# Perry Hall's Angel Park wraps up community build

 Volunteers helping to build Perry Hall's newest park were able to finish their work on schedule Monday, July 18, and before a round of afternoon storms rolled through the area.

Angel Park, an all-inclusive playground for children of all ages and abilities and located on Honeygo Boulevard next to the Perry Hall Library, began construction on Friday, July 8. The 10-day community build period saw members of the community come out and volunteer alongside professionals from local businesses to take care of every job that needed to be done on the site, large or small.

Fundraising for the \$1.5 million project

was also done entirely by the community, along with a \$250,000 boost in the form of a grant from Baltimore County. And many of the materials and tools used were donated directly by local businesses.

The project's construction manager, Michelle Streckfus, said the final day of the community build was "absolutely amazing - a flurry of activity."

The playground was almost entirely completed Monday afternoon with the famed castle as its centerpiece. And organizers were just awaiting the laying of pavers which donors have purchased to commemorate loved ones, as well as the pouring of the rubberized surface which will form the playground floor, which

were scheduled to begin Wednesday, Streckfus said.

She remarked about the spectacular change the site has undergone since the build began, when it was "just a concrete pad with 200 holes in the ground."

During the last day, the community volunteers were able to finish assembling the equipment, painting the playground features and return any unneeded tools and materials to the warehouse, Streckfus explained.

When all construction is complete, Angel Park will be inspected by engineers to ensure it is safe. It is expected to be open for children to play by the end of August.

## School Board approves Victory Villa demolition contract, hears testimony on closing schools for Muslim holidays

The Baltimore County Board of Education met on Tuesday, July 12, to discuss a wide array of issues, including the approval of a contract for the demolition of Middle River's Victory Villa Elementary School.

Five bids for the demolition project were received by Baltimore County Public Schools, with the winning bid going to Interior Specialists, Inc. of White Marsh. The

Board of Education approved a \$595,000 deal, with another \$59,000 added as a contingency amount.

BCPS also received bids from Barco Enterprises, Potts & Callahan, P&J Contracting and Rubble Bee Recycling and Demolition, ranging from \$595,000 to over \$1 million. The difference between Interior Specialists' bid and the next closest amount was \$40,000.

Earlier in the afternoon, the Board's

Building and Contracts Committee met and were presented with the schematic designs for both Victory Villa Elementary and the planned new northeast elementary school. Those schematics have not been released as of this time.

Other business discussed at the meeting included the growing concern that students aren't using their new laptops and tablets for their intended purpose.

# Essex development site again faces storm water runoff issues

For the second time in as many weeks, residents living along Hog Pen and Norman Creeks in Essex have found the two waterways soiled by sediment runoff after rainstorms hit the area.

The source of the sediment has been identified as a site along Cape May Road in the Turkey Point area which recently began clearing and grading to make way for the Quiet Waters at Norman Creek residential development.

The developer for the site, Glen Burnie-based Craftsmen Developers, heard a swift outcry from the community after a rainstorm on July 4 caused the failure of a silt fence around the site, and the resulting runoff turned the typically clear

waterways cloudy and brown.

According to Conor Gilligan, vice president of land management for Craftsmen, the site had just been cleared of its trees and the land had not yet been fully graded or stabilized. Then, when about a half-inch of rain fell in just an hour's time, it revealed a problem area on the fence where too much water was draining to.

Additionally, because the site is within three miles of an airport, the Maryland Aviation Administration requires that storm water ponds be pumped down within 24 hours to keep birds from congregating. That water was said to be thrice filtered, but residents said the discharge into the creeks was still murky.

Workers quickly re-graded the site

and reinforced the fencing to keep it from failing again. They also installed a turbidity curtain at the storm water outfall from the site into Hog Pen Creek to catch the majority of sediment flowing into the creek.

But the problems arose again this past Saturday, July 16, when yet another storm dropped about 1.5 inches of rain on the site in roughly 90 minutes.

Neighbors quickly took photos showing sediment-laden water spilling over the silt fence and heading for local waterways. The turbidity curtain was also unable to contain all of the sediment inflow.

Gilligan defended the measures in place, though, noting that the sheer amount of rain in such a short timeframe was too much to be able to prepare for.

"There couldn't have been anything that we could have designed that would've prevented it from breaching," he said, adding that sediment erosion control measures are typically designed to handle two inches of rain in a 24-hour period. Saturday's storm, he said, was on pace to double that if it had continued.

In response, Craftsmen was told by Baltimore County inspectors to expedite part of the site's storm water management (SWM) system which will carry water from the silt fence problem area to the other side of the street where there is already a large storm water collection pond. And in the time before that is complete, they will dig a three-foot-deep, 30-by-40-foot-wide hole in the low-lying area to keep it from spilling over the fence again.

"Basically, the water would have to fill up over six feet before it will breach

over [the silt fence] again," Gilligan said.

But community members were not completely satisfied with the developer's efforts to control sediment pollution coming from the site.

