## Eating at home?

Last month this column looked at the pros and cons of "eating out" and it seemed only fair to also take a look at the advantages and disadvantages of eating at home. So, here we go. We might start by pointing out the obvious. It's just a lot cheaper to eat at home, no matter what kind of restaurant one chooses or what kind of "specials" it offers.

But there is the downside as well. No matter how well stocked your refrigerator might be, it's unlikely that you will find everything that your recipe calls for—or, you may have it, but not necessarily in the quantities specified. It's possible to substitute many ingredients, but not all. If you didn't already know, "dark" chocolate is not the same as cocoa, sour cream is not really similar to mayonnaise, and shoulder of pork is not a suitable substitute for pork loin!

Another problem that arises from eating at home is that you have to make the meal that you want to eat. This means not only baking, frying, or boiling the raw meat and/or vegetables, but actually timing how long each component must cook to be done when everything else is. This is not as easy as it sounds and can make the difference between a gourmet meal and tasteless disaster.

The physical and social aspects of eating at home must also be considered. Besides the dining date itself, there are also the preparations for it: cleaning the house, putting out some flowers or other decorations, and setting the table. As host or hostess, your hospitality extends beyond the "food" you offer to the entertainment of all.

You actually face "multiple tasking." The time you spend on preparing your entree cannot be used to fill the water glasses, to pour the wine, to get the finished fare from the stove and oven to the dining table, and/or to spend it with your guests.

Of course, to eat at home doesn't necessarily mean that you have to have a dinner party. The informality of current entertaining often results in supper barbecues or "Brat Frys" as well as midmorning brunches, both of which end themselves to more casual dining.

Before concluding, however, we shouldn't omit the possibility of dining alone while "eating at home." Those are the times when you can set your own menu and dress as informally as you wish. As was mentioned in last month's article, you may even want to settle down in your most comfortable set of "jammies" and turn on that truly awful sitcom that you never would admit watching.

# Summer School plans announced for EL-G

Summertime is a super time to engage in fun activities that encourage creativity, team building with friends, enrichment, and academic growth.

At Elkhart Lake-Glenbeulah Elementary/Middle School, you can sharpen your skills and experience the job of learning through participation in five weeks of motivating classes.

Teachers are planning a wide range of unique opportunities that include CAD (computer aided drafting), Math Galore, Cooking from Scratch, Sports Trivia, Bowling, Archery, and good old-fashioned fun! Our summer school program will run for five weeks (Monday-Friday), June 13-July 15. There will not be any classes held on Monday, July 4. Classes will begin at 7:50 a.m. and will run until 11:55 a.m. The daily schedule will consist of four 50-minute time slots for courses with an additional 30 minute unstructured snack/ break time mid-morning. 
All summer school courses and registration forms can be found on our school website www.elgs.k12.wi.us, by stopping in the elementary/middle school office, or calling 920-876-3307.

# Elkhart Inn offers unique dining concepts

Rich in history and rich in the tradition of serving classic dishes with modern flair to family and friends, old and new, just as it has for close to 100 years.

The Elkhart Inn opened in June of 2015 as a contemporary supper club with an emphasis on sourcing the very best ingredients available.

Chef and restaurant manager John Berge cut his culinary teeth in restaurants in Madison and Milwaukee. He then left the big city to be the sous chef at the highly-acclaimed Al Corso Restaurant in Collins, until he was asked to be at the helm of the new Elkhart Inn.

Coming up on the restaurant's one-year anniversary, Chef Berge's innovative cuisine has received rave reviews for cooking with unique products. He curates his ingredients with exceptional culinary knowledge and care. Some of the world's best and rarest game meat: Sika Venison, Blackbuck Antelope, and Axis Venison can be found on the menu or in weekly specials.

Dorper Lamb, Ora King Salmon, and Sushi-Grade Viking Village Scallops are just a few other ingredients that aren't typically found on menus in the area.

As for his current menu favorites, Berge noted, "I really enjoy making the Elk Chop and Scallops. It's a dish where every ingredient truly compliments each other, so every bite is balanced and really delicious.

