 Last year Comptroller Peter Franchot stopped by the Glenn L. Martin Maryland Aviation Museum with his father to take in a Rosie the Riveter Celebration as part of an Armed Forces Day event. While there, he promised that he would return to take in all that the museum has to offer. Last Friday, Franchot kept his word, stopping by the museum to tour it with State Senator J.B. Jennings and Delegate Kathy Szeliga.

"My father told me that when he was 12 years old, his mother brought him down here and she paid Glenn L. Martin

\$3 to take my dad up in a plane and they flew around," said Franchot.

Franchot and company exchanged stories about the history of the Glenn L. Martin Company and how their families were tied to the Middle River company.

"I have a lot of history here," said Jennings. "My grandfather was a new father in North Carolina in 1949. He read an ad of an aircraft company hiring machinists."

Jennings stated that during the week his grandfather would drive up to Middle River to work in Plant 2, then travel home

on the weekends to see his family. During the week he slept in his car while he saved up money to move his family up north closer to work, which he was eventually able to do.

According to Stan Piet and Jane Michael, two officers at the museum, this is a very common story.

During the 1930s and 40s, thousands of people poured into the area as the Glenn L. Martin Company expanded. Many of the communities in Middle River were set up solely for the purpose of housing those families of the company's workers.

**Baltimore County police announce start of body camera program**

 Last week Baltimore County Police Chief Jim Johnson and County Executive Kevin Kamenetz, joined by a host of other local politicians, announced the start of the body-worn camera program. The first 10 cameras were deployed on Wednesday, July 6, to one officer in each of the county's 10 precincts.

County police will train 10 officers per week for the next 15 weeks until 150 cameras are deployed around the county. Johnson expects that the program will be fully phased in by December of 2018, at which point 1,435 of the county's 1,900 police officers will wear cameras.

Some officers, such as undercover vice and narcotics officers, will not have to wear the cameras.

"We're investing in this program for one reason," said Kamenetz. "We believe it will improve public safety by enhancing transparency, by reducing complaints against officers, by improving behavior of all parties involved in police activity and by making prosecutions more effective and efficient."

Baltimore County State's Attorney Scott Shellenberger agreed with Kamenetz, stating that footage from the body cameras will prove to be a valuable prosecutorial tool. He pointed to the fact that footage

from citizen-operated surveillance cameras already plays an important role in investigations, and that using police body camera footage will show police activity from a different perspective.

Kamenetz and Johnson announced plans for the body camera program back in September, despite objections from an internal work group.

The county agreed to an eight-year \$12.5 million contract with Taser International to supply the cameras and provide data support. The cameras can be worn in a variety of ways, including on an officers shoulder, hat or glasses.

Johnson also highlighted the most important of components of the body camera use policy, saying that his "biggest concern was the potential for the cameras to strip officers of their autonomy," before adding that the policies are designed to preserve the discretion of an officer.

According to the policy, officers assigned body cameras will activate them as soon as possible unless it is unsafe, impractical or impossible to do so. Officers have discretion to activate the camera during any legitimate law enforcement activity if they believe recording may be appropriate. They also have discretion to de-activate the cameras in places or situations where there's a heightened expectation of privacy, such as locker rooms or rest rooms.

David Rocah, senior staff attorney with the ACLU of Maryland, expressed concern regarding certain aspects of the department's policy on cameras, specifically a provision that requires internal affairs to allow officers and their representatives to review recordings before giving a statement during an administrative investigation.

Rocah stated that the provision was absurd, saying it would "completely

destroy the integrity" of an internal investigation.

"There is literally no other circumstance at all in which anyone who is under investigation would be given the right to see the evidence about that investigation," said Rocah. "It is only police. This is one more manifestation of the way in which we are not being serious about investigating police."

Rocah followed that up by stating that the policy did set appropriate rules regarding mandatory activation and de-activation.

According to a report by the ACLU of Maryland released a few months ago, five people died last year in police encounters in Baltimore County, more than anywhere else in the state.

Johnson stated that he didn't want body cameras turning county officers into "robotic, by the book figures" but added that officers who aren't complying with the body camera policies will be subject to the department's disciplinary system.

Kamenetz and Johnson both stressed that while body cameras are a strong tool that will help officers and the public, the cameras won't capture everything. "Body camera footage is not magical,"

said Kamenetz. "It is no substitute for a thorough investigation.

