The Midwest Acoustic Music Festival was founded by Shannon Brunet in 2005 to garner attention for up-and-coming acoustic artists and provide a venue at which to celebrate and foster rising talent and original music. Featuring 13 - 15 acoustic music acts from across the Midwest, MAMF became an instant success. The festival has had an average attendance of 650+ fans each year.

Wedding Bells

Every year in the U.S. 2.3 million couples get married. That's over a staggering 6,300 weddings a day.

Vintage owner gains new certification

Elkhart Lake's own award-winning certified sommelier, Jaclyn Stuart has added yet another feather to her credentials as a wine steward.

Stuart, the owner and proprietor of Vintage Elkhart Lake, has officially received her certification diploma from the WSET, Wine and Spirit Education Trust based in England.

She remains only one of three wine professionals in Wisconsin to hold this prestigious certification.

To achieve this status, Stuart had to complete a six-part examination, with a research paper. The examinations each featured a written exam, plus a blind tasting session where the sommelier was required to identify the product in her glass down to the vintage, region, and grape.

The blind taste tests center around different units and topics such as sparkling wines, fortified products or spirits.

Stuart's preparation and testing period was stretched out over the past five years, prior to her opening of Vintage Elkhart Lake in 2012. She had to take a rigorous prerequisite exam before even being allowed to enroll in the Diploma program. The testing required intense preparation along the way.

Preparation for the various tests included reading and studies to keep up on the changing wine and spirits world. "You have to be globally minded to know what is trending in markets around the world. That includes keeping up on current events and trends not only in the U.S., but around the world," Stuart said.

Benefits for customers

The biggest benefit for Stuart's new certification is the credibility she adds to top of her current professional résumé as Elkhart Lake's sommelier.

"It helps our wine and spirits customers know that there is a professional here who has put a lot of thought and education behind the wines we offer," said the Vintage Elkhart Lake owner.

"It involves a lot more than just looking at labels," she added. "It's about looking beyond the label and finding the unique taste and qualities that customers are looking for."

To have a wine steward of this background and credential level is rare for a community the size of Elkhart Lake. Stuart said it takes customers by surprise in a pleasant way. "Many of our visitors come from bigger cities, and they don't expect to find a professional with this much knowledge in 'little old Elkhart Lake."

Many customers may have a deep knowledge of wines on their own, and they may come to Stuart's shop seeking wines from a region they have visited or learned about. Perhaps they are seeking a special taste in a wine. That's where her background comes into play. "Having this certification, and the training to earn it, allows me to help customers find what they are looking for," she said. "I want them to leave with a bottle of wine they will be happy with, and this helps me to be able to do that."

Stuart also shares her expertise on a regular basis through wine academy sessions held at Vintage Elkhart Lake.

Stuart also serves as a resource to other business owners in Elkhart Lake. "It's not uncommon for me to get texts, emails or phone calls from our local resorts and restaurants asking for help in choosing wine or making sure that wine is being properly served and handled.

"It's all about being a good neighbor and furthering the helping attitude that we all have as business owners in Elkhart Lake," Stuart said.

In addition to her role as a sommelier and local business owner, Stuart also currently serves as the president of the Elkhart Lake Chamber of Commerce.

While her talents are valued and appreciated locally, she is also called upon to share her skills elsewhere from time to time.

In late June, Stuart ventured to Milwaukee to serve on a panel of wine judges for the Wisconsin State Fair. This marked her second time as a state fair judge.

Stuart helped judge professional made wines submitted from licensed wineries in Wisconsin.

Judging is different from wine sampling or tasting. Judges are asked to professionally evaluate different types of wine, some which may not be their own personal preference, for the purpose of providing competition rankings.

A "sip-and-spit" method is used where the judges simply allow the wines to leave an impression on their palates, without consuming the wine. Even palates need a rest or refresher time, during the process, as crackers or other palate-restoration breaks have to be taken.

"It's all about professional discernment, in addition to consumer enjoyment when you are judging," Stuart said.