#### Spring brings excitement

In the spring, Chef Berge requests which vegetables and herbs he'd like grown using organic practices on a local two-acre garden. As it is harvested, the produce is then worked into the menu and featured in specials to keep the menu continuously in-season.

"Spring is always an exciting time for a chef. I just harvested rhubarb, asparagus, chives, mixed greens, and tarragon from my parents' farm and those will be incorporated into my menu. Planting started in mid-May at The Osthoff's organic garden, so when summer hits we will have a bounty of fresh, organic produce right at our disposal."

Berge is a strong believer in local food sourcing, but knows some of the best ingredients must come from the right environment to produce the best meal.

"I know it's trendy to say that you only buy "local," but sometimes the best ingredients with the best flavor aren't local. Our Red Deer and Elk come from New





Zealand and our Antelope is from Broken Arrow Farms in Texas. When you source ingredients from where they thrive, you can really taste it on the plate."

Dining Hours are Wednesday through Sunday, from 4-9 p.m.

Walking into The Elkhart Inn is like taking a step back in time. The restaurant is filled with old world charm, from the ornate wood work and hand-carved bar to the tin ceiling and roaring fireplace. The classic décor lends itself to eating the way they did when the Inn first opened 100 years ago.

Sarah Botham is the owner and founder of Botham, ink., a marketing and public relations consulting firm that specializes in branding and strategic planning for businesses. She is also the vice president and director of marketing for her husband's business, Botham Vineyards & Winery, and president and founder of Acala Farms, a food products business launched in 2012. Additionally she serves as a faculty associate for the Department of Life Sciences Communication in the College of Agricultural and Life Sciences at the University of Wisconsin-Madison, where she teaches marketing, advertising and design for the life sciences.

As advisor for the University of Wisconsin-Madison student chapter of the National Agri-Marketing Association (NAMA), Botham oversees the organization's activities and functions as competition coach for the NAMA student marketing team. She was recognized as Outstanding Student Advisor by the NAMA national organization in 2008 and has helped the team earn numerous awards. Under her guidance, the NAMA marketing team earned the National Championship in a field of 30 colleges from across the U.S. and Canada and brought home \$5,500 in scholarships at the 2016 competition.

Since founding the team 29 years ago and through the 2016 season Cunningham had amassed 91 sports car victories in 10 professional series', a record unmatched by anybody in North American sports car racing history, as well as seven drivers' championships in the World Challenge series, and seven more from IIRA Ice Racing, SCCA PRO Rally, Escort Endurance and Shellzone Sport Trucks. As a team owner, he heads an effort which has won 86 individual events (by 12 of his drivers) in 23 years of SCCA Pirelli World Challenge racing, plus 14 drivers' championships and 14 manufacturers' championships for the Honda and Acura brands.

Although Cunningham is best known for his affiliation with Honda and Acura, he also drove for many other professional race teams, including those campaigning BMW (1998-2001), Chevrolet (1987-90), Nissan (1986, 2003-04), Toyota (1985), Porsche (2004) and Audi (2003).

Cunningham also founded RealTime Logistics (RTL) in 1993 to assist in the introduction of Bridgestone's Blizzak winter tire. Since then, RTL has been Bridgestone Americas' exclusive provider for organizing and implementing dynamic driving events across North America.

Cunningham was a founding shareholder of WC Vision LLC, owner of the Pirelli World Challenge Championships and is a current member of its Board of Directors. Cunningham is married to Rhainey Watts-Cunningham and along with their teenage daughter, Audrey, lives in Milwaukee.

Sissy's offers beverages and sweets, traditional cones and root beer floats. "We have a lot of people who come by and grab a quick cup of coffee street side on their way to work, or the rest of their day."

#### Founded in 1916

Siebkens was founded in 1916 by Herman and Laura Siebken. Hotel owners in Germany, they came to America's east coast, then moved to Wisconsin, eventually buying the resort, which was known as the Elm Park Hotel.

For 25 years, the couple managed Siebkens until the resort was taken over by their daughter Ollie Siebken Moeller. Her tenure lasted for 36 years.

Lisa and Laurie's parents, Pam and Doug Lueck took the reins of the resort in 1977 and ran Siebkens for a period of 20 years. The two daughters began their tenure of ownership in 1996.