"There were no fines levied, penalties imposed and no stop-work orders issued [following the first incident], much to the disappointment of the community and nearby residents," said Kevin McDonough, vice president of the Rockaway Beach Improvement Association which represents nearby communities.

Following the second incident, residents described the problem and forwarded photos to county officials. They asked about imposing fines, penalties or issuing a stop-work order until a solution is implemented and were told that that would not happen, McDonough said.

"We are disappointed in the lack of action from environmental authorities on this issue, given the magnitude of the impact and large scale of the project," McDonough explained. "Our residents invest a significant amount of money in their homes along the waterfront and that investment is put at risk when the waterway they're living on is turning brown after each rainstorm since the start of construction," he continued.

Gilligan observed that the public seems to believe he can discharge only clear water. "But that's just not true," he said.

He admitted that SWM facilities are not perfect on paper, so they make changes as they implement them.

"We're making lots of changes to try to prevent any type of cloudy water leaving the site, period," Gilligan asserted. But it is tough not to have some that is "undesirable" to look at when 30 acres of cleared site drains to just two areas.

"Money spent on Bay restoration efforts is counteracted when things like this are allowed to occur repeatedly without accountability," McDonough lamented. "We are hoping that this doesn't happen again at this site, but will certainly be closely monitoring the issue."

## Middle River aviation museum director Robert Byrnes retires

The Glenn L. Martin Maryland Aviation Museum, located at Martin State Airport in Middle River, said farewell to its executive director, Robert Byrnes in June upon his retirement.

Before coming to the museum, Byrnes had been an editor for the *Evening Sun* newspaper, moving over to the Sun Papers after it closed its doors. And when he retired from there, he discovered the wealth of wonder and knowledge that the museum had to offer, according to museum spokesperson Debi Wynn.

Prior to his appointment to the director position in 2009, Byrnes served with the museum's Aircraft Committee, working with the preservation of museum aircraft and hosting visitors to the flightline. Through that work, the museum itself soon captured his imagination, Wynn said.

That experience had him flying high with excitement for preserving and sharing Maryland's aviation story and he happily stepped forward to volunteer as executive director when the position opened up.

Byrnes observed that Baltimore County's east side tended to be overlooked with regard to Maryland's rich history. But he hoped to change that as director while giving the museum a higher profile.

"He has certainly done that," Wynn commented.

Wynn explained that Byrnes was also able to assemble a solid administration of steady volunteers to keep the museum running effectively and efficiently while growing it at the same time.

During his eight years of leadership, the museum expanded its exhibit space with new exhibits including "They Answered the Call," a tribute to World War II homefront workers, and the Maryland Air National Guard exhibit.

The flightline has added the Dome restoration workspace - a 2,400-square-foot indoor space that allows aircraft restoration to continue despite bad weather - and new aircraft included the Huey helicopter and Beech 18.

He also initiated the museum's annual Wings Over Maryland fundraiser, now in its sixth year, which has helped to raise approximately \$30,000 for the museum and its programs.

Byrnes also helped to coordinate the museum's participation in major state events, including the Star Spangled Banner weekend with the Blue Angels, Homefront to Warfront: WWII in Maryland, and LZ Maryland.

The Star Spangled Banner festivities were essentially the kick-off to the two-year bicentennial celebration, throughout the state, of Maryland's participation in the War of 1812. The events began in earnest with a visit from the U.S. Navy's Blue Angels to Martin State Airport in 2012.

Homefront to Warfront, which took place in 2015, was a coordinated commemoration of the 70th anniversary of the end of WWII. During the event, the Glenn L. Martin Aviation Museum worked with other museums in the region that had WWII exhibits to deliver the whole wartime historical experience.

"That was a really great experience to get those

## Storm causes sanitary sewer overflow in Essex

At 7 p.m. on Saturday, July 16, Baltimore County's Bureau of Utilities received an alarm indicating that power had been lost leading to the Essex Sewage Pumping Station, located at 328 Riverside Drive in Essex.

The power outage, which subsequently halted the station's operation, was due to a severe thunderstorm passing through the area Saturday evening.

Crews were immediately dispatched to the site in order to connect a temporary, emergency power source to the station's pumps. But before the connection was completed, the power was restored at 9:12 p.m. At that time the Essex Pumping Station resumed operation. During the two-hour power outage, 751,185 gallons were discharged into Back River.

The Essex Pumping Station, which has been renovated and modernized in recent years, is served by two electrical feeds to reduce or prevent a system failure. Both feeds were interrupted during the storm.

The Baltimore County Department of Health will monitor water quality at the sites and issue water contact advisories if necessary on the department's website at [www.baltimorecountymd.gov/Agencies/health/environmentalhealth/watersampling/alertadvisory.html](http://www.baltimorecountymd.gov/Agencies/health/environmentalhealth/watersampling/alertadvisory.html).

museums all working together," Wynn stated.

And LZ Maryland was an effort organized by Maryland Public Television to showcase the Vietnam War era and its veterans from in and around Maryland. That took place last month.