Johnson commented that cameras won't be able to show what's going on in an officer's mind, and also highlighted that cameras don't have the ability to see everything an officer can see in his or her peripherals. He also noted that the camera makes things seem brighter than they actually are.

But the biggest thing for county officials is transparency, with Kamenetz pledging that there's no question that footage will be released in most cases when requested by the public.

"Body camera footage is a public record," he said. "We will treat requests

for footage the same as requests for any other public record."

According to Kamenetz, there are exceptions in the state's public information laws that allow the department to redact certain identifying information or withhold a video amid an ongoing investigation. The identity of juvenile suspects, medical information and license plate and driver's license numbers will be redacted from videos that are released.

"Absent those exceptions, we will release the footage," Kamenetz stated.

Shellenberger added that the footage will be most beneficial in domestic violence cases, where victims are often reluctant to testify.

## New Fort Howard developer reveals himself at community meeting

Russell Donnelly says it has been two and a half years since the community has received any information on the status of the redevelopment at Fort Howard from government or Veterans Administration officials or the developer in charge of the project, Timothy Munshell.

But that all changed on Wednesday, June 29, at a meeting of the Save Fort Howard organization when Armando Cigniorelli stepped forward and identified himself as the new developer for the Fort Howard redevelopment project.

As of that day, his company, Cignal Corp, holds the contract to develop the property, Cigniorelli said.

While he did not go deep into specifics, his plan is to build 400 "veterans

preferred" townhomes on the property, along with an assisted living facility with 100 beds in the former hospital building.

Since that is not his expertise, Cigniorelli said he would rather that portion of the project be done by a group such as Shelter Builders who does specialize in that kind of housing.

Cignal Corp was the developer for the nearby Beachwood Estates and Beachwood North communities off of North Point Boulevard, completed in 1997 and 1996, respectively, and totalling about 360 homes. They have also completed several projects along the Canton waterfront.

"I want to do something that's for real," Cigniorelli stated. "I don't want to be like the last two developers" who got contracts and the property sat vacant.

"I have no interest in that," he said. "I don't have that kind of time and I've never done that in my life."

As part of the project, he also envisions creating a park as part of the development along the waterfront that would be open to everyone in the local communities during the day. However, it would be closed off at night because of the people living there.

"But that is a very expensive ordeal," he explained. "That will take some form of participation from one of our local governments - either the state or Baltimore County would have to contribute." Additionally, all 13 buildings on the property which are marked for historic preservation will be restored.

But community members expressed

skepticism that the "veterans preferred" designation would really mean anything, or that the average veteran would be able to afford the roughly \$300,000 price tag on the homes.

Donnelly said it would be an "injustice" to veterans for the property to be used for anything other than a full, long-term care facility in a national park setting. And now that the Veterans Administration outpatient clinic on the property is closed for good and their mission on the property no longer exists, he is concerned that they can just turn the property over to the developer, "lock, stock and barrel."

Residents at the meeting speculated, though, that closing the clinic was a way - see **FORT HOWARD** on page 6 -

# Overdevelopment is main issue at District 7 CZMP hearing

Marking a stark contrast from the hearing before the Baltimore County Planning Board in March, the June 28 Comprehensive Zoning Map Process hearing for District 7 before the County Council featured a mostly empty auditorium at Chesapeake High School.

The March 31 Planning Board hearing saw a packed auditorium at Dundalk High School, filled with residents concerned about the future of their local parks and confusion over the purpose of the proposed Neighborhood Commons zoning overlay.

And although one speaker at last Tuesday's hearing seemed to exhibit some of that confusion with her comments about what the loss of her local park would do to the neighborhood, the rumors about selling public parks had been mostly dispelled.

"I think we have put to rest the concern that Baltimore County is going to sell park land to build apartments," Seventh District Councilman Todd Crandell said before

public comment commenced. "That is absolutely not happening."

Beyond that, increased housing density in the district, particularly on the Back River Neck Peninsula in Essex presented itself as an issue, as it has been throughout the Fifth and Sixth District hearings as well.

T.J. McCann, a resident of the lower peninsula, said he was concerned that if increased housing density is allowed to change the character of the community, it could be lost forever.

McCann believes the area is at a "nexus" right now with good property values and new homeowners perhaps buying distressed lots to improve the existing homes and make a return on their investment. He also

named things like the area's improving water quality and abundant wildlife as things that make it unique and desirable.

"All of these things are what give eastern Baltimore County that special niche in coastal heritage," McCann stated. "And I think that it's really unique to anywhere else in the county."