#### Elkhart Lake has many draws

Stecker said that the resort business has changed some with each passing generation. In days gone by, families from Chicago or Milwaukee would come to Siebkens to stay for a month at a time.

Today, that has changed as tourists come for the wider variety of reasons that makes Elkhart Lake an attractive destination.

"We get a real variety of customers here. We see a lot of destination weddings and family reunions," she said.

Stecker recalled the stories of how her grandmother played an instrumental role in helping to promote Road America. "She helped sell the shares of stock for the track and saw Road America as an opportunity to help revitalize the resort businesses," Stecker said.

The great racing legacy of Road America is just one of the many reasons that resorts like Siebkens have continued to attract patrons to Elkhart Lake.

Stecker cited the beauty of the lake and the quaintness of the village as drawing cards. Today, the lure has grown even stronger.

"People are really beginning to find out about Elkhart Lake. Once they get here and realize the beauty of the lake and see all the opportunities for biking, hiking, water sports and outdoor activities, they get hooked," she said.

At Siebkens along the shores of Elkhart Lake, they also find the pleasures of great dining and entertainment.

Once they find this treasure, families keep coming back to Siebkens. "We see lots of generations of families that keep coming back to Siebkens," Stecker said. "It's interesting to see people we may remember playing with as kids on the beach now bringing their families back. People just enjoy this area that much."

#### **Generations of returnees**

Siebkens offers year round hotel accommodations. The construction of a new building in 2008 helped open up the all-season possibilities. Likewise the Stop-Inn Tavern is also a year round feature at Siebkens.

Private parties are available throughout the year, although normal public dining remains seasonal.

Siebkens offers a variety of lodging options, including hotel rooms and 1-, 2- or 3-bedroom condominiums. The Elm Park and Lake Cottage Buildings offer a style of lodging patterned after bed and breakfast offerings.

Condominiums offer full open-concept kitchens and fireplaces, with expansive verandas and a built-in laundry.

Many rooms have a lake or pool view.

#### Maintaining the charm

For the sisters continuing the Siebkens Resort family tradition, the key to success lies in their ability to keep the old charm

"That's one of the great things about Elkhart Lake. The village has done a great job of maintaining and revitalizing the downtown area and keeping original structures," Stecker said.

That quaintness carries over to the great





sense of community that visitors can feel. "Elkhart Lake is just such a unique place, and Siebkens is proud to be part of that tradition. Together we all make Elkhart Lake the special place that it is," she added.

Both sisters raised their children in Elkhart Lake and were able to have them help in the resort business while growing up.

'It's almost like a fairy tale place to grow up in," Stecker said.

For the past century, Siebkens Resort has been part of that fairy tale story for tourists and locals alike.



# ConceptWorks keeps on innovating

### Addition of Mekco helps company diversify, grow

for the Depot Dispatch An Elkhart Lake Chamber member business known for its innovative approaches is venturing into yet another series of unique and interesting projects.

ConceptWorks, honored by the chamber in 2014 as the Innovative Business of the Year, has since acquired a company known as Mekco, allowing it to diversify its product offerings and to continue the steady growth it has seen since the 2009 recession.

Known for its unique ability to produce creative solutions for customers, Concept-Works blends its talents in working with wood-based solutions, along with the advantages of fiberglass-reinforced plastic fabrications learned through the acquisition of Mekco to broaden is productivity.

Adam Schneider, ConceptWorks president/CEO said Mekco's affinity for working with fiberglass has helped the newly acquired company make inroads to markets where materials must be anti-corrosive, lightweight, and robust. Originally headquartered out of Cleveland, Mekco has created fiberglass components for items such as small sand and salt boxes, to calf hutches, silo caps and eventually growing into buildings used to house wastewater treatment equipment, nuclear power structures and instrument landing systems at airports. Mekco has constructed weather observatory shelters in Alaska, as well as radar sheltering devices for NASA.

"Mekco had learned to utilize the advantages of fiberglass to develop high quality products in niche markets. Mekco had a great attention to detail and a high level of skills, and that's what we thrive on at ConceptWorks," Schneider said.

The acquisition has enabled crossover of skill sets and employees, as well as product lines and potential new product.

