Vote on Aitkin School \$68.5 million referendum August 9 School board has already approved purchase of 221 acres for \$750,000

By ANN SCHWARTZ Bernie Novak, Aitkin superintendent of schools, is urging people to vote next Tuesday, August 9, on building a new grades 5-12 school in Aitkin and remodeling Rippleside Elementary.

"But I'm not going to tell them to vote yes or no," said Novak in an interview. "I'm asking that they get the

en to fix the present school facilities which are older and need upgrades. "We'll probably reconvene the Community Task Force and see what our options are to upgrade the buildings."

Answers to frequently-asked questions

According to the district's website, the \$68.5 million bond referendum would replace the current grades 7-12 high school with a 5-12 grade building on the new land and remodel Rippleside Elementary to a preK-grade 4 school. Due to retiring debt on recent construction bonds, the new amount would be

\$18.75 per month on a \$100,000 home.

Goals that would be met

include healthier buildings, safer properties with better traffic flow and secure building entrances, full compliance with state building codes, more efficient operations and more flexibility to meet student and staff needs.

A Community Task Force, formed by inviting some folks and other volunteers, made this recommendation on March 29, 2016.

Although the district has been going through a facilities evaluation process for many years, it says that now is the time when interest rates are low and before construction costs -- still lower than before the recession -- go up. And there are immediate needs at the high school.





Minnesota sells \$799 million general obligation bonds for state projects

On Tuesday, August 2,, the State of Minnesota sold nearly \$799 million of general obligation bonds. The proceeds of the bonds will fund capital investment projects in the State such as construction of higher education facilities, highway projects,

and economic and redevelopment projects previously authorized by the legislature. The bond sale also included a refunding that refinanced a portion of the state's outstanding debt, saving the State \$40.4 million through fiscal year 2029.

"Today's bond sale stands as an example that investors have confidence in Minnesota's fiscal position. We have a balanced budget, growing reserves, and a healthy surplus. Under Governor Dayton's leadership, Minnesota has taken the necessary steps to

throughout the state, while also managing our financing affairs in a prudent manner. As a result, our economy is thriving and the credit markets have responded favorably," said Myron Frans, Commissioner of Minnesota Management and Budget.

Last week, the credit rating agency Fitch Ratings announced that they upgraded

make critical investments Minnesota's credit rating to AAA, the highest rating awarded by the firm.

"The interest rates we secured were lower than we had projected. Taxpayers can rest assured that this will mean long term savings for Minnesota," Commissioner Frans said.

The four series of general obligation bonds were sold competitively. The interest

cost on the G.O bond issues ranged from 2.13% to 2.29%. The refunding sale, which refinances a portion of the state's outstanding debt, received an interest rate of 1.57%

Kutak Rock acted as bond counsel on the transaction and Public Resources Advisory Group was the State's financial advisor for the sale.

Highway 6 north of Crosby reduced to single lane beginning August 8

Motorists on Highway 6 between the Mississippi River bridge, four miles north of Crosby, and Moritz Road, north of Pery Lake, will encounter delays while segments of the road are reduced to a single lane beginning Monday, August 8.

The closures will occur from sunrise to sunset, Mondays through Saturdays, and will be complete by Friday, September 2.

Flaggers and a pilot car will control traffic through the

daily work zones. Motorists approaching each work zone must slow down and prepare to stop, obey the flagger and follow the pilot car through the work zone. Motorists entering the work zone from an intersecting driveway or road must wait for the pilot car to pass, then follow the pilot car through the work zone.

Winds pack wallop and shut down Hill City

Small community recuperating from devastating late July storm

About 2 a.m. on Thursday, July 21, a windstorm caused severe damage in Hill City but no one was killed nor injured said Aitkin County Sheriff Scott Turner.

The storm hit the hardest in the small city's core, where trees were down, blocking roads and hitting structures, and power lines were down.

There was some structural damage and three families had to go to motels in Grand Rapids. The storm continued

to the southeast, hitting the Big Sandy and Minnewawa areas and south of Jacobson.

At one point, Lake Country Power had 30,000 people without power and some local residents were without power for up to a week.

Aitkin County set up a cooling station in Hill City at the city hall. A heat wave followed on the heels on the storm and for the next week the city staff, the sheriff's office, Aitkin County Public Health, Salvation Army and Red Cross worked together to feed and cool the residents of Hill City.

Generators got the power and air conditioning fired up and meals were served and water and ice offered.

A lot of people lost food due to the extended power outage and the Assembly of God Church in Hill City administered grant dollars to allow families to collect food vouchers for the Roadside Market so they could replace their perishables. The Hill City Food Shelf also offered non-refrigerated food.

How they did it First, Health and Human Services and the sheriff's office made contact to local residents making sure everyone was safe. According to Erin Melz, public health supervisor, by noon the day of the storm the Cooling Center in the Hill City Hall was open, running on generators

and staffed -- with lunch

arriving at 12:40 p.m. Sher-

iff's boat and patrol officers and planning began to have picked up 20 cases of water at Paulbeck's County market in Aitkin and brought them to Hill City.

On Friday, public health organized for officers to bring up 160 pounds of ice and three coolers from Paulbeck's (half of the ice was donated). It was determined that the Center would need to be open through the weekend. Planning began for staffing 8 a.m. to 9 p.m. through Sunday.

Educational materials were developed and printed to be distributed regarding "Food Safety after a Power Outage," "Stress in Times of Crisis" and "Preventing Heat-related Illnesses." Other donations came in, including water from the Walmart in Grand Rapids, a thousand pounds of food from Second Harvest in Grand Rapids and Subway. Meal planning was bumped up to 200 people.
