

**Crandell PULLS FORT HOWARD BILL after meeting with VA, developer**

Councilman Todd Crandell pulled Bill 48-16 after meeting with members of the VA and the developer of the Fort Howard property. Crandell stated that the redevelopment of Fort Howard is "a botched mess" and that he "just wants a workable plan."

Prior to the Thursday, July 21, Baltimore County Council work session at which Bill 48-16 was to be discussed, Councilman Todd Crandell, the bill's sponsor, withdrew his Fort Howard Overlay legislation following a meeting with government and development representatives.

By Crandell's own description, the bill would have ensured that the community remained at the bargaining table in discussions on the redevelopment of the Fort Howard property, which is owned by the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (VA).

The bill called for a limit of 400 units

for the amount of residential housing that could be built on the site and set guidelines on what types of development would be acceptable there. It specified that development would be restricted in the Chesapeake Bay Critical Areas on the site and apartments and commercial uses would be prohibited.

But Crandell took to social media after a July 19 meeting in Washington, D.C. with VA officials and developer Timothy Munshell to express his disapproval of the current state of affairs regarding the Fort Howard redevelopment. Munshell's Montgomery County-based development firm, Fort Howard Development, LLC,

currently holds the lease from the VA to develop the property.

"I am more convinced than ever that the scheme hatched over a decade ago for the redevelopment of [Fort] Howard is a botched mess," Crandell's post read. "I have no trust that the VA or the developer has the will or the means to do the right thing." He added that their latest request was for him to amend the overlay bill to allow for workforce housing, which would help with the high cost of the historic restoration necessary on the site.

**Developer requests URDL change for Bird River area property**

In order to maximize the development potential of a property in the Bird River Road community of Middle River, a developer is requesting an uncommon movement of the Urban-Rural Demarcation Line (URDL) around the parcel.

The 28-acre property, which fronts on Vincent Road and backs up to MD-43/White Marsh Boulevard, currently lies split in two by the URDL, with roughly half of the acreage inside the boundary and half outside.

Because the line essentially determines the limit of public water and sewer service

by Baltimore County, land outside the URDL cannot be as intensively developed, and developer Hilltop Residential, LLC has requested that the entire property be moved inside the line.

The URDL was established in 1967 to serve as a boundary between urban and rural portions of the county and serves to focus higher-density growth in those areas having or planned to have all the necessary components for the orderly development of communities.

The Baltimore County Planning Board, which has sole authority over URDL changes, held a public hearing on

Thursday, July 21, to gather community input on the matter before they make a decision.

At that hearing, Lloyd Moxley, a development review planner in the county's Planning Office, noted that the URDL rarely changes, the last time having been in 2012 in western Baltimore County. He said when they have been done, more often than not it was to provide public water and sewer service to areas with failing septic systems near the waterfront, such as was done in Bowleys Quarters and on the lower Back River Neck Peninsula.

"The integrity of the URDL is a primary goal for the department," Moxley said, adding that there is language in the county's Master Plan that counsels against significantly changing the line in order to maintain its current structure.

But when the request was introduced to the board last month, Deputy Planning Director Jeff Mayhew opined that the "placeholder" RC 3 (resource conservation) zoning currently on the property makes it a good place to reevaluate the URDL location.

RC 3 zoning is used by Baltimore County to defer planning and development on land that could be used for future public

facilities such as utilities or roads. And Hilltop's attorney, Scott Barhight, said portions of the subject property were surplus land from the State of Maryland that they did not need when building the MD-43 extension.

The parcel is also the subject of a rezoning issue during the 2016 Comprehensive Zoning Map Process (CZMP), and Hilltop's Joseph Moran has petitioned for the zoning to be changed from RC 3 to a mix of DR 1 (one home per acre) and DR 3.5 (3.5 homes per acre).

Barhight, explained that his client needs the three aspects of the zoning change, the URDL change and being within the Baltimore Metropolitan District to align

to be able to develop the property how they want to. However, the entire tract is already entirely within the Metropolitan District.

He said the plan is to build single-family homes. But in order to determine the exact plan, there are currently negotiations going on between his client and property owners in the area, as well as communication with County Councilwoman Cathy Bevins who represents the area and will decide what the property's zoning will be.

