The route started and ended in Proctor and included McGregor, Grand Rapids,



## Crosby approves garbage contract; turns attention to garbage ordinance

At the City of Crosby Council meeting on July 25, Mayor Joanna Lattery read aloud a Proclamation declaring Friday, August 5 as Hayden Zillmer Day in Crosby. Hayden is an accomplished Wrestler on NDSU and the U.S. Olympic Wrestling Teams and son of Nick and Mary Zillmer of Crosby.

The council approved filling the staff positions at the DMV with Tracy Fuller as a part-time administrative assistant and a fill-in position with Lynette Zontelli.

The council approved the final form of the five year refuse contract between the City of Crosby and Range Disposal. There was some discussion about the time frame for switching the responsibility of garbage customer billing from the City to Range Disposal. Then the owners of Range Disposal signed the contract with the understanding there would be time allowed for changing the billing over.

The council approved the addition to the fee schedule an annual fee for On Sale Tap Room License \$500/year, Off Sale Brewer Taproom License \$200 and Sunday Brewer Taproom license \$100.

The council approved the 2 a.m. liquor license for Lamplighter Inc, DBA Spalding House.

Council approved reappointment of Linda Peeples to the HRA Board.

Council approved the gambling permit for Ducks Unlimited Banquet September 17, 2016.

Planning and Zoning Specialist Justin Burslie presented information about the new Ordinance Violation Reporting and Enforcement Policy. This would provide a formal standardized form for reporting violations. Forms will be available on-line and at the city hall. There was some discussion between Lattery and Burslie about who should handle the forwarding the written complaints. Clerk/Treasurer Lisa Sova suggested that this was just a formalization of the process that already exists.

Council approved the ordinance violation policy.

Burslie indicated that in February of this year the Kellys got a variance with conditions including details of no additional fill be added to increase the elevation of the new structure they were building. It was determined following a survey that following the construction that the elevation of the northwest corner of the structure had been raised by 1.05 feet and fill had been added. To correct the violation of the variance the elevation would need to be reduced by the 1.05 feet and an engineer would have to adjust the footings accordingly. The Planning and Zoning Commission would allow until August 15 for these changes to occur. Tom Scull spoke about since the construction his basement had flooded three times. He had concerns about when the French drain would be installed. Burslie indicated the French drain would be the final phase of the Kelly's construction. The Kellys have been working on getting into compliance with the conditions of the variance by August 15. The Sculls had concerns about the additional time being allowed, because each rain could cause their basement to flood again.

Councilman Jim Goshey spoke about the progress with the Weilding fence being removed from the City right of way. The deadline for the removal was June 1 and it was decided to inform the Weilding's in a letter from City Attorney Tom Pearson about the remaining 10 foot portion of fence on the east/west corner is still on the right of way.

City Building Inspector Scott Sadusky spoke about building permits and roofing permits for roof repair from hail damage. Sadusky had hired a new employee and it is working out well. The code enforcement has been complaint driven only. With the additional help, Sadusky was wondering if the council would like to direct some active ordinance violation investigation. It was decided to continue to use the written complaint forms to drive investigations.

Sadusky talked about a contractor working on blocking off the doorway for a coal chute. The contractor indicated that he had the project 85% complete and said he hadn't been paid by the property owner. The permit was issued to the property owner Linda McLaughlin at 1st Ave SW & Main Street. Sadusky asked why he was not notified that construction had started so he would inspect it. The contractor indicated he had pictures of the construction Sadusky could look at. Sadusky was told by Mayor Lattery to inform McLaughlin to stop the work before it could be inspected. Sadusky and City Engineer Phil Martin said they would get together to inspect the visible work on-site before the next council meeting and give their recommendations.

City Engineer Phil Martin spoke to the council about the CSAH 33 city utility work including the sewer line through the ball field and the old railroad grade. Also included would potentially be replace a sewer dump tank for the campground with a new sewer line.

At some point in the future, if done correctly, the coal bin will need to have drainage holes put in using a contractor that is bonded. Martin has concerns about who is doing the work and their responsibility level. Mayor Lattery asked if they could have the property owner Linda McLaughlin sign a hold harmless agreement. City Attorney suggested that the Building Inspector Sadusky and City Engineer Martin should meet with McLaughlin. Then get estimates and work out agreement to access the coal bin filling costs on her property taxes payments over a period of time. Mayor Lattery asked how long will that take. Sadusky said he would contact McLaughlin Tuesday morning and coordinate with Martin on his availability. Martin indicated the estimate he had before ranged between \$25,000-\$30,000 for the coal bin project.

Martin indicated that regarding Holiday issue on First Street he would have a feasibility study ready for the next council meeting.

City Attorney Tom Pearson talked about the Franklin outdoor lease contract; and the council approved the new contract.

SLSSD land conveyance

at a cost of \$1 was approved by the council with the city concerns being addressed between SLSSD engineer and the City Attorney.

Pearson then spoke about the Holms Radiator payment.

Councilman Jim Goshey informed the council of a proposed SLSSD averaged flat rate to the cities. The City Engineer indicated it would be dependent on what the water pump-age reading was compared to the amount billed to the residents as recovered by the city. If the cites billing from the District was using the average pump-age instead of the amounts from the residents the average amount would likely be higher.

Goshey talked about a bushes quote for around the base of the Serpent statue in the Park. Barberry Shrub bushes would cost \$31 per bush. Depending on how many 24-30 shrubs the total would be from \$744 to \$930. There could be better pricing next spring if they waited. After looking into if they had it in this years budget it was decided to put it in the budget for next year.
