DNR anticipates conservative deer hunting season this year



Deer hunting season begin s a half-hour before sunrise today, Saturday, November 7.

"Many hunters look forward to deer season all year as a way to enjoy nature and the outdoors, and reconnect with family," said Steve Merchant, wildlife populations and regulations program manager with the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources. "Hunters also enjoy seeing deer, and the good news is there should be more

deer out there this year."

Deer populations are on the rise following a milder winter and a conservative hunting season last year. This season will again be a conservative one, which means fewer antlerless deer permits were issued. Harvesting fewer does allows deer populations to grow and helps provide more opportunity in the future.

Here are some other reminders from the DNR for

the Minnesota firearms deer season.

Check regulations

The DNR strongly advises hunters to review new deer hunting regulations, permit area designations and boundary changes. Current and up-to-date information is available at www.mndnr. gov/hunting/deer.

Buy license

With nearly 500,000 firearms deer hunters in the state, the DNR encourages hunters to purchase their licenses early to avoid long lines and any potential system issues associated with the high sales volume. A list of DNR license agents across Minnesota can be found at www.mndnr.gov/licenses/agents.html.

Changes in 2015 affect when licenses are valid if purchased after a season is open. A deer hunting license purchased after a season is open is valid the same day of purchase if purchased prior to the beginning of legal shooting hours. If the license is purchased after legal shooting hours have begun, then the license is valid the following day.

Register deer

Deer must be registered within 48 hours after the deer was taken, before being processed and before antlers are removed. Hunters can register deer they harvest by making a telephone call, using the Internet or bringing deer to a big-game registration station. Hunters need to provide accurate information when registering. It is a violation to register a deer as taken in a permit area different from where it was actually taken. Registration instructions for all methods are available at www.mndnr. gov/gameregistrationhelp. Registration is important because it provides harvest data used for management of deer populations.

Projected harvest

The 2015 season will be the second year of a management approach to rebuild deer populations in areas below population goals. The DNR is projecting the 2015 total harvest to be between 140,000 to 155,000 deer. The 2014 total harvest after last year's conservative season was just over 139,000. More information on deer management can be found at www. mndnr.gov/deer.

IRRRB approves funding measures

The Iron Range Resources and Rehabilitation Board unanimously approved on October 30 financial measures with significant benefits for the city of Aitkin and the region at large.

The Aitkin action is approval of a \$250,000 grant for a lift station and sewer line infrastructure upgrade to support additional housing development in Aitkin.

"I am very pleased to see this project get IRRRB support," said Rep. Dale Lueck, R-Aitkin. "The funding represents approximately one-quarter of an infrastructure investment totaling more than \$1 million that supports increasing the amount of housing available in our local community."


The IRRRB also unanimously endorsed an \$18 million loan to assist in developing a \$52.8 million Sweetwater Energy facility at Mountain Iron that will extract industrial biochemicals from northern Minnesota timber resources. Lueck, an IRRRB member, said the operation could be a boon for Minnesota's rural economy by eventually creating around 100 new well-paying jobs on site and benefiting a large number of other workers in related fields throughout the region.

"The plant will be constructed in modules, beginning with the capacity to process about 150 cords of wood stock per day," Lueck said. "Over the next three to five years, the plan calls for expanding to handle up to 550 cords per day. That level of demand for area forestry resources will have a regional impact, helping our logging industry remain viable as we capitalize on biochemical manufacturing technology that displaces the use of both crude oil and agriculture products as raw-material feed

Lueck said flexibility is the key to this technology, which already is being used in northern Europe. The Mountain Iron plant is designed to be able to shift across a broad range of both raw-material inputs and the types of biochemicals produced, unlike traditional paper, press-board or dimensional-lumber plants.

In all, \$26 million in public financing will be directed toward the Sweetwater project.







Washington football coach suspended for post-game prayers

Joe Kennedy, the assistant football coach at Washington state's Bremerton High School, has been placed on administrative leave because he refuses to stop praying with his team after games.

Kennedy started praying in 2008. He would wait for the other coaches and players to clear the field and then he would pray at the 50-yard line. When students started to ask what he was doing he told them he was praying for them. Some of the team members were Christians and asked if they

"It's a free country," Kennedy remembers telling them. "You can do whatever you want to do."

Call

On September 17, after someone complained, school administrators told him to stop and to keep from doing anything that could be construed as religious. Kennedy refused and took to the field with his players for post-game thanks.

"You violated those directives," wrote Superintendent Aaron Leavell, "by engaging in overt, public and demonstrative religious conduct while still on duty as an assistant coach."

The school district told Kennedy he could pray privately after the games. He just couldn't allow a child to see him doing it. Kennedy asked to meet with school officials in person, but

they refused.
"We were only able to have a

brief hour-and-a-half call with their lawyer," Kennedy's attorney Hiram Sasser said, "And the result was a letter banning private prayer just a few hours before last Friday's game." Sasser is part of Liberty Institute,

which is representing Coach Kennedy in a lawsuit against the district. "It's unfortunate," Sasser said,

"that this school district is choosing litigation instead of a simple meeting."

"I am devastated that the school district is denying me an opportunity to privately and silently pray for my players at the fifty," Kennedy said. "I love my players, and I hope I can continue coaching them and being a part of their lives."
