La Festa di San Giuseepe March 19

On Thursday, March 19, the Italian American Heritage Foundation will once again host the annual St. Joseph's Mass and Table -"La Festa di San Giuseppe" at the Italian American Heritage Foundation, 425 North Fourth Street in San Jose. The event is "free" and open to all. Donations collected are shared with various local community charities.

Mass will be celebrated at 11a.m. with Father Peter Pabst, S.J, President of Cristo Rey San Jose Jesuit High School, presiding. The Lenten (meatless) Luncheon Buffet Table "Tavole di San Giuseppe" will immediately follow Mass.

Background

It is a very special day for our community, both as Italian Americans and as residents of San Jose (San Giuseppe), the patron saint of our City too. In Italy, this is very much a special day as it is also considered Father's Day there as well as a Catholic Holy Day of Obligation.

The feast has its roots in Southern Italy, specifically medieval Sicily, where petitions were presented to St. Joseph to relieve a drought; the petitions were answered with life-giving rains to the countryside. Does the theme sound familiar today given the concerns of the damage a drought can do to a community? In grateful commemoration of that miraculous occasion, St. Joseph Day events have been a mainstay of the Italian American community.

Visitors to St. Joseph Altars are given small paper bags that usually contain a prayer card, a piece of bread and an orange. The most interesting item in the bag is the fava bean. Some believe that the pantry that contains a fava bean will never be bare and so the bean is said to bring good luck. It is also believed

that if the St. Joseph's bread is kept in the home, the family will never starve.

Restricted watering hours change with Daylight Savings

Despite a few impressive rain storms this winter, California's multiyear drought is still far from over, and the need to save water remains critically important.

As spring approaches and daylight hours lengthen, the allowable hours for outdoor watering will change with the start of Daylight Saving Time. Watering will be allowed only before 8 a.m. and after 8 p.m., effective Sunday, March 8. Outdoor water use is the easiest place to reduce and accounts for roughly half of the average residential water bill.

To meet the state's voluntary water conservation target of a 20 percent reduction, San José water regulations remain in effect and apply to everyone in San José, regardless of which water utility is providing service.

According to the Santa Clara Valley Water District, statewide and local precipitation has remained low. In the Sierras, where San Jose imports half of its water, the snow pack measurement in February was only 19 percent of normal levels. Locally, groundwater level in San Jose is about 45 feet lower than the five-year average.

"The best way we can deal with drought is to continue saving water whenever possible," said Kerrie Romanow, director of San Jose Environmental Services Department. "San Jose residents and businesses are doing their part to meet water conservation targets, but we all need to remain committed to following water use rules."

The California State Water Resources Control Board declared an emergency water shortage last year and asked all Californians to reduce water use by 20 percent. The San Jose City Council also declared a water shortage emergency last year. San José's water rules only apply to drinking water, not gray or recycled water.

Here are some water rules and conservation tips to keep in mind: **1. Be cool** - water when it's coolest. After Daylight Saving Time begins on March 8, outdoor watering hours are restricted to before 8 a.m. and after 8 p.m.

2. Be quick - fix leaks as soon as possible

3. Be in control - don't let water flow into gutters or streets
4. Be a sharp shooter - with automatic shut-off nozzles. Hoses are required to have a nozzle that shuts off when the handle is released
5. Be a sweeper - sweep hard surfaces. Use a broom instead of a hose to clean patios, sidewalks, parking lots, or other hard surfaces View the full list of water use rules now in effect at www.sjenvironment.org/waterconservation. San Jose sets record for litter removal

Guided by San José's commitment to keep trash out of local waterways and the Bay, city staff, community groups and volunteers had a record breaking year in 2014 for litter removal by picking up 163 percent more litter than in 2013.

More than 6,000 volunteers, participating at 115 cleanup events, collected 654 tons of litter from streets and creeks throughout San José the equivalent to the volume of about 44 semi-trucks. The combined cleanups have had a dramatic impact on the quality of life and environment in the South Bay.

"I'm heartened by our community groups who are committed and working together to getting litter off our streets and out of creeks," said Kerrie Romanow, director of San José Environmental Services Department. "I challenge everyone who lives, works, or visits San José to get involved – put trash where it belongs, pick up litter found on the street, and join community cleanups."

small urban farms where there were once vacant lots. Successful urban agricultural nonprofit organizations have been popping up in urban neighborhoods, providing people with fresh produce and healthy food options. Gardens that the entire community can enjoy will greatly enhance the quality of the neighborhood. A voluntary agreement between the county and a land-

owner designates the use of vacant parcels of land for crop production, thereby entitling the property owner to a significantly reduced property tax bill. An Urban Agriculture Incentive Zone puts farming in cities, where thousands of people will benefit.

