New construction, remodeling going on around Aitkin

It is hoped that the project will be done by year's end. Other than saying the exterior will have a stone veneer, Running declined to talk about specific decorating schemes or colors. "It's going to be light, bright and modern. But we are going to keep the final details a surprise so people can get the 'wow' factor







Ironton City Council Meeting

In attendance at the September 16 Ironton Council meeting was Mayor Dean French, Council Members Angie Kugel and Eric Heglund. Also present was Clerk Amy Baratto, Ironton Fire Chief Jeff Thompson and C-I Courier Reporter Lisa Hamilton. Absent were council members Clark Hamdorf and Gloria Perpich.

Fire Chief Thompson said a fire truck needed some repair. He had noticed a leak when they had a practice burn with the Cuyuna Fire Department.

A five year contract with AAA Disposal was renewed for mixed municipal solid waste hauling. Recycling was not included.

The options for residential recycling was discussed. No decisions were made until more research could be done on costs and options.

The daily/weekly rental discussion with many issues and benefits noted. The biggest expense to the city would be the cost of changing the ordinance for residential zoning.

A 2% or less increase to the proposed preliminary budget was approved.

A request for payment of \$1700 from Community Fundraising Solutions LLC for Lead Base Paint Risk Assessment Service on four homes. No action could be taken since councilman Heglund could not vote and as a result there was not a quorum. It was noted that the administration of the grant had been moving along well and there was hope for some fall remodeling this year.

There was a request to reduce the sewer portion of

a water bill, using a one year monthly average in place of the disputed usage. The additional water usage was to water sod and didn't go into the sewer. The council approved the adjustment for one time only for this resident, as similiar adjustments have been allowed in previous cases. It was noted that a special water meter for watering the lawn could be purchased, if the resident wanted to track usage.

A \$13,807 grant from the small cities assistance program was awarded to Ironton. The funds will be held to help offset some costs for the CSAH 33 road project in 2017.

The council agreed that two stop signs at Ironton Terrace should be removed since they were not necessary anymore.






