Officials encourage drivers, pedestrians to be alert for back-to-school safety

Yesterday, Aug. 24, was the first official day of the 2016-2017 school year for Baltimore County students, and commuters have undoubtedly noticed an increase in both motor vehicle and pedestrian traffic.

The increase in traffic means taking more time to get to work. And state and county officials took the opportunity on Wednesday, Aug. 17, to remind both drivers and pedestrians that they need to be aware of each other in order to stay safe.

The event was held at Perry Hall Elementary School, directly adjacent to the busy US-1/Belair Road, which carries more than 28,000 vehicles through the area each day.

"The potential conflict is clear," said Dave Coyne, deputy state highway administrator with the Maryland Department of Transportation. "Whether you have a school-aged child or you're a daily commuter, we all have a role to play in the safety of our youngest commuters - our children."

Specifically, pedestrians should use sidewalks and marked crosswalks whenever possible. Always stop at the curb and look both ways before crossing a street. Watch for turning vehicles and remove headphones while walking. No texting

or playing games.

Drivers should always stop for pedestrians and observe posted speed limits, as speeding makes it more difficult to stop. Always keep eyes on the road and avoid distractions from electronic devices.

Officer Cynthia Spriggs, of the Baltimore County Police Department's Traffic Management Unit, noted that electronic devices are a big culprit in distraction on the road.

"The primary focus is driving," she said. "The electronic device can wait until you've safely reached your destination.

#### Study finds high bacteria levels in Bird River, tributaries

A summer-long study performed by the Chesapeake Bay Foundation and local volunteers has found levels of fecal bacteria in the Bird River and its tributaries in some cases nearly 400 times higher than what is considered safe.

The same study also found high levels of the enterococcus bacteria - found in the fecal matter of both animals and humans - in other waterways around the region.

Following rain storms of about a halfinch or more this summer, volunteers sampled eight sites around the Bird River watershed to gain an understanding of how much potentially harmful bacteria is washed into local streams and rivers during significant rainfall.

Data gathered within 24 hours following each major rain storm from June 17 - Aug. 15 at sites along Bird River tributaries Honevgo Run and White Marsh Run showed enterococcus levels sometimes reaching or exceeding 24,000 colony-forming units per 100 mililiters (cfu/100mL). Although not as high, samples from Windlass Run also showed levels of the bacteria well above recommended levels.

According to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), enterococcus levels should not be above 61 cfu/100mL


for an area that is used frequently for recreation, or 151 cfu/100mL for a place that is used occasionally.

Water samples gathered from five sites along the three tributaries showed spikes in the amount of bacteria present following storms on June 17, June 28, July 5, July 29, Aug. 2 and Aug. 15.

A dry-weather sampling was also taken on July 22 for comparison when there had been no rain for several days prior.

Samples taken on Windlass Run at Bird River Road ranged from 620 to more than 2,419 cfu/100mL following the storms.

#### **Ruppersberger meets with troops in Afghanistan**

Congressman C.A. Dutch Ruppersberger, an appropriator who serves on the House defense subcommittee, last week traveled to Afghanistan to meet with troops on the frontlines who are working with our NATO allies to combat ISIS and the Taliban. The 2-day trip followed the administration's announcement of a modified schedule for U.S. troop withdrawal as well as new authorities in the fight against terrorists that were central to securing the support of our allies at the NATO Warsaw Summit last month.

The group was briefed by Commander of NATO Resolute Support Mission and U.S. Forces in Afghanistan, General John Nicholson, Jr. - a Baltimore County native - and U.S. Ambassador to Afghanistan, Peter Michael McKinley. They also met with U.S., NATO, and Afghan service members at Forward Operating Base Oqab and the Train, Advise and Assist Command-East at Gamberi Training Base, who are working to train Afghan security forces near the Afghanistan-Pakistan border. There, Congressman Ruppersberger was honored to meet two service members from Maryland.

"I was in Afghanistan to hear directly from U.S. and Afghani military leaders about what's working and what's not," Congressman Ruppersberger said.

