Back in 1954 on a springtime day, a young lady was called out of class at Sulphur Springs High School by Mr. Sterling Beckham, and informed that she had been chosen as the "Dairy Princess" for Hopkins County. Standing there in the hall, she was told she would be representing the local dairy industry at a special event and that she was selected by a committee of working farmers. Dairying was just 15 years old in Hopkins County at that time, and lots of families were still getting started in it! The young lady was Lynda Mosely, a dairyman's daughter. Lynda went back into class that day, and in fact finished out her week. Soon though, she was watching over the cattle exhibitions in the show barn where crowds were gathered, wearing a "milk maid" outfit made by her aunt. The event was held in May 1954 in the Show Barn, then located in City Park (Buford Park) near where the new Pavilion has now been built. (in your youth, the swimming pool was there) Lynda had graduated and married Bill Hager before the new Hopkins County Dairy Festival was officially organized in 1959. She was a member of Mother's Club then, became a volunteer and has kept her finger on the pulse of the festival all these years. This is is her 51st Dairy Festival to take part in. As a member of the board of directors, she is currently Treasurer but over the years has held most every position and gladly volunteered for every job, big or small, that it took to build the Queen's pageant to what it is today. For Lynda, presiding over a cattle show in an un-air-conditioned barn was a far cry from the prestige of the title that today's Dairy Festival Queen and contestants are welcomed to. But I'm sure she smiled all the way, just like today!

# **CROSSES IN AMERICA**

Rick Vanderpool of Lubbock doesn't hesitate to follow up on his brainstorms, no matter how bizarre they might seem or how far he will have to travel to make them happen. He is a photographer and finds fascinating ways to make a living with his camera. During the 500th anniversary of Columbus discovering America, he went to every city in the country with the name Columbus and did a photographic display.

You've probably seen some of his posters. They're 18 by 24 inches and cover all kinds of topics: wildflowers, hamburger and barbecue joints, the word Texas, stars, birds, windmills and so forth. He has done 34 of them. Numbers 33 and 34 of his photographic montages are pictures of crosses.

In May of last year, Rick set out to photograph crosses in America. "I think I was only traveling 8 weeks over a 4-month period," he says. "By the first of September last year I had logged right at 27,000 miles, had taken 8,000 plus photographs and had visited all 48 contiguous states. I made arrangements with two friends to photograph for me in Alaska and I came up with 2 shots in public domain records that I needed for the two earliest churches in Hawaii. Of course I did the research and wanted a cross to represent each Christian denomination. I was looking for the original site of Christian activity state by state. With Christianity originating in this county on the east coast in San Augustine, Florida and up in New England where the first Christian pilgrims settled, those states have quite a few more than one example."

He framed 20 of his photos and exhibited them at the Legacy Event Center in Lubbock. "The facility was once a Presbyterian church. How appropriate is that? It's the first exhibition of the project. It wasn't easy to edit 8,000 photographs down to 20. I gritted my teeth and wanted the collection to be as dramatic as it could be. I'm honored to be in this venue. It's stellar. Everybody in Lubbock knows it well. There are lots of weddings here."

The two posters he created sell for \$24.95 each. "There are about 135 photos on each one," says Rick. "There are just a shade under 300 of the crosses that I photographed selected for the posters. I actually visited 165 different sites. There are at least two images from each state."

Rick gives programs on the crosses. "I put together a slide show and have a rambling narrative about the project. I can tailor it to any age group, any Christian activity, any travel group, any photography group, or any writing group. Churches and schools have shown interest in having me do a program. Usually when I do those, I give a slight discount on the price of the posters."

He calls his project CROSSIN AMERICA. "I was crossing America but I dropped the 'g' because I was also looking for the cross in America. It was a different type of project for me. I hope I have been as reverent as necessary considering the subject."





Also Meredith Cadell, still acting leader of the Chamber of Commerce, carried out the final Contest of her Chamber career, but she did it with ease and grace, typical of her style!

Youth who entered cattle in the Jr. Dairy Show also had the opportunity to sell those cattle at a sale, with proceeds to benefit youth activities in the coming year. The top 15 animals are eligible for the sale on Thursday June 16 at Sulphur Springs Livestock Auction, sponsored by NE Texas Farmer's Co-op. Congratulations to these young agriculturists on raising top animals! From Hopkins County 4H, Braden Lennon (Grand Champion), Elida Miller (Top Jersey) Machelle Allen, Tripp Smith, Mattie Smith, « Pilar Ortiz, Zia Miller....Como-Pickton FFA, Baylee Bowen (Reserve Grand Champion), Breanna Bowen (Showmanship), Hannah Pegues, Evan Pegues and Cameron Mathews...Sulphur Springs FFA, Jake Couch, Bayler Boatman and Spencer Brewer.

