Pros and cons presented by roundabout open house attendees

f an emergency vehicle approaches, exit immediately and then pull over and stop. Do not stop in the roundabout.

By ANN SCHWARTZ About 23 folks attended an open house held in Aitkin on Sept. 28 to discuss the

proposed construction of a roundabout intersection in 2017 at the corner of Hwy. 169 and Red Oak Drive (Paulbeck's

The project, at Southgate Drive/Red Oak Drive/ Highway 169, will include pedestrian crossings, trail connections, overhead lighting and other improvements.

On hand were engineers from Stonebrooke Engineering of Burnsville, consultants on the project, and from MnD-

ot's Brainerd office, along with Aitkin's mayor and city council members.

"It was a

pretty normal meeting and the concerns weren't anything we wouldn't expect to hear," said Tim Ar-

vidson, CEO of Stonebrooke. He said a video was playing that highlighted some concerns expressed at similar

meetings and "offset some myths about roundabouts."

"There was some skepticism," Arvidson added, "but people who came tonight were

listening and learning about the reasons for and benefits of roundabouts. There have been nine crashes at that intersection in the last five years, with one a fatality."

JP Gillach of MnDOT guessed that of those who attended, half

were in favor and half skeptical of how a roundabout would work. "Some are opposed but we also got positive feedback."

Eric Schiller, MnDOT's manager for the project, observed: "People were willing to listen even if they were not initially for it. Some people who came out have driven on roundabouts in their travels to Europe, the East Coast and other places and they are in favor, and some have reservations."

Engineers noted that the roundabout design does serve to prevent the serious, right-angle crashes that drivers experience at other intersections. This is the only option being considered for improving that intersection in Aitkin, they

\$125,000 in COPS Grant Funding

U.S. Senators Amy Klobuchar and Al Franken, along with Representative Rick Nolan, announced \$125,000 in Community Oriented Policing Services (COPS) grant funding for Aitkin.

"The first responsibility of government is to protect the safety of its citizens," Klobuchar said. "COPS provides critical support to local law enforcement in Minnesota, and this funding will help Aitkin prevent and reduce crime."

"All across our state, law

enforcement officers are dedicated to keeping Minnesota families safe," Franken said. "This new support will help Aitkin's police department continue to serve and protect the community."

"This grant provide a substantial and much needed boost for the law enforcement officers and personnel who go to work every day to make our region a safer, better place in which to live, work and do business," Nolan said. "Hats off to every one of them, and to the families who support them."

Since 1995, COPS has invested over \$14 billion to advance community policing, including grants awarded to more than 13,000 state, local, and tribal law enforcement agencies to fund the hiring and redeployment of approximately 127,000 law enforcement officers.

Klobuchar and Franken introduced the Cops Improvement Act of 2014 last year to provide vital support to local law enforcement by funding the COPS program through 2019.

Crosby City Council approves JFHL merger with Kitchigami Library

At the Crosby City Council meeting on August 28, it was announced that in conjunction with the earlier resolution by the Jessie F. Hallett Library (JFHL) Board the Crosby City Council expresses it's intent for a merger of JFHL with the Kitchigami Regional Library System (KRLS).

Fire Chief Jay DeCent addressed the council reporting there had been no calls since

last meeting. Again the membership wanted permission to change the Crosby Volunteer Firemen by-laws from six minutes response to ten minute. A motion was made and seconded to approve the change. Then the City Attorney Tom Pearson suggested they should find out if Crosby and contracted community residents insurance rates would go up if the change

were made. Following some discussion, it was decided that more information was needed and the motion and second was rescinded.

Councilman Dusty Paul spoke about some people were attempting to vandalize the Serpent figure in the Crosby Memorial Park by hanging and pulling on it. Paul suggested installing a fence around the base of the figure

and the council approved to have the fence installed.

Cuyuna Range Chamber Executive Directory Jessica Holmvig gave a proposal for a total budget of \$12,500 for the years events in 2016. In addition a request for \$3,000 the Christmas in the Park, scheduled for Wednesday, December 2, for 2015 sponsorship and permission for use of the cook shack and band shell. It was noted by City Clerk/Treasurer Lisa Sova that Crosby's total advertising budget for 2015 is in two parts advertising and economic development. The advertising budget for the year is \$18,500 with \$21,380 spent so far or \$2,880 over budget. The economic development is \$4,909 under budget leaving approximately \$2,030 remaining in the budget from the two categories. The council approved the donated use of the cook shack for the event and tabled the \$3,000 sponsorship for later.