# **Second man charged in North Point Road assault**

Baltimore County Police have charged a second suspect in connection with the July 6 assault in Dundalk that left a man injured.

Victor Rabon Collier III, 25, has been charged with attempted first-degree murder and related charges. He is being held without bail at the Baltimore County Detention Center.

Just before 3:30 a.m. July 6, police responded to the 3600 block of North Point Road in Dundalk for an urgent welfare check. When officers arrived, they found a 20-year-old man lying next to the roadway suffering from traumatic injuries. He was taken to an area hospital for treatment.

The investigation first led detectives to identify 24-year-old Shane Michael Williams of the 8100 block of Dundalk Avenue as a person responsible for the crime. Williams was arrested on July 11 and is being held at the Baltimore County Detention Center on \$250,000 bail.


Further investigation led detectives to determine that Collier was also involved in the assault.

#### **Current crime trends**

Since Aug. 6, there have been three residential burglaries in the Essex community within the Essex Precinct. Two cases occurred during morning hours. One case occurred over a multiple-day time frame. Unlocked doors or windows were entered in all cases. Screens were cut in one case. Items taken include purses, money, tablets, credit cards and jewelry.

Since June 22, there have been seven pharmacy burglaries in the Wilkens, Woodlawn, Towson, Pikesville and Dundalk precincts. Cases occurred during the early morning hours. In most cases, entry was made with force and through front doors. Once inside, the suspects then forced interior doors and ransacked cabinets. In most cases, the suspects removed large amounts of narcotics or prescription medications. In two cases, the suspects pried or pulled open cash registers and removed money. In the last case, the suspects took money. There has been no new activity since Aug. 4. Anyone with information regarding these burglaries is urged to contact Baltimore County police.





# Phone scammer posing as MSP demands money

Maryland State Police are warning the public about a telephone scam in which the caller represents himself as a barrack commander and threatens the victim with arrest if money owed is not immediately forwarded.

A victim in her 70's from Allegany County called the Maryland State Police Rockville Barrack last evening and reported she had received multiple calls from a man with a 'heavy foreign' accent. He told her she owed \$800 and would be arrested if she did not quickly forward him the money. Fortunately, the woman said she hung up on the suspect each time.

The woman said when the suspect called her, the caller ID on her phone showed the number 301-424-2101, which is the publicly listed phone number for the Maryland State Police Rockville Barrack. The woman reported the suspect identified himself as Lt. Dan Pickett, who is the commander of the Rockville Barrack.

Citizens are reminded that the Maryland State Police does not collect fines for traffic or criminal offenses. All fines are collected by Maryland's court system (<a href="www.courts.state.md.us">www.courts.state.md.us</a>). No one in the Maryland State Police would place a call to someone and threaten arrest if a fine was not forwarded immediately to the State Police.

The Maryland State Police Criminal Enforcement Division is investigating this case of fraud and telephone misuse. 
# **Keep the environment** in mind when changing oil

#### How to touch up your vehicle's exterior

Warm weather is synonymous with many things, including summer vacations. But for auto enthusiasts, spring, summer and even early fall would not be the same without road trips. Road trips often instill a spirit of rejuvenation in drivers and their passengers, and there's no reason that spirit cannot be applied to vehicles as well.

Vehicle touchups were once a realm reserved specifically for mechanics or the most ardent auto enthusiasts. But nowadays even weekend warriors can address the minor dings, chips and scratches on their vehicles, saving them both time and money.

- Crack the color code. One of the fears novices commonly have when touching up their vehicles is that they won't find the exact match with regard to their vehicle's exterior color. The key to the perfect color match is contained in the vehicle's color code, which can be found somewhere on the vehicle, most often on the inside of the driver's side door. Consult your owner's manual or call the vehicle manufacturer if you cannot find the color code on your vehicle. Once you find the code, you can then order your color. - Use the right application tool. Dings, chips and cracks come in many shapes and sizes, and the ap-

propriate touchup tool will depend on the type and size of the blemish. Small chips and nicks and thin scratches are best addressed with pens, while you might need a small bottle of clearcoat to address slightly larger areas. Use an aerosol spray can to address areas that have experienced extensive damage. When applying the paint, use several light coats rather than one heavy coat. Drivers concerned about their application abilities can visit the Automotive-Touchup website to access a library of educational videos that illustrate how to use the various application tools. Visitors to the website also can speak directly with a team of advisors who can walk them through their projects.