"This is kind of our last shot," he said, referring to protecting the area from increased residential density and overdevelopment. "You cannot put that genie back in the bottle."

for the VA to wash their hands of the property and its issues, even though the programmatic agreement in the Enhanced Use Lease with the developer called for a state-of-the-art replacement of the outpatient clinic on-site.

The *East County Times* reported in March that part of the reason the VA was looking for a new site was to be more centralized in the region.

However, the VA has never revealed the complete terms of the EUL to the public, so the community is at a loss for what it really says. And they do not know for sure what it means for the development that the clinic is no longer there.

"We really can't answer any questions, legally or otherwise," Donnelly lamented, since the relevant government and VA officials, whom were all invited to the meeting, did not show up.

Officials from the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs in Washington, D.C., had not responded by press time to a request for comment on how the contract transfer process works or when it was carried out with the new developer.

Much of what the community has seen regarding the EUL comes from the request for proposal (RFP) that was originally put out for the property by the VA calling for bids.

And once the clinic was taken off the Fort Howard property, it could be clas-

sified by the VA as a "non-use piece of excess property," according to Donnelly.

"What we're after is to have that dedicated as a living national monument," he said, to include the area's history with the War of 1812, as well as amenities for veterans such as the clinic, tranquility gardens and a fishing pier.

Cigniorelli assured that he will back out of the project if the community does

not like it.

"I don't want to fight with communities," he said.

But he also said that the VA has decided it will hand the property back to the General Services Administration for use as whatever they deem fit if it is not approved for development this year. And at that point the VA and veterans would no longer have any control over it.

tion (RBIA), echoed those sentiments in his support for his organization's request to slightly downzone the property at 522 Back River Neck Road from DR 3.5 (3.5 homes per acre) to DR 2. The request would decrease the allowable density on the 15-acre property from 52 homes to just 30.

McDonough expressed that the community is becoming saturated with housing and this decrease would help lessen the burden on local schools and other infrastructure.

Additionally, he advocated for the use of the NC overlay on several local parks, as well as Resource Conservation (RC) zoning as an extra layer of protection.

Residents of the Seventh District's other rural communities on the peninsula to the south also expressed their feelings about development, but this time regarding Fort Howard.

Scott Pappas, vice president of the Fort Howard Community Association, said there has been no change in his organiza-

tion's support for keeping the existing zoning on the 100-acre property. But there has also been no shift in their opposition to any new construction on the property under the Veterans Administration's Enhanced Use Lease of the property until the burned and otherwise destroyed historic buildings there are restored and the VA outpatient clinic is improved on-site.

"There appears to exist a disconnect between our elected representatives and those who elected them," Pappas contended. "Please do all you can to repair this disconnect so that residents of Baltimore County can work together in this unfinished business for perfecting a government of the people, by the people and for the people."

State Delegate Pat McDonough also testified regarding Fort Howard, vowing to do everything in his power to further the best interests and goals of both the community and the veterans.

"I'm going to be in their corner working as hard as I can," he said, "and I will assist [the Council] in any way that I can."

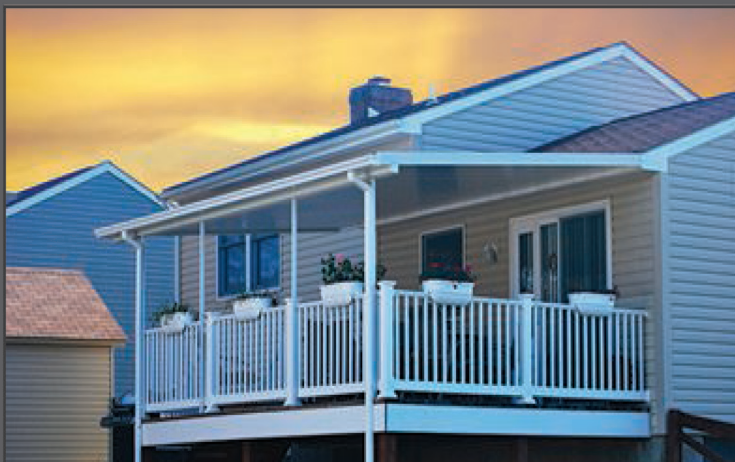

Between the years 1909 and 1960, The Glenn L. Martin Company produced over 80 different types of aircraft totalling more than 11,000 planes, including dozens of Boeing B-29s (50 of which were the "Atomic Bombers" including Enola Gay and Bockscar). Beginning in the 1950s, the company ventured into missiles, space and electronics and, since the Lockheed merger in 1995, has now reestablished itself as a prominent aerospace manufacturer.

