Walker leads Elkhart Lake walk

Wisconsin's First Lady, Tonette Walker brought her entourage, and associates from the Wisconsin Tourism Council to Elkhart Lake in early July to encourage the community to take part in the 52nd "Walk with Walker" event.

A host of local business people and residents showed up on the grounds of The Osthoff Resort early July 7 to take a walking tour of Elkhart Lake for dual promotion purposes.

First off, the walks are geared to promote fitness and wellness. Secondly, they offer opportunities to learn about great places in Wisconsin. According to Walker and Stephanie Klett, Wisconsin Tourism Secretary, Elkhart Lake sure qualifies on both counts.

So far we haven't repeated one single location. We are just that lucky to have so many wonderful places in Wisconsin," she said.

Walker continued that the Walk With Walker program has continued to wrap its health and fitness theme around the opportunity to interact with people in key Wisconsin locations.

As each walk unfolds, participants are able to walk with the First Lady and hold conversations about topics they wish to share. It's a tradition she started when her husband was Milwaukee County executive. "We have moms with strollers, and 80-year-olds with canes who turn out for

Sharing our Journeys

Touring Henry Ford Museum

Now that summer is here, many Wisconsinites are looking around for a good place to visit. Not necessarily for a full-blown vacation (Wisconsin itself is pretty nice in the summer), but maybe just to get away for a week or so to do or see something different. My husband and I have found a perfect place.

Although most of you know about Henry Ford and his application of the "assembly line" process to the production of the automobile, have you ever heard of Dearborn, Michigan or Greenfield Village? I thought so. Well, that's where it all happened. Dearborn is about 500 miles from Elkhart Lake and is the site of Greenfield Village, a replica of some 300 years of American life and the homes of Ford, Edison's Menlo Park, Firestone, Noah Webster, Robert Frost, and the Wright brothers. To really do justice to the sights of Greenfield Village, you should allow at least one day of touring.

The other "musts" on our list would include the Henry Ford Museum and the Ford Rouge Factory tour. The museum exhibits not only the usual museum sights, but also such unique selections as a "driving America" presentation, the Rosa Parks bus, the Kennedy limousine (where he was shot), the Lincoln chair, and a round "Dymaxion House."

The Ford Rouge Factory tour consisted of two introductory films and then a walking tour of an operating assembly plant, which featured the all-new aluminum Ford F-150. This included actual assembly lines which moved the various parts of the vehicles to and from all the workers along the line, each adding his own parts/segments to what then became a complete small Ford truck at the end when it rolled off the line. The production time took 90 minutes for each truck, all of which had already been ordered, sold, and paid for. Also included in the factory tour were sights of an environmental first, "the world's largest living roof" which sported green vegetation growing on all the roofs and some additional land devoted to orchard trees. These natural plants had attracted back such living animals as frogs and birds, which had been frightened away during the construction period.

All in all, visitors should plan at least two full touring days to see and absorb the sights and exhibits offered at Dearborn — Greenfield Village itself, the Henry Ford Museum, and the factory tour. So, the next time you're looking for something to do or see, take a look at some of the sights right back here in the USA, including Dearborn, Michigan.

Camp Anokijig observes birthdays

For 90 years Camp Anokijig has played a major role in developing young lives along the beautiful, wooded shores of Little Elkhart Lake.

Started in 1926 as a YMCA camp with ties from the Racine area, Anokijig is celebrating a pair of birthdays this year.

Not only is it 90 years old as an ongoing youth and family camp, Anokijig is also celebrating its 10 year birthday as an independently owned and operated camp.

In January 2006, the Friends of Camp Anokijig stepped forward to purchase the camp, insuring its viability as a youthbuilding camp for future generations.

"It was a huge step for the Friends to take on this project," Anokijig Executive Director Jim Scherer said. "But we had great support from the community and a lot of wonderful alumni, who understood the value of what we strive for here at Anokijig."

With the same leadership team and mission, Camp Anokijig forged through that transition, emerging seamlessly.

"Being independent, we have had the opportunity to serve more people than ever before," Scherer said.

One of largest camps

Anokijig's stellar record of serving young people and families lies at the core of its growth to one of the largest youth camps in the Midwest.

Speaking of core, Anokijig focuses on core values that keep families and young people coming back.

The word Anokijig is a Native American word that means, "We serve." The team of leaders at Anokijig believes firmly in the spirit of servanthood that also fosters development of new friendships, positive values, personal growth and positive life changes.