- Recognize that practice makes perfect. Even if you are confident you purchased the right paint, it's still best to practice using your touchup paint prior to applying the paint to your vehicle. Use a glossy sheet of paper or metal can as a practice surface, and then hold that practice surface up next to your vehicle to confirm your choice and calm any lingering nerves you may have about the paint match.
- Paint in the right conditions. Before applying any paint, thoroughly clean the affected areas. A simple formula of dish soap and water should do the trick, but be sure to allow the area to dry completely before continuing. When using aerosol cans, the ideal temperature to spray is between 70° and 80°F and humidity should be 50 percent or less. Never spray primer, paint or clearcoat in direct sunlight.
- Allow the paint time to dry. Drying times vary depending on the temperature. Paints may take longer to dry when temperatures are below 70°F than they will when the weather is warmer. Once the application process is complete, do not wax the vehicle for 30 days.







#### Cloudy headlights a safety concern

Many drivers feel less comfortable behind the wheel at night than they do during the day, when daylight makes it easier to see fellow motorists as well as pedestrians. Nighttime can compromise a driver's vision, and that reduced vision is a key factor in traffic fatalities, nearly half of which occur at night.

Though traffic accidents are a byproduct of a host of factors, headlamp clouding is one of them and a growing problem for many motorists. Vehicles equipped with plastic headlamp lenses can become hazed and yellowed from the effects of sunlight, ozone, road pollution and the chemicals used in car washes. #### Car battery care in extreme weather

Few things can be more frustrating than jumping into the driver's seat on a frosty morning, turning the key in the ignition and failing to hear the engine roar to life. Frigid weather can cause trouble with a car's battery. Some drivers do not understand why, but getting the facts can help people avoid having to deal with dead batteries on cold winter days.

Cold temperatures wreak havoc on batteries because they slow the chemical reaction inside of the battery. Batteries work by combining lead plates with lead dioxide and sulfuric acid to create electrons. While batteries can function under myriad conditions, the cold weather tends to degrade high-quality batteries and may render subpar batteries useless. The cold weather can cause the fluid in the battery to freeze and lose function. A battery that is frozen will not hold a charge. • Assess the age of your battery. If your battery is old, now may be the time to replace it. Batteries differ in how long they last, but many last anywhere from five to 10 years. If your car is still running on its original battery and your card is several years old, it may be a good idea to get a new battery before the arrival of winter. Battery size will not necessarily provide

better starting. It's important to buy the correct battery for the make of your car, which can usually be found inside of the owner's manual.

- Verify that there is no corrosion. Corrosion can prevent a car from starting just as much as a worn-out battery. Corrosion is caused by a faulty connection that allows battery acid to escape and corrode surrounding areas. Regularly inspect the battery to keep abreast of issues that may cause corrosion. Carefully clean away any corrosive residue that has formed and make sure the battery is correctly seated.
- Install a battery blanket. A battery blanket is used to wrap around the battery and fit inside of the battery cover. A cord with a plug runs from the blanket to a wall outlet. The blanket can produce enough heat to keep the battery fluid from freezing.
- Minimize the use of automotive accessories. Do not start the car with the heater and the radio on. They can use up the power coming from the car's alternator and prevent the battery from charging. Do not leave the heat and the radio on while the car is idling. Otherwise the car will not be putting out enough power for the alternator to charge the battery and power the electrical systems.

Knowing how to skirt trouble with your car's battery can keep your car on the road throughout the winter.





The 2016-17 school year kicked off in Baltimore County on Wednesday, with thousands of teachers and students returning to the classroom.

