

Hart-Miller south cell officially opened to the public

Although it has technically been open for a month, officials and dignitaries gathered on Hart-Miller Island to cut the ribbon for the opening of its south cell to the public.

The island's central beach, originally constructed to join the then-separate Hart and Miller Islands in 1981, has been a popular destination for boaters for decades. But now visitors to Hart-Miller have access to nearly 300 acres of additional real estate on the island full of recreational opportunities such as five-plus miles of hiking and biking trails, abundant bird and wildlife viewing opportunities and history about the island.

South cell interior access is available May through September on Thursdays - Mondays from 11 a.m. - 4 p.m.

And don't worry about bringing your bike to the island; they have them there for visitors to use.

According to Ranger Dean Hughes of the Maryland Park Service, the expansion of the Hart-Miller Island State Park facility is the fulfillment of a promise made more than 30 years ago to the citizens of Maryland.

"It was at that time that the Department of Natural Resources, the Port Administration and the [Maryland] Environmental Service agreed to work together to rebuild and restore Hart and Miller Islands with

the vision of creating a new state park," Hughes explained.

The first phase of that vision was initiated in 1982 with the opening of the beach to the public. And the island had more than 44,000 visitors in that first year, he said.

Within the next 10 years, the ranger station, observation tower and all of the other facilities there today were completed and open to the public, "and believe me, they enjoy them," Hughes noted.

'If you haven't been here on any given weekend in the summertime, this entire beachfront is filled with hundreds or even thousands of boats and visitors, all here

received from the Maryland State Senate and House of Delegates are state money, they can only be used for in-state schools.

When McCluskey learned she could not take that money with her, she began to ponder who deserved it as much or more than she did. "And I instanstly thought of him," she said.

That person was her friend of six years and fellow SPHS senior David Mundy Jr., whose father had passed away late last year.

When McCluskey brought the idea of giving her \$1,000 scholarship from Sixth District Delegate Bob Long to Mundy, Long's office told her they could consider him, but he had not submitted the scholarship application.

"Nothing was done because the due date was right before his father passed," McCluskey said. "It makes sense that he didn't do it."

So McCluskey worked with AVID coordinator and mentor Dr. Geoffrey Holland to complete the application for Mundy.


"He had an essay on file already, so that was put in the packet. And I wrote a letter stating that he deserved it more, and I explained to Bob Long that I can't take it out of state, but he can [use it]," McCluskey explained. Mundy plans to attend Towson University in the fall.

"He's the most deserving person for this that I know," she commented. "He worked just as hard as I did."

And since the deadline had already passed, the application would not have been considered if it was mailed in. Therefore, McCluskey had to find Del. Long's home address and personally deliver it to him so it could be considered.

What's more, McCluskey went through this same process for Del. Robin Grammer's \$500 scholarship and noted that she will with Senator Johnny Ray Salling's if she can, though she has not heard back for sure about that one yet.

Mundy and McCluskey after the June 3 awards ceremony. Courtesy photo.


after announcing his other scholarship recipients and commended McCluskey and Dr. Holland for their tenacity and hard work.

McDonough gears up for general election with Republican Club visit

Last week, Delegate Pat McDonough stopped by the East County Republican Club to speak with the club's members about the upcoming Congressional race and highlight the differences between he and Congressman Dutch Ruppersberger.

McDonough spent about 30 minutes taking shots at the incumbent congressman while laying out his plan for

"I believe the country is moving in the wrong direction, rapidly," said McDonough, before labeling Ruppersberger as a "prisoner of big money."

Highlighting recent statements Ruppersberger made regarding transgender bathroom rights, as well as Section-8 housing, McDonough painted Ruppersberger as an out-of-touch Washington insider who votes along party lines.

Unlike Governor Larry Hogan, Mc-Donough has embraced the surge that presidential hopeful Donald Trump has seen, and like Trump McDonough voiced his support for a wall to be built along the Mexican border. But his reasoning goes beyond illegal immigra-

tion, with the delegate noting that a lot of heroin makes its way up north from Mexico. Deaths from all categories of opioids reached new highs in Maryland last year, with heroin fatalities increasing 29 percent, to 748, while deaths from prescription pain medications climbed 6 percent, to 351. It was the fifth straight year that heroin deaths were on the rise, and the third straight year for prescription opioids.

Overall, opioids accounted for 86 percent of Maryland overdose deaths

McDonough also spent a lot of time hammering Ruppersberger for his time spent on the intelligence committee, wondering aloud how the Congressman could have missed the rising threat of ISIS.