Byrnes also provided expansion to the museum's website presence, education programs, Open Cockpit Day season and speaker series.

For his endless hours of volunteer service to the museum in this director role, he received a special award of volunteer achievement at Baltimore County's Retired and Senior Volunteer Program (RSVP) awards luncheon for volunteering 1,000-plus hours at the museum during 2015 alone.

That, Wynn stressed, was "recognition well deserved," adding that Byrnes was also nearing the qualifications for the RSVP's lifetime achievement for volunteering 4,000 or more hours total at the museum.

"As the museum heads into its 27th year of providing an aviation resource to the region, it is grateful to Bob Byrnes for preparing it for its next phase of expansion," a museum statement read.

Although Byrnes has departed from the role, a suitable new candidate has not yet arisen to fill the position, and Wynn could not say who might be the museum's new executive director.

"Those are big shoes to fill," Wynn said. "It's a major commitment for whoever is chosen."

The museum and its members are hoping that someone will step forward and volunteer for the job, she explained,

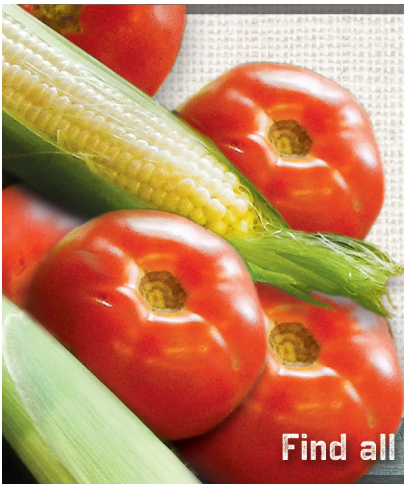


Fair weather for each of this summer's Open Cockpit days has contributed to hundreds of visitors coming out to see the flightline during each event. Courtesy photo.

# Md. Comptroller proposes regulations on daily fantasy sports

daily fantasy sports. Two bills to address the issue passed the state Senate, but died in the House.

A 2012 gambling law saw fantasy sports exempt from regulation, but after last year's media blitz Franchot - as well as legislators in many other states - decided to step in.

The Maryland law grants regulatory authority over fantasy sports to the comptroller, who decided to step in after the General Assembly adjourned in April without taking final action on any of several bills regarding daily fantasy play, leaving the games' status murky. The sports sites had lined up top lobbyists and attorneys before the session to build support for keeping the games going.

"The General Assembly declined to act during the last session," Franchot said. "That's why I believe it is incumbent on us to step into the breach."

Maryland's new rules include:

- Capping players' spending at \$1,000 a month. Exceptions would be permitted for players who request it and are deemed by the fantasy operator to be able to afford more wagering.

- Banning computer scripts "that provide a fantasy sports player with a competitive advantage over another fantasy sports player." Such scripts can allow automatic lineup changes by players who may enter hundreds of times a day.

- Requiring operators to offer competitions limited to beginners and attach a symbol to the usernames of "highly experienced" players so they are clearly

identified.

- Prohibiting players under 18 and games based on amateur sports.

- Requiring operators to inform Maryland players of tax obligations resulting from winnings.

- Requiring operators to make sure they have enough money on hand to pay out all potential earnings. Last year Draft Kings claimed to have paid out approximately \$2 billion in winnings

"I think it's a positive step," said Del. Eric Luedtke, a Montgomery County Democrat who is co-chair of the joint gaming committee, of the rules. "It looks like what the comptroller is proposing gels pretty well with what the House was contemplating [in the last session] before things broke down."

After Franchot's announcement, both Draft Kings and FanDuel issued statements of support.

"Comptroller Franchot took a thoughtful approach," said a statement from FanDuel, "with proposed regulations modeled after some of the best and strongest fantasy regulations installed in states across the country. We are still reviewing the details and look forward to working with the Comptroller through the comment period."

The regulations proposed by Franchot wouldn't go into effect until October, with a period for public comment.

Maryland is one of 11 states that allow daily fantasy sports, including Colorado, Massachusetts, Mississippi and Tennessee.

Citing a recent study by Johns Hopkins University, Leslie Webber of the PTA Council of Baltimore County stated that "a large number of students... frequently use their devices to play video games, listen to music, watch YouTube videos" and more. Webber told the board that a number of students had broken the firewall set up by BCPS and were using their devices to visit websites that were off limits.

Webber stated that the current safety policy in place is too tough to enforce and changes need to be made. She also pointed out that, as it stands, the school system "has absolved itself from responsibility" regarding proper use of devices. It is the students' responsibility to follow rules in school, while outside of school, the burden falls on parents. The PTA Council suggested that the policy be revisited and altered, which falls in line with the suggestions from the members of JHU who conducted the study.

"BCPS need to ensure a system-wide policy that includes consequences for students using devices inappropriately and

may want to revisit measures currently in place to restrict inappropriate use," the JHU findings stated. "In addition, BCPS may consider acquiring software that teachers may use to monitor student device activities without having all student devices within view."