To prepare for the upcoming year, supply drives have been held all over the county, culminating in a big giveaway last Saturday at the White Marsh Mall. Hundreds of teachers poured into the mall to grab supplies for students that had been collected over the previous three weeks at libraries around the county.

ementary teacher who was there collecting supplies. "And often that burden gets put on the teaching staff. I'd do anything for my kids; that includes providing supplies. But it does burden teachers a bit, so drives like this are a life saver."

Boscov's was one of the non-library drop off spots for donations, and the White Marsh Mall very generously donated space for the materials to be held and displayed.

During the supply drive, which began on July 25, organizers asked for any school supplies but said the mostneeded items were colored pencils or

composition notebooks, pencils, pocket folders, socks and underwear.

"I'm really glad they included things like socks and underwear," said another teacher who asked to remain anonymous. "All the school supplies in the world won't help if a child can't be comfortable and clean."

Events were held in Randallstown, Catonsville and Dundalk, with the Dundalk event being held at the Sollers Point Multi-Purpose Center.

Approximately 3,000 backpacks and other school supplies were given away to those in need. The fairs also featured free haircuts, on-site immunizations, information about health and a lot

And for those apprehensive to start the school year in a new school, BCPS kicked things off with Early Entry Day on Monday morning.

All 30 middle and 28 Baltimore County high schools participated in the Early Entry Day. Monday operated on a half-day morning schedule, with

the start times at each school based on a real school day.

Offered exclusively to sixth- and ninth-grade students, thousands of students took part in Early Entry Day.

Teachers returned to the classroom on Aug. 17, and many were greeted with a surprise when they arrived - a change in policy to grading.

Under the new system, a student's behavior is factored out of his or her grades. The school system also now recommends that teachers do not factor homework into overall grades or give students marks below 50 percent.

"The power of the zero is extremely powerful and frankly hurtful to a student," said George Roberts, a Community Superintendent with BCPS. "If a child gets a zero on an assignment, it's that much harder for the child to come out of."

## Parker's steps its game up under new chef

A few months back Chef Dallas Wells took over the kitchen at Parker's in White Marsh, and things have greatly improved. That isn't to say that it wasn't good before, just that Wells has a gift when it comes to finding flavor.

"Before food was kind of being thrown together quickly," said Wells. "I started thinking about how to add more flavors, started thinking about sauces more."

Wells's love of sauces is apparent, with cream sauces aplenty on the menu at Parker's. I ventured over to Parker's to try out a few dishes with a co-worker two weeks ago to give some of these dishes a try, and it was worth it.

To start, Wells brought out fried green tomatoes, topped with an ample serving of crab and covered in a sherry cream sauce with a touch of old bay. Truthfully, I would have been content getting serving after serving of this dish.

From the fried green tomatoes we dove into the six ounce crab cake, which was surprising in both taste and texture. While many love to boast about their jumbo lump crab, Parker's goes a different way, opting to use shredded backfin crab meat. By shredding the crab meat, the flavor is able to work its way into every crevice of the crab cake. And there's a lot of flavor. Wells opts to touch up his crab cakes with a little

bit of honey and dijon, which gives the dish a slightly sweeter taste. It's unlike any other crab cake I've had on the east side.

After the crab cake we tackled the blackened seafood macaroni and cheese. The mac and cheese (note: actually penne pasta) is covered in a white cheddar bechamel sauce with a touch of blackened seasoning and comes topped with blackened shrimp and scallops. This was probably the heaviest of the meals we tried, but arguably the tastiest.

"One of the things we've been trying to do is portion and price control," explained Wells. "Before with the mac and cheese we were giving a monstrous serving that pretty much always called for leftovers. It would feed two but was lacking in a bit of flavor. So we knocked back the serving size a little bit to focus on the flavor, and so far it's been great."

I have to agree with Wells on that.

From the mac and cheese we tried the salmon and asparagus. The plating for this dish was very lovely, but more importantly, it was delicious. The asparagus was cooked to perfection, as was the salmon. In years past, some chefs have opted to cut corners when it comes to prepping, but not Wells. He takes a lot of pride in his work, so it was no shock that the salmon came out perfectly pan seared. The dill sauce that was drizzled on gave the dish an extra little burst that wasn't there before.