Located at 100 E. Rhine Street in Elkhart Lake, Vintage Elkhart Lake, uses Stuart's expertise to provide a unique wine-buying experience where customers can feel comfortable enjoying wine, craft beers, local chocolates & cheeses, and olive oils/vinegars bottled-to-order.

Vintage Elkhart Lake offers over 200 wines for purchase (over 100 of which are under \$14), as well as wines by-the-glass at the bar. These hand-picked wines are sourced from wineries located around the world and even some local Wisconsin vintners. "We also offer a wine club that features two sommelier-selected wines each month!" Stuart said.

Vintage recently expanded to offer more unique grocery items, a wide selection of spirits, and an event room for private parties, classes, and more!

Four community programs will be strengthened, thanks to the charitable donations program of Ladies of the Lakes, (LOL) an Elkhart Lake area woman's social organization.

Camp Anokijig will use the donation presented for their children's Scholarship Program. All the monies will go directly to scholarships for underprivileged children from Sheboygan County. Camp Anokijig has grown to one of the largest youth camps in the Midwest, and has a stellar record of successfully serving youth and families. A check was presented to Mary Krahn, Camp Anokijig Development Director and LOL member.

Finally, the Sheboygan Park Project in partnership with the Sheboygan Jaycees, will use their donation towards the building of a handicapped accessible playground in Sheboygan Evergreen Park. This park will allow all children to play in a safe structure that will be wheelchair accessible and provide many features for handicapped children and adults. After having conjoined twins 10 years ago, Ryan and Angie Shaw have dreamed of having a park that their three boys could play together in a universal playground, one that is accessible to children of all abilities. A check was presented to Angie and Ryan Shaw, founders of Sheboygan Park Project.

Ladies of the Lake, founded in 2005, meets on the second Wednesday of each month. Their purpose is to develop and enhance friendships while, at the same time, provide support for the improvement of the community. Annual dues are used for charitable purposes as determined by the memberships. New members are always welcomed and encouraged. DNR land sale parcels listed online

A list featuring 128 land parcels under department review in the third year of Department of Natural Resources land sale efforts is now available for review online.

Parcels currently under review are located in 37 counties and total approximately 5,3200 acres. Some of the parcels are located in all area counties-Calumet, Manitowoc, Fond du Lac, and Sheboygan-including parcels east of Mount Calvary along CTH CCC and Walnut Road, and in the Killsnake and Collins wildlife areas. For more information visit dnr.wi.gov and search keywords "land sales."

In June 2014, the Natural Resources Board approved the sale of 22 parcels (totaling 1,407 acres), as a part of the first phase of DNR land sales. In February 2016, the board approved the sale of an additional 81 parcels (totaling 5,633 acres) as part of the second phase of land sales.

A review process conducted by DNR field staff will consider each parcel's recreational utility, natural resources values, and how the parcel fits within the department's overall portfolio of real estate holdings. The department owns more than 1.5 million acres of land; sales and exchanges are part of the department's routine management of its land holdings.

The importance of on-the-ground parcel review was identified during the land sale process to determine if any exceptional natural resource or recreational value is present. These field reviews will take place over the next two months, and final department recommendations will be presented to the Natural Resources Board Sept. 28. DNR staff hopes to gain approval to sell approximately 3,000 remaining acres required under Act 20 and market parcels for sale in 2016 and 2017.

Wisconsin Act 20 requires at least 10,000 department-owned acres located outside of project boundaries to be made available for sale by June 30, 2017, and net proceeds will be used to repay outstanding public debt related to the Knowles-Nelson Stewardship Program.

The sale of department-owned lands under Act 20, passed into law in June 2013, will help resolve key boundary and access issues, realign land ownership with conservation partners and private citizens for more efficient management, and allow the department to work closely with partner and stakeholder organizations to meet common property and conservation goals.

Seed-to-table effort shines through

This past October, the community celebrated the ribbon cutting of the new greenhouse at Elkhart Lake - Glenbeulah High School.