Jenny Smith spoke on byhalf of Jennifer Holmvig from Cuyuna Regional Medical Center (CRMC). Holmvig wrote for a \$2,500 grant plus collected over \$4,000 in donations from CRMC to purchase 40 bike racks. The main purpose of writing the grant was to encourage bike riding in our area and to encourage bike riders to come downtown with a safe way to park and store their bikes. The racks have been ordered and should arrive here in four to six weeks. Some ideas were discussed for locations of the racks in the area.

A donation was accepted from James R. Anderson.

Mayor Joanna Lattery appointed to the Planning and Zoning commission seven members. The members are John Hunter, Robin Wolf, Ed Vukelich, Dale Sova, Chris Ryan, Beth Hippert and Duane Anderson. In addition she appointed alternate, Jim Hunter. Hunter will fill in if someone is absent. The council approved the appointments.

There was a request to allow a cemetery marker placed in the ground without a cement base. The council approved the exception with a hold harmless release to allow the monument without a

base, with the understanding the marker will most likely be damaged from weed whipping and lawn maintenance.

Councilman Ron Prueshek suggested flowers be sent to the City of Brainerd for the recent death of their Mayor.

City Building Inspector Scott Sadusky volunteered to donate half his regular HVAC permit fee for the Hallett Community Center back to the City of Crosby.

There was some discussion about if the fine increase for maintenance code and if it had improved anything yet. Sadusky said he would be able to tell more in the coming weeks. City Attorney Tom Pearson spoke about a citation for long grass at a property formally owned by Sherry Wink. An attorney representing Wink was in attendance and indicated the property had been sold by contract for deed. Pearson indicated the administrative citation should be rescinded for Sherry Wink and reinstated for the new owner.

Overpayment to Holms Radiator was discussed. Paul indicated he had heard the business had been sold. Pearson was directed to seek a verdict in small claims court based on the promissory note including interest and attorney fees.

Pearson indicated that Charter had contacted the city since a recent merger. He felt no motion or action was necessary to continue with the service.

The Comprehensive Plan draft for the City of Crosby was due August 14. So far the draft has not been produced, yet the city has paid about \$3,000 of the \$16,000 to \$18,000 that the completed plan should cost. Planning and Zoning Administrator Justin Berslie indicated he could not do the work at this time. Berslie has no idea how far the work had progressed to this point. Lattery said she wasn't happy with the lack of progress on the Comprehensive Plan. It has been over a year now.

Pearson indicated that there had been a data request by Eric Heglund from the NewsHopper. Heglund indicated he had been asked by readers for the information

and was trying to get it from the City of Crosby. The data request pertained to a cost comparison of legal fees from las year and this year between law firms, including any reimbursements. Heglund also requested a breakdown of costs associated with litigation, mediation and legal fees. It was indicated Pearson and Sova would work to get attorney fee cost for Hallett Library, CRMC, Up North Basecamp, garbage collection and other specific legal fees broken down. It was indicated the specific costs for attorney fees were not being currently being tracked and some litigation was still ongoing.

Engineer Phil Martin spoke about the west Crosby project. It will start the third week in October and November 30 is the anticipated completion date. The \$150,000 grant would be used on this project.

Martin said the Up North Base Camp would probably need an easement for utilities.

There was a coal chute in a resident's yard and was a potential hazard. Martin had concerns about the material used to fill the chute jeopardizing the integrity of the adjoining building.

Council approved the hiring Jerry DeCent as a parttime police officer.

City Clerk/Treasurer Sova recommended a \$1,270,000, 2.8% increase in the preliminary 2016 budget. The council approved to certify the delinquent utility accounts to the tax rolls. Sova indicated she had

received a letter from CRMC dated September 18. After an audit, CRMC had discovered a billing error resulting in an overpayment \$116,552.37 to the City of Crosby on their water and sewer bills going back to 2011. CRMC is looking for a refund of the overpayment within 30 days. CRMC had hired an utility audit company to audit three meters. The audit showed that one meter was over-billing and one was under-billing. One meter was for lawn watering. The audit discovered that there were two meters metering the same water usage and as a result were being billed twice.

Good news on the marriage front

New research suggests the millennial generation is finally ready to settle down, get married and start a family – in that order.

That's good news after years of disheartening trends. Ever since the sexual revolution, most of what we've heard about marriage has been bleak.