In earlier steps of the CZMP, the Planning Office staff and Planning Board each recommended that the property be split between RC 5 (rural residential) and DR 3.5, with RC on the portion outside the

URDL and DR on the acreage inside. The developer's requested zoning would allow for nearly 60 homes to be built, while the Board's recommendation would only allow 50.

And while Bevins has not yet indicated what she will decide for the zoning, the County Council will vote on the final changes on Aug. 30.

"I wish I could tell you what is going to happen on Aug. 30," Barhight commented. "I can't."

Residents in Bird River Road neighborhoods have come out staunchly opposed to increased residential density on land in the area, seeing recent developments as overcrowding local schools and traffic

## Delegate Metzgar takes in the Republican National Convention in Cleveland

While millions across the nation were watching from their couches as the events of the Republican National Convention in Cleveland unfolded, Delegate Ric Metzgar decided to make one of his dreams come true.

"It wasn't a bucket list item, but attending the convention was something that I've always wanted to do," said Metzgar.

While Metzgar didn't get to spend a lot of time on the floor, the experience was more than worthwhile as he got to meet political icons such as former Speaker of the House Newt Gingrich and former governor Mike Huckabee.

And while many can be overwhelmed by all of the rules and regulations that go into the conventions, Metzgar reveled in the opportunity to see how things are run.

"What I learned from this event is


that people who have a gift and feel it in their heart, they need to go to school for political science, get involved at the local level - no matter your political identity - and get involved with the process," said Metzgar. "It's fascinating how many rules there are."

While many in the mainstream have been touting the Republicans as "fractured," Metzgar disputed that designation. While some prominent Republicans were absent, he contended that a strong contingent of voters have rallied around Trump, more so than the Democrats who are dealing with a split between progressives who backed Bernie Sanders and establishment Democrats who have supported Hillary Clinton.

Metzgar, who has been an avid sup-

porter of Donald Trump, stressed that jobs and the economy are the biggest issues in our country, and that Trump is a businessman who knows how to get things done. Trump also stressed the importance of shipping and the Panama Canal expansion. And with all of the development going on in Sparrows Point and in Port Covington in Baltimore, that kind of talk is music to Metzgar's ears.

"When Trump was talking about bringing jobs back to America, bringing back manufacturing, I just kept thinking that there's a large plot of land in Sparrows Point that could use thousands of jobs," said Metzgar. "He knows how to get this done, and I'm fully behind him."

Crandell pulled the bill entirely and announced his intention to rezone the property to a lower density of residential housing, calling the developer's plan "unworkable and ultimately unfair to our community."

"When pending legislation no longer serves the purpose of fixing the problem it intends to solve, it is the legislator's duty to withdraw it," Crandell stated.

That problem, he said, was not the question of housing density, amenities for veterans or traffic, which would have been addressed through the legislation and the county's development review process.

Rather, "The heart of the problem is that the VA and our federal officials have allowed the historic structures at Fort Howard to fall into disrepair and blight, and the only solution the VA and the developer offer to offset the high cost of restoring [them is] high-density housing and apartment units," the councilman explained.

"This means that the local community pays the price with workforce housing, apartments, increased housing unit density and increased pressure on school capacity, roads, and water and sewer infrastructure," he continued. "This is an injustice to our community, our veterans and our historical heritage."

Crandell lamented the lack of progress with the property, the failure of multiple plans for the redevelopment project and the silence of our federal elected officials, who have secured hundreds of millions of dollars for projects across the state over the last decade, but none for Fort Howard.

The property has also been plagued by vandalism and fires in recent years which have resulted in the loss of five historic buildings. Baltimore County issued \$45,000 in fines to Munshell last year for code violations such as a lack of security and fire suppressing infrastructure for the site - fines which have yet to be paid.

The move by Crandell drew some praise

from the community, which has expressed fierce opposition to the development plans offered previously, with spokespersons for the North Point Peninsula Council (NPC) and the Fort Howard Community Association (FHCA) supporting the action.

The FHCA had advocated for Crandell to either withdraw his bill or replace it with their version, which required the development to be strictly for veterans as a key difference. "FHCA is satisfied Mr. Crandell elected one of the two FHCA proposed actions," the organization's secretary-treasurer, Kathleen Labuda, said in a statement.