After spending most of his time lasering in on Ruppersberger, Mc-Donough turned his attention to jobs and economic growth.

"In the past eight years our economic growth has been 1 percent," said McDonough. "Growth at 1 percent is third-world country growth.

According to McDonough, he plans to help spur growth by limiting outAct, getting a handle on illegal immi-

sourcing, repealing the Dodd-Frank gration and being prepared for the imminent wave of automation.

to enjoy the relaxing atmosphere and calm waters that the island provides," he said. HMI is now one of Maryland's 72 state parks under

HMI is now one of Maryland's 72 state parks under the stewardship of DNR. But it began its modern life in 1977 and 1978 when Bethlehem Steel Corporation and C.J. Langenfelder & Son, Inc., respectively, conveyed the deeds to the islands to DNR.

In 1981, the state began construction of a containment dike around the island, forming its present-day perimeter. And placement of dredge material from the Port of Baltimore and its surrounding marine channels commenced from 1984 through the end of 2009.

And according to the Maryland Port Administration's Director for Harbor Development, Chris Correale, the island was important because it allowed Baltimore to become the first port on the east coast to have a 50-foot-deep channel, ready to handle the super Post-Panamax

ships which will begin arriving this summer.

"It has allowed us to thrive as a multi-billion-dollar economic engine for the state of Maryland because it holds 100 million cubic yards of dredge material, put here through the the deepening to the 50-foot channel and subsequent maintenance," Correale explained.

And while the work of countless people over the last four decades has brought the island to this point, everyone in attendance acknowledged the work of one particular group of people - the Hart-Miller Island Citizens Oversight Committee - in assuring that the island would be an asset to the public and the state.

DNR Secretary Mark Belton said that, while the new facility is the culmination of community activism and leadership, steadfast dedication and a "really innovative" partnership, the efforts on the island have only been successful due to the dedication and involvement of citizen groups like the HMICOC over the last 30-plus years.

Since its creation in 1981 in response to community concerns over the HMI project, the Committee provided ongoing review of water quality, sediment monitoring and scientific studies on the impacts of dredging, as well as design plans for the recreational improvements on the island.

"We owe the members of the Citizens Oversight Committee a large debt of gratitude for their vision, unique perspectives and their grit, which ensured that their government never forgot a concept promised to the citizens of Maryland over 40 years ago," Belton commented.

"Their involvement has become a model for how the Port engages with stakeholders in all other dredge material management projects we have," Correale stated, adding that the open and transparent dialogue has been key to establishing relationships with communities.

Belton and Correale recognized two longtime Committee members, Tom Kroen and Harry Wujek Jr., who both passed away late last year. As part of that recognition, Correale revealed that the MPA plans to erect a monument on the island in the fall, in honor of the HMICOC and the importance of citizen engagement.

Maryland Park Service Superintendent Nita Settina said some of the island's greatest assets are "world-class views of the Chesapeake Bay from an observation tower, high-quality grassland and lake habitat that attracts and impressive diversity of sea and bird life" and a half-mile of beachfront for wading and picnicking, along with several other recreational resources.

An avid cyclist, Settina made the decision to have bicycles on the island for visitors to use.

"I thought bikes out here would be really fun, and a good way to run from the mosquitoes and generate a little breeze," she joked.

DNR will now be working with MES and using input from visitors to develop a plan to eventually expand recreational access to the island's much-larger north cell as well.

"When that's ready, the entire island will be 1,100 acres and open to public access," Settina concluded.

Mundy heaped praise on his classmate as well, noting that through the years they had been in school together, he and McCluskey had discussed their futures, including how they would pay for college.

Mundy had expected to have enough scholarships to almost fully pay for his expenses at TU. But because of his father's death, he had missed the deadline on many of them.

"I thought I had nothing. It was a really happy moment, knowing that someone was there for me," he said. "What Christina did for me is really going to make a difference."

But McCluskey told the *East County Times* she was just doing what her parents had raised her to do.

"I feel very humbled to give [the scholarships] to him," she said. "But I was just doing what was expected of me, and what a friend would do, really. I know he would do it for me."

