Evergreen track star to represent the US at the IAAF World Track & Field event in Beijing

eneba Tarmoh will represent the United States in the 200m at the IAAF World Track & Field Championships in Beijing, China to be held August 22-30.

Tarmoh, an "All-American" student athlete, grew up in Evergreen Valley and is an alumna of Mt. Pleasant High School. She is a leader in Evergreen's Cardinal Track Club.

After graduating from Mt. Pleasant High School in 2007, Tarmoh was awarded a scholarship at Texas A&M University and led her team to two consecutive NCAA Track and Field Outdoor Championships during the 2009-2011 seasons.

Tarmoh gave up her final year of eligibility to compete in the NCAA after she went professional, signing with Nike. She finished third at the 2011 USA National Outdoor Championships in the 200m behind Shalonda Solomon and Carmelita Jeter earning her a place on the 2011 IAAF World Championships Team.

Tarmoh is a graduate of Holly Oak Elementary School and Quimby Oak Middle School. Her parents, both nurses, immigrated to Evergreen Valley from Sierra Lone shortly before she was born.

After graduating from Quimby Oak Middle School in 2003, she went on to become a top scholar athlete (3.0 GPA), leading the Mt. Pleasant High Track & Field team to CCS and

California State titles. While at Mt. Pleasant, she won both the 100 meters and 200 meters at the CIF California State Meet in both her junior and senior years.

¶1 Niño brings both promise and problems for California. If El Niño conditions persist this winter as some predict and bring higher than average rainfall, our parched reservoirs and hills could finally be getting relief after four years of drought.

But, we could also be confronted with catastrophes similar to those generated by the 1997 and 1998 El Niño that triggered extensive flooding and washed out highways, bridges, and roads.

The Mediterranean diet was big news when a report was published in the *Annals of Internal Medicine* in 2013. The study examined the dietary habits of more than 10,000 women in their mid-50s to mid-60s, and compared how healthy the women were fifteen years later.

The results of the study were conclusive with more than 40 percent of the women more likely to live past 70, and have fewer chronic illnesses, physical limitations, and mental degenerative problems associated with aging. The results came as no surprise to doctors and dietitians, who have recommended this kind of eating for decades.

Interstate 10, severing a major connection from Southern California to Arizona. The flooding and mudflows caused the

Governor's office to issue a state of emergency.

The recent problems in Southern California illustrate the potential damage heavier El Niñodriven rains could generate, a situation that would be compounded by the state's growing \$59 billion backlog in deferred highway maintenance.

The backlog is the result of several factors:

A dwindling gas tax, the primary source of revenue for road repairs, that has not been adjusted since the early 1990s.

The depletion of state bonds and federal recovery grants for repairs.

The proliferation of hybrid and zero emission vehicles which contribute little or no gas tax revenue to fix our crumbling transportation infrastructure.

The condition of our aging roads caused the Governor to call a special session to address examine how to fund the repairs.

As the chairman of the special session's Senate Transportation and Infrastructure Development Committee, I have introduced a proposal that establishes an equitable process to that relies on everyone who drives to contribute their fair share. It also includes protections to ensure that revenue is used strictly for transportation purposes.

If passed and signed into law, the bill would augment the state's road repair budget by an additional \$4 billion. A portion of the new revenue would be available to eligible cities and counties to spend on local road repairs that they deem are priorities.

It may require a significant investment to upgrade our roads but it will be more costly if we do not act quickly. Our current road maintenance revenue is insufficient and mounting repairs grow by \$4 billion a year. Our roads rank as the second worst in the nation, costing drivers an average of \$590 in annual vehicle maintenance, according to the non-profit U.S. Public Interest Research

Given the crumbling condition of our infrastructure and forecasts of what could be the strongest El Niño event in recorded history, California must be prepared to restore its roads and highways.

Even if the weather models

come true and California were to be slammed by storms, it would take an incredible amount of rain, nearly 60 inches— two to three times the state's average rainfall — to return our reservoirs to normal in a single winter. Therefore, the

best we can hope for is higher than average rainfall this winter to be followed by several wet years.

But, the weather projections are not a guaranteed certainty. What we can control is our wise use of water that stretches every drop.