Studies have linked a high school summer employment experience to career success later in life. I am proud to announce the 2015 Youth Summer Jobs initiative, proposed by Supervisors Dave Cortese and Cindy Chavez and approved by the Board of Supervisors. The new program will create up to 500 paid summer internships and job opportunities for atrisk youth from ages 16 to 21years-old. This pilot program targets foster youth, CalWorks families, low-income and disconnected youth and is expected to help get kids off the streets and into a career path. Similar programs in Chicago and San Francisco have resulted in dramatic reductions in crime rates among target populations. Paid internships and employment opportunities will be coordinated with public-private and nonprofit employers through the non-profit Work2Future.

Speaking of high school summer employment, the Metropolitan Transportation Committee (MTC) is currently accepting applications for their paid summer internship program. Students in 10th- through 12th-



grade who are interested in pursuing a career in the field of transportation are encouraged to apply. During the course of the internship students will learn how public transportation agencies shape transportation decisions. Students will assist MTC staff and MTC's transportation partners like the Santa Clara Valley Transportation Authority.

out a trip to the Great Mall in Milpitas and figuring out which parent could drive them there for a Saturday afternoon, so we are happy there's a local spot they can walk to where they can go be with friends, play Kendama, participate in fun competitions and still be close to home!"

And so is Stephanie Matulich who used to drive to the Great Mall to also visit the kendama kiosk.

"My oldest son discovered Kendama at Castillero Middle School over a year ago," says Matulich. "Now it rarely leaves his hands and it quickly replaced his interest in video games. This grand opening has been all my sons, ages 11 and 13, have talked about for the last two months. They spent many weekends at the Great Mall Kendama Syndicate kiosk which was a distance to drive to enjoy the fun games and Kendama environment. We are thrilled they can now walk across the street with friends in tow to enjoy their favorite hobby."

The Kendama Syndicate already had a store at the Great Mall in Milpitas and kids from Almaden asked their parents to visit to purchase the traditional Japanese toy consisting of a *ken* (sword) and *tama* (ball) connected by a string. The ken has three cups and a spike which fits into the hole in the ball. Basic tricks consist of catching the ball in the cups and on the spike, but there is a huge variety of tricks that can be performed by juggling the ball between the cups, balancing it in various positions on the ken, and more. It takes mastery and coordination but is also calming as concentration is on the task at hand.

Parent Anne Herreria likes that her sons play Kendama rather than video games.

"I also read something so interesting on one of the kendama boxes," says Herreria. "It told about the history of kendama in Japan and how it teaches self-confidence, mastering a skill, etc. and how (like golf) you can keep getting better, learning new tricks, etc."

"The kendama craze has been so viral!" added Herreira who was in line with sons Jake and Nick waiting for the opening on March 7. "It was passed down to the elementary school kids after first being popular at Castillero Middle School. Just as the craze has been viral, the grand opening of the Kendama Syndicate was viral too! As far as I can tell, the only advertising they did was via their Instagram feed. Here's another parent who is happy to have Kendama Syndicate closer to home than Milpitas!"

Kendama Syndicate did go viral on the Instagram feed with 2,000 followers says owners Jason Morrison and Ernabeth Agutos as well as word of mouth from their young customers who live in Almaden. So quickly did they open that the old Kidtopia Palace sign at the Almaden Oak Center was still in place above their new retail store at the grand opening.

The partners' fascination with the kendama started about two and a half years ago. Visiting family in Sacramento during the holidays, Morrison noticed that his nephew was playing with one. They found out that the toy was the rage there. He purchased one and "immediately fell in love with it."

"But it was poor quality and the paint started coming off," said Morrison. He hand painted his own kendamas with durable unusual colors and offered them on a website, BLK Kendama, and sales took off. The partners decided to open their first retail store named Kendama Syndicate in a kiosk at the Great Mall in Milpitas in late 2014. They talked to their customers and took surveys finding that many were coming from San Jose and specifically Castillero School.

"We're excited to be in Almaden," says Morrison. "It's a great family area."

Morrison and Agutos still offer their hand painted kendamas at their new location but also other durable brands. Prices range from \$15.99 to \$79.99, depending on size: mini, regular or jumbo. They're looking for employees who know kendamas and can advise their customers on different games to play. They're planning games and contests at their new location. They also sell baseball caps, tshirts, holsters to hold the toy and other Kendama-related gear.

And for such a quick Almaden opening, they had Kendama pros such as Jake Weins, Matt Rice and legendary painting craftsman Sourmash. The kids and parents played games for prizes, raffles filling the new store and spilling into the parking lot at the center.

And what did the Almaden kids think of the Kendama Syndicate's grand opening who attended?

"That place is so awesome!" said Nick Herreria. "I'm going to go there whenever I'm free!"