A recent hot topic issue on which the Board also heard testimony last week was the closing of BCPS for the Muslim holidays of Eid al-Adha and Eid al-Fitr. A former BCPS student spoke about the system's failure to recognize the holidays and contended that the Muslim community feels conflicted after seeing the school system shut down for Jewish and Christian holidays.

A second speaker, Dr. Bash Pharoan, a Muslim physician whose children attended county schools, echoed those sentiments and stated that this has been an issue for well over a decade. "We came in large numbers in 2004 and 2005, then the community really lost faith in the Board of Education," he said. He asked the Board to address the issue and vote on it at the Aug. 9 meeting. "20 years of injustice is enough," he stated. "It's time to act now."

Lawrence Schmidt, a former member

and president of the Board of Education, rebuffed the idea that schools should be closed for muslim holidays.

"Baltimore County Public Schools are not closed on Dec. 25 because it is Christmas Day. Closing of schools for that purpose would be unconstitutional, as it would represent favoritism to a particular religion (Christianity)," said Schmidt. "Rather, the schools close that day because the two criteria established by state law are met."

Those criteria require that school closings occur when a large percentage of students would be absent, or if the school system would sustain a significant economic impact. In the case of the latter, a large number of substitute teachers would need to be hired to keep schools open on a lot of Jewish and Christian holidays, making it more sensible to keep schools closed.

"School closures have been, and should continue to be not about honoring or favoring any religion, but about the secular considerations established by law," Schmidt continued. "The issue here is not

one of diversity, equity or political correctness. Rather, it goes to the fundamental constitutional principle that prohibits the government from favoring any religion."

Another issue discussed was the awarding of a contract that would see technological improvements made to help special education teachers track student development. The Special Education Citizens' Advisory Committee's Megan Stewart-Sicking advocated for the approval of the contract, stating that the amount of paperwork for students is "remarkable" before adding that she doesn't understand how teachers handle their current load.

A major issue that was not discussed was the school system's heat closure policy. As it stands, schools without air conditioning in Parkville/Carney, Dundalk, Catonsville and Lutherville-Timonium will close when the heat index hits 90 degrees by 11 a.m. Members of the Kingsville Elementary PTA aren't thrilled with the fact that Kingsville isn't included, considering Kingsville Elementary will be without air conditioning when the new school year begins on Aug. 24.

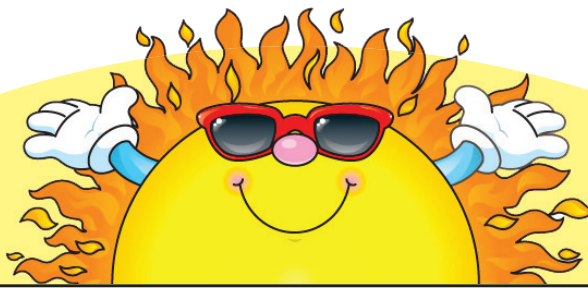

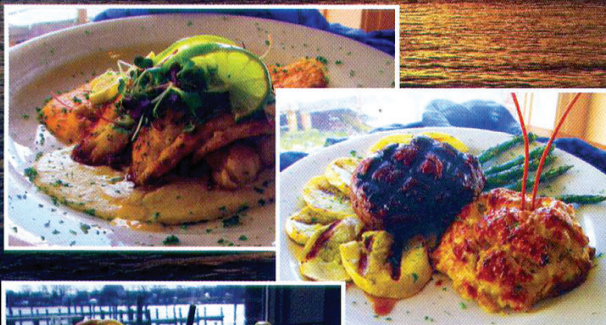

## Maintain tire balance and alignment for a smooth ride

It is easy for motorists to take their tires for granted when everything is working correctly. Wheels and suspension systems bear the weight of cars and trucks and must bear the brunt of rough roads, pot holes and any additional obstacles, so some wear and tear is to be expected.

Many drivers know to monitor their tire pressure, but it's also important to check for worn treads and inspect tires for punctures or damage. Proper tire alignment and balance also is essential for a comfortable and smooth ride.

### Balance

Balancing tires involves equalizing the weight of the combined tire and wheel assembly so that each tire spins smoothly on the road. Tires are mounted on the wheel assembly, and the chances of this assembly having precise weight distribution is nearly impossible without a little help. According to Discount Tire, the slightest imbalance in the tires, even as little as half an ounce, can be felt by drivers. Unequal mass can make tires wobble, causing noticeable vibrations.

Mechanics will test tire balance by putting it on a balancing machine. The machine will spin the tire and determine the tire's heaviest point. Counteracting weights will be placed on the tire hubs to create a more uniform balance of weight. Lead weights are often used, but some are being phased out for other metals, such as zinc, because of the medical and environmental implications of lead.

Tires that are not balanced will not only cause vibration, they also can lead to uneven wear.

### Alignment

Tire alignment is another way to reduce wear on tires and help avoid steering and "pulling" problems. Bridgestone Tires defines tire alignment as an adjustment of the vehicle's suspension, or the system that connects a vehicle to its wheels.