Additionally, the acquisition ties into growth marked by a continuing bump in the work force team—now 42 employees a six-fold increase in just seven years. Manufacturing facilities at the Sheboygan County location have expanded with the additional of 7,200 square feet of working space added last October.

#### **Recession buffer**

From an overall perspective, the addition of Mekco to the ConceptWorks family will make the company more robust and perhaps more recession resistant in the future, Schneider said.

"We talk a lot about what Concept-Works and Mekco do well and how we can feed each other," Schneider said. "ConceptWorks is great at processing wood to meet very unique customer needs and Mekco is great at creating fiberglass components. There is a new synergy when we are able to blend these together.

Schneider said one big immediate impact has been the ability of ConceptWorks to use the fiberglass components for some of its innovative trade show displays. "It allows us to think bigger, better and bolder and match the pace of our customer's needs," he added.

#### New product lines

ConceptWorks' ever-searching vision







for new products has begun to churn out unique product lines fed by new diversity of fiberglass fabrication.

"We started asking ourselves how we could use the Mekco advantages to produce more and more unique product lines," Schneider reflected. "The innovation engine is always churning here, and it didn't take long to come up with 40 or so new product ideas."

Since the ConceptWorks team has a lot of people with a passion for the outdoors, a new potential market and new products began to surface in the idea-shaping process. "We spun off a sub-set brand that became the hybrid of ConceptWorks and Mekco capabilities, known as Mekco Outdoors."

The Hunt Locker was the first such product, a Mekco Outdoors-produced fiberglass containment vessel with 75 gallons of storage capacity.

Outdoor enthusiasts can situate and secure these lockers in their favorite outdoor sports location to store all their gear near where they will use it in the woods.

Forget about rust, corrosion or water problems. Gear is stored safely in the lockable container.

"Why should hunters lug all their gear out to the woods and back. They can just store items like seats, backpacks, decoys and such in the Hunt Locker, and it's there for you every time you go back," Schneider said.

Boaters might use the Hunt Locker to store life jackets and other equipment.

Gardeners might be able to store tools, seeds and bulbs. For those that camp, firewood and charcoal can be kept safe and dry.

For areas where hunters are allowed to use bait, the Hunt Locker works as an inthe-field storage solution to avoid hauling bait into the woods on a daily basis.

What's more, the fiberglass product can painted or hydro-dipping to match surrounding environments.

#### **Other Fiberglass products**

Mekco Outdoors unveils complete hunting blinds made with fiberglass components.

"They offer great creature comfort for the hunter and archer in the field, complete with windows that fold up and down," Schneider said. "You could almost take it camping if you wished." Several other products are in development mode – slated to be unveiled at the upcoming DeerFest tradeshow in August. All products will carry the common theme of providing a robust product for the outdoor enthusiast. Mekco Outdoors focus is on a long-lasting product-line – capable of being passed down like an heirloom. Mekco Outdoors' tag-line is: built for the next generation.

#### Water sport intrigue

Because of its connections with Elkhart Lake, Mekco Outdoors has also begun to dabble with fiberglass solutions for water sports.

One product that has moved from the drawing board toward production is a line of paddle boards. Calling them the "Jeep" of paddle boards, Schneider said these fiberglass models will have a dudecentric focus with a wider width. "Guys tend to have less balance, so, we are looking widening the stance as well as changing the traditional look of a paddle board by having harder lines and moving away from the curved, feminine look.

The new paddle boards will also have bolt-on features to accommodate the boards for things guys like to do, like fishing, drinking a cold beverage or two or connecting mobile camera mounts.

"These won't be for racing. The concept is to make them serve utilitarian needs," Schneider said. The company's dream would be envisioned by seeing these products at major outdoor retailers within 3-4

# Wade House hosts Dairy Day

On Saturday, June 25 and Sunday, June 26, from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m., in celebration of National Dairy Month, visitors to Wade House will have the opportunity to help make ice cream and butter in 1860s fashion as well as learn about the process of making cheese. Hands-on activities will include hand cranking an ice cream maker and plunging a dash up and down to churn butter.