"I think it became apparent during his outreach with the VA and some citizens that far more than legislation is going to be necessary," commented NPC President Fran Taylor. "It was his decision to withdraw the bill and I support his judgment."

Crandell said he has not yet decided what the new zoning on the Fort Howard site will be and that he is still considering all options before the County Council votes on the new zoning maps Aug. 30.

"What I would hope to see is that the developer and the VA come to the table with a more reasonable proposal," he affirmed.

"Ultimately, the historical restoration is the goal," he said, adding that he does not feel that a community of 10,000 people on the North Point Peninsula should be the ones to pay the price with such high-density housing for the mistakes the VA has made with the property. "I'm looking for some sense of trust, and I think that we're so far from that."

While Crandell mentioned that a planned unit development (PUD) - which involves more control by the county, along with community benefit and oversight - is an option for future development on the site, he explained that he is not married to any one method of getting it done.

"I just want a workable plan," he said.

VA officials had not responded to a request for comment on Crandell's withdrawal of the overlay bill.

infrastructure. And while no community members testified at the hearing, Bird River Road Neighborhood Association member Sandra Magsamen sent a letter to the Board with comments.

That letter described Magsamen's view that overdevelopment is taking its toll on the area, with even more coming in the form of Greenleigh (1,700 housing units) Hawkins Manor (96 homes) and the nearby Tito property (156 homes) which have already been approved.

"It is not wise planning to continue approving more homes at this time," she wrote. "I think a more prudent approach is to wait and let the community adjust to the already approved or completed homes in this area."

She stressed that the runoff from so much development is a problem for local waterways, and deterioration of the Bird River and Chesapeake Bay affects their property values and quality of life. Additionally, traffic congestion, overcrowded schools and stress on emergency services are negative impacts for residents.

"The protection of the current property owners needs to be of at least equal

concern as the request of the developer," Magsamen wrote. The developer "should not expect changes that do not benefit the community."

The Planning Board will vote on the URDL change request at its next meeting in September. But board member Scott Jenkins made known his feeling that, although they have not specifically ruled on the URDL change yet, their zoning recommendation made in April reflected their vision of where the URDL would be.

# New 'STAR TREK' film boldly goes beyond

As action-packed as it is, "Star Trek Beyond" can't help but also feel melancholy and even a touch mopey at the same time. The film opens with the rebooted crew of the U.S.S. Enterprise feeling a bit down three years into their five-year mission. Life aboard a starship has become routine, old-hat, or as Chris Pine's Captain James T. Kirk wryly describes in a log entry, "Episodic." Kirk is considering promotion to an admiral's desk job. Spock is considering giving up Starfleet altogether and having a mess of Vulcan kids. Uhura is reeling from their recent break-up.

At the same time, the "Trek" audience itself comes into this a bit misty-eyed and feeling its years. This film was targeted to celebrate "Star Trek's" 50th anniversary. I'm of a certain age where I can remember "Star Trek IV: The Voyage Home" celebrating the franchise's 20th anniversary and "Star Trek VI: The Undiscovered Country" celebrating its 25th anniversary.

Captain Film Critic is gettin' old!

Meanwhile, "Star Trek Beyond" also has to acknowledge the real-life death of Leonard Nimoy, which it does so on a lovely note with the off-screen passing of Spock Prime and its effect on Zachary Quinto's young Spock. But perhaps most poignant of all, we watch the youthful Anton Yelchin heroically play Chekov one last time, unaware his life will end tragically at age 27 before he even sees this film's final cut. There is a scene in "Beyond" where Kirk raises a glass and repeats his "Star Trek III" toast "To absent friends," and director Justin Lin somehow shot this moment from such an angle that the toast squarely focuses on Chekov for just a second or two and ... well, it's a moment of quiet power.

And, yet, through it all, we still have phaser shoot-outs, warp-speed jumps, the Enterprise getting thrashed, and Kirk duking it out with a new baddie named Krall (Idris Elba) and once again getting his yellow Starfleet command shirt ripped just so. "Star Trek Beyond" delivers the goods probably better than any franchise film this summer, folks. This third time out, the cast has become completely comfortable as their iconic characters. There are constant echoes of Shatner, Nimoy, Kelley, Doohan, et. al throughout. But it's all part of a mix that both evokes the past and moves the franchise forward.