The generosity of our many community members made the purchasing of the building and equipment a reality and opened new opportunities for collaboration between the Agriculture and Family and Consumer Sciences students. The Carl Perkins Grant also provided funding to the project in the form of curriculum development for Mrs. Beth Roehl, Family and Consumer Sciences Teacher and Mrs. Michelle Arbuckle, Agriculture Teacher.

Mrs. Arbuckle's Animal, Plants and Pizza class and Mrs. Roehl's Culinary Arts 3 class collaborated this semester in a Seedto-Table project that focused on student's working in a team, applying their current knowledge, teaching others that knowledge, planning a project from beginning to end, and marketing their project to the other students and staff. The end goal was for the students to grow a green in the greenhouse, choose a recipe utilizing that green, and harvest the green by April 6 for the school luncheon on April 8. The groups were assigned different greens to grow: arugula, spinach, endive, spring lettuce, pak choy, Swiss chard, and collards.

The Animals, Plants and Pizza class shared their expertise of planning within the greenhouse, germination, pest control, water testing, and harvesting. During the process of growing the greens, some of the greens did not grow to the anticipated timeline. The students then engaged themselves in problem solving and critical thinking to determine the next plan of action. Some of the groups changed the environment a bit by adding certain beneficial insects to eliminate insects that were feeding on the crop, other groups researched their options and chose to grow microgreens that would still complement their green in their recipe but also supplement their original greens. Two of the groups were fortunate and did not have any problems with the growth of their crop. Throughout the growing process students monitored and tracked the progress of their greens to ensure that they would meet their deadline on April 6.

While the greens were growing, the students chose a recipe that would be prepared to sell at the all school lunch on Friday, April 8. The students chose Arugula Bites, Spinach Quiche, Farfalle Pasta with Bacon and Endives, Zuppa Toscana Soup with Swiss Chard, Caesar Salad, Honey Chicken with Pak Choy, and Walking Tacos. Each group needed to convert their current recipe into a yield of 25four oz. servings. Throughout this process, students learned how to cost a recipe, plan the preparation of the recipe, create a grocery and equipment list, and ensure proper food handling and safety, particularly with allergens, using ServSafe principles.

The last part of the project was to market the lunch choices to the students and staff. Many of the greens were unfamiliar to the students in the class, so they knew that they would also have to educate the rest of the students and staff about their product to ensure sales. The groups marketed their product using technology, announcements, posters, promotions, word of mouth and sales flyers. Sales were tracked the day of the lunch to determine the effectiveness/success of their market-



Distance event rides again at MPTC

Moraine Park Technical College held its fifth-annual Distance Challenge recently at the College's Fond du Lac campus.

The event is hosted by Moraine Park's Process Engineering Technology and Mechanical Design programs. High school students build a device of 30 pounds or less to hurl or throw a rubber ball, with whatever contraptions getting the furthest "throws" declared the winner.

Four high schools entered teams this year: Mayville; North Fond du Lac; Elkhart Lake; and GPS Education Partners, a charter school in Jackson.

Tom Roehl, process engineering technology instructor at Moraine Park, said the event is a great way for students to learn collaboration, hone their criticalthinking skills and have fun.

"The competition is held as an opportunity for high school students to design, build and test a device under the constraints of weight, time and budget in a fun and low-pressure environment," Roehl said. "Students also win prizes donated by local manufacturers and are exposed to career opportunities in manufacturing and engineering while at Moraine Park."

This year there were six total entrants, four in the "Slingshot" division and two in the "Other" division, both being catapults.

Elkhart Lake-Glenbeulah's entry named Sling-Shot took first place in the "Slingshot" Division with a throw of 260 feet. Owen Kalbacken designed and built Sling-Shot. Elkhart Lake-Glenbeulah's Claw took second place with a throw of 76 feet. Team members were Kalbacken



and Jon Roll.

"Each year that we have held this competition, I've been impressed with the creativity shown by the students, "Roehl said. "This is an excellent project for high school students because it requires design, manufacturing and troubleshooting, all of which are skills that employers look for in skilled labor fields.

In addition to the competition, the students also had opportunities to tour the College and talk with local employers. John Ostermann, Elkhart Lake-Glenbeulah High School Technology Education, felt Moraine Park's Distance Challenge provides a great learning tool.