The Wade House kitchen will be busy as staff and guests alike take turns working dashes and cranks until their arms get weary. Butter will be made from fresh cream by moving a dash (staff) up and down within a stoneware plunge churn. Homemade ice cream will be made using a hand crank ice cream maker, comprised of an outer bowl and smaller inner bowl with a paddle for stirring. Guests will be rewarded for their hard work with a sample of the dairy products that they helped to make. There will also be ice cream from Kelley Country Creamery in Eden for sale that day at the site's Butternut Café.

Besides making butter and ice cream, Wade House staff will demonstrate the craft of cheese making following a detailed recipe of Miss Catharine Beecher, a 19th century pioneer educator and home economist. Visitors will see milk being strained, heated, and stirred until curd is formed. Interpreters will break and press the curd to separate and remove whey. Then they will immerse the curd in a kettle of warm water and stir. Next, the curd will be drained and placed into cheese hoops and put into a press. Once taken from the press, the cheese will be placed on a shelf in a dark, cool room for approximately six months until firm.

Dairy Day will take place at the Wade House Historic Site in Greenbush. Visitors will begin the special experience at the new Wade House Visitor Center and Wesley W. Jung Carriage Museum located at W7965 State Highway 23. Admission is as follows: adults \$11; students/seniors \$9.25; Children (5-17) \$5.50; family (up to two adults and two or more dependent children 5-17) \$30. 

# Plantar Fasciitis Causes and Treatment Options

It's been a great stretch of weather, and it's great to see more and more people outside. Whether it's going on a walk, golfing, or working in the yard, take advantage of this weather for in just a few short weeks, the Summer Solstice will arrive and we will begin that slow drift back to shorter days.

Time is of the essence. Don't let your feet slow you down!

Chronic foot pain is no fun, and can spoil your enjoyment of life. One of the most common causes of pain in the feet—one that affects nearly two million people yearly in the U.S. is plantar fasciitis, which is an inflammation of the plantar fascia ligament that connects the heel bone and the toes. This ligament is composed of fibrous bands of tissue, and runs along the entire bottom of the foot. It stretches and contracts with every step or movement, and may become inflamed when tiny tears occur in the tissue.

The most common symptom of plantar fasciitis is a burning or aching pain on the bottom of the foot, often near the heel, where this ligament attaches to the heel bone. It is often experienced in the mornings, because the ligament has had time to rest and relax during the evening, but then tightens up and becomes painful again when we put pressure on it by standing or walking. The pain tends to decrease with activity, but may recur after periods of walking or standing. Half of people diagnosed with plantar fasciitis say that their pain is constant; 90 percent say that it hurts when they press on the area around the heel.


There are many potential causes of plantar fasciitis. Overuse during exercise or physical activity is one of the most common, and athletes who run, jump, or perform other repetitive movements that put pressure on the feet are prone to this condition. It may also be caused or aggravated by arthritis and diabetes, especially in the elderly. Interestingly enough, one of the most common causes of plantar fasciitis is wearing the wrong shoes. A poor shoe one someone with flat feet, high arches, overpronation, or underpronation will likely stress and irritate the ligaments and muscles of the foot and cause an overuse injury like plantar fasciitis. Being overweight also places additional strain on your feet that can lead to this condition.


Whatever the cause, plantar fasciitis can take all the fun out of walking or even moving around easily. More important, it is a condition that should be diagnosed and, if present, treated early, before it becomes more serious. The longer you ignore it, the worse it's gonna get!

Traditional medical treatment of plantar fasciitis tends to focus on reducing the pain (via anti-inflammatory medications such as Ibuprofen or more serious pain relievers) and alleviating pressure on the heel. Sometimes, even surgery is suggested. Unfortunately, this regimen does not address the potential causes of the disorder. For many, chiropractic manipulation of the feet and related joints (in addition to traditional approaches such as the use of ice packs and avoiding for a time the movements that seem to exacerbate the pain) may help to restore a proper range of motion, and thus remove the cause of the problem. Personally, I've found Active Release Technique INVALUABLE when addressing plantar fasciitis. I also always suggest some home care activities, like rolling a tennis ball under the foot or strengthening the foot muscles by pulling a towel under their foot with their toes.

