### Did Anderson and Girtz stop a thief in Crosby? Ya Betcha! removed Grant's shoes, jack-



Steve Girtz and Blair Anderson(left to right) answered the call, caught burglary suspect Joseph William Grant and saved \$3,554 in pull tab revenues belonging to the Crosby Fire Department on March 3.

In the early morning hours of March 3, two citizens interrupted a burglary-in-progress at Ya Betcha's Bar and Grill on First Ave. NW in Crosby.

Joseph William Grant, 40, Roseville, was arrested by Crosby police. According to the criminal complaint filed against Grant by the Crow Wing County Attorney's Office, Grant was allegedly one of three suspects caught on video casing the bar in a white cargo van before breaking in to steal \$3,554 in pull tab revenues belonging to the Crosby Fire Department.

The bar owner, who lives upstairs, heard glass breaking at around 6 a.m. on March 3. et, black ski mask and gloves.

As Crosby Officer Smith arrived in front of the Spalding Bar and observed Grant on his knees and two males

standing by him. Grant stood up and told the officer he was having trouble breathing, because he'd just been beaten up by Anderson and Girtz. After being arrested, a large

amount of cash (\$1,849) was found in Grant's pockets. Some money (\$41) was also recovered from the street, and an additional large sum



# At workshop Crosby signals raising rates for garbage collection

### Crosby City Clerks ask for more help in the office and less work by switching billing duties to Range Disposal

In reference to the ongoing organized collection contract the entire Crosby Council and Crosby Mayor Joanne Lattery held a workshop on March 7. Along with the council and Mayor, attending the workshop were City Attorney Tom Pearson, City Clerk/Treasurer Lisa Sova, Administrative Assistant/Billing Clerk Rene´ Lind, Deputy Clerk Linda Distad, Jim and Shellie Wynn and Alan Woods, all owners of Range Disposal and Range Disposal's Attorney, Mark Severson.

Although no decision could be reached at Workshop Mayor Lattery and Crosby Council members signaled that rates of organized garbage collection may be increasing for Crosby residents and businesses.

Mayor Lattery asked if everyone had read through the proposed contract.

Councilman Dusty Paul indicated that he noticed the contract period was for seven years and he was thinking it should be a five year contract.

Councilman Jim Goshey agreed with Councilman Paul.

Attorney Severson said, "By the way I just asked for seven [years] so Range wouldn't have to hire me in five years, that was the only reason."

Range Disposal is willing to honor a five or seven year contract.

Councilman Paul questioned the cart maintenance fee of 50¢ per month, who gets that fee?

Shellie Wynn of Range Disposal said the cart fee is to pay for cart repairs/replacement and had been reduced from \$1 per month.

Mayor Lattery indicated there was something about rate increases in the contract. Attorney Tom Pearson referenced roman numeral five [V] on page seven. Item number five contained some rate increase language. Attorney Pearson indicated he wasn't comfortable with an open ended rate increase without stipulations and definition of the process or escalator of the increase being spelled out in the contract.

Mayor Lattery suggested the price of gas could go up during the contract and they needed to protect themselves. Shellie Wynn, Range Disposal, said tipping fees have just gone up this year, but Range did not increase the rate to the city.

Again Pearson said the language in the contract is "upon ten days of written notice the city clerk and contractor shall meet and determine of existing laws etc., etc., the parties shall negotiate any such price adjustment in good faith." Pearson said "that's the language is problematic, because, again, that requires, you got a contract, it requires a pretty significant term of the contract which is price to maybe change. But it doesn't tell us how it says will meet and agree."

The contract that the city is reviewing is based on the previous contract and that language was used in the last contract.

Attorney Mark Severson said, "To that point, the approach taken was if it's not broke don't fix it. If the council has a proposal that they would like to suggest to Range, by all means it would be considered. We didn't get together to discuss that, because it has never been an issue."

At issue is whether the City of Crosby will continue to bill the residents for garbage pick up or pass that responsibility to Range Disposal.

"I would like to know an explanation as to why," said Mayor Lattery, "so I can explain it to the residents, as to why the city is doing the billing and running the books for a private business? That's a question that I have been asked several times. I know my response."

Mayor Lattery then posed the question to Councilman Dusty Paul and he said, "I guess we've always done it that way."

Councilman Jim Goshey agreed. Goshey said, "The history of that seems to have worked well. I haven't had anybody complain and people say that works well for them."

Councilman Ron Prushek also agreed. Prushek said, "I haven't had anybody say anything different to me either way, as to the city doing it or Range doing it. As far as I know, it has always been done that way, since Range took over."