Director Justin Lin is not as good at ratcheting up palpable danger as J.J. Abrams was, especially in Abrams' 2009 freshman effort in which he and his team took some big chances like restarting the entire "Trek" storyline, killing off Spock's mother, and wiping the planet Vulcan off the interstellar map altogether. Lots of bad things happen to Kirk and Co. in "Beyond." But the outcome is never in any real doubt. And partly that's because Krall as the villain who lures the Enterprise crew through a nebula and into a trap doesn't start to come into focus until very late in the film. And, by then, he's more of a tragic character than an outright evil one.

But "Beyond" isn't about villainy. It's about heroism. And all seven of the main Enterprise crew members get their moments to shine, whether it's with their fists, their phasers, or their wits. We even get a brief return to

some good old-fashioned technobabble -- the kind that actors like Nimoy and Brent Spiner used to rattle off like Shakespearean poetry while battling Klingons, Romulans, and Borg over the decades. Actor Simon Pegg co-wrote the script with Doug Jung, and they also create a marvelous new female protagonist in Jaydah (Sofia Boutella). She's an exotic alien warrior who's survived on the villain's planet for years holed up in a very special ... uh ... "house." Kirk is curiously chaste in this installment, leaving Pegg's Scotty to come the closest to a flirtation with Jaydah. The pairing works, and I hope we see this striking character in the next one.

Yes, I'm still willing to go "Beyond" with these characters and actors. "Star Trek XIV?" Beam me up!

"Star Trek Beyond" is rated PG-13 for sequences of sci-fi action and violence and some language.

# 'ABSOLUTELY FABULOUS' movie is anything but

"Absolutely Fabulous: The Movie" is strictly for fans of the cult British sitcom, which chronicled a couple of boozy, chain-smoking, pill-popping middle-aged women working in the international fashion industry. Edina (Jennifer Saunders) is still a PR agent, representing models and entertainers. Patsy (Joanna Lumley) is a fashion magazine editor.

They both like living life to the fullest and being as catty as possible while doing so.

The trouble with their new film is ... well ... there's really not much of a film here. Even at just 86 minutes, the movie seems padded. The plot constantly staggers and wanders like a lush trying to find the way home without car keys. The ladies are witty as always, and a heck of a lot of the

supporting characters who graced the episodes back in the day are along for the ride here, too. But more joy could have been derived by just getting all of these personalities together in a restaurant and filming their chats "My Dinner With Andre" style for an hour or so.

Hey, look, I understand the allure of being a big fan of something and feeling good about seeing your old favorites back after years and years in literally anything. Most people who have read me for any length of time know that I am a huge "Star Wars" fan. If last year's "The Force Awakens" had just been two hours of Han, Luke, and Leia pounding back drinks at the Tatooine cantina and telling old star war stories to the new cast members ... I would have been fine with that! It would have been worth my time and money.

But ... uh ... it wouldn't have been a good movie. Edina and Patsy find themselves in a bit of a twisty, screwball farce this time out after Edina accidentally kills Kate Moss at a London party while trying to offer her publicist services to the supermodel. When Edina becomes Public Enemy No. 1, it's guilt by association and Patsy is fired, too. Broke and outcast, they flee to the French Riviera where Edina tries to help Patsy seduce a rich, older man and grift him of his millions. How well the movie works for you depends on how much you want to see these two unapologetic boozehounds

continue to live their lavish lifestyles. Of course, this being the "Ab Fab" crew, there are some wonderfully quirky laughs to be mined, even from such a thin storyline. Early on, we see Edina self-injecting Botox into her face to try and maintain as youthful appearance as possible approaching 60. To which Patsy laughs at her and uses her own syringe to inject fetus blood (!) directly into her aging countenance. "A little spritz of after-birth is much more effective, darling," she advises.

I also laughed at Rebel Wilson's cameo as a bargain-airline flight attendant who Patsy quickly dislikes. The sequence begins with Patsy sneaking a cigarette in the plane's bathroom and ends with Wilson's character lamenting about how miserable it is now that her job requires her to be nice to transgender people.