Anokijig accomplishes that goal in the spirit of outrageous fun and great adventurism.

"Anokijig is not just another place to go," Scherer said. "It is a character building machine that surrounds children 24/7 with positive mentors and lifestyles in a very special community that nurtures numerous opportunities for them to grow in character and self worth."

He added that the spirit of Anokijig is a force that can change lives and influence future horizons for young people. The camp's mission statement hails its dedication to development of positive lifestyles based on Christian principles and values through the camp experience.

A team headed by Scherer includes 10 full-time staff members, one part-timer, and 120 seasonal employees.

Anokijig's beautiful natural home lies in the rolling hills of the Kettle Moraine on the southeast corner of Little Elkhart Lake—356 acres in all.

In an average year, Anokijig serves more than

- 2,500 summer campers,
- 500 family campers,
- 3,100 outdoor education students,
- 2,190 group/retreat participants,
- 670 teen summer leadership core participants,
- 520 adult summer leadership core participants, and
- 380 program and weekend volunteers.

 In all, more than 10,750 people, young and old alike took part in Anokijig pro-

grams in 2015! More than 70,400 volunteer hours were

donated to the camp, giving Anokijig the equivalent of 34 additional full-time staff members every week.

And, since Anokijig believes strongly in accessibility for everyone, the camp also made nearly 200 scholarships available to campers last year, helping those who were financially challenged.

Limitless opportunities

Outdoor experiences and learning opportunities at Camp Anokijig seem to be boundless.

Campers get to pick from activities that speak to their interests, and they can choose from a wide range of choices. All varieties of water sports and activities are provided along the lakefront, including swimming, fishing, windsurfing, kayaking, sailing, canoeing and just about every other imaginable opportunity in a safe and supervised setting.

Anokijig is a horse-lover's paradise, as the camp offers a herd of its own riding horses, 55 in all, to provide lessons in animal care and grooming and trail riding.

Nature is at the heart of many of the camp's offerings, with classrooms set out

along woodland trails and paths. Activities range from traditional crafts to digital photography and imaging.

The fine arts also have their place, with music, drama, dance and comedy options available to those of interest. And, there's a whole lot more.

Outdoor sports also include archery and a pellet gun shooting range.

During the normal week, campers also come together for great team and community building activities. Meals are served in the spacious Western Lodge atop the hill. Campfires bring everyone together a couple of times a week, and one day usually features a full blown beach partying during summer camping weeks.

Resident campers also have Specialty camp options available with emphasis on horseback riding, fishing, comedy, team sports, jewelry-making, youth shooting sports, competitive swimming or an adventure challenge!

Adventure abounds

For those that want to test their courage or adventuresome spirit, Anokijig extends its boundaries to include off-site



experiences.

Campers grade 7 and up can customize their camp experience with day trips including whitewater rafting, paintball, caves/spelunking, or thrills at a water park or go-kart complex.

Also available for grade 7 and up are week-long adventure trips to incredible locations. Campers report with all other campers to start and finish their week at Anokijig but the rest of the week is spent enjoying unique opportunities like Sylvania backcountry canoe fishing, Apostle Island sea kayaking, whitewater rafting in northeast Wisconsin or Rock, Roll and Splash!

Family Camping

Anokijig also offers Family Weekend Camping opportunities, with a full range of activities for families to enjoy, including horse rides, sailing, windsurfing, arts & crafts, pontoon excursions, swimming, archery, fishing, kayaking and canoeing, campfires and specially planned weekend

Elkhart Lake-Glenbeulah High School Students will get a chance to meet their new principal at a special open house on Monday, Aug. 1.

Ryan Faris has taken the reins as ELGHS prinicipal, succeeding Jim Brown, who is headed for a career change in the Appleton Schools system.

Faris said meeting students, staff and community are his highest priority, and something he truly looks forward to in this month leading up to a new school year.

"The biggest part of the new role is getting to know students and staff and learning what they value, and what Elkhart Lake-Glenbeulah High School is all about. I am also excited to reach out to community members and learn their expectations," he said.

Faris said the initial weeks and months in his new job will be all about building relationships. "I look forward to sitting down with people and have good conversations," he added.

The official meet-the-principal openhouse is set for August 1 from 5-7 p.m. following the registration day for ELGHS from 1-5 p.m.