When tires are not properly aligned, drivers may notice uneven tread wear. Misaligned tires also may cause the vehicle to pull to the left or right. Drivers who notice their steering wheel is off-center or vibrating when they are driving may need to adjust their tires' alignment.

Camber, or the inward or outward angle of the tire when viewed from the front of the vehicle, will be adjusted. In addition, "toe," or the extent to which the tires turn inward or outward when viewed from above, will be adjusted. Caster angle also helps balance steering, stability and cornering. Caster is the angle of your steering axis when viewed from the side of your vehicle.

When tires are balanced correctly and aligned, vehicles will offer a smooth ride with little to no vibrations. Having tires serviced can maximize their performance and lifespan.

## Don't forget a pre-trip vehicle check before hitting the road

- Check the wipers and lighting so that you can see and be seen. Check that all interior and exterior lighting is working properly and inspect and replace worn wiper blades so you can see clearly when driving during precipitation. Keep the reservoir filled with solvent.

## How to handle car trouble while driving

Sudden car trouble is something no driver wants to experience, but many a driver has been driving down the highway only to feel his or her vehicle start to sputter. Such sputtering might indicate a car is running low on fuel, or it could be a sign of something more serious that requires motorists to think as quickly and safely as possible.

When car trouble strikes while a vehicle is on the road, the first thing many drivers do is check their fuel gauges. A car that runs out of gas is certainly inconvenient, but if you can pull over to the shoulder or make it to the nearest filling station, then this unfortunate situation can be remedied rather easily. But when a car's tank is full and it is still showing signs of trouble, drivers must take steps to protect themselves, their passengers and their vehicles. The following are a few simple tips motorists should keep in mind so they can safely handle any car trouble that may arise while they are out on the road.

- Keep a first-aid kit, spare tire and tire jack in the car at all times. Flat tires are no fun, but they are even more of a nuisance when drivers are not prepared to address them. Always keep a jack and spare tire in your car, even if the spare is a donut you can temporarily use to replace a flat tire until you make it to a filling station or automotive supply store. As an added safety measure, keep a fully stocked first aid kit in your vehicle in case you

cut yourself while changing the tire or need to address another medical situation. Visit [www.redcross.org](http://www.redcross.org) for a list of items to include in your automotive emergency kit. Keep a blanket in the trunk as well so your passengers can stay warm should you experience car trouble on a cold day or night.

- Make note of your surroundings. Some car troubles can only be fixed by the professionals, so pay careful attention to your surroundings in case an issue arises and forces you to pull over and call for help. Always pay attention to mile markers and any landmarks that might help you describe where you are. Car troubles can strike at any time and anywhere, so be sure to pay special attention to your surroundings when driving in unfamiliar areas.

- Pull over. Don't panic if an issue arises suddenly. Remain calm and pull over onto the shoulder. The right shoulder is the area for pulling over on most roads, but you may also use the left shoulder on multilane highways with medians. Try to get as far away from traffic as possible without driving off of level ground, and always use your signals when pulling onto the shoulder. If the vehicle can't make it to the median, put your emergency flashers on and get out of the car, moving away from both the vehicle and traffic. Immediately call for emergency roadside assistance, alerting the authorities if need be.

- Use flares or triangles to alert other drivers. So long as you are not risking your well-being, you can place flares and/or warning triangles behind your vehicle so oncoming traffic knows to drive around it. The popular not-for-profit motor club AAA recommends placing the first flare or triangle 10 feet directly behind the side of the vehicle that is closest to the road. The second should be placed between 30 and 60 feet (increase the distances as the posted speed limit increases) behind the middle of the bumper, while the third flare or triangle should be placed between 120 and 360 feet behind the vehicle's right side.

- Stay with the vehicle. Once you have called for help and set up flares or triangles, stay with the vehicle, though

do so at a safe enough distance so you are not in harm's way.

Sudden car troubles can be scary, but drivers who approach such issues calmly and quickly can reduce their risk for accident or injury.

**Response to McDonough on HOME Act**

The Housing Opportunities Made Equal (HOME) Act is a move in the right direction. The bill would ensure that housing vouchers are treated like any other legal income.

To be clear, the HOME Act does not authorize any new spending to Baltimore County's Housing Choice Voucher program. It also does not prevent landlords from screening tenants based on other criteria, such as their ability to pay rent or criminal records.

But, in treating voucher holders equitably, the HOME Act will allow people to live in the community of their choice. Historically, program participants have been limited by where landlords accept vouchers, effectively concentrating them in certain communities.

The overwhelming majority of voucher holders are decent folks, just like you and me. A large percentage of them in Baltimore County are seniors, people with disabilities, veterans or low-wage workers.

People with housing vouchers just want to live in a safe and stable home in a nice neighborhood. They want the opportunity for their children to escape life in shelters, on the streets or in the woods. They just need financial assistance. We should welcome them into our communities.