"It's amazing that a little company that started here is now part of the largest aerospace corporation in the world with Lockheed Martin," said Piet.

After a few more historical exchanges, the conversation turned to the needs of the museum. The museum, which was founded in 1990, is a private, all-volunteer nonprofit dedicated to the promotion, preservation and documentation of aviation and space history in Maryland. When Franchot asked if the museum needed help, Piet and Michael responded with an emphatic "yes."

"We're very fortunate that Maryland Aviation has allowed us to be here because [Lockheed Martin] hasn't shown a whole lot of interest in their history," said Piet.

"We're here because of the State," said Michael. "And we're very appreciative of the land we have. But we're growing."

The way things are currently laid out at the muse-

um doesn't make a whole lot of sense logistically. In order to see the historic planes kept at the center, you need to actually leave the museum and take a short drive. There's also plenty in storage that's being kept at Lockheed Martin.

"With most museums, you get there and everything is right there," said Piet. "When you come here, you have to hop in your car and cross streets, a lot of people don't end up seeing the aircrafts."

"One of our three major goals is to acquire land and a building, and we need funding for that," said Michael.

Franchot told Piet and Michael that the state is currently "awash with money" and that he "couldn't imagine" the Board of Public Works not being supportive of the museum.

"This is potentially a real tourist attraction," Franchot added.

Michael added that the economic boom that took place around the Glenn L. Martin Company rivaled what happened with the emergence of Bethlehem Steel at Sparrows Point.

"We want the state hierarchy to know that we exist and that we have the history of Maryland aviation, and of Maryland's economic development," said Michael. "A hundred thousand people moved here in the 1940s and it totally changed the face of Maryland."

Last year Delegate Dan Morhaim floated the idea that the museum team up with Tradepoint Atlantic,



who are allegedly looking to build a museum to preserve the history of steelmaking at Sparrows Point, to run a joint operation. According to Michael, they would need about 90,000 square-feet. Things would need to be moved from their current location, but Michael only saw that as a small hurdle.

When Franchot suggested maybe looking at Port Covington, Piet responded that they'd like to keep it local.

"There's a lot of history here, from Rosie the Riveter to astronauts training for Gemini, and the people have worked hard to preserve it...so we'd like to keep it local," said Jennings. "Trying to get everything under one roof is tough, but we'd like to keep it here."

## Maryland Democrats push for gun control in wake of Orlando shooting

Last week Congressmen Chris Van Hollen, Dutch Ruppersberger, Elijah Cummings and John Sarbanes joined together with Maryland Attorney General Brian Frosh, Baltimore Police Commissioner Kevin Davis and advocates for gun control to call on Congress to enact what they perceive to be "common sense" legislation to curb gun violence in the wake of the Orlando terrorist attack that took place on June 12.

"Our message today is simple: no more business as usual in the House of Representatives until we get an up-or-down vote on common sense gun safety measures," said Van Hollen to a group of reporters on the steps of the Cathedral of the Incarnation in north Baltimore. "We will continue to demand action until the 'people's House' acknowledges the will of the American people and votes on measures to save lives and prevent the next tragedy."

The gun control debate took a turn in the wake of the Orlando shooting when Democratic members of Congress, led by Representative John Lewis of Georgia, performed a sit-in on the House floor after Speaker Paul Ryan ended a session before an up-or-down vote on gun control measures. The sit-in lasted for over 26 hours. Ryan ordered a recess until July 5, prompting all C-SPAN cameras broadcasting the session to be turned off. Many Democrats then turned to social media to get their message out.

"I was proud to join my colleagues on the House floor last week to say 'enough is enough,' and I am proud to continue the fight," said Cummings. "It is time for Republican lawmakers to treat gun violence like the scourge on our country that it is. The American people have had enough, and so have I."

After the Orlando shooting, Ruppersberger released a statement saying that it was his hope more Americans would rally around the cause of gun control. Ruppersberger pointed to the shooters San Bernadino, Aurora, Newtown and Orlando and the fact that they all used "assault rifles" as their "weapon of choice" for committing atrocities.

"They are weapons of war designed to inflict as

much carnage as possible in as little time as possible," said Ruppersberger. "When assault weapons or high-capacity magazines are used in a shooting, the number of casualties has increased 63 percent. So a ban may not stop these attacks, but will help drastically reduce the bloodshed."

