Emily Fire Department responded to an alarm at 2:45 a.m. on Wednesday, June 29 at the Bungalow Sportsmans Bar and Supper Club in Emily.

According to Emily Fire Department Chief Kenny Roden, the fire started in the back diningroom and the structure was quickly engulfed in flames. The building is a total loss. The cause of the fire is unknown at this time and the fire remains under investigation.

Bungalow owner, Chris Spindler, said the main structure was about 100 years old. Spindler is unsure of his plans yet. He said the loss came just before two of their biggest weeks of the year, 4th of July weekend and Emily Day on July 16.

Crooked Lake Fire Department, Fifty Lakes Fire Department, Crosslake Fire Department and Ideal Fire Department responded with mutual aid to help contain the blaze.

How we fulfill Jesus' mission

JIM DALY President of Focus on the Family I love the way Ray Vander Laan illustrates the expanding influence of God's kingdom when we Christians live in faithful obedience to Christ. He says every time we obey our King – in

big or little things, whether in our families or throughout our communities – we extend His kingdom by a square inch.

That's the example Jesus lived out before us, and one which He asks us to follow. He extended God's kingdom by doing the will of His Father, by loving His neighbor, by loving His enemy, by touching the unclean, and by caring for sinners. In each instance, He put into practice the will of God, and God's kingdom was extended.

The same is true for us in how we conduct ourselves. The decisions we make in our classes, at our jobs, and in our homes either give away a square inch that belongs to the King or take away a square inch now belonging to the Evil One. If we run our business faithfully to God, His kingdom will grow because our business then becomes a part of His kingdom where His will is done. When we raise our children faithfully to God, the Lord's kingdom grows.

For the Christian community to understand the role God has for us in the culture, we have to rightly discern what Jesus meant when He said, "My kingdom is not of this world."

Early believers would have interpreted His words through the context of their culture and heard Him say, "My kingdom did not come from this world, but it exists right now, here, among you."

The people of that time understood the structure of power and authority all too well. They were subjects to the imperial rule of Caesar, who embodied the full authority of the Roman Empire. Caesar spread his kingdom through violence, blood, and overpowering the weak.

Jesus, on the other hand, said His kingdom was not expanded through violence and power. The world would be changed through sacrificial living, being a light to those lost in the darkness of sin, and by loving your neighbor.

When Jesus said, "Take up your cross and follow Me," He wasn't simply warning us that we would suffer for what we believe, although that's literally what it means for believers around the world. More broadly, it was a challenge to recognize the true way God's kingdom is established throughout homes, communities, and the earth.

The implications of that are staggering. By God's design, the Early Church wasn't able to bring about influence through the ballot box or by an army. Instead, God gave them a power far greater than any government could devise. The Early Church had the power of God's unconditional love. They loved their neighbor and their enemies, and it changed the world.

Our task, in our time, is no different. Our mission hasn't changed, because God hasn't changed.

A couple of weeks ago a letter writer stated that excellent teachers make excellent schools. I certainly agree. He then went on to write that a building has no impact on education. I disagree. Bricks and mortar matter.

As a government and economics instructor, I was tempted to write about social contract and cost-benefit analysis: instead, I want to focus on how it is the responsibility of public education to teach the skills necessary for people to be productive members of society. Our economy today needs workers who can collaborate, solve problems and analyze data.

The current high school is based on an outdated model where the teacher is the sage on the stage and a textbook is the only resource. Technology has changed all of this. The facts and stories that teachers once had a monopoly on are now available with the right Google search or

by posing a question to Siri. Research based strategies indicate that the old method should only be a fraction of how we deliver instruction.

Simply put, the buildings limit the services we can provide for our students. In a highly competitive world economy, our kids are at a disadvantage. We have teachers with innovative ideas for journalism, marketing, video production, biology and more but are limited by the facilities. In an era of teacher shortages, Aitkin competes for excellent educators. If we want to attract and retain guality teachers, our facilities must be competitive as well. Look to other districts and you will see robotics and engineering labs, construction classes, collaborative spaces and other areas designed for 21st Century Skills. Since the world is changing at light speed, we need to focus more on learning skills, innovation and flexibility.

Creative spaces should not be limited to the art rooms and industrial tech areas.

We can teach Aitkin's youth in our outdated buildings. I have been doing it for the last eighteen years. Just because you can, doesn't mean vou should. The current buildings limit the services we provide our students. Much like the businesses in town that realized their old buildings prevented them from fulfilling their customers' needs and built new, ISD 1 must invest in the future to maximize the potential of our youth.

Bricks and mortar are the infrastructure that frames the experience of education. They matter because they affect the opportunities of our students. It is ok for our community to be excellent. Please vote yes on August 9.