Councilman Paul Heglund dissented. Heglund said, "I think Range should do the billing myself. I have talked to a few people five weeks ago, I kind of thought the opposite. Being as they are getting a five year contract, I think it would be right for them to do the billing. Shellie did mention, I don't know how long ago, we asked her about billing. There didn't seem to be a problem."

Mayor Lattery said, "Because we can't make any decisions everyone should be able to speak freely. I think each one of us met privately, when we met with the clerks, to discuss the billing part of it. And the concerns were put out there as to how they felt and I'm just wondering why we continue to do the billing, when we know how the clerks feel about it?"

Councilman Dusty Paul asked Shellie Wynn, if they are still willing to take over the billing. She indicated that the problem is the prices that were quoted were for the city to continue to do the billing.

The price for a 40 gallon bin would go from \$14.85, if city does the billing to \$21.11, if Range does the billing. An increase of \$6.26 per month, if Range does the billing.

The price for a 68 gallon would go from \$18.37, if the city does the billing to \$22.29, if Range does the billing. An increase of \$3.92 per month, if Range does the billing.

The price for a 96 gallon cart would go from \$22.18, if city does the billing to \$25.53, if Range does the billing. An increase of \$3.35 per month, if Range does the billing.

That is before the price increase at the Landfill on April 1, Shellie Wynn said.

Range Disposal Owner Alan Woods said they were honoring the same pricing as the last two contracts in this proposed contract despite an increase cost at the landfill.

Shellie Wynn continued, "So many fees that the residents of Crosby pay have gone up. And when we got rid of the 20 gallon cart in 2006 we made a promise to the council, at that time, to keep the 40 gallon cart affordable for the elderly residents that are on fixed incomes."

According to Clerk/Treasurer Lisa Sova there were an average of 778 accounts for garbage pickup (the accounts range from 795 to 764 throughout last year.)

There was a delinquent balance on garbage pickup of \$6,894 last October and now that delinquent balance \$4,476.

Shellie Wynn said, as an independent business, they could not carry over \$4,000 in bad debt and still be able to provide the service to every resident of Crosby.

Councilman Dusty Paul indicated they were planning an increase to the administrative fee to about the same level, as if Range were doing the billing.

There was more discussion about the garbage rate being increased regardless, if Range does the billing or they increase the administrative fee and continue to bill through the city.

Councilman Jim Goshey said that with an increase in the administration fee they could use part of that to provide more staff to continue to do the billing of the garbage.

Mayor Lattery disagreed. She said, "That increase is coming what it's costing them to do now. There wouldn't be any left over."

Goshey then asked about reducing some of the workload on the city clerks by referring service calls directly

to Range, instead of having the city clerks in the middle.

Attorney Severson said he would talk with Shellie Wynn about what service issues they could take on. Severson continued saying that they had submitted a draft of the contract by February 10 and are just now getting some substantive feedback.

City Attorney Pearson responded saying, "This process is a workshop to work through a contract that is extensive, that has red line revisions to it and it needed commentary. So I don't think there is anything about this process that is lagging behind."

Severson responded "No one suggested we should rush through anything. The council elected to go through this new statutory process. That's fine, even though it didn't need to. That's fine. I think it would be helpful to the community, if you defined what due process means to you, what this time line means to you. Then we can tell the community we are going to have a finish line, a contract that is actually signed."

Mayor Lattery indicated the process had taken about six months so far.

City Attorney Pearson indicated that, at the next city council meeting on Monday, March 14 at 6 p.m., a revised red lined draft of the contract would be available to the council for review.



# **Tennessee moves to protect** privacy of all children

A Tennessee House subcommittee held hearings today on bill that would protect the physical privacy of students in public school restrooms. HB 2414 seeks to protect the privacy rights of all students, but especially those who have suffered sexual trauma.

Alliance Defending Freedom attorney Matt Sharp testified before the committee.

"Protecting students from inappropriate exposure to members of the opposite sex is not only legal, it's an important duty of officials who watch over our children," he said. "Letting boys into girls' restrooms and changing areas, for example, is an invasion of privacy and a threat to student safety."

The state Department of Education said they are simply following the guidelines laid out in the Title IX law that prohibits discrimination on the basis of sex in any school that receives federal funds.


"That's not what Title IX means," said Sharp. "It's deeply ironic that the Department of Education is using its lawless misinterpretation of Title IX to pressure schools to adopt policies that actually violate Title IX."

Family Action Council of Tennessee President David Fowler said the state DOE claims it's only trying to give the schools local control.

"The Tennessee Department of Education needs to stop hiding behind all these specious arguments and develop an ethical spine regarding human sexuality and biology," he said. "It needs to say that there is something true about the nature of human biology or there is not, and then support policies accordingly."