"A ban on assault weapons is not gun control," he continued. "It is terrorist control. While I strongly believe in the Second Amendment, I also believe that we also have a Constitutional responsibility to protect American citizens from harm."

Democrats in Congress have been adamant that changes to gun laws need to be made. Specifically, they want a vote on legislation that would expand and strengthen the background check system, as well as legislation that would keep guns out of the hands of suspected terrorists by utilizing the government's No Fly List. Dubbed the 'No Fly, No Buy' bill, House Republicans have voted 14 times to block this particular piece of legislation.

While Democrats have been stating that this is "common sense legislation" that most Americans support, there has been plenty of backlash from Republicans.

Delegate Kathy Szeliga, who is vying for Barbara Mikulski's Senate seat against Van Hollen, told *The Sun* that she would take a broader approach to ad-

ressing violence rather than focusing solely on guns, tying the issue both to "radical Islam that has spilled over to our country," as well as "those who are severely mentally disturbed and have a tendency to act out violently."

"Career politicians want to give you a simple solution because it's easier for them, but the problem is far more complicated," Szeliga said.

Szeliga wasn't the only Maryland Republican to come out against recent moves for gun control, with Representative Andy Harris referring to the sit-in as a "political stunt."

"There's always a chance [for compromise] but you don't do it by stunts," Harris said.

Delegate Pat McDonough, who is running against Ruppersberger for the Second Congressional District seat, told *The Sun* that he supports "a reasonable solution" on gun control but showed apprehension at the idea of using watch lists to keep people from purchasing guns. He wants to make sure that people mistakenly identified as potential terrorists have a chance to get their names removed from said lists. McDonough went on to refer to the Congressional sit-in as "an embarrassment."

Despite the two sides remaining at odds, there are plenty who hope that some agreement can be reached.

"Gun violence is an epidemic that has impacted too many lives across the country and especially in big cities," said Davis. "We must work tirelessly and in partnership to deter those who want to illegally arm themselves with guns, and arrest and prosecute those who choose to illegally possess guns with the specific intent of harming our communities."

Baltimore City Health Commissioner Dr. Leana Wen decried the fact that the Center for Disease Control is barred by Congress from researching gun control measures, before adding that she had "no doubt that gun violence is a public health crisis."

"Unlike so many medical ailments that do not have a cure or a vaccine, with gun violence, we have the power to make change, prevent injury and save lives," Wen stated.

As it stands, Speaker Ryan has given no indication that a vote on gun control measures will take place on the House floor any time in the near future.

# 'The BFG' is giant-sized entertainment

A filmmaker like Steven Spielberg is, of course, only competing with himself at this point in his career. So, do you compare his latest film, "The BFG," with such past efforts as "E.T.," "Close Encounters of the Third Kind" and "Jurassic Park?" Or, do you put it up against... well, everything else? If the former, "The BFG" is a secondary accomplishment. If the latter? This is a film 99 percent of the directors out there wish they could pull off! This is PG-rated family entertainment at its near finest.

Of course, the film this will be compared to the most is "E.T." for two reasons. First, its story chronicles the sweet, imperiled friendship between an ordinary human child and an extraordinary, otherworldly being. And second, the core behind-the-scenes talent from "E.T." reassembles here after 30-plus years. In addition to Spielberg, they include the late screenwriter Melissa Mathison, producer Kathleen Kennedy

and composer John Williams.

But the comparison is unfair. "E.T." is a classic that took the entire world off-guard in the summer of 1982 and has enchanted generations thereafter. "The BFG" is based on a Roald Dahl book that has been around for years and years. This one's not sneaking up on many, and the magic has to be captured here.

Spielberg, for the most part, captures it with a mix of live action and CGI effects and environments. The film is almost entirely one extended special-effects sequence. And there are long portions of it that are just mesmerizing to watch. The early sequences are the best, with the film starting off one dark evening in London. It's around 3 a.m., and the only ones on the streets are a few staggering drunks from a local pub and an enormous giant who proves amazingly adept at using shadow and street lights to conceal his mysterious purpose while the city sleeps.

Well, there is one person who is not asleep. Her name is Sophie (the wonderful Ruby Barnhill), a young orphan with insomnia who spots the BFG (motion-captured and voiced by Oscar winner Mark Rylance) after skulking around the halls of her prison-like orphanage. The BFG panics. And in what will go down as the film's signature, "E.T. and Elliott riding across the moon on a bicycle" moment, he reaches in through the open orphanage window and snatches Sophie out of her bed.