The blackened seafood mac and cheese was a delight served with a vegetable medley and bread.

"Before we were just serving the salmon without any sauce," said Wells. "So that was an easy fix. A lot of what has changed was relatively easy to fix. Mostly it was about not cutting corners, providing the best flavor and really taking pride in what you're serving."

The changes might be small but they work. In talking with Wells and co-owner Julie Parker O'Brien (who co-owns the restaurant with Ron Parker), it's obvious that they care immensely about Parker's, and it's also obvious that over the last few months they've changed for the better.

## 'BEN-HUR': How dare they mess with Messala!

My history with the original Charlton Heston "Ben-Hur" goes back to my Lutheran childhood. The first time I saw it was Easter weekend. I must have been about 12 or 13. I had never even thought of watching a nearly four-hour movie at that point in my

life. But I was grumbling about going to church. So, my grandma gave me a choice. Go to worship or stay home and watch "Ben-Hur," which was running that morning and afternoon on our local UHF channel. It was the only movie suggestion she ever gave me in her life, and I was so glad I took it.

The movie enthralled me! It grabbed me from the first moment to the last. I loved that the story of the fractured friendship and bitter rivalry of childhood pals Judah Ben-Hur (Heston) and Messala (Stephen Boyd), one a Jew and one a Roman, took place alongside Biblical history. The story tracked the life of Jesus, and Christ existed on the peripheral of the movie, seen from behind or the side a few times throughout. He was never front and center, but absolutely pivotal to the three turns of the epic story.

The new "Ben-Hur" is half as long, and it's... eh... about half the movie the Charlton Heston version was. It gets quite a bit right. But the things it gets wrong absolutely killed the experience for me.

First, the right. OK, the one thing director Timur Bekmambetov had to deliver on, he delivered. Of course, I'm talking about the chariot race. The sequence in the '59 version is one of the great pure action spectacles in cinematic history. How do you top it? You don't. You just make it work, and you throw in a few moments that couldn't possibly have been done in the late '50s.

I also love how computer effects have made a largescale Jerusalem possible in this film. Judah Ben-Hur (Jack Huston) was a Jewish prince. So, the parts of the city he moves around in called for more than just ramshackle ruins and dusty streets. The sets and set extensions in this flick are really well done. My eyes drank in the sites.

Now for the bad. Oh my god, they totally destroyed the Messala character! Producers Mark Burnett and Roma Downey turn "Ben-Hur" into a journey of sappy forgiveness. They re-imagine Messala as a redeemable character and make him Judah's adopted brother - a point driven home in almost every other scene. As





played by Toby Kebbell, there's never any doubt of Messala's decency.

But... but... that's not Messala! I'm sorry! Pardon my Hebrew, but Messala is one of THE great scumbags in movie history! And Boyd was a lion in that original film. Knowing that his best

friend from childhood was really innocent

of sedition, he still sentenced him to a life of slavery AND lied to him that his mother and sister were given merciful executions.

How much more scumbag can you be? And his death scene? Gnarly! As Messala lies on his deathbed, his internal injuries causing him to convulse uncontrollably, Judah gives him one final chance at redemption. And what does Messala do? Repent? Hell, no! He tells Ben-Hur his mom and sis didn't die a merciful death years earlier. As he spits his last breath, he boasts, "Look for them... in the Valley... of the Lepers!" Then, to twist the knife further, he adds, "If you can recognize them."

But this new Messala? Wuss! Oh, how they botch his part in the story. And as played by Kebbell, he looks more bewildered than conflicted - more like he's been presented with a tricky algebra problem on the chalkboard than betraying his friend and family to the Empire.

I also didn't like that they moved Jesus (Rodrigo Santoro) from the peripheral of the story to be a walking, talking, scripted character. His ultimate sacrifice on the cross then becomes less about him saving humanity from its sin and more about teaching Ben-Hur to forgive his brother. Ugh.