"I anticipate having my family here to meet and greet the community," Faris

Teaching/coaching background

Faris, who holds a Master's Degree in Education Leadership from Marian University, has 15 years experience as a teacher and coach. He earned his Bachelor of Science Degree in education with an emphasis on broad field social science.

Faris has spent his entire career in the

Random Lake School District—a member of the same WIAA conference as Elkhart Lake-Glenbeulah.

After six years of teaching at Random Lake Middle School, he added nine years as a high school social studies instructor.

Faris has been the character development coordinator for the PBIS program at Random Lake, and has served as advisor for National History Day and Model United Nations. He has also served on the district and building leadership teams in his teaching role.

Outside the classroom, Faris has parlayed his passion for sports into a 13-year stint as a girls basketball coach—including serving as Random Lake's varsity girls coach.

"Coaching in the same conference, I have made at least one visit a year to Elkhart Lake for the past several years," he said.

Small school background

Faris said he sees the ELGHS principal's roles as a good fit for his small school experience, as well as the things he values in education. "When I met the individuals on the hiring community, I admired their passion for this school and the community, and that really drew me in," he added.

In addition to serving as ELGHS principal, Faris will also be the advisor to the Future Business Leaders of America. "I like the opportunity to interact with students outside the classroom—getting to know kids outside the principal's office," he said.

Away from school, the new ELGHS principal relishes his role in what he calls a "baseball family."

Both boys compete on their teams, his oldest recently being named to a Wisconsin All-Star team. "We are literally travelling to diamonds all over the place as a family. It's what we enjoy doing," he said.

activities.

Family campers have the option of selecting either platform tents or lodges for their accommodations.

In addition to family camping, Anokijig is used by schools for outdoor instruction opportunities, and by business and other groups for off-site conferencing and/or team-building experiences and meeting opportunities.

Scherer noted that many young people get their start at Anokijig as part of the family camping experience, then roll right into the normal camper routine as they come of age.

Anokijig's normal age range for campers is 7-16. Camping experiences can include a four-day option, one week, two weeks, or as long as nine weeks.

"Once a camper comes here, they really become part of the Anokijig family experience. Many of them keep coming back year after year," Scherer said.

Some of the young campers evolve into camp counseling roles. Others, remembering great experiences may wait until adult life to return as volunteers. Some come back as retirees to work on the grounds or assist with other logistical needs.

No matter the connection, they become attached in timeless fashion to the experience that they knew as campers at Anokijig.

And the spirit of service still speaks to their hearts.

By the way Camp Anokijig is pronounced "anna-kee-jee" and as the brochure says, "If you can't pronounce it, you haven't been there. If you haven't been there, you just haven't been."

Camp Brosius celebrates 95 years of summer fun

Gently jutting into the clear, calm waters of Schwartz's Bay, you'll find an Elkhart Lake institution that's been a local mainstay since 1921. Celebrating its 95th anniversary this summer, Camp Brosius, owned and operated by Indiana University, is more than just a camp for families and college students. It's a place that honors simpler times, where an afternoon of string art, hot dogs and sailing can restore the souls of both adults and children alike.

"I think the camp in many ways is timeless. It is comforting for those of us who value and appreciate family and tradition to get away from all of the pressures of our daily lives and connect with nature, our families and friends, our hobbies and just relax. In a constantly changing world, I enjoy the comfort of knowing what to expect and having that be delivered year after year," says Ann Skirvin, a previous Camp Brosius staff member and longtime guest.

Every summer, over 800 guests descend upon the 17-acre camp, each signed up for a week's worth of classic camp activities—from paddle-boarding to kickball, line-dancing to hiking. Family Camp, which runs from mid-June to early August, includes separate programs for adults and children, and allows for plenty of opportunities for families to spend time together as well.

Camp Brosius also holds its College Camp for two weeks in May and one week in August, requiring Indiana University students majoring in exercise science, fitness management and personal training, sports management or physical education to take two courses at Camp Brosius.

Although the programming has been modified over the years, little has changed about Camp Brosius since it was founded in 1921.

The camp has its roots in a surprising area of study—gymnastics. At its start, Camp Brosius served gymnastics students from the Normal College of the American Gymnastic Union, which later became part of Indiana University. In 1937, Camp Brosius began to offer summer camp programming to children. And in 1974, the camp started its Family Camp experience for Indiana University alumni and their families. Today, Camp Brosius is completely open to the public.