He carries her back to Giant Country and his home. There, Sophie discovers that the BFG is actually a bit of a runt. The other giants are much bigger, and they bully him repeatedly. The two find that they are kindred spirits, and Sophie is amazed to discover that the BFG is a dream-catcher who's captured both dreams and nightmares in glass jars like we would nab fireflies on summer nights. Sophie also

learns that the bad giants who boast such intimidating names as Bloodbottler and Bonecruncher make semi-regular forays into our world to snatch children from their beds and consume them as late-night snacks (all off-screen). She hatches a plan that involves the BFG revealing himself to the Queen of England (Penelope Wilton) and enlisting her aid.

To be sure, the middle section of "The BFG" lumbers. But when the movie finally gets to England and Buckingham Palace, it is simply sublime. The scenes with the Queen and her staff are a wonderful mix of British humor, visual slapstick and pure cinematic spectacle leading into a climax that is both tense and nutty at the same time.

This is a very enthusiastic recommend, folks. I hope Spielberg, Williams and Kennedy can continue to make movie dreams like this come true for some years to come.

# You can pass on 'Swiss Army Man'

The new comedy-drama "Swiss Army Man" attempts to show that there is a fine line between independent filmmaking auteurs... and junior high school cut-ups who still find flatulence and erections to be the funniest things ever. Dear readers, I give you co-directors Dan Kwan and Daniel Scheinert. Together, they refer to themselves as "The Daniels." That's an actual on-screen credit. But they might as well have listed themselves as Quirk Quirkinson and Quirky McQuirkenstein.

It's a film about a suicidal man named Hank (Paul Dano) marooned on a deserted island who finds a washed-up corpse he names Manny (Daniel Radcliffe). Manny has spectacular flatulence. Yes, big-time gas, folks! How big? Hank is able to use Manny's smelly, almost-constant emissions to ride the cadaver jet ski-style out into the ocean where he eventually becomes stranded on another distant shore that sits on the edge of a great wilderness.

He's clearly deranged. He imbues Manny with additional magical powers, such as the ability to propel objects like un-popped popcorn kernels at bullet speed out of that same mouth. Most magically of all, the corpse re-acquires the ability to speak.

Still not making this up. You either go with this film or you don't. I tried, folks. I tried really hard, because some respected critics have been giving this high marks ever since it premiered at Sundance earlier this year. But this is one of those indie movies where oddball things happen not because of some cool internal logic carefully set up. Oddball stuff happens just because... it's an indie movie. That's not good enough. There's whimsical and there's quirky. And then there's just plain dumb.

I give the filmmaking duo credit for selling some important money people on this kooky premise. And I give Dano and Radcliffe a heck of a lot of credit for their amazingly committed performances. I won't soon forget "Swiss Army Man." But I won't remember it fondly either.

Not making this up.

Hank then traipses off into those thick woods, Manny in tow, to find civilization.

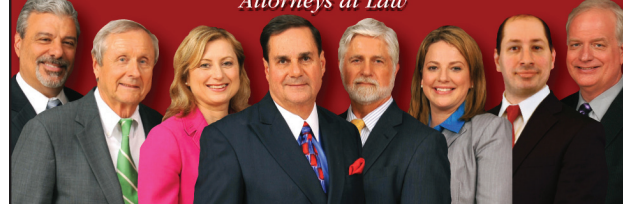

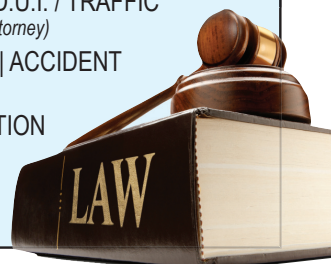

## How to ensure a more restful night's sleep

Adequate sleep is an essential element of a healthy lifestyle. But as beneficial as a good night's rest is, restful sleep is proving elusive for millions of people across the globe.

According to the American Academy of Sleep Medicine, 10 percent of adults in the United States have a chronic insomnia disorder. That translates to roughly 32 million people in the United States alone who struggle to fall asleep or stay asleep at least three times per week for at least three months. Sufficient sleep boosts energy levels and makes it easier to focus and concentrate, while insomnia contributes to poor memory, disturbs mood and leads to daytime sleepiness. But insomnia is not just harmful to individuals. The AASM notes that researchers estimate that insomnia costs an estimated \$63 billion in lost work performance each year in the U.S.