Following the announcement at the awards ceremony, the two embraced each other, during which McCluskey said Mundy expressed his heartfelt appreciation for what she did, and she responded that it was her pleasure. She added that she was so proud of him and





Speed camera enforcement steps up on 695

As part of the Maryland SafeZones Automated Speed Enforcement (ASE) program, the Maryland Transportation Authority (MDTA) and MDTA police, in coordination with the Maryland Department of Transportation's State Highway Administration and Maryland State Police (MSP), will deploy ASE equipment for construction activities on the I-95 Express Toll Lanes (ETL) project in northeast Baltimore.

Beginning on June 9, the ASE equipment will be deployed on eastbound I-695 (Inner Loop) between Bel Air Road and Philadelphia Road. This equipment will be used to slow drivers in the ETL work zone at the I-95/I-695 interchange. Advance warning signs are in place prior to the work zone to alert drivers of automated speed enforcement use, while a speed trailer will display drivers' speeds.

After a 21-day warning period, MSP will authorize citations starting on June 30. By law, if a vehicle is recorded as traveling 12 or more miles over the posted speed limit (the posted speed is 55 mph at this location), a fine of \$40 will be issued to the registered owner of the vehicle.

Maryland SafeZones' goal is to slow drivers and make work zones safer environments for workers, drivers and passengers. Even when workers are not present, work zones can be dangerous due to uneven pavement, lane shifts, reduced shoulders and other modifications. For more information on the program, visit safezones.maryland.gov. The current work at the I-95/I-695 interchange will reconstruct and realign I-695 from Bel Air Road to Philadelphia Road. The project is anticipated to complete in fall 2016.

Darren Beattie, 21, turned himself in to police on June 7. He is currently being held in Ocean City awaiting a court appearance.

On May 29, at approximately 2:30 a.m., Ocean City Police and EMS responded to the area of 136th Street & Coastal Highway in reference to an assault. Ocean City EMS transported the victim, Ryan M. Shupert, 31, of Lutherville Timonium, MD, to Peninsula Regional Medical Center where he was admitted to the Intensive Care Unit with life-threatening injuries. Shupert succumbed to his injuries and passed away on May 31. Shupert's body was transported to the medical examiner who ruled the death to be a ho-

With assistance from numerous leads provided by the public, resort detectives were able to tentatively identify the suspect as Beattie. Equipped with this information, detectives travelled to Dundalk and Sparrows Point on Saturday, June 4. With support from the Baltimore County Police Department Homicide and Intelligence Units, Ocean City detectives were able to quickly locate and interview Beattie along with other witnesses and involved parties.

Beatty is a relatively recent graduate of Sparrows Point High School where he excelled on the Pointers football team as a jack-of-all-trades. In 2014 he was the runner up for the East County Times Player of the

Subsequent investigation led to the identification of the victim and the daughter being responsible for the murder of her mother. Police have not yet been able to determine the motive behind the murder.



'Now You See Me 2' has little movie magic

One of the great things about having XM/Sirius satellite radio in the car is that when you are on a long road trip with the family, or just doing a lot of driving in general, you can pre-set multiple channels and enjoy music from multiple decades that you wouldn't ordinarily hear on terrestrial radio. So, on my pre-sets, I have the '60s on Channel 6, the '70s on 7, the '80s on 8, the '90s on 9, and so forth. Of those, I must say, the '60s had some of the best road music with everyone from the Beach Boys to the Beatles to all of the old Motown classics.

But if you listen to any station long enough, you recognize their playlist. For the last week, for whatever reason, whenever I have turned to the '60s on 6, inevitably within the first three or four songs I will hear Sam Cooke's great 1962 hit "Twistin' the Night Away." You know the lyrics. They're somehow in your head already when you come into this world. "They're twistin'... twistin'... everybody's feelin' great! They're twistin'... twistin'... twistin' the night away!" That chorus repeats a LOT! You wanna know where else it was repeatin'?! In my head during the entirety of my recent screening of "Now You See Me 2!" Aaargh!

Here is a film that has little interest in

recognizable human emotions, believable character development or plausible storytelling. It's only interested in piling plot twist upon plot twist, reveal upon reveal, until you just don't care. You're just on a roller coaster waiting for the darn thing to stop. It's so twisty and turny that it makes boring, normal, everyday, routine life a welcome return.

