

"Taking Care of Business" also the name of an infamous bull whose rodeo career ties in with Texas and Oklahoma folks like us. Please read on to find out how.

HUCKLEBERRY DAYS IN NORTHERN IDAHO

Yes, there are such things as huckleberries. They grow wild in Northern Idaho and during the short time they are ready for harvest (mid to late July), the state celebrates the small purple berry in all sorts of ways. Bars offer huckleberry beer or wine. Restaurants offer huckleberry ice cream. Stores (like Huckleberry Thicket in Post Falls) have dozens of items like huckleberry candy and jam. The berry is about the size of a pea and has a distinctive taste that is similar to a blueberry,

but more tart and bold. Bears love them and compete with human pickers.

We went to Coeur d'Alene (pronounced core da lane) to visit our friends who recently bought a home there. Their yard has hundreds of flowers and shrubs, which were all in bloom when we were there in mid-July. The neighborhood has the greenest well-kept lawns and cleanest streets. People take extra good care of their cars.

There are 55 lakes within 50 miles of CDA (as the natives call their city), some of them so deep that the US Navy tests submarines at its base at Bayview where Lake Pend Oreille (pronounced Pondoray) is more than 1,000 feet deep. Most of the lakes are surrounded by thick forests of fir and pine. Nestled among the trees are elaborate homes, many of them owned by movie stars and sports figures. One of five homes is a permanent residence. The rest are used by the owners for get-aways.

Towering over Lake Coeur d'Alene is a resort that features the only floating golf green in the world. Golfers tee off on the mainland and are taken by boat to the green. Boating, swimming, parasailing and water skiing are popular activities on the lake. Some folks surf without a rope in the boat's wake. We toured the Stancraft wooden boat factory that turns out beautiful water vehicles.

Hanging baskets of flowers are everywhere and the snow-capped mountains in the background give the visitor an experience that goes right to the soul. We took a drive along the Selkirk Loop, a 280 miles route that offers scenic beauty punctuated by waterfalls, footbridges and lighthouses. The drive is along rivers and lakes and has inviting places for picnics. The loop goes through Idaho, British Columbia and Washington, past picturesque mining towns with unique hotels and cafes. There's a free ferry ride from Kootenay Bay to Balfour. At Nelson, BC we stayed in the Hume Hotel, which offered an evening of soft jazz in the bar, played by experts on guitar and violin. The next morning we went to a street market that had beautiful fruits, vegetables, furniture, clothing and jewelry. Nelson is known as the best small art town in Canada.

Perhaps the most unusual thing we saw was a beautiful house near Boswell, BC made of empty embalming bottles. The builder collected more than 600,000 bottles and used them like bricks. He kept the caps on for insulation. He was an undertaker and spent ten years building his house. It is comfortable with all the modern conveniences. The grounds are maintained in typical Canadian fashion with bright colored flowers, green grass, shade trees, patios, observation decks and walkways.



We just passed the anniversary of the death of Lane Frost whose life and death were memorialized in the 1994 movie "Eight Seconds". This may be one of your all-time favorite movies. You may also know that Lane is buried very near here, next to one of his real-life rodeo heroes. But not everyone has visited his grave site. It is definitely worth a trip across the river to Hugo.

On July 30, 1989, Lane was a good-looking, super-talented 25-year-old with the rodeo world at his feet when his career suddenly ended. He was in his seventh year of professional bull riding. It was the final day of the Cheyenne Frontier Days Rodeo and he had successfully ridden the bull "Takin Care of Business". His dismount landed him in the dirt, directly in the path of the bull. Lane had started to get up when the bull hit him in the side with his horn, breaking several ribs. He rose and yelled for his friend Tuff Hedeman, then fell. The fall apparently caused a rib to puncture his lungs and heart, resulting in near-instantaneous death. Lane was rushed to a hospital where he was pronounced dead. Posthumously he finished third in the event. The rodeo world was in shock and soon a string of poems, songs, paintings, articles, documentaries, and tributes from Lane's fans began to surface. During the 1990's, he was inducted into numerous Halls of Fame. Between 2000 and 2015, more tributes to Lane continued to be paid. One of the farthest-reaching has been by his traveling partner Cody Lambert, who created the protective vest that all professional bull riders now wear during competitions.

Lane's parents Elsie and Clyde Frost moved from Utah to Oklahoma when their son was 14. He was already a champion in youth rodeo events, and would soon take top honors as National High School Bull Riding Champion in Oklahoma in 1981, and in 1982 at the Bull Riding Championship in the National Youth Finals in Ft. Worth. Upon graduation from high school in Atoka, Oklahoma, he joined the PRCA and went professional. He and Texas barrel racing champion Kelly Kyle married in 1985. He competed in the 1988 Winter Olympics at Calgary, Alberta, Canada.

Lane's funeral service on August 2, 1989 was held at the First Baptist Church of Atoka with an estimated 3500 people in attendance. He was laid to rest in the Mt. Olivet "Showman's Rest" Cemetery in Hugo, Oklahoma, just steps away from his mentor, Freckles Brown. If you visit the cemetery, you will find him near the archway entrance. His grave will probably be decorated with small tokens placed there by fans young and old who have visited recently. Walk further into the cemetery and discover a large section of graves of circus folk. Many of the stones are colorful and decorated with engraved circus scenes. For many years, Hugo has been the wintering grounds of Miller Brothers and other small circuses, which has gained it the name "Circus City"