Wiley and Mary Craft, directors of Camp Brosius' Family Camp, note that members of one family have been coming to the camp every summer for the past 95 years.

The Crafts can both feel the sense of history at Camp Brosius, saying, "Besides being an absolutely beautiful place, it has tradition. You can see and feel the memories being made."

Camp Brosius not only impacts each and every guest; it also makes an impact on the Elkhart Lake community. Each year, the camp spends around \$300,000 at greater Sheboygan County retailers, partnering with utility companies, grocery stores and a variety of vendors. Boat repairs are made at B&B Motorsports. Signage is provided by Marshall Sign. Golf cart rentals come from Jim's Golf Cars. And that's just to name a few.


The camp positively affects Elkhart Lake's tourism revenue as well. College and Family campers spend money locally on food, shopping, recreation and transportation. Camp Brosius offers short jaunts to local points of interest, taking campers to golf courses like Quit Qui Oc and Erin Hills, wineries, spas, art galler-

When Camp Brosius patronizes nearby businesses and brings in guests who shop locally, the economic benefits to Elkhart Lake come to nearly \$1 million.

Dan Garton, the president of Elkhart Lake's Friends of Camp Brosius community group, says, "Camp Brosius is focused on being a good lake resident. We are fortunate to have this camp."

Skirvin has personally patronized Elkhart Lake businesses as a camp guest

and as a counselor, saying, "I remember taking children every week on a lake hike to Gesserts and having Yvonne Landgraf scoop ice cream for excited children. As a camp guest, a typical week for me includes shopping at the farmer's market, going to favorite local shops like Gina's and Enchanted Florals, having lunch at the Barefoot Bay Tiki Bar and taking a trip to Hennings Wisconsin Cheese."

She adds, "I think the ties and loyalty

to Elkhart Lake run deeper than people might know for campers and staff at Camp Brosius."

Camp Brosius has been entirely self-sustaining since 2005, operating on a breakeven budget supported by student and guest fees. The camp's day-to-day essentials are always met, but it's the big-ticket needs, such as new buildings or renovation

projects, that require funding from an endowment, insuring that the camp will have a long and prosperous future.

Gifts to the new endowment campaign, known as "Ignite," will be invested by the Indiana University Foundation in perpetuity, meaning that long-term needs will be met and the chances of sustainability will be improved. Camp Brosius has access to the investment earnings on an annual basis, which can be used on a significant building renovation project or used during a year when the camp may experience an operational shortfall. It's the camp's "insurance policy," if you will.

Garton, who would like many, many more generations to enjoy Camp Brosius in the coming years, says, "It is an important element of the lake's history and tradition. We all think the camp is a great neighbor, and would fear what could happen if the camp were ever determined to be unsuccessful."

Thanks to the endowment and gifts to the general fund, it looks as if Camp Bro-

sius has a bright future ahead. Much to the delight of its loyal guests, who visit year after year to enjoy the camp's timelessness and dedication to summer fun.

Jay Bradley, director of the College Camp, says, "At camp, you really don't even know the rest of the world exists. There are not many other places in the country like Camp Brosius."

Skirvin echoes Bradley's sentiment, saying, "There is a magic in seeing your children sing campfire songs and be silly at any age. You start to feel as though you reconnect with a younger version of yourself, to not be afraid to try new things or let down your guard. There is something special about sitting on the waterfront, seeing the sails on the boats set up, the sun shimmering on the water and knowing you have the whole day ahead of you. At the end of the week, I am always sad to hear the gravel under the tires for the last time that week, and I am always eager to return."



Learn about jams, jellies at Old Wade

On Saturday, Aug. 6 and Sunday, Aug. 7 from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m., in the Wade House kitchen, costumed interpreters will produce and can flavorful jams and jellies. Visitors will get to experience the canning process by watching and listening to staff as they follow recipes dating back to 1858. Staff will use raspberries picked on the Wade House grounds to make the jam and jelly and then will seal canning jars with brandy-soaked paper rounds and five layers of tissue paper.

Interpreters will also explain the differences between jams and jellies. They will explain that both are preserves but are very different when it comes to ingredients, recipe, and overall composition. Jams are usually made with whole fruits that are boiled in sugar until they form a thick, spreadable gel. Chunks of the original fruit are usually visible and tend to make the end result somewhat lumpy. The same is not true for jellies. In most cases, jellies are made only from juices, which means that they contain no fruit pieces or seeds. They

tend to have a smoother, more uniform consistency as a result.

