

## Super soaker rainstorm results in state of emergency in Aitkin

The area received a significant amount of rainfall between Sunday, July 10 and Tuesday, July 12. Reports of over five inches of rain re-

sulted in flash flooding in a number of locations. Some roads were under water and in Aitkin County at least one county road was washed out.

Aitkin County was hardest hit. On July 11, the Aitkin County Sheriff's Office evacuated the campgrounds along the Mississippi River in Jacobson, Palisade and Aitkin. Additionally, the Aitkin Police Department evacuated the campground on the Ripple River in Aitkin.

Officials from the City of Aitkin and Aitkin County met to discuss remedies to reduce the impact of the rising water on the Mississippi.

City officials in Aitkin asked residents to conserve water as storm water infiltrated the sanitary sewer system. The water conservation will allow the sewer system to continue to function.

Sandbagging began Tuesday afternoon at the substation in Aitkin, as well as, pumping at the sewage treatment plant. The Aitkin County park on the Mississippi River in Aitkin was closed, and a temporary culvert was placed on 4th Avenue.

At the Aitkin County Board of Commissioners meeting on Tuesday, a resolution was passed declaring a local state of emergency. The flooding has caused a significant amount of damage to county

The southeast corner of and township roads. This declaration and the amount of damages sustained will allow the county and local units of government to be eligible to use the State Public Disaster Assistance fund.

> Rep. Dale Lueck, 10B, met with Lt. Gov. Tina Smith and local officials to provide her with a perspective on how our area has been impacted by the heavy rains and flooding.

On Wednesday, Aitkin County Sheriff Scott Turner issued a no wake advisory on lakes in the county.

As of press time on Wednesday, the National Weather Service reported that the Mississippi River near Aitkin was at 13.85 ft. (Minor flooding is at 13 ft. and moderate flood is at 15

ft.) The National Weather Service predicted that the Mississippi River would crest at 14.5 ft. on Thursday.

Any Aitkin county residents with questions or concerns are asked to call the Aitkin County Sheriff's Office at 218-927-7435 or 888-900-2138.

As of press time on Wednesday, Crow Wing County Road 105 at Thompson Lake remained closed due to water over the road. County Road 10 south of Town Hall Road in Deerwood Township remains closed due to washouts. Spruce Grove Road in Unorganized Dean Lake Township remains closed due to washouts. There was water over the road on several other roads in Crow Wing County.

quest. The request was denied by the council. No motion was made since no action was taken. The refuse contract with Range Disposal had one last question to be resolved. The issue is that Range wants to include a provision that if a change of ownership of 51% or more with a requirement the new owner be located within a 60 miles radius. The balance of the contract would be transferable to the new owner. City Attorney Pearson recommended termination upon change of ownership. Some discussion was introduced by the Mayor about the pricing concerns she had. It was noted by Councilman Jim Goshey that the pricing had remained unchanged until the decision was to have Range do the billing instead of the City. The council voted unaminously against City Attorney Tom Pearson's recommendation of termination and for the contract assignability to a new owner if and when there is one.

The council approved the transfer of Jane Troge(Deputy Registrar from the Crosby DMV) to the part-time Deputy Clerk position following recommendation of Lisa Sova Clerk/Treasurer.

Sova requested an organizational study be done by David Drown and Associates at no charge to the city and paid for by the NJPA. The council approved having David Drown and Associates to do an organizational study on the city at no cost to the city with NJPA paying up to \$2,500 anything additional could be charged to the city.


## New electronic billboard in Crosby

## City of Crosby comes to the aid of residents with flooded basement

At the July 11 Crosby Council meeting, Councilman Dusty Paul said that the basement of Tom Scull's residence at 119-1st Street SW was completely flooded. (Scull is retired from the City Crew.) As a result the power had to be shut off and the City Crew was deployed to pump it out. He said a voucher from the Police Department for a night's stay at the Deerwood Motel was given to the Sculls since they couldn't stay in their house.

There was some discussion about if it was the city's responsibility or not.

Councilman Ron Prushek said, "Technically, I can't see how that can be a city problem really, where it's our responsibility to pump out somebody's basement."

Councilman Paul Heglund interjected "I don't know how you can say that. I'm not saying it's a 100 percent, but there had better be something

Mayor Lattery interupted "There is. The property next door, that tore down a home and built a new home, received a variance [from the city] and is kind of in

violation of their variance, because they brought the grade up too high and the Sculls never had water in their basement before."

