

Do you, or don't you, like change? Either you do or you don't. Many of us are drawn to the familiarity of having things "the same" in our lives. Others feel a positive surge by selecting something "new and different" when a choice is needed. Then there are the times when we have to embrace change due to circumstances beyond our control. That's how I found the horse doctor.

Dr. David Howton operates a vet clinic in Winnsboro, Texas. He has a partner, Dr. Matt Gerdes. The business sign for Winnsboro Veterinary Clinic is posted as you turn onto it's long gravel driveway from Highway 11 just west of the Winnsboro city limits. It is across the road from Country Boy's Convenience Store, and Winnsboro is just a few miles ahead. The drive to the clinic from Sulphur Springs is a pleasant one, along a smooth, wide roadway where in the autumn of the year, the leaves on the trees offer a spectacular color display (for Northeast Texas). That's also the season that Winnsboro hosts "Autumn Trails" in October, a month-long celebration of the best of [additional content of [small-town living.

I own a couple of horses. From time to time, I have needed the services of a vet. Dr. J.D. Norris was our vet for the past few years. He was always fun, funny and down to earth, kind of like a family doctor for animals. At Veterinary Services on East Loop 301 in Sulphur Springs, his barn always felt welcoming and friendly and kind of a home away from home on the occasions I had to board a horse for a few days. He served the working horses and other animals of the ranches and farm families of the area. Dr. Norris succumbed to an ongoing illness during the Spring of 2016. His funeral was well-attended by rodeo, country, farm and western folk from all around Northeast Texas, and his warmth and humor are still missed. Dr. John Allen is now working out of Dr. Norris' clinic. Dr. Allen has operated a mobile equine service for a number of years, and he also is a trusted long-time servant of God's noblest creatures.

It was during the early summer that my paint gelding Edgar needed a vet. He was experiencing some irritation of the eyelid of the left eye, his "glass"eye. I had heard that the odd-looking blue eye might be susible to a form of cancer caused by exposure to sunlight, but I never took it too seriously. Horses were created to be out in the sun, right? By the time I chose a new vet clinic, the irritation was identified as cancer (squamous cell carcinoma) of the eyelid. It was a good day when we met Dr. Howton in his spacious treatment barn. His prognosis was straight to the point:
he would administer the "freezing" treatment on
"freeze" capear calls inveding the the affected surface every 2-3 weeks and look for positive progress. The first and second visit

were pretty rough, with the eye looking just horrible. Cancerous. I began to fear that I'd be unable to beat this for Edgar, and he might lose the eye altogether, or worse. But like a miracle, when we pulled the fly mask off his face today, around the eye we saw pink tissue that was not swelled or weeping. It looked great to me!

There were a couple of small spots that needed attention today, so Edgar was given a sedative to allow the doctor to work on the eye. By the time he "woke up", there were two more horses in the breezeway waiting for the doctor's care. I loaded Edgar onto the trailer feeling very relieved although Dr. Howton cautioned that diligence is still needed to keep the cancer at bay. And that recurrence is almost a certainty, partly because of Edgar's color-diluted genes. However, I am happy at the present moment and feel rather victorious, thanks to Dr. Howton and his expert staff. Edgar and I have an appointment to keep on behalf of the Hopkins County Sherrif's Posse, to carry the colors at the head of the Fall Festival Parade on Saturday, October 15. I hope to see you curbside as the parade winds through downtown Sulphur Springs. It's a tradition!

If you are looking for a veterinarian that treats large and small animals and provides medical, surgical, dental and wellness care for pets or livestock, then take the relaxing drive to Winnsboro, Texas and meet Drs. David Howton and Matt Gerdes. Their clinic is very busy but adequately staffed by people who are caring and professional, and loving what they do! Meantime friends, til next week, I'll watch for you at the corral gate!

JOHN MORROW IS A SUPER HANDYMAN

Tumbleweed Smith



John Morrow has a water well drilling business in Clarendon. He makes a lot of his equipment. "The derrick is made out of a swing set and television antenna poles," he says while smiling and laughing, "I used a sprocket from an old cotton stripper and a four-speed transmission from a Chevrolet. I use a Ford starter motor to get things going."

John has always been curious about how things work. "My earliest recollection of any mechanical ability goes back to the

little cars I played with as a boy. They had a little centrifugal motor in them and you could push them on the floor a couple of times to get the wheels going, then set them down and they'd take off. After a while those gears would wear out and they wouldn't go any more. I figured out why. They had little bitty tabs and you could bend those tabs out straight, pull the body off and see the working parts of that thing. I bent the frame of that little motor sideways and it would push the gears over where they weren't worn out and they'd re-mesh again and it would work for a while."

John was doing that at age four. Then he started helping his mother with some of her equipment. "She had an old Maytag wringer-type washing machine and the wringer quit working. There's a little box there by the wringer and I took the top off of it. I saw that when you tried to make it go, this gear would spin on the shaft. There was a series of small holes where some metal pins went in. One of those pins was missing, so I figured out you could use a nail. You had to bend it, but it worked and the wringer was back in service. Mother was proud of me for fixing it."

His first business venture was mowing lawns. "I tied the handle of the lawn mower to the back of my bicycle and pulled that thing across town mowing lawns."

His main transportation around town these days is a pickup from the 70's he bought new. It has nearly half a million miles on it. One of John's trucks is a retired fire engine from the fire department in Hamilton. "When I went to pick it up, the entire Hamilton fire department was there to see old 307 leave. They requested that if I ever used it to put the number 307 somewhere on it. When we repainted the truck, right up on the corner of the hood we put number 307. That's a tough old truck. When I got it we had just had a big snowstorm up here. I did some work on it and took it through a six-foot snowdrift in nothing flat. I drove it over a wheat field covered in deep snow and it never showed down. The wheels just kept turning."

John has had some unique experiences. On his wedding night his souped-up car blew a front tire while going 115 miles an hour. He and his bride both walked away. John bought an old drive in theater that had been closed for years and brought it back to life. He cleared trees that had grown up around it, repaired the screen, added digital equipment and started showing the latest movies. The drive in has become a destination for panhandle residents.

While there, he landed small roles in many popular t.v. shows (including My Name is Earl, According to Jim, Sarah Silverman Show) and became a stunt man on the Deadwood series. He also appeared in several feature films (including Transporter 2, Color of the Cross) and many short films. Jesse's greatest success came in modeling. He modeled for photographers from all over the world. He was sought out by EA Games to be their cover model and main character, Dusty, in the Medal of Honor 2010 video game.

Jesse was a camp counselor for Camp Reach for the Sky which is a camp for children with cancer and their siblings. He also worked with autistic children.

He loved children, horses, dogs, nature, and motorcycle riding.

He was a screenwriter, poet, artist, singer, and musician.

During his adventurous life he traveled to Greece and Great Britain; raced motorcycles; boxed professionally; rode horses; competed in bull riding competitions; trained dogs and horses; became proficient in roping; and was a licensed private pilot.