## Pokémon Go robberies prompt release of safety tips

Just after midnight on July 7, three people were robbed near Belmont Park in Parkville while playing the phone app Pokémon Go. The game has caused quite a stir, resulting in Baltimore County police releasing a list of safety suggestions for players.

Pokémon Go is a new mobile game that uses augmented reality to place characters in real-world locations; players catch and use the characters in the game. It can be a fun way to explore your neighborhood and become more active, but you should always keep safety in mind as you play.

Using a cell phone while walking can lead to serious injury, whether from bumping into an object or stepping off the sidewalk into the path of a car. Always put down your phone when crossing the street and only cross at designated crosswalks or intersections. The game's creators have guaranteed to players that a creature spotted on the opposite side of a street will remain there until you have safely crossed.

If you're out looking to add to your Pokédex, avoid secluded or unfamiliar areas, especially at night. Stay in well-lit, public areas where there are open businesses or other pedestrian traffic.

All Pokémon within the game can be found without entering private property. The map may indicate that a character is sitting on a neighbor's porch or backyard, but you will always be able to interact with that character from a distance. The developers of the game programmed this feature for the safety of the players and with consideration for privacy.

Additionally, all Pokéstops and Gyms (in-game locations for finding or "training" Pokémon) have been placed by the developers in public areas. You should never enter private property or enter a location after operating hours to attempt to access these game features.

If you see a suspicious person, vehicle, or activity, dial 911 immediately and report it to police. For non-emergency concerns, call the Baltimore County Police at 410-307-2020.



## Essex man killed in collision on Mountain Road

An Essex man was killed on Fallston on July 14 after his box truck was hit head-on by another driver on Mountain Road. The man has been identified as 57-year-old Conrad Giovanni Gilbert, of Essex.

Shortly after 4 p.m. on July 14, a 17-year-old driving a Ford F-250 pickup truck crossed over the center line and collided with Gilbert's vehicle. Gilbert was pronounced dead at the scene while the 17-year-old, who has not been identified, was taken to Johns Hopkins Bayview. His condition is not known at this time.

At this time it is unclear why the pickup truck crossed the line, but investigators are working to get answers. The collision caused Mountain Road to be closed for approximately three hours.

## DUI enforcement stats from Fourth of July weekend

Police departments all across Maryland stepped up impaired driving enforcement over Fourth of July weekend, with both Maryland State Police and Baltimore County Police arresting a significant number of violators.

Statewide, state police arrested 108 drivers for driving under the influence. Of those 108 arrests, the Golden Ring barrack reeled in seven. And according to Corporal John Wachter, county police booked 17 people for driving under the influence, though those numbers are not an official statistic.

## County police warn residents of jury duty phone scam

The Baltimore County Police Department is warning residents of a recent increase in scam phone calls pertaining to jury duty.

The caller will claim to be from the Baltimore County Sheriff's Office and tell the resident that he or she has missed jury duty and must pay a fine in order to clear the record. These scam callers will request that the resident purchase a pre-paid debit card and call back with the number on the card. By doing this, they defraud people into giving them money.

The Baltimore County Sheriff's Office will never ask you for money over the phone. If you receive one of these phone calls, hang up and report the incident to your local precinct.

If you have questions about jury duty, you may also contact the Office of the Jury Commissioner.

## Woman found dead in her Parkville home

Homicide Detectives have charged a suspect in connection with the death of a 91-year-old woman in her Parkville home.

When they arrived, they found 91-year-old Nadia Evanowicz Schaible lying on the basement floor. She was declared deceased at the scene.

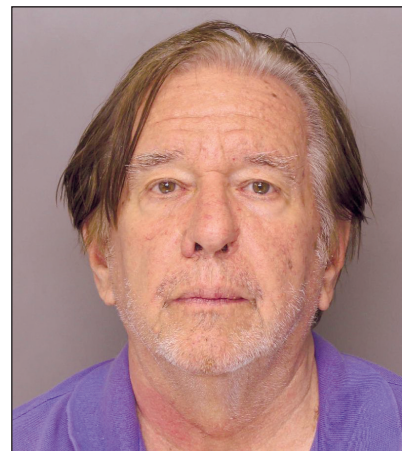
Officers spoke with Schaible's cousin, 72-year-old John Malko of Salt Lake City, Utah. He stated that he had been visiting Schaible and left the location. When he returned, he found the kitchen door broken, jewelry items scattered on the floor of Schaible's room and Schaible's body in the basement.

Schaible's body was taken to the Office of the Chief Medical Examiner for an autopsy. That autopsy determined that cause of her death was multiple blunt force injuries and manner of her death was homicide.

Further investigation indicated that Malko was responsible for Schaible's death and had staged the burglary.

Malko has been charged with first-degree murder and is being held without bail at the Baltimore County Detention Center.

This incident remains under investigation by the Baltimore County Police Homicide Unit.