I wanted more biting commentary like that. Too often, director Mandie Fletcher thinks her job is done by turning the camera on and watching Edina and Patsy stumble around drunk or high. The end result is sort of "Arthur" crossed with a female buddy film. And that could have been a pretty fun experience. But this effort is just too lazy to recommend other than to the old show's hard-core fans. It's absolutely not fabulous for everyone else.



## Police charge Dundalk shooting suspect with murder

Baltimore County Police have charged a suspect in connection with a Sunday morning shooting in Dundalk that left a man deceased.

Anthony Fortune, 23, of the 7500 block of Lange Street in Dundalk, has been charged with first-degree murder and is being held without bail at the Baltimore County Detention Center.

Just before 1:30 a.m. on July 24, police responded to the unit block of Center Place in Dundalk for a shooting. When officers arrived on the scene, they found 20-year-old Tavon Guy suffering from at least one gunshot wound to the upper body. He was transported to Johns Hopkins Bayview Medical Center where he died.

The investigation into the incident has indicated that Guy and Fortune had been involved in an argument. During the argument, Fortune assaulted Guy and then shot him at least once.

This incident remains under investigation by the Baltimore County Police Homicide Unit.

## MDTA police recover drugs while serving warrant

On Friday, July 22, Maryland Transportation Authority (MDTA) police arrested a Baltimore woman who had suspected cocaine, illegal prescription pills, drug paraphernalia and ammunition in her car.

An MDTA police officer arrested Jennifer Joyce Paine, 30, in Dundalk while serving a warrant. Paine was in a 2013 Nissan Altima, parked near the 7-Eleven in the 4000-block of North Point Boulevard. During a search of the vehicle, officers found the cocaine, paraphernalia, pills and ammunition.

The vehicle search yielded opioids including 35 gelatin capsules filled with suspected cocaine, Acetaminophen/Propoxyphene pills, empty gelatin capsules and a digital scale. Officers also recovered 95 rounds of ammunition from the vehicle.

MDTA police applied for and received an arrest warrant after Paine fled a traffic stop on northbound I-95 in Baltimore City on July 14.

MDTA police charged Paine with drug possession with intent to distribute, drug possession, possession of paraphernalia, possession of drug packaging materials and possession of ammunition after being prohibited from possessing a firearm.

Paine is being held on \$100,000 in Baltimore County.

Since June 5, there have been nine auto thefts in the Joppa Heights and Apple Ridge communities in the Towson, Parkville and White Marsh precincts. Cases occurred mostly overnight. Two vehicles had a popped ignition. The rest were taken by unknown means. One vehicle was stolen from an auto repair lot. The two vehicles in the White Marsh Precinct were taken on the same night. ## Police add another charge for Dundalk rape suspect

Baltimore County Police have charged a Dundalk man with impersonating a police officer and a sex offense. This is the fifth sexual offense incident that police have charged him in connection with.

Detectives became aware of the incident on May 18 after a woman reported that she had been victimized in November 2015. She contacted police after seeing a previous media release about 30-year-old Brian Keith Cooper Jr of Dundalk.

The investigation has indicated that during the last week of November 2015, the victim was walking on Bethlehem Avenue in the area of Graceland Avenue. A man pulled up to her in a dark blue, four door vehicle, and asked her if she needed a ride or wanted some "company". After she got into the vehicle, he asked her how much she would charge for a sexual act and she said \$20. The man then displayed a badge and handcuffs, read her Miranda rights, and said he was taking her to the precinct up the street. Instead of going to a police precinct he drove her to a dead-end street where he forced her to perform a sexual act on him. The man dropped her off where he had first picked her up. Further investigation indicated that the man was Brian Keith Cooper Jr.

Cooper has been charged with first-degree sex offense, impersonating a police officer and related offenses. He is being held without bail at the Baltimore County Detention Center.





## Councilman Crandell withdraws Fort Howard Bill

- By Councilman Todd Crandell (R-7) -

Recently, I authored and introduced legislation intended to govern the re-development of the Fort Howard VA property and to bring the VA and the lease holder to the bargaining table. After meeting with VA officials and the lease holder on Tuesday in our nation's capital, I am more convinced than ever that the plan devised by the federal government over a decade ago is unworkable and ultimately unfair to our community. I have no trust that the VA or the developer has the will or the means to do the right thing, reach common ground, and gain an understanding of the truly unique nature of the property and the surrounding community.