"Events like this are a great way for students to learn beyond the classroom. It forces students to push themselves beyond what they know and see in class. They have unknown opponents and a set of rules set by the event rather than a teacher," Ostermann said, adding "While testing at school, students often ask 'Do you think this is good enough?' They are typically looking for approval and someone to say 'Good job, it's done.' In this case, I simply ask them if they think the other team's device is "good enough" yet, or do you think they are still pushing their design to do better?"


This is what my memories were growing up there.

Boating Regulations

A Coast Guard approved Personal Flotation Device (PFD) in serviceable condition is required to be in the boat and accessible for each person in the boat.

A speed of "SLOW NO WAKE" is in effect all year long from 7:30 p.m.-10 a.m. each day. "SLOW NO WAKE" is defined as the slowest possible speed at which a boat can operate while still maintaining steerage.

Maintain a speed of "SLOW NO WAKE" at all times when operating a motor boat between the shoreline and the NO WAKE buoys and within 100 feet of any craft at anchor, adrift or not operating under engine power.

No boat towing persons skiing, tubing or the like can come within 100 feet of swimmers, divers, rafts, other boats or restricted areas.

All boats engaged in towing skiers, tubers or persons in similar activities must have a competent person, other than the pilot, observing the towed person(s).

NO SUNDAY operation of motor driven boats, beginning the second Sunday of June and ending the third Sunday of September. Note: Only electric trolling motors allowed.

There is a radar-enforced speed limit of 35 MPH on the water.

A counter-clockwise course should be maintained while water-skiing, jet skiing, etc., and during the times of high-volume boat activity. A complete listing of Elkhart Lake and the State of Wisconsin Boating Rules Regulations and Statutes is available at the Village Office in Elkhart Lake.

The Road to Wellness

Young Children Pay a High Price for Screen Time

Many parents are occasionally thankful for the television—after all, it can serve as a low-cost, short-term babysitter while they cook or do housework. At the same time, however, many parents are concerned about the amount of television that their children watch—and for good reason. Statistics tell us that in America, children under 6 watch an average of two hours of TV a day, and children 8 to 18 spend an average of four hours in front of a TV and often an additional two hours a day on computers or playing video games.

So what does all of this screen time mean for America's children? Recent research published in JAMA Pediatrics suggests that it is results in poorer wellbeing and sleep and that it contributes to childhood obesity.

In the first study, part of a larger research project called IDEFICS (Identification and Prevention of Dietary- and Lifestyle-Induced Health Effects in Children and Infants), researchers examined 3,604 children aged 2 to 6 to determine if there was a relationship between their electronic media use and their sense of well being. They assessed the children based on six standardized indicators of well being (including emotional problems, peer problems, self-esteem, family functioning, and social interactions) and compared the results to the number of hours they spent in front of a TV, computer, or video game screen. They found that increased media use predicted much poorer senses of well-being. TV was found to be more harmful than

computer use, but overall they found that there was a 1.2- to 2.0-fold increase in emotional problems and poorer family functioning for each additional hour of media use.

A second JAMA Pediatrics study involving 1,713 Spanish children found that children who watched more than 1.5 hours of television per day had shorter sleep duration and began to suffer from sleep deprivation. Their sleep duration shortened with every extra hour of television watched over the 1.5-hour baseline. And in a third study, researchers found that increased media exposure resulted in sharply increasing BMI (Body Mass Index) scores, and thus a tendency toward childhood obesity.

So how much TV is too much? Every day more research comes out indicating that exposure to electronic media can have adverse effects on children—effects that can persist into adulthood.

As a result, the American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP) recommends that children under the age of 2 not watch any TV, as the first two years of life are a critical time for brain development. Television and other electronic media can prevent exploring, playing, and interacting with parents and others, all of which are critical for social development. In addition, the AAP suggests that children older than two watch no more than one to two hours of electronic media per day.

Summers in Wisconsin are short, but amazing. Get those kids outside and get them healthier!


