretary. "I have been researching the Hagerud family genealogy for over two years as a gift for my last surviving aunt, Marlys Hagerud, who lives in northwest North Dakota."

While catching up on past YouTube episodes of 'Alt For Norge' late one night, Jacobson sat up and took notice of the name 'Ole Hagerud'. He h opened his Ancestory.com files and the 'Ole's' were one in the same. And much to Jerry's surprise, the Hagerud family came from a small village that was very close to his own family's ancestral home of Ringebu.

Jacobson, responsible for the genealogy program presented at the February 13 Tusenvann Lodge meeting, immediately knew he wanted to invite Engen to participate in this program. But how to invite David was the next question.

Having no means to contact David, Jerry caught a glimpse of a house number that appeared in the distance in one video clip featuring Engen. With just this number, Jacobson was able to find a possible residential Twin City address that was a match for the TV star.

To show his sincere genealogical interest rather than being a crazed stalker, Jacobson assembled a volume of historical information about the tragic crossing of the "Hannah Parr", a sailing vessel which the Hagerud family sailed aboard, that nearly sank in the North Atlantic, after encountering a severe storm.

"It was a few weeks after mailing the thick envelope when I received a call from David," Jacobson said. "Da-

Wisconsin Governor pulls the plug on Planned Parenthood funding

Wisconsin Gov. Scott Walker has signed legislation defunding abortion businesses in the state, including Planned Parenthood.

SB 237 and 238 direct public funding to comprehensive health care providers instead of organizations like Planned Parenthood and prevents abortion providers from overbilling Medicaid for prescription drugs. Casey Mattox, an attorney with Alliance Defending Freedom, testified before the state's Committee on Health last year.

"Planned Parenthood shouldn't be profiting off women and taxpayers," he said in a statement after the signing. "Wisconsin taxpayers deserve better than an organization with a long track record of abusive and potentially fraudulent billing practices, that have been caught... negotiating prices for baby body parts and that have repeatedly failed to report the sexual abuse of girls.'

Wisconsin Family Action, one of CitizenLink's nearly 40 state-based family policy groups, was active in getting the bills passed and signed

into law.

"For years, Wisconsin taxpayers have watched millions of their hardearned dollars go to organizations that provide abortions," said Julaine Appling with Wisconsin Family Action, "the main recipient being Planned Parenthood of Wisconsin, the state's largest abortion provider. The bills signed today move us much closer to stopping this outrage of public funding for organizations that collectively since 1974 have killed over 540,000 of Wisconsin's preborn citizens."