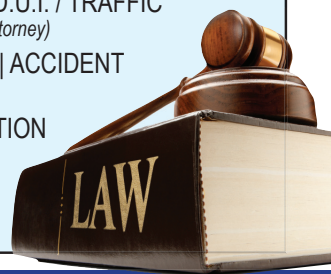

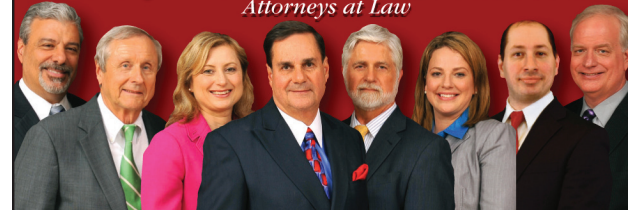

I strongly encourage Congress to strike this amendment from the final appropriations package.

Currently, the federal government reviews each Chesapeake Bay watershed state's nutrient and sediment reduction efforts annually. Those states that are significantly behind their annual goals can face consequences such as withholding federal grant money. The only state that has been penalized for their failure to meet their goals under these current rules is Pennsylvania.

The amendment was opposed by a bipartisan group of Bay watershed legislators including Reps. Andy Harris and Elijah Cummings from Maryland and Reps. Barbara Comstock and Gerry Connolly from Virginia. The Senate has yet to take action on the legislation and the White House has threatened to veto the bill for several provisions it disagrees with.

## 'THE INFILTRATOR' gets lost in the layers

I am fascinated by stories of brave men and women who infiltrate crime rings and bring down their kingpins. "The Infiltrator" is about Robert Mazur (Bryan Cranston), a real-life federal agent who infiltrated the organization of the notorious Colombian druglord Pablo Escobar in the 1980s. His specialty was accounting. So rather than having to cozy up to the dodgy, enigmatic Escobar personally, he was able to throw a wrench into Escobar's worldwide money-laundering operation from afar. But the stakes were no less dangerous, as everyone in Escobar's world was suspicious of him on some level. The tension comes as Bob has to convince multiple layers of the crime ring that he can be trusted with their most precious commodity - their cash, of course.

Cranston delivers a solid lead performance, playing a family man who has crafted a life and a marriage where everyone close to him understands what he does and knows exactly what questions to ask and what not to ask him. If I did Robert's job, I highly doubt I would have taken a wife and then reproduced. I kept waiting for these innocents of his to be threatened in this already tense movie.

But it never came. And that was one of the two problems I had with "The Infiltrator." I never really felt all that tense while watching the film. This is definitely a "follow the money" movie. Rather than thugs and cutthroats, Robert then just has to convince bankers and Escobar's more civilized middle management.

The second problem I had was that Robert Mazur's story here is just too big for a single motion picture... or at least one written by first-timer scripter Ellen Sue Brown, adapting Mazur's non-fiction book. There are a ton of layers that Mazur has to navigate through to make a dent in Escobar's organization. And each has its own set of players whose confidences he must gain. Because this is such a condensed window into this world, the whole process felt too easy to me. Characters are introduced in various scenes, and he gains their trust almost instantaneously - characters that seem to be important, but then disappear for long stretches as Mazur goes to the next part of his operation.

At the same time, "The Infiltrator" tries to go for some grander tragedy when Robert and his fake fiancée, undercover operative Kathy Ertz (Diane Kruger), end up betraying Benjamin Bratt's sinister second-in-command Roberto and his wife, who welcome them into their home and lavish them with meals and gifts after gaining their trust. The problem is, the trust was gained in just a few minutes of screen time, and I found the love-fest almost completely unbelievable considering Mazur's initial introduction to Roberto was passing an "audition" where he ends up surviving while a man similarly forced to his knees has just had his head blown off.

Bottom line, I can't quite recommend "The Infiltrator." It's really all over the map. But I think there is more than enough story here for a network to do a dynamite limited series. Here's hoping...

From the various movie and entertainment websites, I knew I was going to see cameos from most of the entire original cast.

And as the film's opening action and haunting sequence played out - climaxed by a ghost attacking a New York City tour guide, that man screaming into the camera and the real Ray Parker Jr. theme song kicking in over the Dolby Surround Sound (the wretched Fallout Boy remake doesn't happen 'til later in the film) - I was relieved to know that I was in mostly good hands.

Yes, dear readers, I liked it! Didn't love it. But the new, all-female "Ghostbusters" is good. It's not great. I am not going to oversell it to you. But I'm really relieved that this thing didn't turn out to be as bad as those ads had made it look. I am not a big fan of threatening anyone's livelihood, but the Powers That Be at Sony should either fire or re-assign whatever staff was responsible for cutting those awful, awful trailers and commercials.

It's not so much that director/co-writer Paul Feig gets this reboot right. It's more like he didn't screw it up. The film takes very few chances, but that might be a good thing in this case. Feig and Co. tell a solid story, the casting is mostly good and the effects (especially in 3-D) are quite cool.

Kristen Wiig stars as Dr. Erin Gilbert, a scientist who has tried to shed her early years in which she tried to prove the existence of the paranormal. Now, she yearns for tenure and respectability at Columbia University. But her old lab partner, Dr. Abby Yates (Melissa McCarthy) is in dire need of funds and has begun re-selling a book on Amazon they co-wrote years earlier about ghosts and multi-dimensions.

