

By ANN SCHWARTZ In order to integrate technology into the classroom and homework experiences,

all Aitkin High School 7-12th graders will start the new school year with their own laptop computers.

The MacBook Air laptops were leased from the Apple Company for four years. Each student gets a computer with a case, necessary cords and chargers. They will be used both in the classroom and at home.

Several orientation nights have been held with parents, where computers were passed out and policies discussed. Although the use of the computer is free to families, Aitkin High School Principal Paul Karelis said many families did purchase the optional \$50 insurance plan for the machines.

When at school, students and teachers will all use their laptop for lessons, which will also be displayed on screens in the classroom, known as Smartboards by Epson.

"This opportunity to roll out computers for our students

puts everyone on an even keel," enthused Karelis in an interview. He said he was very excited to put these tools of knowledge at the fingertips of every student, giving them the chance to do research. "It puts all of our students on the same level for learning," he explained.

Jason Roos, technology integrationist for the school district, said that a total of 670 computers were leased for students, Airs, MacBook Pros and Aitkin High School. iMacs. Those who sit at a desk, such as administrative assistants, will get desktop models. Otherwise, students

and teachers will have portable technology to use in the classroom, elsewhere in the



Ranching with the respect and protecting heritage the Lakota way

"Long before the white man first stepped onto North American soil there was a time when the land was sacred, the family was considered the center of life, everything was done with prayer, and man and nature lived in concert with one another," writes Jennifer Archibald, a Lodgepole, SD, writer and rancher.

Seventh-generation ranchers Wayne and Alex Frederick preserve the ways of their proud and rich Lakota culture by looking to their future in ranching through actions that speak of, and honor, their past, Archibald explains.

Their ranch on the Rosebud Indian Reservation was started in 1904 by Wayne's family, William Cordes and Emma Agnes Red War Bonnet, both of whom were at what "we Lakota call the Battle of the Greasy Grass, better know as the Battle of the Little Bighorn," says Wayne.

The Rosebud Reservation is located in south-central South Dakota near the Nebraska border and in many ways is typical of reservations across the United States, writes Archibald. Abject poverty, alcoholism and unemployment are daily realities.

Todd County, the largest county on the reservation, ranks as the second poorest county in the United States. Unemployment is over 80 percent and even the majority of those who are employed live below the poverty level.

Despite the poverty and feelings of helplessness around them, the Frederick family draws strength and hope from their family culture and traditions.

"I was the first one to bring the sun dance back to the family in the last four generations," Wayne says. "It was abandoned by my family because of the boarding schools."

Alex homeschools 12-yearold Summer and seven-yearold Cedar. "We are practicing our language every day and have our children involved in all of the ceremonies," she says. "We wanted the Lakota language to be our children's first language."

Language, cultural identity and education are emphasized in the Frederick household. "Children are exposed to more bad habits in the schools," Wayne says, adding that only about one-third of students on the Rosebud Indian Reservation have received

a high-school diploma. Wayne has a technical degree as a diesel mechanic and bachelors' degrees in human services and criminal justice. Alex has bachelors' degrees in history and science.

Wayne explains the Lakota practices and beliefs. "When you pick up the Sacred Pipe you have a responsibility to leave behind anything that is disrespectful. This includes alcohol, drugs, swearing, speaking in a nega-

tive manner, or anything else that doesn't put our people first." The Lakota family extends beyond the immediate family, and they believe there are essential virtues that, when practiced, balance life. The quality of life is not measured by material possessions, but by how well you live those virtues.

The virtues that are the foundation of the Lakota culture include humility, perseverance, respect, honor, love, sacrifice, truth, compassion, bravery, fortitude, generosity and wisdom.

Spirituality plays a role in the Fredericks' ranching practices as well. They raise 100 head of cattle and sublease their pastures, taking in another 350 head. "The animals are as much a part of us as we are them. It is balanced why there aren't more Native respect. We always start with our traditional prayers before we work or do anything with our cattle and thank them for everything they have provided for us and for being able to live this way of life," Wayne says.

They take in cattle belonging to others to pay for operating costs. Although the family was able to get a loan for cattle and equipment, they can't get a loan for operating money because they don't own the land, the tribe does, and it is in trust. They can't get any sort of mortgage on trust land. Which explains ranchers, Alex explains. The legal title to the land remains under the federal trust with the U.S. government.

A multi-layered government bureaucracy that includes the Department of Interior and Bureau of Indian Affairs has created Indian land-tenure issues and limits the ability of a tribe or an individual to maximize profits on different land-use opportunities.

Alex says there are few like them. "There are other ranchers who are enrolled in the tribe, but culturally are so far away from it. It can be isolating not having the friendships or neighbors to help. We don't have a social life, because we really stand up for what we believe in. We see a lot of people selling out to those who want to make money on our culture and we've stood against it."

By having the courage to stand up for what they believe in and doing the right thing, writes Archibald, the Fredericks have found the key to living their lives and raising their kids with integrity.

Study investigates whether grouse exposed to pesticide

Sharp-tailed grouse and prairie chicken hunters can voluntarily submit samples for study by the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources.

Ongoing DNR research is assessing prairie grouse exposure to chemicals called neonicotinoids. These are pesticides that, once applied, can move throughout a plant. Neonicotinoids are commonly applied to seeds before planting.

"In this study, we're assessing whether prairie grouse have been exposed to neonicotinoids by eating treated seeds, and other means," said Charlotte Roy, DNR grouse project leader.

Hunters can voluntarily submit whole frozen liver, breast muscle tissue, or entire carcasses from harvested sharp-tailed grouse and prairie chickens in zip-close type bags, along with the location where the bird was harvested (GPS coordinates preferred). GPS locations and personal data will not be made public.

Samples should be stored frozen in a sealed plastic bag after harvest and dropped off at a local DNR wildlife office by appointment during regular business hours. Visit www. mndnr.gov/contact/locator. html to find a local office.

Funding for this year's project is provided by the Minnesota Environment and Natural Resources Trust Fund as recommended by the Legislative-Citizen Commission on Minnesota Resources.

Last year, DNR researchers were collecting wing samples for a study on grouse and prairie chicken movement.

"Although wing collection for the movement study has ended, we would be happy to keep collecting wings that we can archive for future studies," Roy said.

Wings should be sent in paper envelopes with the location of harvest to Eric Nelson, with specific instructions and more information available at www.mndnr.gov/hunting/ grouse, or by calling Nelson at 218-203-4336.

Deer lottery application deadline

Firearms and muzzleloader hunters who want to harvest antlerless deer in a deer permit area designated as lottery this hunting season are reminded they must purchase their license and apply for an antlerless permit by Thursday, Sept. 8.

This season, antlerless deer permits are issued by lottery in 67 of Minnesota's 128 deer permit areas. The lottery is a way to evenly distribute antlerless permits, which limits harvest of antlerless deer and moves deer populations toward goal levels. Antlerless deer are without

an antler at least 3 inches long. No application is needed to take antlerless deer in permit areas designated as hunter's choice, managed or intensive harvest areas.

All hunters who purchase a firearms or muzzleloader license, and declare a lottery permit area by Sept. 8 will be automatically entered into the lottery for an either-sex permit. Hunters who want to participate in special firearm deer hunts also need to apply for permits that are issued by lottery, and the application deadline is Sept. 8.