With luck, nature may begin replenishing our water system and with hard work we can begin restoring our transporta-

tion system.



sweet and magical collection of edible art creations were presented online to celebrate the 50th birthday of JK Rowling, thanks to a suggestion by a local teacher.







he 41st Charlie Wedemeyer high school football all-star game is over, with a score of South 14, North 6, but the game will be remembered more for the "field of play" than the final score.







s we start a new fiscal year at the city of San Jose. Inearly everyone sees the progress made in the last six months towards healing the wounds of the past and moving towards rebuilding our critical services - especially the police department. Our new mayor and council have pulled together and along with a committed city manager, labor team, and new leadership on the union side, we have made substantial progress towards a day when the needs of the city, its employees. and our residents are in balance and working together.

During the traditional month of July council hiatus, we continued to work as a council with our city negotiation's team to reach a tentative settlement with the San Jose Police Officers Association and the International Association of Firefighters on Measure B reforms. Out of this hard work and commitment to resolve our sticking points, we've reached a tentative agreement on litigation with our police and fire unions over pension, retiree healthcare, and disability


In all of this, we also must remember our history so it doesn't

repeat itself. If we want to maintain our healthy budget situation, we must remember that long range financial planning for the city is all-important. No one wanted to go to the ballot with Measure B, but we needed to address the rising pension and benefit costs that were crippling our ability to provide city

- Pension and disability benefits competitive with that of our neighboring cities
- Protecting those officers and firefighters who are harmed in the performance of their duties with

robust disability benefits, but with strong limitations to curb abuse

This settlement agreement recognizes and

retains the savings and achieves many of the best parts of Measure B. There is still some work to be done to complete this agreement. The Police Union still needs to ratify the settlement agreement as well as their labor agreement, then the Federated Employee Unions (all 9) need to vote to ratify a similar settlement which recognizes differences in the non-sworn positions.

Concerned about public safety and recognizing the quickest way to increase the number of police officers on the street was to bring back the veteran officers who left, I authored a memo (http://sanjoseca.gov/DocumentCenter/View/28 650) last year that proposed allowing Tier 1 police officers who left and wished to return, to come back to the city as though they had never left. I am glad that my proposal is

included in the settlement agreement. Achieving staffing goals of adding 150 additional officers must include a return of our experienced police officers who left and wish to

We cannot achieve our recruiting goals fast enough relying solely on new academy graduates. Last year I estimated there were at least 40 officers who wanted to return back in 2014. I am hearing now that number is much higher. I'm hopeful that with the settlement agreement many of these officers will return to San Jose.

It's time to start rebuilding and reestablishing our relationships with our employees who serve our city. We know this has been a tough time for everyone. The great recession was a wakeup call for all of us to evaluate our finances and our priorities. We have weathered the storm and we can celebrate the rebirth of our city. San Jose is back!

n just a few weeks, families in Silicon Valley will be sending their kids off to college. This is a time of great anxiety for a lot of parents as they get their students ready to set forth on their own for the first

Unfortunately, for many, it's also a time of disappointment. We have a large and growing number of highly qualified California students who weren't admitted to University of California schools despite stellar achievements, grades and test scores. And we can expect this problem is going to get worse over time.

Why is that? Well in large part it's because we have a growing state yet we don't have a growing UC system.

Consider this: in the last fifty years, the population of California has doubled. But in that time, we've only built one new UC campus (in Merced). San Jose is the largest city in the state without a UC campus and it's one of the fastest growing. We have so many bright and talented young people who would benefit from a UC in our community; not just for their college degrees but for advanced degree opportunities as well.

Since this new UC is envisioned to focus on science, technology, engineering, arts and math (STEAM), young professionals who work in Silicon Valley and want to get their Masters or PhDs would be particularly wellserved by a world-class STEAM university right in their backvard.







states that a certain amount of money is offered to increase his/her offer if there are other bids. For example, let's say the purchase price of the home is \$900,000, but the buyer is capable of increasing the offer to as high as \$930,000. The buyer can put an escalation clause saying he is willing to go as high as \$930,000. Make sure, however, that the clause also says the seller can only take the winning bid up to a level just above competing offers. In other words, if your competitors only go as high as \$928,000, the seller will only expect you to pay \$929,000, no more no less.

4. Pre-inspection

A pre-inspection may cost you a few hun-

dred dollars that may not come back to you, but yes, it can help secure the property. Ask to do a pre-inspection before submitting an offer. The seller will know you are serious.

If you love the home, then let the seller know that, either directly or through your real estate agent. Some of the most successful buyers write a letter and even send a picture of their family!

6. Be smart!

Buying a home is one of the most emotional things you will ever do! Don't let your emotions steal your wallet by overpaying because you got wrapped up in a competitive bidding war. The home you are looking at may be special, but it's not the only home that will preview during your lifetime.