Combating insomnia is no small task, but the following healthy sleep habits may help men and women overcome their bouts of insomnia and get more restful sleep.

- Avoid too many beverages before bedtime. Drinking water or beverages that include caffeine or alcohol too close to bedtime can interrupt sleep or make it difficult to fall asleep. Too much water before going to bed may lead to nightly bathroom breaks that interrupt your sleep. Along those same lines, alcohol consumed too close to bedtime may make it easy to fall asleep fast, but you're likely to wake up once the effects of the alcohol wear off, which can be very soon after your head hits the pillow. In addition, avoid caffeinated beverages

in the late afternoon or evening, as caffeine stimulates the central nervous system and may compromise your ability to fall asleep. Nicotine also serves as a stimulant, so smokers fighting insomnia should avoid tobacco products in the hours before they plan to go to bed.

- Get out of bed if you can't fall asleep. The AASM recommends getting out of bed if you haven't fallen asleep within 20 minutes of lying down. The longer you lay in bed without falling asleep, the more likely you are to dwell on your sleeping problems.
- Dim the lights inside your home. Two to three hours before bedtime, dim the lights in your home. Dim lighting signals to your brain that it should begin making melatonin, a hormone that is closely associated with sleep.
- Eliminate potentially distracting sounds. A poor sleep environment can contribute to insomnia, and distracting sounds can make it hard to fall asleep. Fix distractions such as leaky faucets and close bedroom windows if nearby traffic is compromising your ability to fall asleep at night. If necessary, use a white noise machine that blocks out distractions but contributes to a consistent sleep environment.
- Use your bed only for sleep and sex. Resist the temptation to finish watching a movie, television show or ballgame in bed, using your bed only for sleep and sex. If you grow accustomed to working in bed or watching television in bed, you may have trouble falling asleep once you turn the lights off and close your eyes.

## Pros and cons to detox diets

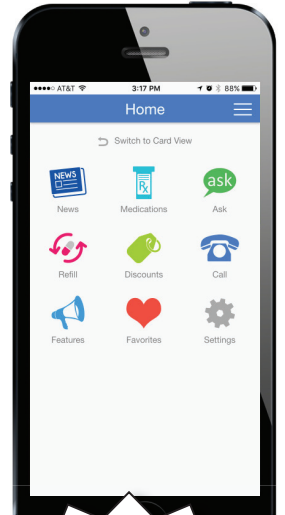
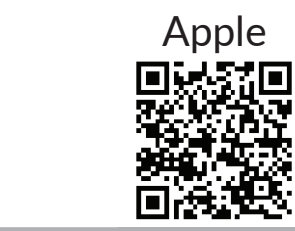
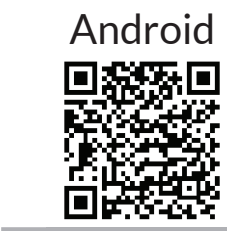

### Healthy foods that may cause weight gain

## Maryland is changing

It is amazing to me the number of times I have read an article by the mainstream media deeming Maryland a "blue state." More often than not, the article is written by someone who has never been to Maryland and never spoken to anyone from Maryland. This was the first time in 50 years Republicans won in this area, proving that even the most entrenched Democratic areas are trending towards Republicans.

Since this sweeping election, Marylanders could not be happier with the direction the state is headed. Governor Hogan has had some of the highest sup-

port in the country - as high as 70 percent - even in the middle of a very contentious General Assembly session. In other words, Marylanders like Governor Hogan's common-sense reforms to lower taxes, decrease tolls and balance the budget. And it's much more likely they are going to want to send someone to Washington who shares his common-sense approach to government over another career politician.

I want to remind the mainstream media and the Washington elite that Marylanders are not so easily put into a box when it comes to their political preferences. We are independent thinkers who select the leader we think will do the best job representing us.

## Marks recommends open space zoning on two Honeygo-area properties

As county councilman for the Fifth District, I have decided during this year's Comprehensive Zoning Map Process to recommend restricting development on two county-owned properties in the vicinity of Honeygo Boulevard in Perry Hall.

The first property is located at the southwestern corner of Honeygo Boulevard and Silver Spring Road and backs up to Saxon Circle.

Right now, the six-acre, wooded parcel has zoning that allows for single-family homes or townhouses. I will recommend Neighborhood Commons, or open space zoning, at this publicly-owned property.

I am doing my best to keep the Honeygo Boulevard corridor as green as possible in this part of Perry Hall. Previously, I announced an agreement to restrict development north of Joppa View Elementary School as well.