A few years back, there was another Easter in which the wife and I were debating whether to go to church. "Ben-Hur" was on Turner Classic Movies. So, I gave Bonnie the same choice my grandma gave me. She scoffed and said, "I don't want to see 'Ben-Hur' again." I was surprised. Again? I've known her since I was 14, and she'd never mentioned seeing it. "You've seen 'Ben-Hur?!'" I inquired. "Yes, years ago. I didn't like it."

I was beside myself. "What didn't you like?!" Sheepishly, she replied, "The story. It... it's stupid." "Stupid?!" I raged. "It's one of the greatest stories ever told! Writers dream of coming up with a story so good! I wish I could write something even half that-"

And she immediately gave up. "OK, I haven't seen it! I just don't want to watch a four-hour movie on Easter!" Well, she's not going to be watching the twohour one either.



#### Definitely see this film, come **'HELL OR HIGH WATER'**

I do love me my Country & Western "story songs." I'm talkin' the kind of old-school tunes you rarely hear on terrestrial radio anymore. You have to subscribe to XM/Sirius satellite and have Willie's Roadhouse on the pre-set. I especially love outlaw songs, about good ol' folk runnin' from the law. And the best ones never get old. Everything from Marty Robbins' "El Paso" and Johnny Cash's "Cocaine Blues" to the Dixie Chicks' "Goodbye Earl."

"Hell or High Water" works EXACTLY like a good ol' country story song. This is kind of a redneck version of "Heat," with Chris Pine and Ben Foster playing brothers and small-time bank robbers in rural Texas, and Jeff Bridges and Gil Birmingham as the Texas Rangers hot on their trail. Like "Heat," you actually like the folks on BOTH sides of the law. You don't want to see Pine and Foster's down-on-their-luck Toby and Tanner Howard get nabbed. But Bridges' Marcus Hamilton and Birmingham's Alberto Parker are so darn endearing, you don't necessarily want to see them fail either.

Set in the modern day, this is definitely one of those "greatest mix" movies, with director David Mackenzie and screenwriter Taylor Sheridan taking their cues from the outlaw music of Cash, Robbins, Charlie Daniels and more to such similarly themed flicks as "Fargo," "A Simple Plan" and "No Country for Old Men." But "Hell or High Water" also finds its own visual and scripted poetry.

What really distinguishes "Hell or High Water" is its sense of place and time. The Howard boys aren't a couple of "Yee-Haw!"-screaming crooks out for an illegal thrill. The brothers have a very specific reason for why they're stealing from a particular chain of banks, and it has to do with post-recession America.

Does it all hold together in the end? I think so. There's a very welcome scene between Bridges' Marcus Hamilton and another character late in the flick that actually answers a lot of the lingering logic questions I had. Mostly, though, the film is about people. Nothin' left to say to you cowpokes, except... this is a must-gander!







#### Delegate Impallaria charged with DWI in Ocean City

Delegate Rick Impallaria, who represents District 7 in Baltimore County and part of Harford County, was arrested on Aug. 18 in Ocean City and charged with driving while impaired.

Impallaria, who has been in office since 2003, was attending the Maryland Association of Counties conference when the ordeal took place.

Records from the District Court of Worcester County show that police stopped Impallaria at approximately 8:15 p.m. after leaving the Ropewalk Tavern.

Impallaria was observed by officers getting into his vehicle, which was illegally parked at the time, and starting his engine. Officers observed an open

container in the vehicle and conducted field sobriety tests, though Impallaria failed to complete the tests.

He was then arrested and taken to the Ocean City Public Safety building where he was administered an alcohol concentration test and was found to have a blood-alcohol concentration of 0.07 percent. He was cited with driving while impaired by alcohol and released.

In Maryland, driving while impaired is a secondary charge for operating a vehicle with a blood-alcohol level between 0.04 percent and 0.08 percent. Driving under the influence is a more serious offense that applies when the blood-alcohol level is 0.08 percent or

Impallaria currently acts as the deputy minority whip in the House of Delegates and has been a strong advocate in the past for harsher drunk driving

Last session, Impallaria, who resides in Essex, introduced a bill that would have seen drunk drivers who injure someone liable for punitive damages in lawsuits. The Washington Post also dug up a quote from 2008 in which Impallaria is arguing against the use of speed cameras.