Back in 1954 on a springtime day, a young lady was called out of class at Sulphur Springs High School by Mr. Sterling Beckham, and informed that she had been chosen as the "Dairy Princess" for Hopkins County. Standing there in the hall, she was told she would be representing the local dairy industry at a special event and that she was selected by a committee of working farmers. Dairying was just 15 years old in Hopkins County at that time, and lots of families were still getting started in it! The young lady was Lynda Mosely, a dairyman's daughter. Lynda went back into class that day, and in fact finished out her week. Soon though, she was watching over the cattle exhibitions in the show barn where crowds were gathered, wearing a "milk maid" outfit made by her aunt. The event was held in May 1954 in the Show Barn, then located in City Park (Buford Park) near where the new Pavilion has now been built. (in your youth, the swimming pool was there) Lynda had graduated and married Bill Hager before the new Hopkins County Dairy Festival was officially organized in 1959. She was a member of Mother's Club then, became a volunteer and has kept her finger on the pulse of the festival all these years. This is is her 51st Dairy Festival to take part in. As a member of the board of directors, she is currently Treasurer but over the years has held most every position and gladly volunteered for every job, big or small, that it took to build the Queen's pageant to what it is today. For Lynda, presiding over a cattle show in an un-air-conditioned barn was a far cry from the prestige of the title that today's Dairy Festival Queen and contestants are welcomed to. But I'm sure she smiled all the way, just like today!

Be there on Saturday June 18 as Miss Sydney Deitze crowns a new Queen out 🥻 of the 8 contestants in the 2016 pageant. You'll see talent and beauty galore,

so don't miss the 8pm show. It will be the FIRST onstage event in the newly-renovated Hopkins County Civic Center Auditorium.

# **CROSSES IN AMERICA**

Rick Vanderpool of Lubbock doesn't hesitate to follow up on his brainstorms, no matter how bizarre they might seem or how far he will have to travel to make them happen. He is a photographer and finds fascinating ways to make a living with his camera. During the 500th anniversary of Columbus discovering America, he went to every city in the country with the name Columbus and did a photographic display.

You've probably seen some of his posters. They're 18 by 24 inches and cover all kinds of topics: wildflowers, hamburger and barbecue joints, the word Texas, stars, birds, windmills and so forth. He has done 34 of them. Numbers 33 and 34 of his photographic montages are pictures of crosses.

In May of last year, Rick set out to photograph crosses in America. "I think I was only traveling 8 weeks over a 4-month period," he says. "By the first of September last year I had logged right at 27,000 miles, had taken 8,000 plus photographs and had visited all 48 contiguous states. I made arrangements with two friends to photograph for me in Alaska and I came up with 2 shots in public domain records that I needed for the two earliest churches in Hawaii. Of course I did the research and wanted a cross to represent each Christian denomination. I was looking for the original site of Christian activity state by state. With Christianity originating in this county on the east coast in San Augustine, Florida and up in New England where the first Christian pilgrims settled, those states have quite a few more than one example."

He framed 20 of his photos and exhibited them at the Legacy Event Center in Lubbock. "The facility was once a Presbyterian church. How appropriate is that? It's the first exhibition of the project. It wasn't easy to edit 8,000 photographs down to 20. I gritted my teeth and wanted the collection to be as dramatic as it could be. I'm honored to be in this venue. It's stellar. Everybody in Lubbock knows it well. There are lots of weddings here."

The two posters he created sell for \$24.95 each. "There are about 135 photos on each one," says Rick. "There are just a shade under 300 of the crosses that I photographed selected for the posters. I actually visited 165 different sites. There are at least two images from each state."

Rick gives programs on the crosses. "I put together a slide show and have a rambling narrative about the project. I can tailor it to any age group, any Christian activity, any travel group, any photography group, or any writing group. Churches and schools have shown interest in having me do a program. Usually when I do those, I give a slight discount on the price of the posters."

He calls his project CROSSIN AMERICA. "I was crossing America but I dropped the 'g' because I was also looking for the cross in America. It was a different type of project for me. I hope I have been as reverent as necessary considering the subject."