The second property consists of 26 acres of wood-

ed property north of the Honeygo Village Center, east of Honeygo Boulevard, south of Perry Hall Farms, and west of Glenside Farms. This undeveloped parcel is currently zoned for single-family homes. I am proposing Neighborhood Commons zoning here as well.

Baltimore County has owned this property since the Honeygo area was developed in the 1990s and early 2000s. Right now, it is one of the largest chunks of green space in the region. It provides a peaceful, undisturbed setting for thousands of residents and for wildlife. Some of the property is wetlands, but enough of it is developable to the point that it was considered for a school site.

I believe this should eventually be added to Honeygo Run Park, but in the meantime, I will support removing any development potential from this property.

The zoning maps will be adopted by the County Council on Aug. 30.

## Crandell fighting for the best deal for veterans and community

One of our district's most complex zoning map issues is number 7-048, the Fort Howard Veterans Affairs Property. While I rejected a proposal that included almost 1,500 housing units and commercial development last fall, I do not feel my job is done. The blight is still there and the threat of overdevelopment still exists.

I am pleased to announce today that my intention is to use legislation to govern what can and cannot be built at Fort Howard.

The goal of the legislation is to create a special district (called an overlay) that limits the amount of housing units, requires the new houses be marketed to veterans as a priority and requires amenities for disabled veterans.

Even though the legislation is in draft form, I have met with several community leaders to seek their input, which is being incorporated into the bill. I intend to introduce the bill on July 5, and at that time, a draft will be available online. I welcome any community comment or input before the bill is voted on in August. If passed, I will establish the overlay district at the end of the Comprehensive Zoning Map Process.

Even with this legislation, the future of Fort Howard is uncertain. Veterans Affairs officials stated to me that they are considering "surplussing" the property - a federal process through which we could lose all control of what happens there - a risk that I am extremely concerned about. Further complicating matters, there are various legal and financial issues associated with the current state of the site, which continues to fall into dilapidation.

I consider Fort Howard to be one of the most beautiful properties on the Chesapeake Bay, and the right project is worth fighting for. Despite the challenges, I still believe that the opportunity exists to create something there that enables us to honor veterans while developing a project of which we can all be proud.

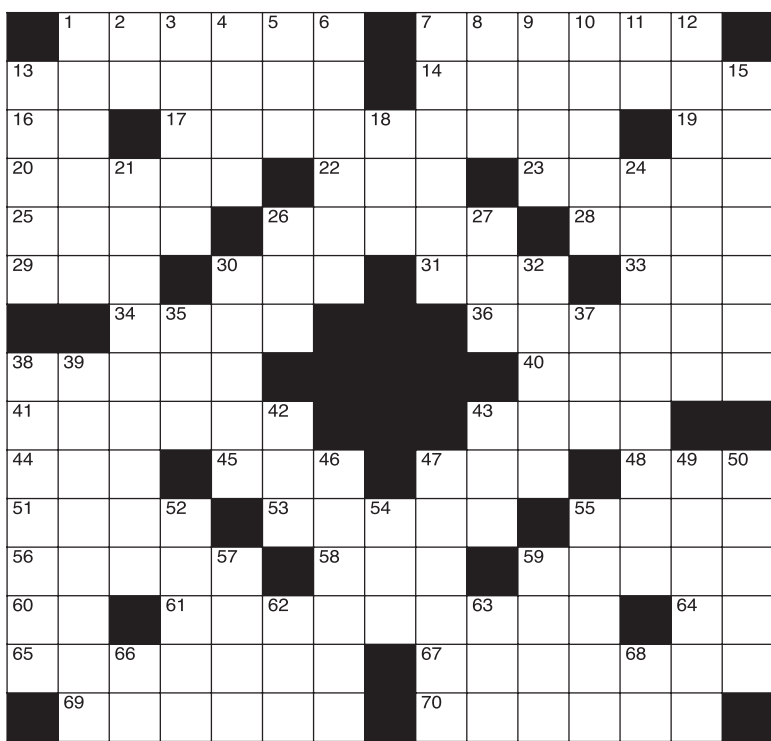

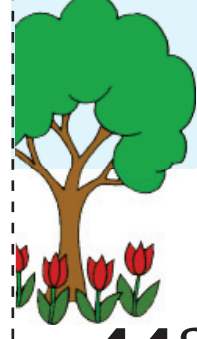