Councilman Prushek said, "But also it was a rain we normally do not get. We don't get five inches in twenty-four

Paul Heglund indicated that the Scull's property had been pumped out before by the City Crew several years prior to this.

Chris Ryan spoke on behalf of the Planning and Zoning Board concerning the variance that was granted to the property owner adjacent to the Scull's property. According to Ryan, included in the variance was stipulation that there be no change in the elevation and a rain garden would need to be added to the property. Although Ryan indicated he didn't have the actual information about how much elevation was increased, he suggested there was substantial fill added to

the property. According to Mayor Lattery, the elevation in the back was increased and to date according to Chris Ryan no

rain garden was installed on the property as a requirement in the variance.

Councilman Prushek indicated there are two houses next to the Scull residence with both having runoff that could contribute to water problems.

Kurt Porter Attorney from Thomas & Severson, P.A., representing the property owner with the new construction in progress, asked if he could offer a solution.

Mayor Lattery didn't want to hear his solution and so he offered to speak with the city attorney Tom Pearson at a later time. This was permitted by the Mayor.

The council approved posting of two part-tine positions as Administrative Assistants to the Department of Motor Vehicles Office.

Lisa Sova read the Fire Chiefs Report because Jay DeCent wasn't present.

Maurice Slepica General Manager Hallett Center of Crosby spoke about scheduling a workshop to talk about the HVAC equipment and maintenance for about two hours. Mayor Lattery said they would send out some dates for the workshop and get back to him once everyone has a chance to respond to suggestions.

The council approved accepting Hallett Foundation donation to the Hallett Center of Crosby and the Mille Lacs Energy Cooperative donation to the Hallett Center of Crosby.

Slepica talked about having an employee working remotely from her home in South Dakota, because she is relocating there. The employee would be doing the Facebook updating and other duties, her duties, hours and pay would be less than half what she is currently doing on-site. Slepica suggested they review it at the end of December.

Mayor Lattery had concerns about security issues. No motion was made on this matter.

Council approved accepting June donations to the Jessie F. Hallett Memorial Library.

Police Chief Kim Coughlin introduced Elaine Barhorst a resident 123-3rd Street NE to inform the council of her parking problem. Barhorst said she lives on a street that dead ends by the apartment development. Her next door neighbor has four vehicles and last year they were parking on an angle. It made it difficult for them to see to back up because they parked the correct way designated for their street. Then the neighbor parked their truck in front of their house. Barhorst said that both she and her husband are handicapped. Some other problem with neighbors parking, dogs barking at all hours and backing into their yard to turn around were also noted. Police Chief Coughlin had a letter from another resident of that block talking about

area. Coughlin indicated she has been running the plates from vehicles parked on that block. Most of them are residents, but some are not. The parking situation with the apartment building residents parking there had improved since they put up signs for resident only parking. There was one sign partially covered by a tree. Coughlin indicated she would have the City Crew look into who owns the tree and possibly have it trimmed. Coughlin indicated she would to speak with the neighbors and discuss the matter.

City Attorney Tom Pearson recommended the Franklin Outdoor Sign Lease agreement and be approved by the council. The council approved it and designated the Mayor and City Clerk/ Treasurer sign it.

A request to change the ordinance to include a new permitted vehicle designation for a vehicle that is similar to a sand rail per the owners request. The request was denied by the council. No motion was made since no action was taken.

The refuse contract with Range Disposal had one last question to be resolved. The issue is that Range wants to include a provision that if a change of ownership of 51% or more with a requirement the new owner be located within a 60 miles radius. The balance of the contract would be transferable to the new owner. City Attorney Pearson recommended termination upon change of ownership. Some discussion was introduced by the Mayor about the pricing concerns she had. It was noted by Councilman Jim Goshey that the pricing had remained unchanged until the decision was to have Range do the billing instead of the City. The council voted unaminously against City Attorney Tom Pearson's recommendation of termination and for the contract assignability to a new owner if and when there is one.

The council approved the transfer of Jane Troge(Deputy Registrar from the Crosby DMV) to the part-time Deputy Clerk position following recommendation of Lisa Sova Clerk/Treasurer.

Sova requested an organizational study be done by David Drown and Associates at no charge to the city and paid for by the NJPA. The council approved having David Drown and Associates to do an organizational study on the city at no cost to the city with NJPA paying up to \$2,500 anything additional could be charged to the city.