"In many cases, we're going to be helping the wrong person," Impallaria said during the legislative floor debate. "We're going to be helping the drunk because he's only going to get the fine for speeding."

\$13,990

Calls to Impallaria were not returned by press time. His court date is set for Oct. 6.

This is the third member of the House of Delegates to get charged



with drunken driving since 2008. Delegate Don Dwyer from Anne Arundel was sentenced to 60 days in jail for driving a car while impaired and operating a boat while intoxicated. In 2008, then-House Majority Leader Kumar P. Barve of Montgomery plead guilty to a DUI but avoided jail time.

tination.

"It is imperative while walking to also keep these devices away," she said, adding that there have been a few "near-misses" in Baltimore County with pedestrians stepping into the roadway while focused on these devices.

Of the 1,070 children 14 years and under killed in traffic crashes nationwide in 2014, 207 were pedestrians, according to the National Highway Traffic Safety

Administration. The vast majority of those pedestrians were struck by the front of the vehicle.

Spriggs reminded drivers that they are required to stop in both directions for buses with red lights flashing and stop arms extended unless there is a physical median dividing the roadway such as a jersey wall, sidewalk or grass median. Failing to stop can lead to a fine of up to \$570 and three points, or even higher if it contributes to a crash.

Ragina Averella, manager of Public and Government Affairs for AAA Mid-Atlantic, pointed to a 2014 study conducted by the Maryland Department of Education which asked school bus drivers to record how many drivers disobeyed their stop signs on an assigned day. On that one day, 70 percent of bus drivers across the state recorded nearly 3,400 motorists ignoring the stop signs.

"That's ridiculous," Averella asserted, "that's dangerous and again, it's against the law."

Spriggs also pointed out that at 25 miles per hour - the speed limit in most school zones - a motor vehicle will travel 36 feet in just one second. At 30 miles per hour, that distance increases to the length of a school bus.

"The shear nature of a child's size makes them that much more vulnerable to serious injury or fatalities, even in low-speed crashes," she explained.

Averella added that children can be unpredictable and may not always have traffic safety in mind. They may have trouble gauging the distance and speed of an approaching vehicle and may struggle to recognize and react to potentially hazardous situations. And unfortunately, more school-aged pedestrians have been killed between 7 - 8 a.m. and 3 - 4 p.m. than at any other time of the day.

Therefore, it is incumbent upon drivers to remain alert, slow down in school zones and residential areas and plan ahead, allowing extra travel time or modifying your route if necessary, she said.

Coyne said that, as a parent, he knows children do not always pay attention to their surroundings. But it is important for them to know that grown-ups can get distracted too. He encouraged talking about the rules of the road as a family.

Although school did not start until yesterday, commuters may have noticed school buses on the roads as early as Thursday, Aug. 18, which was the "dry-run" day for bus drivers to familiarize themselves with their routes, according to David McCrae, transportation director for Baltimore County Public Schools. Additionally, some students in sixth and ninth grades attended school early on Monday, Aug. 22, to help them acclimate to their new middle and high schools.

Of the 112,000 students in BCPS, McCrae explained, around 71,500 rode a school bus on a daily basis last year.

"That's a tremendous number of people that we want to keep safe as they come on and off of those school buses," he said, adding that many of the remaining 40,500 students either cycled or walked to school.

quire an additional process to obtain a more accurate number, which was not initially done, according to CBF spokesman Tom Zolper.

By comparison, the dry-weather sample at that site was only 24 cfu / 100 mL.

The sampling site for White Marsh Run along Bird River Grove Road, just before it joins the tidal Bird River, returned readings ranging from 260 to more than 24,196 cfu/100mL after storms, with a dry weather reading of 220.