"Jams & Jellies" will take place at the Wade House Historic Site in Greenbush. Visitors will begin the special experience at the new Wade House Visitor Center and Wesley W. Jung Carriage Museum located at W7965 State Highway 23. Admission is adults \$11; students/seniors \$9.25; children (5-17) \$5.50; family (up to two adults and two or more dependent children (5-17) \$30. Admission includes a tour of the new Wesley W. Jung Carriage Museum, a horse-drawn vehicle ride to the historic area, a guided tour of the stately, 27-room stagecoach hotel, a trip to the Herrling Sawmill to see and feel the rumble of an up-and-down, water-powered saw, and a journey to the blacksmith's shop.

The Road to Wellness

Can we take youth sports too seriously?

There's a curious dynamic at work in youth sports these days. Maybe you've

On the one hand, public health officials are worried about a broad decline in team sport participation among children. According to a recent survey, the number of kids between the ages of 6 and 17 who play organized baseball, basketball, football, and soccer fell about four percent between 2008 and 2012.

And on the other hand, healthcare professionals are also worried about many of the estimated 60 million children in the U.S. who do play organized team sports. They see signs that young athletes may be taking their sports too seriously—training too hard, playing too much and specializing entirely too early in life. The popular media offers many statistics and anecdotes that seem to point in this direction:

- "While injuries from recreational activities such as biking have fallen over the last decade, team sports including football and soccer saw injuries rise by 22.8 percent and 10.8 percent respectively..." (Wall Street Journal)
- "While concussions account for about 15 percent of youth sports injuries, experts say many sports carry risks for musculoskeletal injuries, in large part due to increased emphasis on yearround competition, single-sport concentration and intense training regimens, even for pre-teen athletes." (Wall Street
- "Overuse and overtraining are also major concerns... As children become good at competitive sports, there is sometimes an impulse to keep them in the same sport year round, which may not be the healthiest thing for a young athlete." (HealthDay News)

What's more alarming to physicians than the number of youth sports injuries is the nature of those injuries. Less than half of the sports injuries that I've seen in the last three years are the sorts of sprains and sprains and contusions that have traditionally been common among young athletes. Fifty percent to 60 percent of them are related to overuse. Because the musculoskeletal system of children and teenagers is still growing, they may be especially susceptible to these kinds of injuries.

Unsurprisingly, each sport has its own risk profile when it comes to overuse injuries. For instance, overuse injuries of the shin and knees are most common to runners. Baseball, softball and football players often have elbow and shoulder

In addition, doctors say they tend to

these types of overuse injuries more often in children who play one sport year-round or play over multiple consecutive seasons without taking a break rather than in those who participate in a variety of athletic activities. Recent research found serious overuse injuries are 2.3 times more common in young, single-sport athletes than they are in more well-rounded athletes, even after accounting for the number of hours committed.

There may be several reasons for the apparent trend in overuse injuries. Experts believe that there's growing pressure among athletes to specialize in one sport—and sometimes even in one position—at a younger and younger age. They also believe that youth training programs and competition schedules are simply becoming more demanding. At the same time, though, it's likely that many managers and coaches at this level (not to mention parents) don't fully understand the risks and don't work with their young athletes to build healthy training and injury prevention habits. And when they are injured, it's not uncommon for children to return to practice before their injuries are completely healed.

So what's the best advice for the parents of a talented (or even just enthusiastic) young athlete?

- Encourage a wide variety of athletic activities and well-rounded development. Evidence suggests that playing more sports leads to fewer overuse injuries, lower burnout rates and better overall performance in the long run. While there's no hard-and-fast "rule," many experts suggest that children and parents avoid specializing in a single sport before the age of 14.
- Take time off. The American Academy of Pediatrics Council on Sports Medicine and Fitness advises that children practice no more than five days per week and take at least one day off from any organized training. Some experts offer an alternative rule-of-thumb: young athletes shouldn't participate in a sports more hours a week than their age. The Council also suggests a two- to three-month break to recover between
- Teach—and practice—injury prevention from an early age. Warm-ups and whole-body stretches should become lifelong habits.
- Be sure your athlete understands what overuse injuries are, how to recognize them and how they should be


