# Aitkin voters overwhelmingly said no to new school

Voters in the Aitkin School district turned down a \$68.5 million referendum for a new school and remodeling of Rippleside Elementary.

The ballot question, posed to primary election voters on August 9, failed with 1,023 yes votes (25.27 percent) and 3,025 no votes (74.73

"The community has spoken," said Superintendent Bernie Novak in a telephone interview after the vote, "they do not want a brand new facility, if it is going to cost \$68 million."

He said that the Aitkin School Board will need to determine if they wish to have the Community Task Force reconvene to come up with another plan.

"We can't stay status quo," said Novak. "We have to do something, because our buildings need to be upgraded and remodeled, and we have to take care of our deferred maintenance."

He said a year and a half ago, the board brought to the community \$24 million remodel for the school district and that was turned down.At that time, the board was told that the community wanted a new building.

When asked, if the shelf life of a school building is 40 years, Novak said, "That varies, I can't say it is 40 years. There are schools out there that are hundreds of years old."

He said, our schools have been maintained, but they need to be remodeled.

"Every 30 to 40 years the school needs to be remodeled," he said, "because education changes. The life expectancy of a building is more than 40 years, but what that building looks like changes over that 40 years."

"I don't believe our facil-

said. "The fact of the matter is education has changed. We need to remodel or build, so that we are meeting today's educational needs."

The land for the new school has been already been purchased for \$750,000. The board approved the purchase of the 221 acres in Aitkin Township before the referendum was defeated. The land is located on Sixth Avenue Southeast about a mile south of Hwy. 47 and the farm was owned by Gary and Mary Lindgren.

"Whether the referendum past or not," Novak said, "the board was planning on buying the land because they were looking long range, 40, 50 years from now."

Novak said the school district had a healthy fund balance available for the purchase of the land and no major budget reductions will need to be made, because of the land purchase.

He said, "does that make things tighter? Yes, we are going to have to monitor our budget, so that we are not overspending in other areas."

When asked about the wetlands on the property that the school purchased, he said the school board bought all of the land available.

The school board could have purchased "the 70 acres of high ground, but what would the [seller] have done with the low ground?"

Novak said the wetlands on the property are green space and can be used for science labs, soil sampling for ag programs or students can observe wildlife and nature for elementary classes.

Novak feels that the voters will have another referendum for the school in the near future.

"We do need to remodel. We do need to upgrade,"

A survey of voter sentiment was done after the previous referendum failed. From that survey it was determined that between \$24 - \$30 million is what the community is willing to support.

"We need to take a look at what we can do with \$30 million," Novak said. "Is it remodel or is it a new building a with remodel."



# Sandpiper Pipeline Project 'probably off the table'

Rep. Dale Lueck, R-Aitkin, issued a statement on August 4 regarding news that Enbridge Inc. and Marathon Petroleum Corp. agreed to purchase a \$2 billion stake in the Bakken Pipeline system to ensure transportation of crude oil from North Dakota.

"Unwarranted delays and general bureaucratic bumbling by our state agencies and the public utilities commission in what should be a straight-forward and timely permitting process has now put at risk hundreds of good-paying jobs for Greater Minnesota," Lueck said. "Not only does this deny quality jobs to our hard working men and women in the skilled trades, but it likely may eliminate a large new

stable property tax revenue source for our school districts, townships and counties here in rural Minnesota."

Lueck said this appears to be Enbridge's work-around to a serious of regulatory delays in Minnesota with permitting the Sandpiper and Line 3 Replacement projects. Those projects have been pushed back to 2019, assuming no

further delays in the permitting process.

Yesterday, "Bloomberg News" reported that Graham White, an Enbridge spokesman, announced Enbridge and Marathon are ending their transportation and joint venture agreements regarding Sandpiper. That likely means the proposed Sandpiper pipeline project is now "off the

"This development is a clear indication that we need to reform our permitting and environmental review processes to ensure projects like Sandpiper are dealt with in a fair and timely manner," Lueck said. "Projects like Sandpiper shouldn't be delayed or canceled because of bureaucratic interference. It's unacceptable that a roughly \$2 billion permanent infrastructure investment and a long-term, stable local property-tax base is now likely going somewhere else where skilled jobs and stable local property tax revenue for our schools and local governments are considered







You can't find running water for your campers, if you don't bring it, you don't have it.

You won't find cell service and you will be hard pressed to find people who care.

No bathrooms, no showers, and absolutely no reason to complain.

Growing up as a little girl in the Effie area (north of Grand Rapids), I went to this stampede for many years, but that wasn't strange, being a local, everyone did.

Now as an adult and living in the community of Aitkin, I find myself drawn back to the area that I ran barefoot in out of the car on every last weekend of July.

I remember then that as things do when you are younger, that it was so much bigger. Barns of beautiful animals for show. A carnival at times.

Now in my heart the memories that I build with my family here tower the grounds gates and the old announcers stand.

The Pitzen family have been putting on this very rodeo for 61 years and going strong. The family always puts forth their best foot to make everyone that comes feel at home and safe. From visiting as many fire pits as time will allow between show times to tipping their

hat to the crowd weather it is raining or unbelievably hot. Through the wind and

dust you will always stand for the opening ceremony, as we watch our young sons and daughters do their inaugural ride, and vou watch vour loved ones ride on their hundredth and sometimes thousandth ride.

You won't find a head that isn't bowed when the cowboy prayer is said, like a table of Christ, everyone participates knowing as we pray we all are truly praying that each athlete animal and human are safe and sound when the weekend is over.

You won't find a dry eye when the cowboyless horse rides through the arena in honor of those passing. And when hard luck presses and old dusty arena you won't find one person talking as we all sit in hope and prayer as the family of the very rodeo grounds are the first to their side and the last to leave. This might be why on this last hot summer weekend in July where it would have been nice to sit in the air conditioning in our homes or on the boat, you instead could find us at one of the many little pop up cities of all Aitkin area families on these grounds.

From the riders to the fans, that this little town of Aitkin provided we should be proud. Because from Layne Baumann on his inaugural bull ride, to Shannon Forster taking her 3-year-old mare to her first real rodeo, to Reba and Ashley Pierce who ride

erra Hoss an Aitkin graduate that rides full time in every rodeo she can, to Ms. Morgan Kowitz who rides whenever she can and doubles as a Baja racer.

We saw the father son team of Keith and Marshal Larson.

We saw Rachel Hauser on her clean sweep on Sunday.

In the past, we have seen Kokesh's, Reinhardt's,

Thompson's and many more from our quaint little Aitkin area, pack up their spurs and saddle, their horses and ropes and move our home to their home for the weekend




to see.
