



**Five Ways Older Adults Can Be More Active** By The National Diabetes Education Program

(NAPSA)—As you get older, your risk for health problems, such as type 2 diabetes, increases. You also have a greater chance of getting type 2 diabetes if you have a family history of the disease. But it's never too late to lower your risk for type 2 diabetes. Research shows that modest weight loss through healthy eating and being active can help to prevent or delay type 2 diabetes in people over age 60.

If you are overweight, losing 5 to 7 percent of your current body weight can help you prevent or delay type 2 diabetes. If you weigh 200 pounds, this means a weight loss of about 10 to 14 pounds. Talk to your doctor about setting safe weight loss goals and ways to be more active

Getting Started: How to Get Moving Once you set your goals, decide what small steps you will take to get started. For example, you might say, "I will walk for 10 minutes after lunch to be more active each day" until you reach at least 30 minutes a day, five days a week.

Be active, move more and sit less to help yourself lose weight or stay at a healthy weight and be more flexible and strong. Ask your health care provider how you can safely start to be more active. Before being active, be sure to warm up to get your body ready. Shrug your shoulders, swing your arms, or march in place for three to five minutes before you begin any activity.

Five Ways to Be More Active There are many ways you can get active at little or no cost, such as walking or doing chair exercises. Find an activity you can enjoy so you can stay at it. This will make it easier to stick to your plan and reach your goals. Try these ideas:

•Around the House. Things that you do every day can help you be more active. Stand up from a chair and sit down again with-out using your hands. Rise up and down on your toes while standing and holding on to a stable chair or countertop. When you watch TV, stretch and move around during commercial breaks. You can also walk around the house when you talk on the phone. Follow along with a video for older adults that shows you how to get active.

•Around Town. Being more

active can also be a great way to meet friends. Join a local walking group. Always walk in safe places such as the mall, museum or a community center. Wear shoes that fit your feet and provide com-fort and support.

•While Running Errands. Make getting active a part of your regular day. If it is safe, park the car farther away from stores or restaurants. If you take the bus or train-and the area is safe-get off a stop earlier and walk the rest •With Your Family. Get your

family involved to make being active more fun. Teach the younger people in your life the dances you enjoy. Plan a trip to the local pool and go for a swim together. Moving around in the water is gentle on your joints.

• Get Outside. When you can, get active outside. Take care of a garden or wash your car. Enjoy a brisk walk with friends or family around a park, museum or zoo.



#### Hybrids, Heirlooms And GMOs Explained

(NAPSA)—If the terms "hybrid," "heirloom" and "GMO" have you stumped, you're not alone. When it comes to buying seeds and plants, there's a lot of confusion, even among seasoned gardeners. Here are a few facts that may help.

#### Hybrids

First things first: Hybrids are not the same thing as genetically modified organisms (GMOs). Thanks to pollinators such as bees and butterflies moving pollen from plant to plant, hybrids occur naturally in nature. A hybrid is created when two different plant varieties of the same species are

cross-pollinated. In the same way that dog breeders can cross a Labrador retriever and a poodle to create a soft, fluffy Labradoodle, gardeners can select parent plants that dis-play particular traits to produce offspring that offer improved yield, size, hardiness, color, shape and taste

The process of selective breeding was pioneered by Gregor Mendel in the 19th century. When it was first used by horticulturists in the 20th century, it resulted in hybrid corn that produced higher yields. Since that point, breeders, researchers and inventive garden ers have been using the process of hybridization to produce fruits, vegetables and flowers with highly selective features. Seed producers such as W. Atlee Burpee & Co. used selective breeding to create iconic vegetables such as the "Big Boy" tomato, a hybrid that dis-played such vigor and disease resistance that it shaped the modern era of tomato breeding.

"Hybrids grow well coast to coast with stable and reliable traits across a multitude of growing environments. The dependability of flavor and garden performance is what makes them garden staples throughout the good—and the bad—growing seasons," said Chelsey Fields, a horticulturist at Burpee. Heirlooms

that haven't changed over 50 to 100 years. They're often specific to a particular area and therefore not widely adaptable. Also, unlike hybrids, their flowers and fruits tend to be less vigorous, making them more susceptible to diseases and adverse conditions. Many heirloom seeds were once available commercially and have been saved from extinction by dedicated gardeners who save fresh

seeds every year. **Genetically Modified** 

**Organisms** GMOs are quite different from both hybrids and heirlooms. GMO seeds are the result of genetic engineering, the process of alter-ing a plant's DNA in a laboratory setting. This often includes introducing genes from a different species to increase a plant's resistance to disease or spoilage. It's important to know GMOs are found only in commercially grown farm produce. Seeds or plants that might contain GMOs are not available to home gardeners in the United States. All of Burpee's hybrid and heirloom seeds are non-GMO. The company has supplied American home gardeners with the highest-quality seeds since 1876.







Preparing Your Lawn And Garden Equipment For Spring: Tips From The Outdoor Power Equipment Institute **OPEI** Reminds Consumers To Use Only E10 Or Lower Fuel In Any Lawn And Garden Equipment

(NAPSA)—Spring is on its way, and soon, home and business owners will be cleaning and preparing lawn and garden equipment.