In addition to all that (much more than a "take some Advil" approach!) it's important to analyze patients' gait (how they walk or run) and thus prescribe better footwear (or orthotics to wear inside their current shoes) that will help both to relieve pain and prevent future occurrences of it. Often relief is found within one or two visits.

How quickly these therapies may provide relief depends of course on each individual case, but relief can be found.

# Veterans Memorial program set May 28

In 1991 Stu's unit, the 2nd Armed Cavalry Unit was mobilized oi Saudi Arabia in support of Desert Storm/Desert Shield. This unit was the lead element into Iraq for Gen. Schwatzkopf's End Around maneuver, which resulted in decisive victories against two of Sadam Hussein's Republican Guard Regiments.

In July of 2006, while executing a reconnaissance mission on a road project in Eastern Afghanistan, Stu was injured when the armored vehicle he was in was hit by two roadside bombs. Stu received extensive care for the next 18 months at Walter Reed Army Medical Center in Washington, D.C. and at the Minneapolis V.A. Hospital Traumatic Brain Injury Center.

For his actions in Afghanistan, Stu was

awarded the Combat Action Badge, the Purple Heart, and the Bronze Star.

Stu now lives in the Kiel area, enjoying his favorite pastimes of hunting, fishing, and spending time with family and friends.

#### New Ordinances

Over the last month, the Village Board revised two ordinances. The first one relates to making the possession of marijuana an ordinance violation as opposed to a misdemeanor. The second ordinance revision deals with the regulation of vicious dogs in the Village. Below are the revisions for your information.

#### ORDINANCE 611 VILLAGE OF ELKHART LAKE SHEBOYGAN COUNTY, WISCONSIN REVISE ORDINANCE 8.18 REGARDING MARIJUANA POSSSESSION

WHEREAS, the Village of Elkhart Lake finds it necessary to revise Village Ordinance Section 8.18 which relates to the marijuana possession; and

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RE-SOLVED**, that the Board of Trustees of the Village of Elkhart Lake creates Sections 8.18(3) and renumbers 8.18(3) to 8.18(4) to read as follows:

8.18 Possession of Controlled Substances; Manufactured or Delivery of Drug Paraphernalia

(3) Marijuana, Possession with Intent to deliver or distribute.

(a) Definition. "Marijuana" means all parts of the plant cannabis sativa L. whether growing or not; the seeds thereof; the resin extracted from any part of the plant; and every compound, manufacture, sale, derivative, mixture or preparation of the plant, its seeds, or resin.

(b) Possession with Intent to Deliver, Delivery. It shall be unlawful for any person to possess, with intent to deliver or to distribute marijuana. Intent under this section may be demonstrated by, without limitation because of enumeration, evidence of the quantity and monetary value of the substances possessed, the possession of manufacturing implements or paraphernalia, and the activities or statements of the person in possession of the marijuana prior to and after the alleged violation.

(c) PENALTIES. Any person who violates any subsection of Section 8.18(3) shall, upon conviction, be subject to a forfeiture of not more than \$500.00, together with costs of prosecution and may be ordered to pay restitution and complete community service. Any person who violates any subsection of Section 8.18(3) may also have his or her driving privileges suspended or revoked in accordance with section 961 Wisconsin Statutes.

(4) Prescription Drugs, Possession and Use Prohibited.

(a) Definition: "Prescription drug" means a drug or device prescribed by a practitioner licensed in this state to prescribe and administer drugs or in another state and recognized by this state as a person authorized to prescribe and administer drugs including, but not limited to the following:

1. A controlled substance included in Schedules II to V of Ch. 961of the Wis. Statutes;

2. A drug, drug product, or drug-containing preparation that is subject to 21 USC 353(b) or 21 CFR 201.105.

(b) Possession and Use Prohibited. No person may possess, attempt to possess, or use a prescription drug unless the prescription drug is obtained in compliance with Ch. 450 of Wis. Statutes. Attempts to possess may include, but not be limited to the following:

1. Use of fraud, deceit, willful misrepresentation, forgery, alteration of a prescription order, willful concealment of a material fact, or use of a false name, address, or title.

(c) Delivery and Possession with Intent to Deliver Prohibited. No person may deliver, or possess with intent to deliver a prescription drug unless authorized by Ch 450 of Wis. Statutes.