The sampling site on Honeygo Run behind the White Marsh Volunteer Fire Company showed similar results ranging from 380 to more than 24,196 cfu/100mL after storms and a dry reading of 440.

Another site farther upstream on White Marsh Run, at the Pine Valley Swim Club, showed overall higher readings ranging from 4,700 - 24,000 cfu/100mL after storms, with 63 during dry weather.

The highest bacterial counts were seen after the largest rainfall on July 29 and Aug. 2, when 3.08 and 0.8 inches of rain fell, respectively.

A spike was also seen after the 0.95 inches of rain that fell on July 5, when all but the tidal sites came back with readings of "greater than 2,419" cfu/100mL. But the additional process was not performed for those samples to get a more accurate number, Zolper said.

"So you can see readings are dramatically higher than safety levels set by the federal government - especially after storms," Zolper said, adding that the risk of illness, such as stomach aches and gastrointestinal issues, increases with the amount of bacteria in the water.

"Some of the readings in the feeder streams to the [tidal] Bird River are equal to or higher than levels found in Baltimore City with its sewage problems," he said."

The Bird River watershed covers approximately 26 square miles and encompasses about 61,000 residents

of communities in Perry Hall, Fullerton, White Marsh, Nottingham, Middle River and as far away as Parkville and Carney. The majority of the 24,400 homes in the watershed are within walking distance to one of its 90 miles of tributaries.

Zolper noted that the tidal readings are lower because the bacteria becomes diluted once it reaches the tidal areas. "But people kayak, fish and swim close to the feeder streams, often after rain storms not realizing the unsafe condition of the water," he said.

He also pointed out that, as a rule, the Maryland Department of the Environment recommends that people do not come into contact with natural water within 48 hours after a significant rainstorm.

CBF scientist Doug Myers called that policy a good rule of thumb for public health management. "But it's not taking responsibility for that pollution source and fixing it," he said.

While a specific source of the excess bacteria in the streams is not yet known, Myers said it could come from pet or wildlife waste washing off the land, or from humans via compromised sewage or septic systems.

"We don't have enough results to really be definitive, but we do see big spikes after rain, so it definitely is connected to the run-off," Myers stated.

Zolper said, though, that the Bird River watershed is a very urbanized area where you tend to have more things like pet waste and public sewer infrastructure that may be compromised.

Baltimore County recently completed a \$13 million restoration project along White Marsh Run which was meant to slow the stream's flow and stabilize its banks while also replacing 800 feet of sewer line that had been prone to overflowing into the stream during rain storms for more than 20 years.

Baltimore County tests for water quality in waterways in the county and posts the results on their website. But they only test the tidal portions and do not specifically test after rain events.

Typically, Myers said, the county samples in the same frequency period, such as every two weeks, regardless of the weather. In fact, most of their testing occurs on dry days, according to Zolper.

"So when they capture high variability between the wet and the dry, they really don't know why because they're not targeting their samples specifically to dry or wet weather," Myers explained.

or wet weather," Myers explained.

Zolper noted that the goal of the testing was to raise the general awareness that when it rains, no matter the source of the pollution, it is getting into the water and is a risk for humans. He added that they want people to pressure their local government to fix the problem, regardless of the source.

Peter and Janet Terry, who live on the tidal Bird River and were involved in gathering samples, said they were "absolutely shocked" by the test results.

"It's really sad when you have children living near these streams and want to play and poke around in them and you've got these high levels of bacteria," Janet said.

Janet, who has lived in the area since the 1950s, said she has seen the Bird River fill up with three to four feet of silt and mud over the last 60 years. The Terrys attribute this to the increased development in the watershed in the last few decades.

Older developments had been approved and built before adequate storm water management policies had been adopted. And Baltimore County granted waivers to developers for newer projects, they said, so they could avoid more recent and strict guidelines.

"We enjoy having opportunities that development will give us," Janet affirmed, "but not at the expense of our environment and our waters."

Although Zolper assured that the testing was not done in response to the county's repeal of its storm water remediation fee, he said the expense of retrofitting older developments to deal with runoff issues illustrates the need for dedicated funding.