Almost the entire cast is back from the first film, which really didn't seem to warrant a sequel. But here it is. The vaunted Four Horsemen - a quartet of magicians, each with a special talent (besides varying degrees of smug), who use their skills to heist major banks and crooked conglomerates and give the cash back to the masses - are back. As the film opens, they are awaiting orders from the secret dark-magic syndicate known as The Eye. The Horsemen include: Atlas (Jesse Eisenberg), a slight-of-hand expert; Merritt (Woody Harrelson), a master hypnotist; Jack (Dave Franco), a professional pickpocket; and newcomer Lula (Lizzy Caplan), who replaces Isla Fisher's escape artist. Her main talent is illusion, which is used to hilarious effect early on when she has to fake her hand being cut off in order to create a diversion.

Unfortunately, as with the first flick, the film becomes less and less interested in

the team as the story twists its night away. And because there are so many turns of the plot, it's one of those dumb movies that actually thinks itself really, really smart. The central story again entails Mark Ruffalo's FBI agent, who is secretly an operative of The Eye, working out some long-held Daddy issues by plotting out ridiculously convoluted capers involving magic and illusion.

Also returning are Morgan Freeman and Michael Caine, who's amazing voices can't save some really silly, faux-profound dialogue about what we see with our eyes, what the nature of reality is and other hogwash. These two gents would have been better served spending their time narrating documentaries or books on tape this past year rather than lumbering through this sequel. They're really old now, too. So, most of their scenes entail their efforts to get from one chair to the next.

The one promising character is an evil tech billionaire played by Daniel Radcliffe who secretly loves magic (get it, get it). He recruits the Four Horsemen to steal an all-powerful computer chip. Radcliffe is great in his first few scenes, displaying an impish glee at his own badness. But, like so many of the other actors and characters, he shrinks the




longer the film goes on as the film piles twist upon twist.

The whole thing is also a grand set up for "Now You Pay Me... er, See Me 3," of course. This is a world where billions around the world literally congregate in large public spaces to await the Horsemen's next performance piece. Let's see if this sequel can pull off the same trick by getting throngs of people to show up and turn this franchise into a trilogy.

Sequel 'Conjures' up a second course of frights and scares

One of the sucky things about getting older - and even as I get older, I'll never stop using words like "sucky" - is that you grow increasingly cynical about horror flicks and other genre movies that are purportedly "based on a true story," "inspired by real events," etc. The "Conjuring" movies play this conceit up to the max, as the main two ghost-busters, Lorraine and Ed Warren (Vera Farmiga and Patrick Wilson), are a husbandand-wife couple who really did practice paranormal psychology back in their 1970s heyday.

With so many cheesy cable TV shows now on about ghosts and haunted houses and the fact that anyone can walk through their creepy dwellings now with cameras and sound recorders the size of credit cards, my guess is any ghosts or evil spirits worth their salt are fading even further back into the collective woodwork of the space between spaces. I feel for 'em. It must have been SO much easier to scare people pre-iPhones.

So, "The Conjuring 2" with its 1970s setting is able to really suck viewers into a time when a "Starsky & Hutch" poster would hang on a kid's bedroom wall and the monsters in the closets had to wade through a wardrobe sea of plaid, polyester and bell-bottoms to even peek out into the real world.

This time, the good-Catholic Warrens are dispatched by the Church to London to help a single mom (Frances O'Connor) and her four kids battle a malevolent spirit in their creaky rowhouse, one that has especially targeted the 11-year-old daughter for some reason. What's great about James Wan's direction is he really knows how to summon a feeling of dread and ratchet up that mood and tone for long chunks of screen time. This is a very unsettling film, folks.

"The Conjuring 2" is also a step above the usual horror-thriller fare due to its casting. Farmiga, Wilson and O'Connor are all top-notch actors that have appeared in prestige pictures and well-produced TV shows before. Farmiga's entrancing eyes are ideal for this kind of story

and character. You stare deep into them as they register fear and anticipation, long enough for your guard to be let down and Wan to slam a door and make you jump out of your seat. Franka Potente of "The Bourne Identity" and Simon McBurney of "Tinker Tailor Soldier Spy" also lead solid support as a British skeptic and believer, respectively, who are already on the scene when the Warrens make the trip from America.

I do have a couple of nitpicks. Chiefly, at around two hours and 15 minutes, it's just too darn long. It takes the screenplay almost an hour (it might have been shorter, but it felt that long) to get the Warrens even over to England. So, that first near-half of the film is spent setting the table.

Mostly, though, my nitpicks are just that. I just like being held in a film's grip from start to finish. I don't want to have times where I check out, where even the movie encourages me to take a little rest while the gears of its plot mechanics lurch and creak forward. There's no denying, though, that when "The Conjuring 2" is good... it's scary good!


