


During that summer When unicorns were still possible; When the purpose of knees Was to be skinned; When shiny horse chestnuts (Hollowed out Fitted with straws

GUN PRANKS IN DEL RIO

Tumbleweed Smith



Gary Humphreys has a gun shop in Del Rio. A giant sculp ture of a six-shooter stands beside his building. Gary is one popular guy. He loves history, explores old battle sites and is active in all sorts of shooting events for kids. He has a buddy named Anthony Kusenberger who is a great practical joker.

They are both members of the Lions Club and when Gary was running for some office within the club, Anthony served as his

campaign manager. At a club luncheon, he got up and made a speech in Gary's

"Nobody in Del Rio knows more about guns than Gary Humphreys," spoke Anthony from the podium. "He stays real busy at his shop taking care of his many customers who bring in their guns for repairs. Sometimes, though, he gets behind and is late getting the guns fixed and back to their owners. Some time ago, a twelve-year-old boy had a small rifle that needed repairing and he and his mother took it to Gary's shop. I'm glad to say I've got that rifle right here and the owner is here to pick it up. So little Jimmy Blocklinger please come up here."

Jimmy Blocklinger is a survivor of Pearl Harbor who is in his eighties. The Lions Club members had a good laugh. Gary, though, was not amused.

"Back at my shop," says Gary, "I found a twenty-two that I've had there since the mid-eighties. This little teenager and his mother brought it in to be repaired. It would have cost more to repair it than what it was worth, so I called the mother and told her it'd be better to just replace it with something and she could pick up the gun. She never came to pick it up. The woman happened to be Anthony's mother and that gun belonged to Anthony."

Last fall Del Rio had its annual wild game dinner during which 125 guns were given away at a raffle. Anthony won a rifle worth about \$700 and was going to pick it up at Gary's gun shop.

"One of my employees, who had heard about the prank Anthony pulled on me," says Gary, "suggested a good way to get back at him and get rid of that old gun. He said we could take that expensive gun out of its box and put that rusty old twenty-two in it. I thought that was a good idea, so that's what we did. We sealed up the box real good to look like it had never been opened. Anthony came down, filled out the necessary paper work, picked up the gun and out the door he went."

Gary got a call from Anthony later that afternoon.

"He said he got home and opened up that box and was looking at the gun, not realizing that it was the one he had as a teenager. His wife commented that she thought the guns were supposed to be new. Anthony got the right gun and he's happy now, probably thinking about another prank to pull on me."