(d) PENALTIES. Any person who violates any section of 8.18(3) shall, upon conviction, be subject to a forfeiture of not more than \$500.00, but not less than \$350.00, together with costs of prosecution and may be ordered to pay restitution and complete community service.

(g) PENALTY. Forfeiture to be determined.

#### ORDINANCE 612 VILLAGE OF ELKHART LAKE SHEBOYGAN COUNTY, WISCONSIN REVISE ORDINANCE 8.27

**REGARDING VICIOUS DOGS WHEREAS,** the Village of Elkhart Lake finds it necessary to revise Village Ordinance Section 8.27 which relates to

vicious dogs; and NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RE-SOLVED, that the Board of Trustees of the Village of Elkhart Lake revises Section

8.27 DOGS

(1) Definitions.

(a) "Collar" means a band, strip, or chain placed around the neck of a dog.

(b) "Department" means the department of agriculture, trade, and consumer protection.

(c) "Domestic Animal" means livestock, dogs, and cats.

(d) "Livestock" means any horse, bovine, sheep, goat, pig, lama, alpaca, domestic rabbit, and farm-raised deer.

(e) "Officer" has the meaning designated in s. 95.21 subsection (1) (b).

(f) "Owner" includes any person or household who owns, harbors, or keeps a dog.

(g) "Fence" includes a traditional or electrical underground fence.

(h) "Vicious Dog"

(i) Any dog or hybrid dog with a propensity, tendency or disposition to attack, assault, cause injury or otherwise endanger the safety of human beings or other domestic animals as evidence by its habitual or repeated chasing or snapping, or barking and/or snarling in a life threatening manner.

(ii) Any dog or hybrid dog which attacks a human being or another domestic animal without provocation.

(iii) Any dog or hybrid dog owned or harbored primarily or in part for the purpose of dog-fighting, or any dog trained for dog-fighting.

(9) DUTY TO REPORT ANIMAL BITE. Every person, including the owner or person harboring or keeping a dog or other animal, who knows that such animal has bitten any person shall immediately report such fact to the Police Department. (10) KEEPING OF VICIOUS DOGS

REGULATED. (a) REQUIREMENTS AND PROHIBI-

TIONS.

(1) Lead and Muzzle. No person owning, harboring or having the care of a vicious dog may suffer or permit such dog to go outside its kennel or pen unless the dog is securely leashed with a leash no longer than 4 feet in length. No person may permit a vicious dog to be kept on a chain, rope or other type of leash outside its kennel or pen unless a person is in physical control of the leash. The dog may not be leashed to inanimate objects such as trees, posts, and buildings. A vicious dog on a leash outside the dog's kennel shall be muzzled by a muzzling device sufficient to prevent the dog from biting person or other animals. A vicious dog shall not be required to be muzzled when shown in either a sanctioned American Kennel Club show or upon prior approval of the Police Department.

(2) Confinement. All vicious dogs shall be securely confined indoors or in a securely enclosed and locked pen or kennel, except when leashed and muzzled as provided in par. (1) above. The pen, kennel, or structure shall have secure sides and a secure top attached to all sides. A structure used to confine a vicious dog shall be locked with a key or combination lock when the dog is within the structure. The

structure shall have a secure bottom or floor attached to the sides of the pen, or the sides of the pen must be embedded in the ground no less than 2 feet. All structures erected to house vicious dogs shall comply with all zoning and building regulations of the Village. All structures shall be adequately lighted and ventilated and kept in a clean and sanitary condition.

(3) Confinement Indoors. No vicious dog may be kept on a porch, patio or in any part of a house or structure that would allow the dog to exit the building on its volition. No vicious dog may be kept in a house or structure when the windows are open or when screen windows or screen doors are the only obstacle preventing the dog from exiting the structure.

(4) Prohibited in Multiple Dwellings. No vicious dog may be kept within any portion of any multiple dwelling.

(5) Signs. All owners, keepers or harborers of vicious dogs shall, within 15 days of the effective date of this section, display in a prominent place on their premises a sign easily readable by the public with letters not less than 2 inches in height stating "Danger-Vicious Dog." A similar sign is required to be posted on the kennel or pen of the dog.

