Social and human service assistants help social workers, health care workers and other professionals provide support to individuals. While a bachelor's degree is not usually required for these jobs, employers are increasingly seeking individuals with relevant work experience or education beyond high school.

Social and human service assistants hold more than 339,000 jobs nationwide. More than 60 percent are employed in the health care and social assistance industries. Employment of social and human service assistants is expected to grow by nearly 34 percent through the next decade. Job prospects are expected to be excellent, particularly for applicants with appropriate postsecondary education.

In addition to preparing graduates for employment as social and human service assistants, the College's Human Services program is also a great starting point for those who aspire to become social workers or other types of social or health care administrators.

The Human Services Associate of Applied Science (AAS) program is accredited by the Council for Standards in Human Service Education. The College also offers certificate programs in Human Services, Addictions and Gerontology. The certificate programs can be completed in nine months.

This program is offered online through the College's Virtual Campus. Additionally, students can get their bachelor's and master's degrees in Human Services through Chestnut Hill College at the University Center in Pottstown.


