This native wildflower displays spikes of brilliant red during summer and sometimes into fall. It loves the sun, and does well in moist soil in ditches and near stream banks, swamps, ponds or lakes. Most insects struggle to access the long necks of the trumpet-shaped blossoms, so cardinal flowers depend on hummingbirds for fertilization. Its roots were once used in traditional medicines; however, the plant is toxic if

eaten in large quantities. Overpicking has reduced its numbers in the wild somewhat; it can be propagated by bending a stem down into the mud and fastening it with a rock or sticks, or can be grown by seed.

Fountain Pen

.I have a Parker fountain pen .that was used by my uncle during the 1930s. He was a banker and considered it his favorite writing instrument. It is the "Thrift Time" model in brown. What is it worth? - Stan, Kent, Washington

. The first fountain pen was A. invented in 1830, but they were not really manufactured commercially until the 1880s, when a suitable metal for the tips was perfected. The first successful commercial fountain pen producers were Waterman (1884) and Parker (1888). Parker entered the market with a fountain pen named "Lucky Curve."

Vintage fountain pens are collectible, and some have become quite pricey. I found your pen referenced in "Collecting Pens" by Edward Kiersh and published by House of Collectibles. According to Kiersh, your Parker Thrift Time was produced in 1932 and is worth about \$150. The Pen Collectors of America can be contacted at www.pencollectorsofamerica.com.

Although you didn't specify the model or grade of your watch, it is best to have it professionally cleaned by a jeweler.

are down, certain consumer costs attributed to fraud actually in-creased in 2010. This demonstrates why consumers need to stay vigilant.

Those are just some of the key findings from the 2011 Identity Fraud Survey Report.

The survey also found that: The number of identity fraud incidents decreased by 28 percent over the past year. Approximately 3 million fewer adults were vic timized by identity fraud in 2010, compared to 2009. This is the largest single-year decrease since the survey began monitoring iden-

tity fraud in 2003. • At the same time, consumer fraud costs increased in 2010. Specifically, the "mean" consumer out-of-pocket fraud amounts due to identity fraud increased 63 per-cent, from \$387 in 2009 to \$631 per incident in 2010. • "Friendly fraud" is on the

rise. Fraud perpetrated by people known to the victim, such as a relative or roommate, grew 7 percent, with consumers between the ages of 25 and 34 most likely to be victims of this type of fraud. People in this age group are also the most likely to have their Social Security number (SSN) stolen— with 41 percent of fraud victims in this group reporting theft of their SSN

• New account fraud was the most damaging and caused the greatest losses—\$17 billion. New account fraud, in which accounts have been opened without the victim's knowledge, can be difficult to detect and is the most likely to severely impact the victims.

The survey was conducted by Javelin Strategy & Research and sponsored by Fiserv, Intersections Inc. and Wells Fargo.



Preparing Pets for Disasters

DEAR PAW'S CORNER: I live in a part of the country that rarely sees extreme weather events like tornadoes, hurricanes, floods or blizzards. So I never gave much thought to having a disaster-preparedness kit. However, a couple of weeks ago my neighbor's house caught fire and burned down. Thankfully no one was injured, and they did not own pets, but it got me thinking about how I would care for my cat and dog in an unforeseen disaster. put together a small disaster kit that I keep in the trunk of my car, stowed out of the way. It has copies of my pets' medical records, two extra leashes and collars with extra ID tags attached, a few single-meal pouches of dog and cat food, a gallon of water and a couple of old T-shirts for emergency bedding (which hopefully have a familiar scent to help them feel at home). If we have to leave very quickly — and in a fire there is no time to try and grab anything, except family - I have a little less to worry about afterward. Sara in Washington DEAR SARA: That's a great idea, and a very important point about pri-orities in a disaster — natural or other-wise, like a house fire. Time is essential, so first, get to safety, and worry about paperwork much later. Preparing a pet-care kit is an important part of disaster planning. Sit down with your family to discuss how you will handle events like house fires. evacuation orders or other emergencies. You also should put together a list of local and federal agencies and organizations that can help you during and after a disaster.





• On Aug. 24, 79 A.D., Mount Vesuvius erupts in southern Italy, devas-

tating the prosperous Roman cities of Pompeii and Herculaneum, and entombing thousands under a thick layer of volcanic material and mud. In the 18th century, the cities were rediscovered and excavated.





involve a football team giving its disabled teammate a chance to score a touchdown or a mother's sacrifice to ensure opportunity for her child, these are the people the Free Country Everyday Heroes campaign wishes to recognize.

In September, company founder and CEO Ira Schwartz honored the first recipients of the award, David and Kaete Nazaroff. cofounders of Ride To Give, a nonprofit charity that turns athletic ability into fundraising power for families with children who are disabled, injured or ill.

During the summer of 2013, David Nazaroff, followed by a sup-port van with a team of three, completed the first annual bicycle "Ride" from Nyack, N.Y. to Jefferson, Ga., completing the 900 miles in five days. Its purpose was to raise awareness and donations for the family of Tripp Halstead, a toddler who suffered a traumatic brain injury in 2012. The "Ride" raised \$180,000 for

the Halstead family, plus an additional \$17,000 for Sunshine on a Ranney Day, a charity that renovates rooms and homes for children with illnesses and special

needs. The charity renovated a room for the Halstead family.

Ride to Give intends to com-plete the "Ride" annually, benefiting different children in need each year. It also continues to raise awareness and funds for other causes dear to the hearts of its founders. To date, Ride to Give has raised more than \$1,000,000 for over 50 families.

Recently, Free Country also rec-ognized Dan Whitney of Corvallis, Ore., the brand's second Everyday Hero. Whitney is the softball coach and president of Camp Attitude, a not-for-profit organization dedi-cated to providing a unique camping experience for families in the disabled community.

As someone who has overcome disabilities himself-about 18 years ago, Whitney broke his neck; he now uses a scooter and has full function in only one