(6) Insurance. All owners, keepers or harborers of vicious dogs or hybrid dogs shall, within 30 days of the effective date of this section, provide proof to the Police Department of public liability insurance in a single incident amount of \$50,000 for bodily injury to or death of any person or for the damage to property owned by any person which may result from the ownership, keeping or maintenance of vicious dogs or hybrid dogs. The insurance policy shall provide that no cancellation of the policy will be made unless a 10day written notice is first given the Police

Department. The owner or custodian of the dog shall produce evidence of the required insurance upon request of the law enforcement officer. This paragraph does not apply to dogs kept by law enforcement agencies.

(c) VICIOUS DOG DETERMINA-TION. The Police Department shall investigate every dog complaint and make a determination as to whether or not such dog is "vicious," as defined in sub. (a) above. In the event the Police Department makes a determination that a dog is "vicious," it shall so inform the owner, keeper or harborer of such dog and provide such person with a copy of this section.

(d) APPEAL OF VICIOUS DOG DE-TERMINATION. Whenever an owner or caretaker wishes to contest an order declaring an animal to be a dangerous animal, he or she shall, within seventytwo (72) hours after receipt of the vicious dog determination, deliver to the Municipal Court a written objection to the determination stating specific reasons for contesting the order. Upon receipt of the written objection, the matter shall be placed on the calendar for the Municipal Court to be reviewed at the next regular session. The Municipal Court shall allow the animal's owner or caretaker an opportunity to present evidence as to why the animal should not be declared vicious. After the hearing, the owner or caretaker shall be notified in writing of the Court's determination. If the Court upholds the determination that the animal is vicious, the owner or caretaker shall comply with the requirements of this ordinance. If the owner or caretaker further contests the determination, he or she may, within five (5) days of receiving the Municipal Court's decision, seek review of the decision by the Circuit Court. During any pending appeal in this section, the owner or caretaker shall comply with the confinement requirements of this ordinance.

(e) COMPLIANCE. Within 10 days of the determination that a dog is vicious, as provided in sub. (c) above, or 10 days after an unsuccessful appeal under sub. (d) above, the owner of a vicious dog shall either comply with all provisions of this section or dispose of such dog.

(f) DISPOSITION OF VICIOUS DOGS. Any vicious dog which attacks a human competent jurisdiction, the dog represents a continuing threat of serious harm to human beings or domestic animals. (g) PENALTY. Forfeiture to be deter-

passing the final version of the revised Liquor License Ordinance. It now conforms to State Statute. Once enacted, the moratorium on liquor & fermented beverage

#### **Victory Lane**

licenses will be lifted.

Victory Lane is scheduled to be finished near the end of June. This new road was constructed to accommodate commercial development. The Vet Clinic opened in February and Victory Auto is schedule to start construction in early June. There are lots available for 2 to 3 additional projects. In addition, the Village decided to extend Garfield Street east along the Catholic Church connecting to Victory Lane. It will provide more street parking and an additional entrance/exit to the church.

#### **Boating Regulations**

1. A Coast Guard approved Personal Flotation Device (PFD) in serviceable condition is required to be in the boat and accessible for each person in the boat.

2. A speed of "SLOW NO WAKE" is in effect all year long from 7:30 p.m.-10 a.m. each day. "SLOW NO WAKE" is defined as the slowest possible speed at which a boat can operate while still maintaining steerage.

3. Maintain a speed of "SLOW NO WAKE" at all times when operating a motor boat between the shoreline and the NO WAKE buoys and within 100 feet of any craft at anchor, adrift or not operating under engine power.

4. No boat towing persons skiing, tubing or the like can come within 100 feet of swimmers, divers, rafts, other boats or restricted areas.

5. All boats engaged in towing skiers, tubers or persons in similar activities must have a competent person, other than the pilot, observing the towed person(s).

6. NO SUNDAY operation of motor driven boats, beginning the second Sunday of June and ending the third Sunday of September. Note: Only electric trolling motors allowed.

7. There is a radar-enforced speed limit of 35 MPH on the water.

8. A counter-clockwise course should be maintained while water-skiing, jet skiing, etc., and during the times of high-volume boat activity.