Elsewhere in the city, an unhinged hotel bellhop named Rowan (Neil Casey) has become obsessed with unleashing the apocalypse on the city and has set up contraptions at infamous sites all over Gotham that

allow the spirits of New York's evil dead to return and haunt the living. Erin and Abby must put aside their differences and form a team that includes wacky inventor Jillian Holtzmann (Kate McKinnon), New York history buff Patty (Leslie Jones), and their incredibly dim new receptionist Kevin (Chris Hemsworth, giving the film's best performance) to thwart Rowan.

Feig does a good job recapturing the feel of the first "Ghostbusters" thanks largely to great Manhattan location work and some evocative big-screen lensing. I also liked that Feig reined in McCarthy specifically. I have yearned for a return to her more charming persona from her "Gilmore Girls" days rather than the increasingly shrill and crass caricatures she's been turning in lately.

Now for the not-so-good. The film is just not that funny. There are some laughs - quite a few, in fact. But they come in clumps. When there is plot exposition or action, it's like the Feig script can't be called on to do anything more than convey information.

Another problem is that the movie turns itself over too much to special effects at its climax as so many big-budget, thrash-Manhattan films do. For a good two-thirds of the new "Ghostbusters," there are some fairly serious, even scary spirits being released. And they and the main villain want to do some serious bad in this world. But when the big ending comes, it's more goofy and madcap than anything. The menace is almost completely missing.

But, hey, until recently, I had NO hope for this film whatsoever. So this can almost be classified as a major triumph. Once again, busting makes me feel good!

"Ghostbusters" is rated PG-13 for supernatural action and some crude humor.

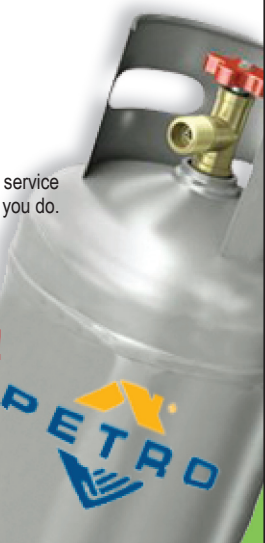

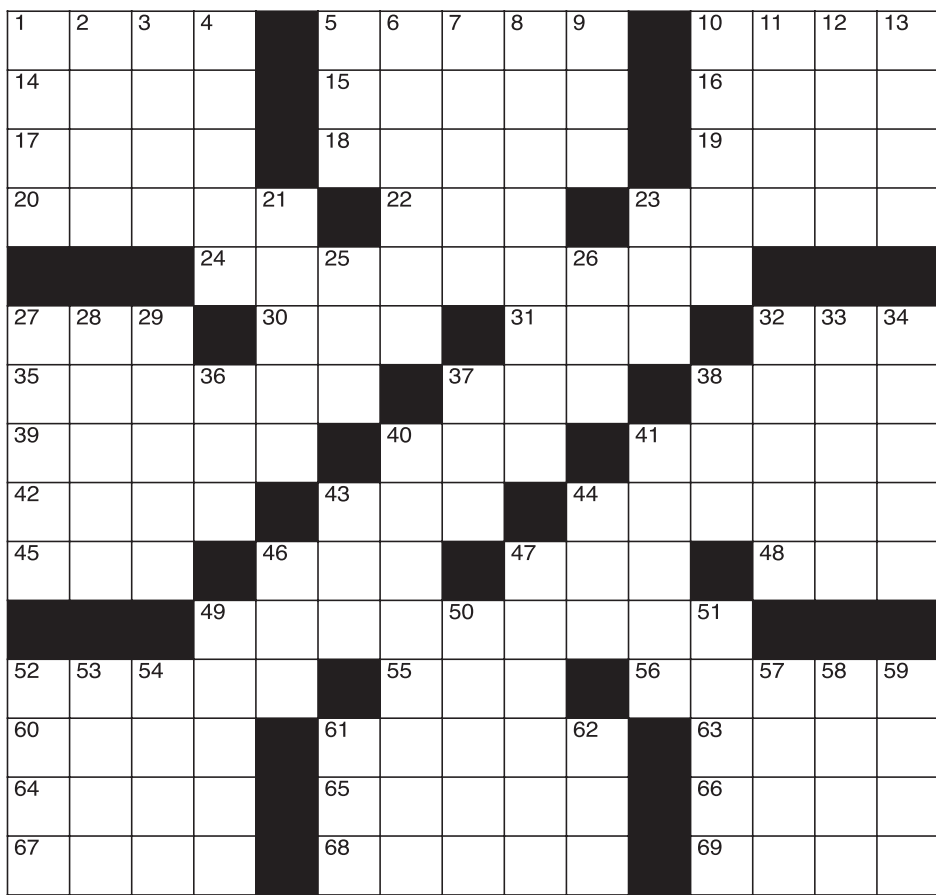