"Many are so eager to pull out lawn and garden equipment once spring arrives that they sometimes forget basic steps to ensure the powerhouse of the equipment—the engine—is in good working order," said Kris Kiser, president and CEO of OPEI.

"One challenge is that most fuel contains some level of ethanol, which contains corrosive alcohol. If you left that fuel in the tank over the winter months, you don't want to use it in the spring. It may damage your equipment. You need to drain it and put in new fuel that is E10 or lower," advises Kiser.

Whether it's a mower, trimmer, blower, chain saw or pruner, the Outdoor Power Equipment Institute (OPEI) offers tips to help users avoid fuel-related problems and ready their equipment to operate safely.

Check the fuel tank. If fuel has been sitting all winter long in the fuel tank, do not use it in the spring. Drain it responsibly and put in fresh fuel. Remember to dispose of this fuel properly.

Use only E10 or lower fuel in your outdoor power equipment. Do not use gas with more than 10 percent ethanol (E10) in outdoor power equipment. Some gas stations may offer 15 percent ethanol (E15) gas or other fuel blends, but this higher ethanol fuel is dangerous-and is in fact illegal-to use in any small engine equipment, such as lawn mowers, chain saws, generators, and all other lawn and garden equipment.

Don't leave fuel sitting in the tank for more than 30

days. Untreated gasoline (without a fuel stabilizer) left in the system will deteriorate, which may cause starting or running problems and, in some cases, damage to the fuel system.

Inspect your equipment. Check for loose belts and missing or damaged parts. If you find anything concerning, replace the parts or take your equipment to a qualified service representative.

Drain out the old oil and put in fresh oil. Remove the oil drain plug in your lawn mower and catch the old oil in a container. Replace the plug and refill the engine with oil recommended by the product manufacturer. Properly dispose of the oil you drained.

Install clean air filters. Your engine and equipment will run much better with clean filters. Paper filters need to be replaced. Some foam filters can be cleaned and replaced

Sharpen your cutting blade Have your lawn mower's cutting blade sharpened so you can get a clean cut on your lawn. Your lawn will be healthier and your lawn mower will operate more efficiently, too.

Clean your equipment. If you did not clean your equipment before storing it, there may be dirt. oil or grass stuck to it. Give your equipment a good spring-cleaning. A cleaner machine will run more efficiently and last longer.

Review your manual. Now is a good time to read the operator's manual and refamiliarize yourself with the controls and what they do. Make sure you know how to stop the machine quickly it needed.



• Instant serving "bowls" for chips: Using your hands, lightly push the bottom of the bag into itself, creating a bottom. Use scissors to trim bag top down to access potato chips easily. Or, if vou don't have scissors, simply create a cuff to make the bag shorter. This way, you can reclose the bag if there are chips left over, and chips don't spill out of the bag left on its side.

· Never add flour or cornstarch directly to a soup or broth for gravy. Dissolve in a few tablespoons in water first and add gradually. You won't get the lumps.

· Got fruit flies? Their short life cycle can make it incredibly hard to rid yourself of their presence. Here's a great trap you can DIY. Add about 1/4 cup of apple cider vinegar to a mason jar. Drop in a piece of over-ripe fruit. Roll up a square of paper to make a small funnel, and tape into shape. Set the funnel into the jar. The flies go in for the fruit and vinegar, then can't get out

· If you want to bring shake-on spices or garnishes to a picnic, use an empty Tic Tac container. This is great for, say, Parmesan cheese that goes on a pasta salad at the last minute, or grill spices that you can shake on.

• "If you have iron stains in your sink or elsewhere, fill 'er up with Coca-Cola, and let it sit for several minutes. The Coke will eat away at the stains, and will make it easier to get them off." — A.C. in Maryland



DEAR PAW'S CORNER: My 1-year-old dog, "Clemente," gets extremely anxious whenever I leave home. He barks nonstop, as my neighbor has mentioned repeatedly. I put him in his crate whenever I leave, but it doesn't matter if I'm gone for 20 minutes or all day he will not stop barking until I get home.

home. I tried leaving him out of the crate when I go out for short periods, but then he just barks, claws at the door and scatters my shoes everywhere. What else can I do? — Beth N., Brooklyn, New York


DEAR BETH: Reducing your pet's anxiety when you leave home can be really tough. Regardless of his history — whether he was a shelter adoption or brought home from a litter — Clemente's perception is that you are leaving, and he doesn't know why or for how long. How will he eat if you're gone for days? Why won't you take him with you? A lot of things are running through his mind.

Even if you just go out of sight for a few minutes, some pets get really worried. I've come out of the bathroom to find my dog and cats clustered together, staring up at me mutely with eyes that seem to say, "Where did you GO?"

There are many things to try, all of which involve reassuring Clemente that you will come home. Contact a trainer who specializes in easing anxiety (Clemente's vet may have some good recommendations). Most importantly, do it soon. Right now he's got some anxiety, but that could develop into more destructive behaviors. Now is the time to really build that relationship with your dog and help him feel more confident that you are always there for him.