When pending legislation no longer serves the purpose of fixing the problem it intends to solve, it is the legislator's duty to withdraw it.

The heart of the problem at Fort Howard is not a question of housing density, amenities for veterans, or traffic. Those issues would have been addressed with my legislation and the county's standard building and development review process. The heart of the problem is deeper and not solvable through county-level legislation. The heart of the problem is that the VA and our federal officials have allowed the historic structures at Fort Howard to fall into disrepair and blight, and the only solution the VA and the developer offer to offset the high cost of restoring the historic structures are high density housing and apartment units. This means that the local community pays the price with workforce housing, apartments, increased housing unit density, and increased pressure on school capacity, roads, and water and sewer infrastructure. This is an injustice to our community, our veterans, and our historical heritage.

For over a decade, the property has degraded significantly with no action taken. Multiple failures of redevelopment have occurred with seemingly no lessons learned that the VA plan is unworkable, yet there has been no substantive change in strategy, thinking, or vision. Our federal elected and appointed officials have remained silent. Those same officials have secured hundreds of millions of dollars over the past ten years for various projects across the state, yet never a dime for Fort Howard. I will withdraw the legislation and intend to down zone the property. I call on the VA, the developer, and our federal elected officials to present a reasonable plan which includes our veterans, maintains our heritage, and does not pass the impact costs on to the community.

## Serving those who serve us

- By Delegate Kathy Szeliga (R-7) -

We are failing the approximate 21-22 million American veterans in this country. The VA is a red tape nightmare and needs immediate reform. Some of our veterans are returning from their service overseas only to find they are unable to secure good paying jobs. Our veterans are facing serious and pervasive issues that don't have easy answers.

But unlike career politicians in DC, who have promised reform for decades with nothing to show for it, Governor Hogan and I decided to roll up our sleeves and get to work. That's why we held a roundtable with a group of Maryland veterans to hear directly from them the problems our veterans are facing and to get their suggestions on what we can do to serve them better.

The governor and I were joined by representatives of each of the branches of the Armed Forces with service records stretching from World War II to the present. At the meeting, each veteran was able to tell their story - and let us know what works and what doesn't. They had several great suggestions, including some I plan to pursue when I'm elected to the U.S. Senate. For example, for a veteran to receive the benefits they have earned they need to have what's known as a form DD-214. The problem arises when the family member of a veteran needs the form. Imagine if your family member needed health care but you couldn't help them because you did not have their DD-214 form. And even worse, you couldn't get the form because you were not the veteran. This is a problem our veterans and their families are facing daily, and it must be resolved.

Career politicians in Washington have become too overwhelmed by the situation at the VA to get anything accomplished. But our veterans deserve more than lip service and empty promises. They deserve action. One of my top priorities when I am elected to the Senate is to serve on the Veterans Affairs Committee. As the daughter and granddaughter of veterans, honoring the promises we have made to our veterans is more than just a moral obligation to me - it's personal. These brave men and women have sacrificed so much to keep our country safe - it is the least we can do.

I would like to thank Governor Hogan and all of the veterans who joined us at what I hope will be the first of many of these veteran roundtables. We can't make the common-sense and positive reforms our veterans need if we only listen to career politicians and DC insiders. We need to listen to the veterans themselves and find out how we can better serve those who served us so bravely.

## Long stands with Hogan on FERC ruling

As Baltimore County Councilman for the Fifth District, I will recommend that the Parkville Armory site, currently zoned for townhouses, be downzoned to lighten development should the property be sold in the future. The 14-acre property is located at 3727 Putty Hill Ave. Owned by the State of Maryland, the property has been the subject of speculation that it may be sold as surplus land in the future. In that event, the zoning would allow about 70 townhouses to be constructed, irrespective of environmental constraints and other factors. I will recommend that the zoning be changed to one house per acre. There are no immediate plans to sell the property, but I want to make sure that if that occurs, a development is built here that provides the residents of Putty Hill Avenue with more open space than we would find in a townhouse project.
